



In response to an earlier "President's Message" I received a reply bringing to the Executive Committee's attention the amount of lead deposited by competitors in long 'shoot-offs'. I thank the member for the email and I print it below:

"Re the President's Message in the last ACTA magazine.

I have vast respect and appreciation for the skills required to shoot 1000 straight (something I could not even dream of) but the reality is most sports have needed rule changes as the elite perform at higher and higher levels.

The elephant in the room for me is the fact that one thousand shots is approximately 28kg of an extremely dangerous and harmful metal. To a non-shooter/green/ anti-gun advocate I would think this level of deliberate

pollution to the atmosphere and environment in the name of a sport is incomprehensible in this day and age, even with our efforts to remove used lead from target grounds.

Cut down the shots and it cuts down the lead exposure in the environment. Our sport is steeped in history and tradition but we progress or we fade away."

28 kilograms per shooter! This is another reason for looking at angles/ distances/targets/lead content/etc! This issue will be placed on the agenda for the June Executive Committee to look at same and if you have any input that you believe to be important relative to this issue, please contact the National Office to ensure completeness in discussion. Again, thank you for bringing this to the attention of the Executive Committee.

At the last Executive Committee meeting a proposal was put forward to further recognise Macintosh Team members by presenting each member, in the order of qualification, a specially struck badge with the individuals "number". This idea is not new, it is used in several sports (as example cricket) to identify when members achieve international representation level. These distinctive badges will be designed and struck in the next 12 months and delivered to eligible members. Members that make the Macintosh Team for the first time in future years will be presented with their badge at the National Carnival.

There was also discussion regarding the barcoding on handicap books, these having been removed for the 2015 year. The scanner system has been used by numerous clubs until now to quickly facilitate shooter information into shoot programs. Advice is, that the new on-line registration system is web based and as a result too much information on individuals would be made available to shoot secretaries. This issue is being looked at by the developers and if at all possible will be reinitiated in the future.

Also brought to the attention of the Executive Committee was a proposal to reinitiate the "rolling percentages" for grade handicaps. After consideration within the meeting it was resolved that the current grading system stays in place with no change.

I also report to members that the Executive Committee reviewed the "Commonwealth Carnival" format. It was previously proposed to change the events to I - 5 placing's only with entry fees to be set at \$100 per event. After discussion with competition members at the last Commonwealth Carnival in Kingaroy Queensland this issue was readdressed by the Executive Committee. I can inform the membership that the carnival will be retained in its current 'graded' format with nomination costs set by the host State.

A reminder to all members that Executive Committee minutes are placed on the ACTA website for all members to view. Please go to www.claytarget.com.au to look at this and any other ACTA information.

I hope that all members are enjoying the friendship and competition that clay target brings to each of you. Remember – all shooting is good shooting!

Executive Officer's Report

The 2014 year commenced with the very sad passing of National Vice-President Mr Ron Traill. Ron was a very respected and much loved member of the Association and the sport for most of his life. Ron's contribution to the Association cannot be detailed in such a short report, needless to say we all miss Ron's contribution to the Association as a whole and particularly his knowledge of the rules (and the spirit of those rules) and the National Championships. For all those who knew Ron personally he was a gentleman in the true sense of the word and is never far from our thoughts.

Our National representation continues to be of the highest level with the National Trap team attending the World Championships in Hamilton New Zealand with great result detailed in the full World Championships report. The governing body of the International Clay Target Shooting Federation went through substantial change in 2014 with the resignation of President John McCormack of Ireland. Unfortunately John was unable to continue due to workplace legislation in Ireland. Vice President of the Association at the time Mr. Robert Nugent stepped into the breach and continues to provide leadership and direction to the ICTSF through to their next meeting in October 2015.

We welcomed to the National Executive, Mr. Malcolm Dyson from Victoria and Mr. Don Power from NSW. Both Malcolm and Don settled in very quickly immediately being active contributors' to the Association through various sub-committees and as part of the Executive Committee.

My thanks to all of the volunteers who selflessly contribute their time Clubs, Zones and State Associations. Without these people, and those on the Executive Committee who give up their time and holidays to assist this Association we would not be in the position we are today. To all of the sponsors of the "Nationals" we appreciate your support of our National Events and the competitors.

