The Chair of the Promotions and Development Committee has also been monitoring the site and is already undertaking some of the suggestions that have been made. There are other ideas and concepts that all members have and this medium is a perfect opportunity to voice these for the benefit of the Association. If it is important to you, it is important to the Association.

Remember though that with any new system there will be teething problems – no different with this, however in the long run any small issues will be repaid with great dividends. The 2015 ISSF Championships are to be conducted at the picturesque Newcastle - Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club in January. My apologies to the Club for inadvertently referring to it as "Newcastle Port Macquarie Clay Target Club".

I am sure everyone knows of the quality of the ISSF facilities and the history of the Newcastle Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club in hosting National Championships in the past. We are looking forward to working with the Club to present another quality ISSF Event. On the back of the Gold medal success of Laetisha Scanlan, Laura Coles and Adam Vella at the Commonwealth games and Jack Wallace (Silver), Catherine Skinner (Bronze) and Emma Cox (Silver) at the World Championships in Spain this National event should be closely contested as we approach the next Olympics in 2016 in Rio. The emergence of two young men, James Willett with his 3rd placing in the Junior World Universal Trench Championships and Mitchell Iles with his win in the Overall and Junior ZZ World Championships shows the calibre of young shooters within the ranks of the Association. I am sure these two young men will put themselves forward over the next qualifying period for future World Cup and possibly Olympic selection. They will not have it their own

way with many of the current National Champions back to defend their titles.

The ACTA National Office has been dealing with some major internet issues over the past month including UDP Flooding (see google for a full description). Sufficient to say the flooding caused our internet to virtually shut down, overloaded to a point where it could not function. Our IT consultants along with Telstra took nearly four weeks to get on top of the issue. This flooding caused our data usage to soar whilst reducing our capacity to use on line services. In turn this has delayed our data base and new website implementation for many reasons.

Given the new data base is web based through our website it was imperative we find a solution before launching. We are confident we are now on top of the situation and the roll out is well underway. In the next magazine we will have screen shots to assist people where required, although following the instructions on the website provides a very easy to follow guide to access the data base. Once in the data base you will end up in "My Page" where your details reside, you will be able to change your details and pay your membership through this system as at the 1st of November.

MELBOURNE GUN CLUB OCTOBER 4 & 5

The 2014 Victorian State ISSF Trap Titles were held at The Melbourne Gun Club on Saturday 4th and Sunday 5th of October in perfect conditions. The event was held over 175 targets + final.

A total of 31 shooters entered the event. Well down on previous years but while this may sound like a small crowd it is a BIG improvement on attendances during the year at regular club competitions where clubs are struggling to get more than 5 shooters turn up and competitions cancelled.

Day 1 and Craig Henwood got out of the blocks nice and early shooting the first 50 straight to be overnight leader on a great 97/100. Behind him was Catherine Skinner fresh off her Bronze Medal at the World Championships on 94/100 along with fellow World Championship medallist Jack Wallace on 93/100. It was good to see Marcel Tigani make a comeback to ISSF Trap also recording a 93/100 after a 4 year break.

Sunday was the first day of daylight savings and most seemed to remember to put their clocks forward the 1 hour to be on time for the 10am start. Conditions again great a little cloudy and overcast in the morning but after our BBQ lunch the sun was well and truly out.

After the 175 Tgts the leader into the Open final was Craig Henwood on 168/175, Catherine Skinner 165/175, Jack Wallace 162/175, Nidal Asmar 161/175. A shoot off was needed for the last 2 places which saw Matej Kandus and Josh Collard edge out Todd Malone on 160/175.

After the 15 Tgts in the semi Final both Catherine and Craig had recorded a 14/15 to go thru to the Gold Medal Match. The Bronze medal match would see Jack Wallace and Josh Collard duel it out.

A close encounter was had in both medal matches with Catherine recording a great 13/15 to edge out Craig on 12 to become the 2014 State Champion. The first time a female has won the open event in Victoria!! Well shot Catherine. The bronze medal went to young Jack Wallace who also recorded a great 13/15. Jack was also the winner of the Junior event.

The ladies final was wide open as Catherine had elected to shoot as an Open shooter both Penny Smith and Anna Shedrina had lead into the final on 147/175 and after the semi-final were to meet in the Gold Medal match. After 15 tgts both were tied on 11 and needed to go to sudden death. Anna coming out on top after 2 more targets. The bronze medal match

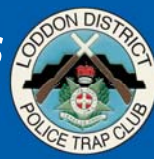

Psychological Skills for Shooting

MINDFULNESS?

