

Presidents Notes



Succession planning. It is a practice that all clubs and management should incorporate into their business plan to ensure continuity for the future of not only their club but the sport as a whole. However mention these two words at a meeting and watch everyone 'duck and dive' for the door, thinking it is an onerous task that is too much for the volunteer committee member to get involved in.

I can guarantee that the majority of clubs do not have a formal succession

plan, business plan or strategic plan for their future. However, most administrators are fantastic at doing each of these without formalising it in a document. You already do it - so formalise it!

Consider your own club. There would be talk during meetings as to what the club is going to do when traps need replacing, how money is going to be raised to purchase fittings and fixtures, and who is going to replace committee members when they retire or resign. These are all strategies for the continued development of the clubs business of providing a service to members.

Where some clubs do have an issue is when members believe that 'knowledge is power'. We have all seen club members, (and this occurs in all sports and associations), that retain the knowledge of the running and disbursement of matters that should be common knowledge to all committee members. The question asked is – 'why is it important that all committee members know what is going on'?

There are several reasons for this:

- 1. Transparency. If people are aware of something occurring then there are no issues when the matter is discussed openly and transparently;
- Shared knowledge. Committee members can freely participate and provide their own input to issues that may be more easily rectified;
- 3. Shared workload. Easier for five committee members to complete a task than one member on their own;
- 4. Members feel valued. The majority of committee members volunteer their time and when included in matters participate more freely and provide positive outcomes, and
- 5. If something happens there is a clear business path. I don't wish this upon any member, however we have all heard of the saying 'what happens if she/he is hit by a bus?'. If a committee member

needs to leave the committee, be it for health, personal reasons or other commitments, then the club can continue with clear and concise direction without needing to reinvent themselves.

Each club should look at having three formalised documents – each of which do not take long to prepare and are easily documented.

A business plan. Document what your club wants to have in place in the next one year, (to) five years, and then to ten years? What is required to continue your core business?

This includes trap replacement, ground maintenance, sponsorship, marketing, club development and any other issues that your club sees as its future business.

This plan should be readdressed on a minimum three monthly basis and rewritten every two years, updating as required. As example, it may be that the traps were believed to be replaced in three years' time and with future knowledge, this may not need to occur for five years. The planned business of the club can change direction, and focus as is required.

This also allows for future committees to see what has been done, has been planned for in future years and the direction that needs to be continued or taken. Again, no need to reinvent the whee!!

A strategic plan. What strategies is your club going to utilise to deliver the business plan? Fundraising, government grants, publicity, marketing and future club development needs to be written down rather than wasting time at meetings. Rather than at each meeting start over, have the committee (with input from members) record where the committee believes it wants to be, one, five and ten years from now. Focus can change and if so, record same and reasons why.

A succession plan. This plan includes the replacement of committee members when required. Most clubs have a Vice-President, this person usually being groomed to take over when the President retires or resigns. In other words, your club is on its way to a succession plan! However, don't just stop there, look at the size of your committee – should it be increased or decreased in size? When should this take place? These are only two suggestions – there are many more that your committee can look at to increase its effectiveness.

I can see committee members reading this document thinking to themselves, 'we don't have the time or skills to do this. We barely have time to go to meetings!' What is firstly required at club level is open and transparent conversation. Once this has occurred, the notations of members and committee input can be completed within an hour. One hour of work that provides clear direction for your club into the future! I believe it is good time spent and encourage all clubs to undertake this course of action as soon as possible.

To those that attended the DTL National Carnival I hope you all had a great time and were successful in competition. Those that are attending the Skeet National Carnival – good luck and have a great time. See you there!

Executive Officer's Report

The Australian Institute of Sport and Shooting Australia invited the ACTA to send two and up to five representatives to a planning conference in February at the Australian Institute of Sport. Executive members Rob Fox, Garry Read and former Australian Shotgun Coach Greg Chan attended the conference to assist in developing a structured sequential pathway for development of elite athletes. The ACTA have a current structured plan in place and the information provided from the conference will be to address the "transition" from the ACTA level of shooting to that controlled by Shooting Australia (ISSF Internationally). The collaboration will enhance the opportunities for shooters to progress through the ranks to complete the transition from ACTA based ISSF events to those conducted by Shooting Australia. This will complement the programs in place that allows shooter to represent their States and the ACTA Internationally in Skeet, Trap and Sporting.