Suzy Balogh commenced in the position of Coaching Director in April 2014. Suzy has already made a powerful impact in the area of Coach Development/Accreditation as well as attending Junior Coaching camps and implementing the ACTA Academy for Nationally recognised Junior's . This is only the beginning of the rebuilding of Coaching numbers and providing a structured pathway for both Coaches and Junior athletes. I take the opportunity to thank the Management and Board of Shooting Australia for their support of the Junior program and Coach education, a very worthwhile investment that will reap rewards in the future.

The new data-base was launched in November with Clubs and State Secretaries now having greater access to membership data as required. The further development of the data-base and new website will bring the ACTA in line with the most modern sporting organisations in Australia.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the staff of the National office, it was a huge year for them as we firstly spent many hours discussing, revising and developing the template for the data-base. This process was a great deal more complicated than first thought. For us with limited knowledge of the IT requirements however a great deal of knowledge about what we required it took a great deal of patience and co-operation to get the finished product. It was a true test of their perseverance along with still performing their normal duties as required.

Our new alliance with the Media and Arts unit of Charles Sturt University has already produced dividends with coverage of the National Trap Championships in April in what were very trying conditions for them to operate. The continuation of this project will continue in 2015 with expanded coverage of events including the National ISSF Championships in January.

Open letter to all ACTA Members from ACTA President, Allan Vilcins

Over the past ten years that I have been on the Australian Clay Target Association Executive Committee, I have heard continuous complaints regarding the selection criteria for representative teams for ISSF shooting. This form of clay target shooting is commonly referred to as the "Olympic" disciplines. These complaints are from a group of shooters that predominantly shoot 'double trap' and 'ISSF trap'.

For completeness, the Federal Government introduced the Australian Shooting Association (ASA) to oversee the utilisation of Federal monies and to report back to government as to its use. This organisation later became "Australian International Shooting Limited" (AISL) – now trading under the name "Shooting Australia" (SA).

The Federal Government has a sports body reporting to the Federal Minister for Sport – this body is the Australian Sports Commission (ASC). The Australian Sports Commission oversees all sports that receive funding from Federal monies and as a result set up the organisation, Shooting Australia. All monies go to SA – not directly to the ACTA and as such are auditable by the ASC.

Enquiries made also found that the International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF) will only recognise one shooting body, Shooting Australia. Shooting Australia has five member bodies, including pistol and rifle with one being the ACTA.

Since the introduction of the ASA and AISL, selection for competitors into international events has resulted in specific requirements prior to selection. These have tightened over the years and until last year, utilised a specific score that had to be reached prior to selection to represent Australia. This was referred to as the "PQS".

A representation by the ACTA Executive Committee to Shooting Australia resulted in changes. One includes – at qualification shoots, "shoot the required score and win the event and you can represent". This is open to everyone. If the reader of this letter is a member of the ACTA and shoots a qualification score and wins the (nominated) event – they are selected. If no one does so, then Shooting Australia, mandated by the Federal Government utilises set selection criteria to choose representative shooters. This gives both a subjective and objective selection process.

I can only speak for the last ten years. During this time the Executive Committee each year has made enquiries with the Australian Sports Commission and the Australian Institute of Sport as whether the ACTA can become its own National Sporting Organisation (NSO). I have, with the Executive Officer made personal representation in Canberra to the ASC and AIS to attempt same – however with the response of a blunt "no". Their response, as at the last Executive Committee meeting held in December 2014 was again no – the only organisation that the Federal Government, ASC and AIS will recognise is Shooting Australia. They have made it distinctly clear that they will not deal with four or five separate shooting bodies. Only the one they put into place. Shooting Australia is required to report to Government through the Australian Sports Commission as to targets that they set. Shooting Australia, a "Company Limited by Guarantee", has a requirement to report to member bodies – as they do on an annual basis through their "annual report".