At the coaches workshop back in July the question of how to keep your mind quiet came up. This is probably the most commonly asked question, when shooters start to focus on mental skills. One of the answers to the question of keeping the mind quiet is mindfulness.

Mindfulness is a special way of paying attention that can help with how you cope with everyday life or deal with tough times, and there are great benefits for your physical and mental health.

What is mindfulness?

Mindfulness is about training yourself to pay attention in a specific way. When a person is mindful, they:

- focus on the present moment
- try not to think about anything that went on in the past or that might be coming up in future
- purposefully concentrate on what's happening around them
- try not to be judgemental about anything they notice, or label things as 'good' or 'bad.'

Regular readers of this column will be aware of the importance of staying in the present and letting go of the past and future. We spend so much time thinking over stuff that has happened in the past, or worrying about things that may happen in the future, that often we actually forget to appreciate or enjoy the moment. Mindfulness is a way of bringing us back to experience life as it happens. When you're mindful, it:

- helps clear your head
- helps you be more aware of yourself, your body and the environment
- helps to slow down your thoughts
- slows down your nervous system
- helps you to concentrate
- helps you relax
- can help you cope with stress.

For the shooter there are some easy mindfulness exercises that can be done out of competition on the tracks when you are actually competing. It is important to know what is happening for you at the precise moment you are focusing your attention on yourself.

Mindfulness is also about the senses:

What can you hear? The sound of the other shooters calling for their targets, the sound of the trap, the report of guns, etc.

What can you smell? The spent powder in the shell, grass, the rain, etc.

What can you touch, what do you feel? Your hand around the stock, the stock against your shoulder, the recoil, your face on the stock, the warm sun on your neck, the wind against your face, your weight of your body in your shoes, etc

What can you see? The background, the target, etc.

Who is mindfulness for?

Mindfulness is something that everyone can develop, and it's something that everyone can try. It's been practiced for thousands of years, with origins in Eastern philosophy, and over the past 40 years, it has been taken up in western societies. People can increase their mindfulness in everyday life, through activities like meditation and yoga, or even by simply paying more attention during regular activities like walking, driving or something as basic as brushing your teeth. Mindfulness was very important last week when I was trapped in an lift for nearly an hour on my way to work.

Why build mindfulness?

There is a lot of evidence on the many benefits of mindfulness; it can:

- help to relieve stress
- help to improve sleep
- help manage depression and/or anxiety
- help you to be less angry or moody
- improve memory
- help you learn more easily
- help you to solve problems more easily
- make you happier
- help you to be more emotionally stable
- improve your breathing
- reduce your heart rate
- improve your circulation
- improve your immunity, or
- help you to cope with pain.

Learn more about different ways to build mindfulness there are lots of websites and Apps for smartphones and tablets that give a description of mindfulness and activities that can keep you focusing on the here and now. Just Google mindfulness exercises.

What can I do now?

- Check out Smiling Mind - a tool that can help you find clarity and contentment.
- Learn more about how to be more mindful
- Try paying attention to things that you don't normally notice, it will help you focus more on what's happening right now

For their part the students made 2 visits to the traps to shoot their 30 qualifying targets but at the end of the day no one was able to register a perfect score, albeit that one competitor missed his very last target.

At the completion of qualification, two shooters had scored 29, so it was to the traps to decide the overall winner. In all shoot-offs, shooters are required to shoot a minimum of 5 targets. At the completion of the 5 targets, Jack Clerke (Lilydale High School) had shot all 5 and claimed the Overall State title and almost forgot he had

The following weekend was my annual October pilgrimage to Wagga to assist the NSWCTA with the running of their State Trap Carnival and the last weekend started with a School Student Shoot at Melbourne Gun Club on the Friday and then centered firmly on the TV as the annual Bathurst motor racing extravaganza unfolded.

NSW Trap Carnival

I usually enjoy the NSW Trap Carnival and this year was no exception. For a start I had nice weather for the trip over on Friday and back on Tuesday. This is especially important for me as my most direct route to Wagga is over the top of Mount Hotham and fitting and driving on snow chains is never much fun. The good weather continued on Saturday, Sunday and Monday morning but blew up a bit in the afternoon which probably harmed their chances in the State Postal Team Shoot. The first day was Saturday which saw the Double Rise, Opening Ceremony and Handicap, all of which went pretty much to plan. The

opening ceremony included their Hall of Fame which saw two more legends of the sport inducted, Tommy Turner and Johnnie Sleightholme.

