The idea of the magazine having a 'glossy' look has already been investigated and was found to increase the printing and postage cost considerably – this would then have to be passed onto the members in annual renewals.*

I hope that you all have had the opportunity to meet the staff and see how the office operates and why some processes, just take time!*

# Executive Officer's Report

The ACTA National Office Staff are in the process of compiling information for the Annual Report and Annual General Meeting in March 2015. We are scheduled to have the Auditors from Tas Tudor and Associates at the National Office prior to the ISSF Nationals at Newcastle. The report will show a successful year in all aspects of the ACTA operation. This year's report will be produced in the same format as 2014. The AGM in 2015 will be conducted earlier than most previous meetings – Sunday the 22nd of March. This date has us all on very firm deadlines to ensure our statutory requirements are met.

With many Club Secretaries now being accessible via email we should be able to email copies of the report within the time frame required.

The ACTA Executive recently had members of the Business and the High Performance Units of the Australian Institute of Sport address our meeting in Melbourne. Mr. Andrew Pratley and Mr. James Ceely delivered presentations on High Performance and Governance and Business Development. Both men gave an overview of their specific roles within the AIS and National Sporting Organisations (NSO's).

There were examples of AIS staff working with NSO's to assist them in aligning themselves to best practice governance principles including: board composition, roles and powers, board processes,

governance systems, board reporting and performance, stakeholder relationship and reporting, ethical and responsible decision-making.

Whilst these principles are not mandatory at this stage, they are best practiced, something we should all be striving for to progress the Association.

Our office staff are extremely busy with registrations at the moment. I am requesting all clubs when sending renewals and new registrations through, as previously done via email or via hardcopy, that all of these come from the designated person in your Club, that is the Secretary. We as a National body need to ensure the information coming in is that approved by the Club. I have a number of Clubs not wishing to have online access for renewal to membership, until we can align all memberships. This has been granted. However, if your Club does not provide details of your Club's fees I cannot process your members. If I cannot process the members of your Club, I have no alternative other than to contact them and advise them they will need to find a new Club. This is the Club's choice. We all need to move forward with regard to technology to ensure we offer members services that are consistent with modern business practices.

# ROMA CLAY TARGET CLUB 100 Year Anniversary

21ST, 22ND & 23RD NOVEMBER 2014



A BIG congratulation to the Roma Clay Target Club Inc. on its 100th anniversary. This 1 in 100 year celebration was a tremendous success. The three day carnival was held over Friday 21st, Saturday 22nd and Sunday 23rd November 2014. More than 310 shooters and their families attended the festivities from across Australia for this unique occasion, travelling from as far as Geraldton WA, Melbourne Vic, and Darwin NT. With over \$55,000 in cash and prizes offered throughout the weekend events and topped off with a celebratory dinner party on the Saturday night. The festivities continued on target late into the night with live entertainment by 'Buckshot' on the 'Stratco' deck coupled with a historic side-by-side novelty competition with shooters dressing in period costume. The 100th year celebration combined with Roma's hospitality was definitely a once in a lifetime experience.

The conditions over the week-end were in a word 'Hot' with regards to both the weather and competition scores. The daytime temperature exceeded 40°C on all days with clouds rolling in late each afternoon. The targets were clear and consistent aided by the enviable background from the Roma layouts.

The weekend was one of the highest scoring carnivals even held at Roma Clay Target Club with record 'break' badge requests and 'possibles' achieved. Within the 'Western Auger Drilling' 50 Target Double Barrel Championship event 86 'possibles' were achieved and 45 'possibles'





in the highly anticipated 30 Target 'Beretta' Handicap where Beretta had generously sponsored a new 692 as the trophy. After a nail-biting shoot-off in the handicap event the local Roma member Gareth Graham proved triumphant shooting 127/127 with Dean Cusack in 2nd with 126/127. In the 50T Double Barrel Championship the overall winner was George Barton with a

Points Score. The successful side-by-side novelty night event had 114 shooters dust off their side-by-sides with Byron Hewitt the overall winner shooting 32/32. Equally important, judged the most authentic period dress for this event was Geoff Bryant and Veronika Forsythe, as an ANZAC couple.

The high scores continued throughout the last day of the carnival with 31 'possibles' achieved in the 'Australian Trade Management' 30 Target Cash Handicap and 49 'possibles' in the challenging 'Australian DST' 50 Target State Continental Championship. The overall winner in the second handicap event for the week-

championship was Bruce Powell with 153 clean and Jessica Robb was the overall ladies winner with 124/125.