The last annual report of Shooting Australia submitted to the Australian Sports Commission included medals from four shooters that attended the 5 I st World Championships in Grenada, Spain. Two of these shooters excelled in junior World Championship competition / and ladies competition at a Grand Prix, conducted at the World Championships. In consultation with the Australian Sports Commission I have ascertained that they have no issue with the report and understand clearly its content. They also were aware that these medals in their own right are meritorious in their achievement and commend the winners. Again for completeness, the target set by the Australian Sports Commission for this event was Minimum 0 – Maximum I medals. Medals achieved - 4. The two medals mentioned are also included in this total.

I must also point out to members is that the ACTA is responsible for domestic competition only, this being local, State and National competition. Selection for Commonwealth Games, Olympic Games and World events is the responsibility of Shooting Australia – endorsed by the Australian Sports Commission. Selection policies adopted by Shooting Australia must comply with the rules set down by the Australian Sports Commission with policies being developed by the SA High Performance Committee. The High Performance committee is an advisory committee only and contains twelve persons – we only have one representative, who even though may argue for changes to our position gets one representative vote. The final decision is binding however on all member bodies, regardless of the decision made – voted for or against by our member. Once policies have been made by the High Performance Committee, they make recommendation to the SA Board who then forwards same to the ASC. These are then forwarded to the Commonwealth Games, Australian Olympic Commission and Paralympic Games organisation for their input and ratification, before any changes can be made to any policy.

At the last Executive Committee meeting held in December two representatives of ISSF shooters attended the meeting and made a presentation to the Executive on their belief as to how ISSF in Australia should be conducted. Not only was it an interesting and informative session, it placed a whole new perspective on how selections for international representation should be made. One of these submissions is that there should be a 'first past the post' system in place. There is merit in their submission and there are just as many arguments for as against. As a result of this submission, the Executive Committee voted to allow three co-opted members onto a newly formed sub-committee of the ACTA, being the International Shooting Committee. This committee was to include the three co-opted members and three members of the Executive Committee, allowing for a balance between administration and competitors. This however as at the time of writing this letter was deemed untenable to the group of shooters. One thing that must be remembered always is that the ISSF co-opted shooters are not Directors of the ACTA and are not responsible for decisions made. There is always under the Associations Incorporation Act, a requirement for ratification by the Directors of the Association to ensure member's interests are upheld. To allow non-Directors to make decisions on behalf of the association can be extremely damaging to the membership should civil litigation commence.

Where to now?

I ask that there be further communication to rectify ISSF issues as it is an extremely important sport to the membership of the ACTA.

This issue is over ten years in the making. One idea of the ISSF shooters was to disaffiliate with Shooting Australia and force the hand of the Australian Sports Commission. Where does that then leave our 'up and coming' shooters that may be looking towards Commonwealth, Olympic or World representation? If there is no dialogue between Shooting Australia and the ACTA, and, the Australian Sports Commission continues to refuse to recognise the ACTA as a National Sporting Organisation, this equals no selections and no funding. Therefore no overseas representation by our organisation. Think about it – no Commonwealth, Olympic or World shotgun competitor attendance by ACTA members.

I do however believe in transparency, in administration and competition. There may be a better system that complements our athletes yet fulfils the Australian Sports Commission requirements. I will always work towards an amicable resolution towards this and other ACTA issues. I hope that this can continue in the future.

I ask that this committee at least meets to discuss this matter with a view to resolve this issue to the satisfaction of ACTA members through consultation with all parties.

Unfortunately some damage has occurred as a result of social media. Some members of the ACTA may be brought before a Judicial Hearing to explain the posts they have created. Others may receive a letter outlining their poor behaviour and cautioned about future behaviour, and I am of the belief that others may be summonsed to civil proceedings. I have cautioned members numerous times of the pitfalls of social media and again warn of the dangers.

Further to this, I remind members that there are rules for all ACTA conducted competition that must be adhered to. If the rules state a clothing rule, then it will be adhered to for ACTA competition. If it states an ammunition maximum load, it will be adhered to for competition. Breach the rule and you will not be permitted to compete. Furthermore every member is reminded that at no time will the following be tolerated on any ACTA facility, by any person. Behaving in a rude, offensive, aggressive, demeaning, racist or discriminatory manner - to any person, official, volunteer or other competitor.