Good Targets make for Good Scores

The Double Rise illustrated both the excellent quality of the targets and their superb presentation, when three possibles and four 49s shot off for the event. Tommy Turner showed why he was about to be inducted into the Hall of Fame by winning the event with a perfect 60/60. Victoria got into the act in the afternoon with their junior team, when young James Hayden won the Handicap, which was a pretty good effort off 21 metres. As a reward he'll now have to go home and learn to shoot off 23. Probably the most impressive thing I saw that day was also in the Handicap when some "Old Stiff" with pictures drawn on him (who seemed to answer to "Pop") shot the 50 off 25 metres and only pulled one second. It's no wonder he was runner-up at the Grand American one year or that I used to grab him for my 2-man team partner every chance I got!

Sunday was either "Record Day" or "Heartbreak Day" depending on your frame of reference. I'm pretty sure that 150 in the Single Barrel and 778 in the Double Barrel are both new record winning scores for NSW State Titles, so obviously Brad Henshall and Daryl Stevens were pretty stoked. But stop for a minute and spare a thought for the runners-up, Terry

Walls and Johnnie Sleightholme. When you shoot more than anyone else has ever had to, and still can't "get a guernsey" it can be downright depressing. I can absolutely empathise with both of them from personal experience.

Sometimes you Gotta Wonder!

At the 1992 World Skeet Shoot, after losing the 28 gauge event to the great Wayne Mayes in the fourth round of the shoot-off, Robert (Mr Skeet) Paxton told me I should take consolation in the fact that I now held the World Record for the highest losing score ever in that particular event. Obviously I could find no solace in that obscure point at that time and my suffering was in no way lessened by the fact that I had already been runner-up in the 12 gauge event two nights earlier (for the third time), or that I had also been runner-up in the Doubles event the

night before that. Not surprisingly I decided right there and then, that if there really was a Skeet God, then he/she either had a warped sense of humour or a mean streak about a foot wide! I don't mind copping my fair share of floggings but surely there should be some sort of "bag limit" on that type of thing.

Winding it up

Monday saw us tidy up the Carnival with Matty Stokes putting on another fantastic single barrel shooting display to win the Points Score event. Unfortunately it was Dan Power's turn to shoot over 100 first barrels and still not cut the mustard. He eventually pulled a second on his 104th target, much to Matt's relief. The shoot-off for Team High Gun was the only short one of the weekend when my old mate Johnny Maxwell doubled his first target, allowing Arthur Turner to add another one to his enormous pile of Red Ribbons. John's early demise may well be a reflection of the undeserved grief he received from the Shoot Marshall all weekend, for which I again unreservedly and humbly apologise. Nathan McDonnell proved to be the quiet achiever all weekend, easing home only three points down to take out the Big One, which was two points clear of the field.

I thought that the program combining 10 DTL, 10 Skeet and 10 Sporting was brilliant, as it catered for kids from all shooting backgrounds. As it's proposed to become an annual event, I would strongly encourage all ACTA shooters to push for and encourage School Shooting Programs

A New Focus

Now that my own personal competitive and administrative endeavours are beginning to wind down, I am looking forward to having more time to devote to my role as ACTA Historian, to build upon the great work initiated by Mark McInnes. Most of this involves countless hours of poring through old copies of the CTSN trying to find obscure and well hidden data from bygone day. Just ask my good mate "Davo" who was once foolish enough to offer to help me with this. A rash decision that I have made very sure he has come to regret. Although Jimmy Shepherd put an enormous amount of time and effort recently into digitising the archives of the CTSN, nothing beats a hard copy for serious research. With that in mind I am looking to try to fill in the last of the gaps in my own CTSN collection.

Sizes and Colours

The CTSN has two distinct variations. Since December 1969 it has been the A4 magazine we enjoy today. Editions prior to this are a smaller version and are commonly referred to as "The Little Red Books". Technically the first 32 issues, starting in September 1947, were actually blue, the next three issues strangely enough were brown and the first "true" Little RED Book was Volume 4 No 1 of October 1950. After this they remained almost unchanged for the next nineteen years, until we went to the larger current version.