Roma Clay Target Club (RCTC) is one of the leading clay target clubs

in Australia. Boasting 16 Down The Line (DTL) layouts and 4 skeet layouts, the club is one of 3 clay target clubs in Australia to host the ACTA National DTL championships and is home to the Queensland Clay Target Association Hall of Fame and museum. In addition, Roma caters for both pistol and rifle disciplines with a 50 metre pistol range and 100 metre rifle range. The club complex includes a fully licenced bar and modern fully catered function room hosting up to 250 seated guests for all occasions including weddings, parties, trade days and conferences, with a fully secured children's playground including play equipment. Major upgrades have been completed during 2014 to the layout lighting and electrics with significant expansion of the caravan and camping facilities with 2 new toilet / shower blocks and an additional 33 powered sites.

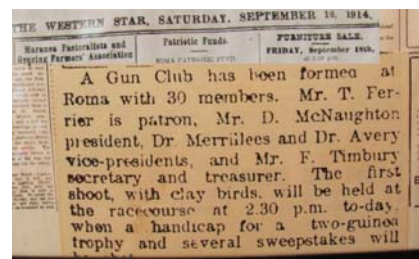
## A club rich in history

Roma Clay Target Club has a rich history within the district and came about through humble beginnings. Initially local meets were organised at the old Roma racecourse prior to World War One by the owner and local publican at the Royal Hotel using live pigeons. It was not until September 1914 the switch was made to clay targets and the Roma Gun Club officially formed, for the purpose of shooting "Clay Pigeons".

The official foundation announcement of the Roma Gun Club was

published in the Western Star within the 12th September 1914 edition of the paper. In testament to the Western Star's integral role in the community, the paper is still in circulation to this day and participated in this 1 in 100 year milestone with a feature article on the Club and its members.

Shortly after commencement, the Roma Gun Club shot at various grounds, at sports days, race days etc. similar to a travelling circus. The club went into recession during World War Two.

The club was reformed in 1948 by a local Roma producer - the late Keith Cameron with events taking place at G. G. Ferriers property "Comyndale" until moving to the now old club site on the same property on three and a half acres gifted by Mr. Ferrier to the club in 1956

As membership numbers grew and

shooting success increased, the club incorporated and changed its name to Roma Clay Target Club and started to develop a profile for itself both at a state and national level. The year 1985 saw the first state carnival at the club and in 1995 the ambitious yet determined project commenced in the construction of the largest clay target club in Australia. Success was achieved in 1997 at its current location and was only made possible via the dedication and cooperation of its members combined with the generous donations by local Roma businesses and state government grants. The new facility was officially opened in March 1997 by Michael Diamond and Russell Mark.

### Fundamental part of the community

The modern Roma Clay Target Club plays a fundamental role not only for its active members but also for the local region and greater shooting community and their families. Since completion of the new grounds the club has hosted two national competitions in 1999 and 2009 with 650+ shooters and their families attending each event over 10 days. In addition, since 1985, 10 Queensland state carnivals have been held at Roma grounds.

RCTC has produced numerous successful female, male and junior shooters, from representing Australia on the international stage, to

representing Queensland in interstate competitions, to Western Zone teams within Queensland and state champions.

The local community is the heart and soul of this Club. It is currently aligned with several charities, hosting a major charity shoot every year to raise funds for the chosen charity for the township of Roma. Inviting businesses and residents to attend and compete for the prestigious Charity Shield. Furthermore, RCTC involves the local Lions Club to assist in running major shooting events and encourages the local Men's Shed to advertise and create awareness during events. The club also donates and actively encourages its visitors to donate to the Royal Flying Doctors Service.

### The future is bright

The future is exciting and promising with the club hosting the Queensland DTL state carnival in 2016, the Queensland state skeet carnival in 2017 and the National DTL Championships secured for 2019. Visitors, fellow ACTA members and new members are more than welcome with monthly club shoots and practice on Thursday afternoon/evenings. # FRANK SEARLES WINS 2014 NSWGC GOLD SOVEREIGN SXS

NEW SOUTH WALES GUN CLUB

NOVEMBER 22, 2014

The 9th Annual Gold Sovereign Shoot was held at the NSW Gun Club, Terrey Hills on the 22nd November in almost perfect weather conditions with 42 shooters attending the Young Guns and Ammunition and sponsored event.

NSWGC President Joan Robertson fired 2 shots from a 1920's Hollis box lock SxS gently loaded with black powder by Vettore Scapinello at a sporting rabbit to commence the days shoot.