In other words, "play by the rules". If you don't wish to – don't attend. As always, I am open for discussion by email at president@claytarget.com. au or phone 0439584531.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Pain in the neck

Several years ago, I wrote a series of four articles that explored hypnosis and showed a range of scripts to help with relaxation, ego-strengthening and guided imagery. Not long after these articles were printed I had a number of shooters comment that they had

used the scripts to help them relax and prepare for competitions.

The scripts were from a book, "*Hypnosis and the Art of Self-Therapy*" written by Gordon Milne in 1995 and published by Lothian. The book has formed the foundations for hypnotherapeutic interventions. Hypnotherapy is very useful in treating stress, anxiety, sleep disorders, sexual dysfunctions, nailbiting, warts, and headaches. It is also useful in teaching clients the importance of relaxation and can be used to increase performance in sport and in the arts.

Recently, I had a shooter ask me about tension headaches and how they could be treated. The shooter stated that before big shoots he would develop pains in his neck through tension and he would end up with a severe headache.

Before we even look at using hypnotherapy to treat headaches and neck pain, it is essential that any physical causes are dealt with. Therefore it is important that you seek the opinion of your GP to make sure it is not caused by something more serious. Headaches and neck pain are not uncommon for shooters: ill fitting gun, dehydration, recoil, tension of the competition, etc can all lead to causing headaches and neck pain.

So, how can headaches and neck pains be treated. Firstly, it is essential that we start with the general relaxation script. I have included the script again below:

1. Gently close you eyes . . . settle back comfortably . . . feet together, hands resting on the sides of the chair or on your thighs (5).

2. Take a deep breath and hold it (5). Let go the breath and feel yourself letting go the tension as you breathe out.

3. Again . . . deep breath and hold it (5). Let go the breath and feel yourself letting go the tension as you breathe out.

4. In a moment I am going to say five relaxing phases . . . as I say each phase slowly . . . breathe in deeply . . . then as you breathe out repeat the phrase slowly . . . not aloud, just think it in your mind as you breathe out . . .

5. Letting go the tension now (5). Unwinding now, as I breathe out (5). Feeling the calm and the relaxation (5), flowing all through my mind and body (5). Relaxing all over (5)

6. Once more (repeat).

7. And I want you to notice that each time you breathe out, you become more and more completely relaxed over your whole body . . .

8. Just lake a minute taking deep breaths and saying "letting go of the tension" as you breathe out. Start now (60)

9. Good now focus your whole attention on your body where it is lying (5) Feel how comfortable it is, from your toes . . . to your scalp.

10. Just think of nothing else but how your body feels at this moment (5) If your attention wanders bring it straight back to your body's feelings (5)

II. And once more I want you to notice each time you breathe out, you become more and more completely relaxed over your whole body . . .

12. Deep breath now, and hold it (5) say to yourself as you breathe out "letting

go of the tension" (5) And now repeat this over and over for one minute, until I stop you (60)

13. Now focus your attention on your legs . . . from your toes to your thighs . . . just let it happen on its own . . . first your toes . . . and a nice, calm, soothing relaxed feeling is beginning in your toes . . . and moving into your feet (5)

14. from you feet, past your ankles . . . into your legs (5) past your knees . . . into your thighs (10)

15. a numb, heavy wooden like feeling is moving up from your toes . . . into your feet (5), past your ankles and into your legs . . . and into your thighs (5)

16. just let all those muscles in your legs go completely limp, relaxed and numb (5) – the same sort of feeling you get if you sit cross legged for very long (5) a numb heavy wooden like feeling . . . your legs are so heavy they are sinking right down where you are resting (10)

17. Now I want you to notice the same feeling moving from your thighs into your body . . .into your abdomen (5), into your chest v, your back (5). Just let all those muscles in your chest, your back, and your abdomen go completely limp and relaxed (10)

18. It may be a very heavy, numb feeling . . . or a floating feeling . . . or it may be a heavy and a floating feeling (5) Your subconscious mind will decide which feeling you should have (10). Good.