Help Wanted – Please!

Of the about 540 A4 editions printed so far, I have all bar eight. Working backwards they are Oct 77, Mar 74, April, May, June & July of 73 and Feb & Dec of 71. If you have a copy of any of these editions you could spare I would be most appreciative. In relation to the Little Red Books, for the first four years from Sep 47 to Sep 51, I only have about 50% of these and would be grateful for anything from that era. For the next 18 years up until just after "A man named Armstrong walked upon the Moon" I am only missing three. They are Apr 58 and Aug & Sep of 66. Obviously I would be grateful for any of these.

Little Red Orphanage

Having said all that, as any Little Red Book is now at least 45 years old, I see them as "Historic Treasures" and I believe it would

be sacrilege to have any of them end up as landfill. On that basis, if you have any that need a good home, just pack them up and send them off to me and I will make sure they are preserved. On the flip side of that, as I already have a fair stack of extra copies, if you are looking to shore up holes in your own private collection, feel free to contact me and I'll try to help you. Since Jimmy Ellis did it in 1975 only one other

person has managed to win the National Double Barrel with a score of less than 100 and that was Larry Dimasi in 1982. Ironically the Runner-up on both these occasions was the same person, Sydney's premier vegetable wholesaler and my old mate, Barry Kable. However in

inauspicious performances, Barry also managed to win the event in 1976 (along with the Overall High Gun) with a score of 141. Additionally Barry may be the last person to have held both the Australian and New Zealand Double Barrel titles at the same time, albeit for a short period. That's because he had also won the Double Barrel in New Zealand in 1975 and back in those days they used to hold their Nationals after ours. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Kai Whitmore from Bowral in NSW.

While we're on the subject of Runner-up at the Nationals, let's change to Skeet this month. 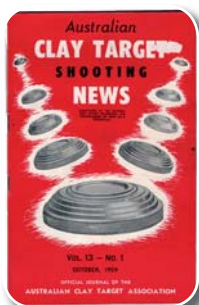

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 15 Pair (30 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Monday 5th January 2015. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. **Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.** Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hours prior to the event.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.**
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.**
11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only except Double Trap. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. **All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A. a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).**

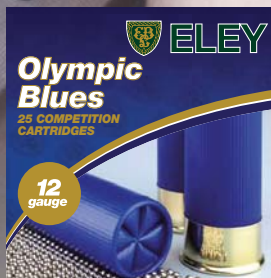

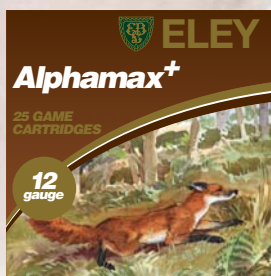

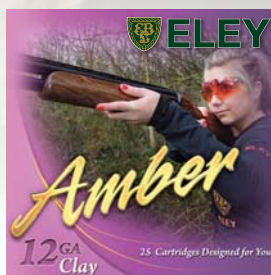

The third and final Event was a 50 target Double Barrel Championship, and after two squads of competitors all having shot a possible 50/50, it came down to Steve Atkins and Laura Woolley, both these shooters were shooting so well the spectators had no idea who was going to be the winner, but finally on her 108th target Laura just could not nail it, and when Steve hit his it was all over, Stephen Atkins having a wonderful day, succeeded in winning every event on the program, winning this Double Barrel Championship on a

A big day of 150 targets which ran smoothly all day, and ended up finishing at an early time, also indicating that there will be some good scores shot at the upcoming State Trap Titles.

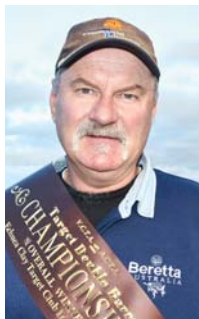

DATA ACCESS

It is pleasing to see and hear from many members accessing and updating their details on the data base. The data base is a great tool to keep up to date with news from within your State, Zone, Club and National body. As we have previously stated this rollout will take some perseverance, as we do not have the capacity to have everyone attend a training session we rely on Club Secretaries to work with us to initiate the program. The Registered shooters area is very easy to access and use, you do however need a phone contact number and email address to be activated. Note: There can only be one person per email address. If you cannot access the area it may be as simple as the wrong email address or no phone number, contact the ACTA office by ringing or just send us an email so we can update the information. We will confirm when it's done so you can access your page.