A fine display of old and modern guns were exhibited in the Clubhouse from 8.30 till 10.00am with Denis & John Coaker from Dubbo winning the most original gun on exhibition with a lovely old London made William Evans side lock ejector. The gun featured beautiful rose and scroll engraving in an original case and had been owned by the family for many years.

Hugh McMaster won the best restored guns being a consecutively numbered pair of 1876 Purdey & Son, Bar In Wood hammer guns beautifully restocked by the late Jeff Slee from Bacchus Marsh and recently reproofed in England. Reportedly, the guns were owned by a Tasmanian gentleman in the late 1890's and then separately sold in the 1920's. It was not until the 1990's that the guns were reunited by the a Tasmanian collector and returned to one ownership.

A number of modern SxS were also exhibited 2 of which were stand outs, one being an exquisite Italian Bertuzzi SLE and a second, an AYA Nol deluxe SLE. Collector, Terrey Hartmann displayed the most unusual firearm being an English made bolt action side x side circa 1850's. Respected Blue Mountains gunsmith John Clapman inspected the display of guns and thought it one of the best exhibition of side by side guns he had seen.

The Gold Sovereign is a 100 target side by side competition comprising 50 sporting targets, 25 DTL targets off 15m and 25 continental targets off 18m. Competitors may use different 12g SxS guns including hammer guns in the competition. Cartridge loads are specifically limited to 28grams or 1 ounce.

The 50 target sporting layout set by director Don Jessop comprised a great mixture of targets and included rabbits, overheads, crossers and incomers. Competitors sporting scores varied from 49/50 to C graders with a 27/50.

Robin Elton and Frank Searles both shot creditable 25/25 in one of the sporting rounds. Alan Kentwell, Les King, Andrew Shacklock and Frank Searles all shot 24/25 in the 15m DTL.

The 25 target continental off 18m event is always a challenge at the end of the day with John Newton shooting a 24/25.

Frank Searles shot superbly to win the coveted gold sovereign and trophy with a 94/100 and could surely claim to be one of the country's best all round side by side shots. Talented all rounder Andrew Shacklock won the NSWGC best shot for the 4th time in 9 years with an 86/100.

Hermidale shooter Peter Boland deservedly won AA grade with a 91/100 with Singleton & Australian shooter Andrew Garvie second with 88 and Andrew Shacklock third with 86.

A grade was won by Chris Eleftheriou with 84, John Newton second 82 and Bret Cummins with 79.

B grade shooter Leslie King improved on his last years score of 83 to win B grade with 89/100 from Dubbo competitor Denis Coaker 86 with Hugh McMaster third with 82.

Upper Hunter Alan Kentwell again shot brilliantly and improved on last years score of 85 to win C grade with 86/100, followed by Geoff Lidgard with 75 and Melissa King third with 73.

Competitors have also the choice to use hammer guns whilst nominating in any of the 3 disciplines. Charlie Strike from Kerang shot an excellent 22/25 to win the 2 DTL event, Hugh McMaster a 38/50 to win the sporting section and NSWGC member Duncan Robinson 18/25 to win the continental DTL off 18m.

The Club expresses their sincere thanks to Graham Jamieson from Young Guns and Ammunition, Young for his generous sponsorship of the event. Graham, a keen shooter has a large collection of classical English guns for sale in his shop located in the main street of Young.

# 2015 National Trap Championships

## 21st March – 28th March 2015

### OFFICIAL PROGRAM

To be staged at the National Ground, Wagga Wagga,  
by the Australian Clay Target Association.

#### CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

##### Entry

Entry into the 2015 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2015 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2015 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

##### Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

##### Age Qualifications

**Competitors must be over the age of 12 (NSW Firearms).**

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition. (Over 60 for Mackintosh)

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

##### Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

##### Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

##### Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

##### Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their

Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

##### Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

##### Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

##### Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

##### Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) shall be \$40 plus targets at \$5 per 25 and include a contribution to the discipline fund.

##### Authority

This program shall control the 2015 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2015 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

##### Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

##### Services and Facilities

###### Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

###### Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting and our sponsors of this event.

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## Can Mindfulness Lead to the Ideal Performance State?

The past two articles have focused on mindfulness: that special way of paying attention

that can help with how you cope with everyday life or deal with tough times, and there are great benefits for your physical and mental health.

Being in a state of mindfulness has lots of parallels with 'being in the zone.'

When I work with the Southern Sports Academy, there is a common question asked by athletes and coaches alike: How we can get into the 'zone'? Shooters are also keen to ask this question, because when it has happened everything appears to be perfect, it is like you cannot miss. Once you have experienced it, it becomes necessary to experience it again and again. The concept of being in the 'zone' or 'the flow', is widely discussed in the sport psychology literature is a state that many athletes strive to achieve but cannot achieve it over and over again.