19. Now think of your face and forehead (5), and feel your face and forehead smooth out with relaxation (5) as the tension flows out . . . and the relaxation flows in to take its place. (10)

20. The muscles around your eyes (5) and around your mouth (5) – let them relax(10)And let the muscles in your jaw feel limp and loose as your lips part slightly as the tension lets go. (10)

21. The relaxation spreads from your forehead (5), through your scalp (5), to the back of your neck, where so much tension gathers . . . and feel the back of your neck go limp and soft and loose as the muscles let go and the tension flows out. (10)

22. The shoulder muscles too . . . let them go limp (5)That numb wooden like feeling spreading down your arms from your shoulders to your fingers . . . your arms feel like dead weights where they are resting (5), so much you doubt whether you could move them . . . but you don't want to move them (5), A heavy detached feeling is in your arms . . . as if you've been sleeping on them (10).

23. Now I'm going to count from 1 to 20 . . . and as I count . . . each time I count . . . I want you to let yourself sink more and more deeply into this nice relaxed state. . .

 24.
 1... deeper and deeper... 2... more and more calmly relaxed ...

 3... nicely, deeply now ... 4... 5... sinking deeper and deeper ... 6...

 7... 8... 9... 10... half way there ... so relaxed that nothing can disturb you ... 11... 12... 13... 14... 15... going down to a deeper, tranquil state of mind ... 16... 17... 18... 19... 20...

25. Completely relaxed now . . . eyes so heavy you don't think you can open them . . . just feel your whole body thoroughly and completely relaxed, its so calm, so peaceful to remain in this nice, relaxed state.

26. Just remain in this nice, quiet state until I speak to you again. (60)

So now that you are in a deep state of relaxation, the next step would be to do some goal specific scripts such as ego-strengthening exercises or sport specific imagery. The script for tension head aches and neck pain follows:

1. As the muscles of my head and neck continue to relax more and more they feel warm and comfortable.... As the tension flows out and the relaxation flows in to take it's place (5)

2. I can feel the muscles relaxing in my neck and scalp, warm and comfortable (5)

3. And maybe I can see the inside of my neck and and scalp... and see as I feel the muscles...pink and warm and comfortable (5)

4. Repeat once and then move to the dehypnotiing script.

Dehypnotising script: In a few moments I'm going to count backwards from 20 to 1. As I do you will gradually return to your normal state feeling... losing

numbness, heaviness, or any other unusual feeling . . . your mind will return to it's normal alert contact with the outside world . . . On the count of 3 your eyes will begin to open . . . on the count of 1 your eyes will be wide open and you will feel GOOD . . . calm, relaxed, and confident. Ready now . . . 20, 19, 18, etc . . . 3, 2, 1. Feel good now calm and alert.

The other effective way to deal with a pain in the neck is to have a massage.

So my only appearance at a Gun Club over the entire festive period was at Frankston for their monthly Skeet Shoot where a very strong field saw a six way shoot-off of 99s and I managed to run last. This year will mark the third holding of this unique event where we shoot nothing but Skeet Doubles for the whole three days. After a couple of months I'll publish the known history in the CTSN and then see whatever else comes out of the woodwork.

And Again

Now that we've broken the ice with the Skeet Doubles, where are we with the National Skeet Long Run Record for the 20 gauge? Probably in just about the same boat up the same creek and still short of a paddle! I'm sure that Leigh Roberts' fantastic effort of 438 straight at last year's Skeet Nationals would stand him in pretty good stead to be the current holder. I'm also pretty sure that Leigh would have taken the baton from Gil Farish who established a break of 322 at the Skeet Nationals in 2008. Fast rewind back to 1999 when I won the first National 20 gauge

with the only 100 and consequently probably established the record at that point. So the \$64 question is: What happened during the ensuing nine years up until Gil set the World on fire? I have no idea and would be most appreciative of any information or leads that help us try to track the timeline of this

event as well. As with the Skeet Doubles I'll wait a couple of months to see what surfaces and then publish the known history in the CTSN.

The End Product

The desired outcome for both these projects is to bring them into line with the 12 gauge and have a similar plaque for each of the events residing in the Trophy Cabinet at the National Office. These plaques would contain the timeline for each record and detail the various names, places and



relevant to each one. Once we believe that the history of each one is as concise as it can be I would be appreciative of offers from interested people to commission and donate the various plaques to the ACTA. So if you have any interest

scores that are

at all in the preservation of this type of historic information, this would be as good a time as any to stand up and be counted.