This is a significant investment by the Australian Institute of Sport through Shooting Australia, coupled with the investment of the ACTA and will enhance the opportunities available to shooters.

Full details of the plan will be unveiled later in the year and be implemented from 2016. National Coaching Director Suzy Balogh has commenced leading the ACTA Academy program as well as being very active within the coaching sphere of her duties. The ACTA recently met with Shooting Australia to clearly define the role and expectation from both organisations in relation to the ISSF funding model. This role includes having SA expertise made available to the ACTA for coaching. For our part we are working with SA in the area of bridging the gap between ISSF at National and International level. Suzy will lead this program, as well as her other duties within ACTA coaching and development. The aim is to have all disciplines working towards common elite development goals.

The Executive Committee are preparing for the National Executive meeting in June. One of the biggest challenges is to take the Association forward by restructuring the organisation into an efficient organisation to drive the strategic direction of the Association. As the current structure is embedded in the constitution this will require constitutional change. Any change will require a notice of motion to be submitted to the Executive Officer prior to the AGM in 2016. Our Association must move forward with a structure that provides and reinforces strategic direction and evaluation of the organisation.

The Association has commenced the planning phase for the delivery of the 2018 World DTL Championship's, the good news is that all current sponsors have committed to the Association for Trap, Skeet and Sporting up to the World Championships. We currently have the ISSF Championships as our next target for sponsorship, we have already canvassed a number of sponsors with the view of extending or introducing them to the Association as a sponsor of the ISSF Nationals. This will be a priority of the Promotions and Championships Committee at the June meeting.

We have already had success on the ISSF World stage in 2015, this is great for the sport. Hopefully the publicity that comes with success will assist in promoting the sport and the benefits to the community. Clay target shooting is a whole of life sport and at the recent Veterans Games 1 I shooters over 80 years of age and possibly one over 90 took part. These young blokes had a great week of shooting at the national grounds.





Rule Reminder

Recently I attended a shoot where one single gun malfunction caused two decisions to be made by a referee that were completely incorrect. This is how the incident played out.

During a double barrel event, the shooter had a double discharge. We should all know that any double discharge, whether you hit the target or not is a "malfunction" and therefore a "no target", repeat the shot.

Rule 1.06 b (vi) NO TARGET "A simultaneous or near simultaneous discharge occurs, ie, from any cause both barrels are discharged together or nearly together. Simultaneous discharges shall be recorded as a malfunction."

In this instance the referee recognised the malfunction, but because the target was hit had the score recorded as one. INCORRECT.

After the shoot resumed and it was again the same shooters turn to shoot, the firearm then failed to discharge. The referee called "no target" shoot again, INCORRECT. On closer scrutiny it was found that the safety catch had been engaged due to the double discharge on the previous shot. Our rules have clearly pre-empted this scenario.

Rule 1.08 b LOST TARGET "The competitor fails to shoot because his gun is unloaded, or because the **safety was incorrectly set or jarred back**, whether from his oversight or not, or because of any other cause chargeable to his oversight or neglect

In this instance the referee, on advice, corrected his decision to "lost target".

As a referee you may feel some remorse for the shooter that had the target called lost. However we must remember that the shooter failed to check his safety catch and it is his mistake. I can be fairly certain that this will never happen again to this competitor. A good piece of advice to remember!



Historic Cars at Phillip Island

Every year at Phillip Island we celebrate notable anniversaries. Four years ago, to mark its 50th anniversary, we assembled the biggest collection of E-Type Jaguars I've ever seen. As the iconic Ford Mustang was released in early 1965, this year marks its 50th anniversary and so this classic vehicle was our feature car this year. I don't know exactly how many Mustangs we actually

had there but it was probably over 200. I had at least ten on display in the Expo Shed. Unquestionably the most famous car present was Allan Moffat's 1969 Trans-Am race car. During the five years of its racing career it managed to win 101 of the 151 races that it started, making it probably the most successful racing car in Australian Touring Car history.