The research and literature tells us there are eight mental and physical conditions that have been identified by athletes as being characteristics of the feelings they have at those moments when they are doing something extraordinarily well;

1. Being mentally relaxed or in a state of inner calm. Sometimes this can be described as the sense of time being slowed down and having a high degree of concentration.
2. Being physically relaxed so that muscles feel loose and fluid.
3. Confident /optimistic; feelings of self-confidence, being optimistic and positive about our own performance. This is very important during challenging times within the competition.
4. Focused on the present. Shooting is a here and now sport and we feel a sense of harmony when the body and mind is able to work as one unit. So in order for the body to perform in the here and now, our minds must also be in the here and now. This means shooting this target and not the one missed (in the past) or not the ones in the shoot off (in the future). By controlling the thoughts about the future and the past the body can perform automatically without conscious or deliberate mental effort.
5. Highly energized. A high-energy state is frequently described as feelings of joy, ecstasy, intensity or being 'hot'.
6. Extraordinary awareness: A state of mind that allows the athlete to be acutely aware of their bodies and of those around them.
7. In control. The body and mind seem to do automatically what is right without the need to exert or impose control. Or to think consciously about what you are doing. It is like you are on autopilot.
8. In the cocoon. This involves feelings of detachment from the external environment and any potential distractions, where the athlete has complete access to one's powers and skills.

The eight qualities listed above are those that are evident when athletes reach peak performance. But there is a difference between being a very good club competitor and being a national champion. Williams (1993) continues and describes a psychological construct referred to as flow. Flow was defined by Csikszentmihalyi when the challenge equals skill level,

when one knows what to do, one has clear goals, deep concentration, a sense of being in control, and a sense of loss of time; and the activity becomes automatic.

What is listed above is what we would all like to achieve, all the time, and if I knew the secret of how to continually achieve it, I wouldn't have to work again. Being in the 'zone' is just a by-product of reaching your Ideal Performance State. Mark Brownlee uses the term, Ideal Performance State, because it is less ambiguous than the 'zone'.

Brownlee argues that focusing on being in the 'zone' is fraught with problems. Firstly, that even though trying to do several things at once is desirable, it actually creates distractions and disrupts performance. Secondly, we should always be aiming for peak or perfect performances. Because peak performances are rare, expecting perfection leads to worry and frustration that deprives us of the enjoyment and motivation that is required to overcome difficulties and improve our skills. Finally, Brownlee talks about mindfulness. Mindfulness is the opposite of multitasking and means focusing your attention so that you are absorbed in the activity to the exclusion of everything else.

Now, armed with the information that Csikszentmihalyi believes is apparent for peak performances, Brownlee has put together the mental and physical attributes that result in consistently high performance in sport. To experience the Ideal Performance State the shooter must be;

1. Focused in the present: in the moment.
2. Breathing properly and relaxed, with the right level of muscle tension.
3. Energized and alert: being in a sense of calm-alertness or serene intensity.
4. Free of self-consciousness and ego: not worrying about others.
5. Confident: that they must feel mental and physically prepared to perform well.
6. Directing concentration and awareness only to what is needed to perform well.
7. Always using positive and instructive self talk.

As you can see Csikszentmihalyi's conditions and Brownlee's attributes are basically the same. What is different is that Brownlee sees them as mental skills that can be planned for, practiced and achieved more regularly, that make up our own "ideal performance state". Therefore practicing mindfulness, may be the path to the zone.

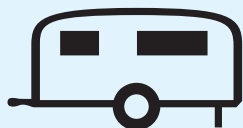
### This Month's Trivia Question

# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – TRAP NATIONALS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.  
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection as advised at the events Office with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.

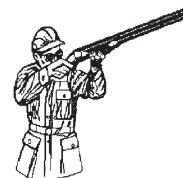

With the number of event entries at an all time high in the recent history of the Tumut club locals and helping visitors were kept busy throughout the weekend which saw almost 19 thousand targets thrown.

And now for the dilemma that success has brought to bear.

Tumut has a small home base membership of which even fewer are active nothing new about this, we are a normal ACTA Club.

We have successfully built the reputation of our Two Day Carnival to our maximum capacity, and we are hearing that we can expect more competitors next year.