State Records

Record plaque

While I'm on a roll with records and the history thereof, I might as well forge on. I was browsing through the December 1983 edition of the CTSN recently and on page 23 stumbled upon a request for information on State and National Long Break Records. I wonder what ever came of that request as the records at the National Office are still fairly minimal in relation to these matters. Also about twelve months ago I printed a request in this column for any information on the current and previous holders of the State Skeet Long Break Record in each State. So far very little information has come to light. Surely there are people out there who know or can remember these things and I would suggest to you that now is the hour to get off your backside and help me amass and collate these very important parts of our history before they are lost in the annals of time. Victoria would probably be the easiest to construct so maybe I'll start with a preliminary list of that one next month and see if I can't get the ball rolling.

More Pleasant Surprises

Back in the December issue I asked for some very difficult help: The procurement of a small number of old/ancient issues of the CTSN in order to fill the few remaining blanks in my magazine collection. Due to the enormity of the task I wasn't holding my breath so I was very pleasantly surprised to receive two of these rare volumes in the mail. If you are considering helping me with this please cross August and September of 1966 off your list and thank you very much Warren Charlton for parting with these historic gems.

The person who has amassed the largest collection of runner-up titles from the Australian and New Zealand National Championships is that famous "fang maker" from Tongala in Victoria, Steven J Atkins Esquire. President of the Echuca

Young Mick (he was all of fourteen at the time) kicked off his Silver Australia Badge collection with THREE that year. As well as the Overall High Gun he also won the Double Barrel and the Macintosh High Gun.

Mixed bag of events at Echuca

January 2015 at the Echuca Clay Target Club was a thought provoking shoot for most of the competitors that arrived as it was a mixture of Skeet, Ball Trap, Handicap, and Double Barrel Trap, and although the office staff thought that the shooters would be very choosey as to selection, it was almost the opposite, with almost all shooters electing to shoot the whole program.

An early start, and ideal shooting conditions, ensured an early finish for the good roll up of competitors, and the 50 target Graded Trophy Skeet started almost on time with the advertised start, and visiting shooter L Roberts demonstrated how it is done, being the only one able to down all 50 targets, giving him the Overall Winner Title, and also 1st place in AA Grade. Todd Pickering shot a 49/50 earning him the 2nd placing in AA Grade. Craig Scott an Echuca member shot a 48/50 and that score gave him the 1st in A Grade trophy, Peter Finn scored 45/50 earning him the 2nd placing in A Grade. B Grade 1st was taken by another Echuca member, retiring Treasurer Peter Sing, Peter scored a 47/50 for his win. B Grade 2nd on a 43/50 was another Echuca member Geoff Ervin. C grade 1st was collected by Bendigo's Peter Beaman scoring an excellent 49/50, obviously looking to rise in the grading ranks, and finally Barry Bloodworth on a 38/50 won the 2nd in C Grade trophy.

A 30 target Ball Trap Championship was next on the agenda and Echuca shooters featured prominently in the event with Craig Fitzgerald only dropping one target in this difficult discipline to claim the Overall Winner's Sash and the 1st in AA Grade trophy with his excellent score of 29/30, Steve Atkins just one target further down claiming 2nd in AA Grade on 28/30. After a one target shoot off Peter Beaman put his hand up to claim 1st in A Grade on a score of 28/31, Echuca's Drew Healey, on a 27/31 result claimed 2nd in A Grade, B Grade 1st was Geoff Palmer 27/31, B 2nd Craig Scott 26/31. C Grade 1st was L Piastri 26/30, and C 2nd was G Hogan 22/30.

A 30 target Handicap was next and it needed just 4 targets of shoot off to deliver all four placing's. First place was claimed by Peter Beaman, having a wonderful day out, Peter's score was an excellent 33/34, 2nd place went to Craig Scott on a 32/34, 3rd place was claimed by Echuca's Patrick Calandro 31/33, and finally 4th place went

to Echuca's Casey Fletcher on a score of 30/32.