We are presently revamping the new website, bringing all of our relevant data to the new website, this will link with the tabs in "Mypage". Information can be provided to the National Office to be added to these "feeds" to pages a member can access. This will include all National events, terms and conditions, nomination forms, program details, include forms etc for State and ISSF (AISL) events.

We anticipate bringing these additions on in stages too, therefore giving us the opportunity to "walk you through" access to various features of the program.

As a Club/State Secretary you are given access to information on each member of the Association on the data base, however it is limited to ACTA number, Name, Club, Handicap, DOB, License (where available) contact number, membership status to run shoot programs or just to check information. At the conclusion of a shoot where reggrades are required the Secretary may login through the system to change handicaps therefore having an up to date data base. We strongly advise against retaining information in a shoot program as this information may not be correct the next time you open it. Always go to the ACTA data base to check the information. ALL CHANGES ARE LOGGED on each registered shooters page with who did the change, date and time. The book should also have the words (DB regrade).

We will be developing and incorporating the "Shootmaster" program on to the website in the near future which will be linked to the data base for ease of use. Frank Auditory will provide his program with the developers integrating it and with an automated handicapping system. This will be available to all ACTA Clubs at no cost to the Club or Registered shooter.

Herb was a Founding Member of the Bombala Gun Club when it commenced in the mid 1950's and rarely missed a shoot until the club ceased operation in 2006.

After farm duties, Herb's main interest and passion was shooting; initially as a youth by waging war against rabbits and later adding clay targets to the list. Herb very rarely travelled away from Bombala, other than to attend shoots at Bega & Berridale. It was often said that he could count on one hand the number of times in his 90 years that he had been to either Sydney or Melbourne and one of these was in 1974 when he successfully made the Mackintosh Team at the Melbourne DTL Nationals.

Visionary in his support of the Bombala Club, Herb instigated and funded trophies for junior shooters and never missed a working bee. Herb, along with Don Badewitz, was made a Life Member of the Bombala Gun Club and teamed with Don at the clubs last shoot in 2006 in a Deauville Doubles display that saw the last targets ever thrown both broken.

Laura just like Herb never travelled far, why go further afield she would say when I can get all the things I need here in Bombala.

Laura's claim to fame was her cooking and sewing. Afternoon teas at Bombala Gun Club were a culinary extravaganza – cream sponges 8" tall, ginger fluffs, cream puffs, apple slices, jam rolls and plum puddings and rich fruit cakes for Christmas – never a bought item – all home made with pride and passion. On big shoot days Laura would rally up the other ladies and it was magnificent barbeques and roast dinners.

It never mattered how poorly a shooting score was, shooters never went home from Bombala feeling unsatisfied, Laura's afternoon tea made sure of that.

In 2006 when the Bombala Gun Club closed, Laura was given the responsibility to lower the flag for the last time; such was the respect everyone had for her contribution to the club for 50+ years.

Herb and Laura lived a simple life and were laid to rest, side by side at the Bombala Lawn Cemetery.

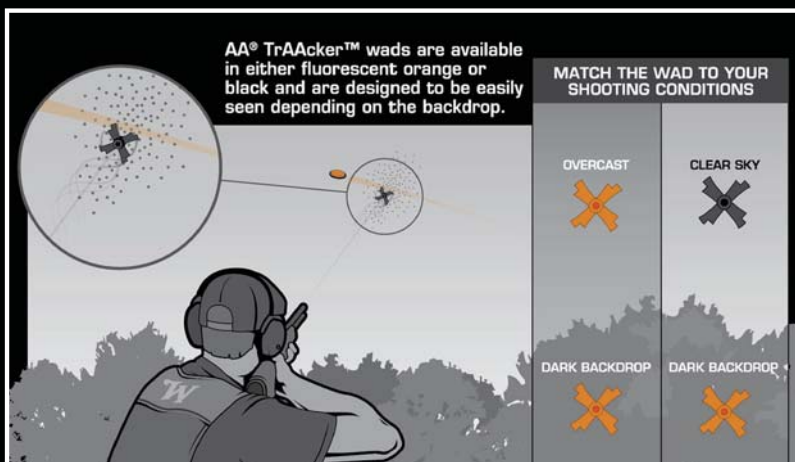