Do we cut the number of event targets from 125 each day back to 100, and if we do this will shooters be prepared to travel for a 200 target weekend the reduced number of targets means less events and hence less opportunity to win is this what travelling shooters want

Do we jump the fence and build a third layout, and increase the targets thrown over the 2 days from 250 to 300 and really ramp up the weekend, our travelling shooters say they come to shoot targets 300 targets over 6 events for less than \$200 and what about those few active members will they last the journey as we say we are the normal ACTA Club, but maybe with a difference as about 75% of our active members are less than 60yrs age.

Yes we have some capital reserve, but we would really like to use that

to upgrade our existing infrastructure and keep it in A1 condition rather than stretch things beyond our capacity to successfully manage.

And maybe the solution is to jump the fence and build a temporary layout, ie one where we assemble a prefab trap-house when needed and borrow a third trap for the big weekend every year and with a trap upgrade on the cards in the next 2-3 years, the borrowing of a third trap will be short-term. Something for the members to mull over.

Returning back to our successful carnival weekend, sponsorship is a key component, great local Tumut businesses support married with excellent industry sponsorship and participant donations makes it all possible. Sponsors included Tumut Fishing Camping and Outdoor Store, R&L Withers Earthmoving, Graeme Fifield Builder, Tumut Toyota, A Murray & Sons Plumbers, Switched-on Electrical Supplies, Crampton Electrical Contractors, J & A Geotech Testing P/L, Power Ammo & Winchester Australia as well as donations of local produce for the Saturday night dinner thanks Dave Cacci for the venison and the Burt's for the strawberries.

Almost 50% of nominations received were from AA grade and by the end of the weekend after 22 shooters had been upgraded, that % had increased markedly. Our handicapper was not only busy shifting shooters up grades; also given away was 5x1m penalties after 6 shooters passed 50 without miss in the handicap event (one shooter already being on 25m).

Competitor balance was another feature of the

carnival nominations, with 13% juniors, 15% ladies and 17% veterans, which also ensured that not only were the grade competitions tough, but also that the competitions within the sections were at the highest standard. Signature event of the weekend the Snowy Mountains Ton highlighted such Overall winner local Tumut member David Crane with 261/261, Lady Winner Alex Heffernan-Power (Wagga) 206/207 and Brody Walters (Cooma) won the Juniors 184/185 whilst Veteran winner on 194/197 was Bill Hulm (June).

Tumut is renowned for good targets and tough competition and this is what top class shooters want, it's good all round, it puts our locals up against the best and this ensures that we are getting the best competitive outcomes for everyone locals and visitors alike.

2014 has entered the club book as a great competition weekend – 7 perfect qualifying rounds of 100/100 in the Snowy Mountains Ton and a further 20 returning either 98 or 99/100. The champion of champions medley consisting of 75 targets saw Narelle Cook show everyone a clean set of heels, when she was the only competitor to return a perfect 125/125.

Tumut's decision to include a handicap match which paid to 10th place in this year's carnival certainly proved worthy with 11 shooters making it a perfect 25/25 in the qualifying round and whilst low light conditions may have closed the competition earlier than what would have otherwise been the case it wasn't before 6 of the 11 had moved to 50 without miss, including one from the maximum handicap distance of 25m. Phil Wales (21m) earned himself the overall winner sash and prize pool with an unbeaten score of 56 in the failing light.

Run in conjunction with the handicap match was a club team competition wherein the best 4 scores from each club were tallied at the conclusion of the qualifying round to a total of 100. In a testa-

ment to the quality of competitors the team competition was tied at an impressive 99/100 between Bega and Wagga clubs with Yass club 3rd on 98/100.

Over the course of the carnival weekend competitor scores are added together in their quest for the coveted High Gun awards. This year the program totalled 400 points and as expected great weather and well set targets ensured scores were to a very high standard indeed.

Aaron Jones from Werribee earned the top award Overall High Gun Winner 397/400 just 3 points down for the weekend, 1 point ahead of Wagga's Rob Yeo on 396/400 who claimed the AA Grade High Gun, again 1 point ahead of fellow club members Don Power, Ben Woodhouse

and Rodney Wright and Tumut's Phil Green.

The Forest visitors Arthur Welsh won A Grade High Gun with 391/400 and Jim Zenner won C Grade after scoring 373/400 for the weekend.

B Grade was tied between Wagga's Cameron Steinmetz and Tumut's Peter Loneragan and Melissa Crane and in the determining shoot off it was Steinmetz that claimed the B Grade High Gun scoring 425/452.

Victorian visitor Wally Wombwell (Tyrendarra) earned the Veteran High Gun Award with 376/400. Alex Hefernan-Power (Wagga) won the Ladies High Gun award with 387/400, 2 points up on rivals Wendy Barton and Narelle Cook. Brody Walters (Cooma) was the best of the junior field taking the Junior High Gun award at 387/400. Full listing of result is reported in club results section.