The last event was a 30 target Double Barrel Championship. And finally, after 88 targets it was decided on the next target, with Steve Atkins shooting his 89th and claiming the Overall Winner's Sash and I st place in AA Grade, and his final opponent, Robert Godfrey, after dropping his

89th target settling for 2nd in AA Grade. A Grade 1st was M Cox 31/32, A 2nd G Fletcher 29/30, B Grade 1st John Pola 26/30, B 2nd S Scott 24/30, C Grade 1st K Comonsoli, C 2nd Julie Hogan 28/30.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – TRAP NATIONALS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- 3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 5. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection as advised at the events Office with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
- 22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.





Following is a summary of the main State expenditure items that this money is needed for:

- I To supply the uniforms for our Trap, Skeet and ISSF State representatives who attend National events, this includes Open, Ladies, Veterans and Juniors
- 2 Update & maintenance to VCTA Website
- 3 Financial allowances for our four Zones
- Purchase of Gold, Silver and Bronze medals for all State titles
- 5 Support for State and Zone Coaching and Junior Development
- 6 State Secretary's Honorarium

- 7 Rates, insurance and maintenance of State Ground
- 8 Stationery, postage and the upkeep and replacement of office and State equipment
- 9 Interest and repayments of borrowed money to finance State Ground

The State Affiliation fee has enabled the VCTA to purchase our own State Shooting Ground at Echuca. This ground will guarantee future generations of VCTA members a secure venue to be proud of, as well as being a very valuable asset for the Association.

DATA BASE

The implementation of the data base has now been completed although we are still working on some aspects of the collection of data and rationalisation of membership categories.

By the 2016 membership year we will be fully automated with member renewals. Clubs who accept payment and paper forms will be able to go into the system and update and renew these members directly in the data base. Further instructions will be provided mid-year. By submitting them online the Club Secretary can have an invoice provided by the ACTA for just the ACTA component of the annual registration. The service is no different to paying your utilities account online.

The next step to be developed will be the integration of the "Shootmaster" program into the website. This will allow an online program to enter scores and submit to the data base. The data base will then calculate handicaps and grades automatically and be connected directly to the data base. Currently we have secretaries adjusting scores both in the book and manually on line thus ensuring members details are current. Club secretaries have access to all ACTA members (limited details) to enter these people in competitions and ensure they are current members as well as being able to check handicap and grade details. With the last upgrade of the data base done in 2000 we are making up much needed ground in keeping members informed and their information secure.

MEMBER CONTACT

I wish to clarify and explain the category of membership within the ACTA and the process for bringing forward business to the ACTA Executive.

Registered shooters (individuals) are members of the ACTA by definition. They are members of Clubs, Zones (where applicable) and members of the State and National Bodies.

Members of the Association (for the purpose of voting) are the Clubs and States.

Any registered shooter, Member Zone, Club or State wishing to contact the Association for reasons other than administration (including Insurance), nominating for National events and their membership status should follow the process below.

An individual member (Registered shooter) should bring the issue to their Club for discussion, the issue may be cleared up at the Club level, if not the next step is to take the issue to a Zone meeting, should it fail to be resolved at this level it should be sent to your State (under their process) for inclusion on the agenda for their State meeting. Should the issue not be resolved a briefing paper or submission should be sent to the Executive Officer of the ACTA for referral to the appropriate Sub-Committee. The other appropriate option is to speak directly to your State appointed delegate to the ACTA (preferably with a written submission relating to the issue). The sub-committee to which the matter is referred will determine a response or recommendation to go on the Agenda for the next meeting of the National Executive. If the matter is determined to be urgent the matter will be recommended for an electronic vote on the proposal.

CTSN MAGAZINE

Through the CTSN we offer clubs the opportunity to provide information and photographs promoting their club and club events. We also provide support to promote and grow their club and the sport of clay target shooting in general. To enable the Association to do this we need your support.

Generally photographs straight from a digital camera without size reduction are best. There is no substitute for photographs taken on a reasonable quality camera but if you do use your mobile phone, ensure that the picture quality is set to HDR.

Photographs supplied of poor quality or size may not be suitable for print purposes.