State Records

Back in March I asked for any help or information at all to assist in constructing the history of the Skeet Long Break Records in each State of Australia since year dot. Although I started shooting in 1967, my recollection of these thing for the first ten or a dozen years in very sketchy as I was a struggling "grade" shooter, more intent on trying to stop my wife beating me, than on collating history. Even from the late 70s onwards my memories are fragmented as I drifted in and out of the ACTA scene for various reasons. However, I'm sure there are still a bunch of "old stiffs" out there who collectively have most of the information in their memory banks that we need to put this project together. So before you fall off the perch, please phone, e-mail or write to me, preferably before I keel over either, and share with me whatever "gems' you have, no matter how minor, in order to document this data before it's lost forever.

eral interesting questions arise from this. For a start, I wonder what the score was that Bill Delaney eclipsed in 1967 and therefore was he the first person in Australia to shoot the mythical "100 straight"? It's unlikely that anyone fits in between Dr Carroll and Roy Fallshaw as although the National Record had been increased to 131 by Billy Stevens at Ipswich in Queensland, this happened just prior to Roy's break.

A Missing Piece?

In a similar vein it is unlikely that anyone fits in the four years between George Biggs and Barney

On the first occasion he only allowed Barney to hold it overnight and on the second he only allowed me to hold it for two hours Rooke as Jimmy Ellis had bumped George's mark up at the old Canberra Gun Club only a week before Barney cut loose in Mildura. The only real possibility for an addition to the Victorian chart is the period between June 1971 and August 1976. During this time the National Record resided at the Brisbane Gun Club courtesy of Bruce Anderson from New Zealand at 189 and someone in Victoria may have exceeded 154 but not reached 189 during this time. If anyone can shed any light on that, I'd love to hear from you.

March's Trivia Question

Obviously the best way to win an event at the Nationals is to "skin" it. ie Shoot a higher score than anyone else and win it outright without having to shoot off. Until you've done it you can't even imagine how much it relieves the pressure on an otherwise stressful day. My luck at card playing is legendary and my friends never miss a chance to remind me that I shoot the same way. So I'm not the least bit embarrassed to admit that no less than thirteen of my twenty eight National Trap and Skeet titles have been obtained by this stress

free method. The next best way would be to win on the first target of the shoot-off. Unfortunately I've never been able to pull that rabbit out of the hat. In fact quite the opposite! Most of my shoot-offs have been long and grueling. The first two set new National shoot-off records thanks to John Woolley and Eugene Kavanagh, so maybe there is a Skeet God and he/she does dish out some karma after all. Anyway, from memory I don't think a one shot victory has ever happened at the Skeet Nationals.

What are the Chances?

Not so the Trap Nationals where I've been able to find at least five occasions where this has happened. By process of elimination you can discount three of the eight events being the High Gun, Double Rise and Champion of Champions, as they all have a multiple target format for the shoot-offs. Next least likely are the Double Barrel and the Handicap where a good second shot has always prevented an early demise. Which leaves the Single Barrel, Points Score and Mackintosh High Gun which are all "effectively" single barrel miss-and-out propositions and thus provide the best opportunities for a one shot victory. Most recently was only two years ago in the Mackintosh High Gun when my old mate Bryan Manns, after shooting 300x300 to qualify, decided that he would retire to the parking lot after loosing only one salvo.

Where it all Started

Fifty years earlier in 1963, Sep Stewart got the ball rolling by winning the Single Barrel on the first shot. Three years later Fred Hudson won the Points Score the same way. After this, advances in the quality of guns, shells, targets and shooting

in general made an encore seem fairly unlikely. Not so! In 1977, at the Brisbane Gun Club, the unthinkable happened and on two consecutive days only one shot was required to acquire Royal Blue Sashes. And talk about karma! On the first day of Mackintosh qualifying, Doug Smith won the Double Barrel with the "modest" score of 112. His two good mates Warren Charlton and Ken Lowry were second and third respectively and gave him quite a ribbing about getting such a "cheap" win.