In summing up the carnival weekend, Club Vice President David Crane paid tribute to the behind the scenes workers, those that kept the target supply in order, the volunteer referees, scorers, and scoreboard and office attendants.

He also made mention of the hard work local members Vern Rees, Bruce Mayo and Matt Gorman had done in making sure the club was presented in tip top shape, new walkways between the competition lanes, improved referee and scorers stands, landscaping and layout grooming and a fresh coat of paint on the clubhouse.

The canteen ladies Pat & Kerrie and their volunteer helpers also received a special commendation, early to arrive each morning making breakfasts for the campers and workers, providing lunches, morning and afternoon teas, and then endowing all with a tremendous 3 course dinner on Saturday evening featuring local game and produce they certainly made sure no one left Tumut hungry. Many thanks Girls.

Mr Crane concluded the carnival weekend by saying that competitors come to Tumut looking for good targets, tough competition and country hospitality and that's exactly what our Snowy Mountains Two Day Trap Carnival has once more provided. It's great to be able to showcase Tumut Clay Target Club and the region and at the same time reward our sponsor partners and competitors with a highly successful weekend, he said.

# ACTA Shooter Profile

## KEN LOWRY

### Where it all started

My keen shooter father Kelvin joined me up at Coburg Gun Club in October 1958 where I shot a Browning plain barrel auto five pogo-stick starting from 12 yards handicap.

To say I had natural talent was a gross understatement; it took me five years before I shot 50 straight.

Coburg Gun Club in those years boasted the best of the best shooters in the nation with every Saturday afternoon featuring now Hall of Famers Fred Burns, Newton Thomas, George Biggs and Jack McCraith, 1956 Olympians Clem Mudford and John Bryant plus Brian Mark, Peter Wray and Don Glover and a stack of other top performers including brilliant lady shooter and hall of famer Tim Read (Jones in the early days before she wore out then husband Bill and married Fred).

The only way in those early days I got into a shoot-off was to be the puller on the manually operated snipe traps throwing black clays that I am sure were mixed with concrete before the days of araldite otherwise they would have included that as an additional binding agent.

In those days one of my puller-trap boy jobs post shoot was to collect the many unbroken clays making sure I stepped on and crushed the many missed clays with more than 4 or 5 clean holes.

Shoot programs were almost always 10 target eye opener, 20 target common mark 16 yards, 20 target handicap and finishing up always with two-bob off the fence 27 yards.

Winning a championship sash in the late 1950's and early 1960's was a really big deal with maybe one opportunity each month.

Trap boys (and I was one) got sacked if they threw too many broken clays, the proven technique was to tap the clay on the side of the trap and listen, if it sounded solid, put it on the plate after the trap was cocked, if it made a "clack" sound, discard it, it would have broken for sure on release.

A 20 straight back then was usually treated with a polite round of applause from fellow squad members and to make anyone with nineteen straight even more nervous the referee call "last bird" (yes they were called birds in those days) with many a twentieth landing unscathed.

It wasn't until 1968 whilst I was living in Burnie Tasmania as secretary of their resurrected club that I finally started to string together respectable scores and making the Tasmanian trap team in the first ever Winchester Tournament that year brought me under the eye of Winchester Geelong management.

Smart people they were, immediately recognising both skill level, potential

and of course modesty, they gave me a sales representative position in Melbourne.

Winchester Geelong struggled then to break the almost invincible barrier of having their Winchester AA trap loads accepted by prominent ACTA shooters with the highly respected Newton Thomas plus his loyal brigade of best gun shots in Australia headed up by Warren Charlton, Pud Burgess, Doug Smith, Vin Ryan, Jim Ellis, Tim Catling and many others all in the exclusive Blue Star IMI sponsorship camp.

The long overdue Winchester ammunition breakthrough came with my first ACTA National Championship DTL win with the prestigious double barrel title in Griffith 1972.

This surprise victory (not to me) finally broke the IMI stranglehold on ACTA title wins being the first time a shooter using Winchester shotshells had won an ACTA Championship, also the first win also by a shooter using a Winchester shotgun, I was sure popular boy number one with the Winchester executive.

From a personal point of view that day, most pleasing was looking down at the top guns who had dropped out of the shoot off between 150 and 250, Pud Burgess, Sperry Marshall, Jim Ellis and Warren Charlton plus famous visiting American gunner Elgin Gates.

Incidentally my good mate Alf James won the National Single Barrel in Griffith the following day also using Winchester Australian shotshells with a then record score.

I shot in and won 1973 National Skeet title in Adelaide beating American Gerry Williams and having my then Winchester Australia boss Don McCall telling me to miss and let the visiting yank win; I must have been deaf even in those days.

Coming across from Adelaide some weekends, I somehow made 1973 Australian Trench team which went on to win the bronze medal at the World Moving Target Championships in Melbourne, this was the first ever medal won by Australia shotgunners at world championship level.

The other team members were Jim Ellis, Peter Wray and Doug Smith

In 1974 won f/a at Melbourne trap nationals, runner up single barrel to Pud Burgess, runner up Champion of Champions to Vin Ryan but did make the Mackintosh team zero points down, the second ever shooter to achieve this result.

In 1974 I made the Australian team for the Switzerland World Trench Championship with Jim Ellis, Sperry Marshall and Pud Burgess, shot OK over there but got into trouble with the team manager/coach Newton Thomas because I wouldn't shoot the provided UK manufactured IMI ammunition, neither would Sperry Marshall.

1975, won the ACTA High Gun at the Launceston Trap Nationals beating my then arch-enemy IMI sponsored Jim Ellis in the shoot-off and received the Presentation-FN Browning (which I still have), up until then all I could beat Jim at was euchre.

Back when I started shooting clays in 1958 at the age of 16 my only dream was to win the blue ribbon national double barrel title and to win the ACTA High Gun Browning so I reckon I relaxed a bit after that.

1976, won the ACTA Skeet title for the second time in Perth.

1978, won the ACTA National Points Score in Brisbane, also won the ACTA High Gun Browning for a second time but in those years there was a rule that you couldn't take the Browning gun for a second time so I begrudgingly handed it over to the runner-up Doug Smith after the ACTA Executive had to use a crowbar to prize my fingers off.

1979, not sure how but won the ACTA Skeet title for a third time in Adelaide.

1981, won the ACTA Champion of Champions title in Melbourne.

Relocated to New Zealand end 1981, won the NZ Sparrow National Title in Hamilton 1983 and the NZ Points Score in Christchurch 1986.

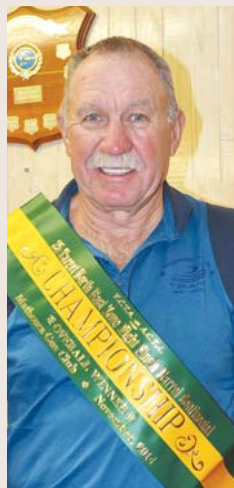
# VCTA North East Zone Night Continental Single Barrel

Event one, a 15 target Points Score Cash Divide, and two Deniliquin members managed to shoot all 15 targets with the first barrel, scoring a full 45/45, they were Bruce Cook, and Tim Maher, and for their excellent shooting they shared all the 1st place cash. Two Echuca members only used their second barrel once, ending on a 44/45 score,

## Shooter Profile— Ken Lowry

Worked in national and international marketing for Winchester Australia from end 1969 to end 1989 before retiring to live in Coffs Harbour NSW.

Looking back, I am proud to say I shot with and against the best shotgunners Australia had ever produced.

I saw the inevitable end of live pigeon shooting in Victoria in 1956, I watched legends like Donald Mackintosh at the very end of their careers, and I was the "puller" for Mr Mackintosh on his eightieth birthday at Coburg Gun Club.

I watched in awe as Newton Thomas dug deep to shoot 300/300 in the 1978 Adelaide Mackintosh shoot after he had to shoot-off for the thirtieth position, the most courageous exhibition I ever witnessed.

I stood in awe as a spectator at 1965 Australian Gun Club in Burwood Victoria as Warren Charlton won half the ACTA titles that year in a simply sensational performance.

I watched the emergence of super-stars like Jim Ellis who hitch hiked from Finlay NSW to Perth for the 1970 Nationals and shot the pants off everyone, wearing thongs and using a field grade Miroku.

I told Winchester over there that I reckoned Jim was a one-national wonder; he sure made me eat my words on too many occasions after that.

Bill Iles came across from Flinders Island to Melbourne and shot his way into ACTA history books around the time I finally started to string a few breaks together in the mid-1960's, he was fantastic then and just kept getting better and is still a threat in every event he enters.

And what about the magic duo Russell Mark and Michael Diamond, I could beat them easily when I was shooting at my best but then again Russell was still at primary school and Michael was crawling around in nappies.

And Adrian Cousens, I watched him win his first skeet national title in Melbourne in 1981 where he broke the national record for the longest acceptance speech.

And who was the best of the best in those early shooting days, my vote goes to Fred Burns who could shoot virtually every discipline, never close to being equalled until Bill Iles really hit his straps 20 years later.

Bill might have lacked the social decorum of most of the famous shooters of the past 50 years but his determination, concentration and killer-instinct was second to none, proud to say he was then and still is a mate of mine.

No Aussie shooter has ever terrorised our Kiwi counterparts across the ditch more than Bill Iles did on his many visits to their nationals, especially when he was accompanied by his recently deceased yank friend Leo Harrison who could quite easily wear the crown as the best clay shooter the world has ever seen.

# ACTA NEWS

## OPEN LETTER TO ALL MEMBERS

We at the ACTA realise the majority of our members are very diligent when it comes to the storage and security of their firearms. With the attached story from the ABC in relation to the safe storage & security of firearms this is a timely reminder of the things that can go wrong, innocently placing a photo or post on Social Media can have far reaching ramifications.

We as an organisation wish to reiterate the message of State firearms branches and police when we ask that all members ensure the safe storage of their firearms both at home and in transit. The more discreet you maintain a firearm the less likelihood you have of being targeted. Whilst nationally firearms laws vary, all members should be aware of safe storage requirements in their State as well as States they visit. Each State has a firearms branch so members should avail themselves of the information available on those sites.

Clubs should reinforce this at shoots as a clear message in relation to our obligations in owning a firearm. By continually reinforcing this message our members will remain diligent and our clubs and members safe.

Whilst most members are extremely diligent and are reminded regularly we are still reminded of the perils of drink driving regularly, yet we still have those who continue to drink & drive. The ACTA will continue to give this message, safe gun storage is vital to our future as a sport.

## AFFILIATION

Affiliated bodies usually have a common goal and usually have specific alliances to ensure both parties retain their autonomy. That is why they are mostly of the same sport. For example the AFL have affiliated bodies, all play Aussie rules, NRL have affiliated bodies who play rugby League. There are no Rugby League clubs affiliated with the AFL and vice versa. These sports are all "football" however do not promote the other "football" codes. Their responsibilities are to the members of their "Sport".

The ACTA have recently had a number of issues with other "shooting" organisations wishing to utilise grounds, promotion and advertising through the ACTA. Whilst we have no objection to other shooting organisations conducting business, the ACTA will not be advancing their cause to the detriment of the ACTA. Should members wish to join and be members of other associations then that is their prerogative, we have no issue with members being members of other associations be they shooting, golf, tennis or any other association. We do not support, promote or advertise any of these sports although we have no particular objection to them.

## ACTA SIGNS OFF ON A NEW ANTI-DOPING POLICY FOLLOWING DISCUSSION AND CONSULTATION WITH ASADA

This Doping Policy is adopted and implemented by the Sporting administration body in accordance with ASADA's and the Sporting administration body's responsibilities under the World Anti-Doping Code, the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority Act 2006 (cth), the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority Regulations 2006 (cth) (including the National Anti-Doping scheme), and in furtherance of combined ongoing efforts to eradicate doping in sport in Australia.

This anti-doping policy contains rules governing the conditions under which sport is played. Aimed at enforcing anti-doping principles in a global and harmonised manner, they are distinct in nature from criminal and civil laws, and are not intended to be subject to or limited by any national requirements and legal standards applicable to criminal or civil proceedings. When reviewing the facts and the law of a given case, all courts, arbitral tribunals and other adjudicating bodies should be aware of and respect the distinct nature of this anti-doping policy implementing the Code as well as Australian legislation, and the fact that these rules represent the consensus of a broad spectrum of stakeholders around the world as to what is necessary to protect and ensure fair sport.

The Sporting administration body has its own Code of Conduct. This is a separate policy document that is managed and enforced by the sporting administration body and is binding on all Athletes and Athlete Support Personnel. It is a document that covers conduct issues that either do not constitute a possible anti-doping rule violation, or have occurred as a consequence of behaviour that does constitute a possible anti-doping rule violation. This separate document will enable the separate management of conduct-related issues, including public disclosure, suspension or termination of contract and consequential sanctioning.

## WARNING TO ATHLETES AND ATHLETE SUPPORT PERSONNEL

1. You are responsible for knowing what the anti-doping rule violations are.
2. You must find out which substances and methods are prohibited.
3. Ignorance is no excuse.
4. You must be aware of the rules in this Anti-Doping Policy.
5. This Anti-Doping Policy adopts the strict liability principle.
6. Athletes are responsible for anything found in their system.
7. You must be aware of the sanctions that could be applied to you in this Anti-Doping Policy.