What goes round

So when Warren won the Single Barrel the next day on the first target, Ken was in his element, dishing it out resoundingly to both his mates. But there's an old saying about he who laughs last and fate had a shock in store for Mrs Lowry's little boy. When he in turn won the Points Score the next day on the very first target and his two good mates were looking for him and very eager to congratulate him, I'm reliably informed that he melted away into the crowd like an ice-cream in the desert sand. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Doug Harris from Horsham in Victoria.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

How can I learn mental rehearsal

I often ask shooters to visualise, imagine or mentally rehearse something they are trying to learn or want to practise. As a teacher and a psychologist getting someone

to imagine something seems normal but it is not a skill that we are all born with. For most people we have to teach them how to visualise.

The easiest way to learn is to visualise something that is really familiar to you. For example, if I asked you to close your eyes and picture what your bedroom looks like, nearly everyone could do this because it is very familiar.

So once you can get the a picture in your mind's eye, then you can start making the images more intense, vivid and you can move on to rehearsing those situations that you want to practise.

How can I learn visualisation or mental rehearsal.

- I. Begin with 5–10 minutes of relaxation.
- 2. Describe your image. Do this in the present tense, alone or with someone asking you questions.
- 3. Use all your senses. Use your eyes, ears and touch senses by creating or recalling your image. Be aware which is your strongest sense.
- 4. Practise regularly and consistently. 5–10 minutes for 5–6 days a week.

What can I do to develop clearer images?

Sit as comfortably as possible, take a few deep breathes then imagine the following images.

- a. A sunset . . . Your gun . . . he ball coming towards you . . .
- □ Which sense are you using here?

b. Sound of a thunderstorm . . . The sound of the ball hitting the backboard of the goal . . . voice of your coach . . .

- □ Which sense are you using here?
- c. The sun on your skin . . . your gun in your hand . . .
- □ Which sense are you using here?
- □ Which of the three senses evoked the clearest images for you?

When you can see images and visualise what you would like to happen, you can use the Black Box Technique to deal with the distractions that can occur during competitions.

This technique was designed for Barbara Lynch in 1979 before she won the European 15 Trench Title. Barbara found that using this technique she was able to give each of her distractions an image and then put them in the black box.

Images that she put into the black box included other shooters kicking shells, having shell ejected in her direction, trap malfunctions, etc.

Having identified your concerns and distractions, sit quietly, close your eyes, take a deep breath and allow yourself to settle heavily into your chair as you breathe out slowly.

Imagine yourself sitting at a desk in front of a window. Look out and notice what you see, what the weather is like, what movements there may be. Then look down at the desk and notice a blank sheet of paper and a pen.

Pick up the pen and write down a complete list of those concerns and distractions you identified. As you write, see the shape of your handwriting on the page, hear the point of the pen slide over the paper, feel the weight of your upper body on your arm. If you find it easier, you can draw a picture to represent the distractions or your distracted mood. When you have finished put down the pen, fold up the paper and turn around. You see a box behind you, somewhere within reach. It may be on a shelf or on the floor. Notice how large it is, what colour it is, whether it is in the light or in the shadow. Open the lid. Then put the folded paper inside the box, close the lid and turn around, settling back into your chair and once more looking out the window.

Having done this you can open your eyes, ready to interact with those around you. However, it is important that once your session or match is over, you close your eyes again and go back to the imaginary desk, turn around, open the box, get out and unfold the paper and look to see what you wrote or drew. Sometimes it will no longer be of interest, that's fine, but if you promised to give the object attention then you should now keep that promise.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 3. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS.**
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
- 17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 18. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 19. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.





The ACTA Academy had their first camp at Cecil Park Clay Target Club directly after the Shooting Australia Youth National Championships. This camp focussed on performance profiling of the athletes, skill benchmarking and generally getting to know each other. Parents and coaches were invited along to the Camp attending coaching sessions, lecture series, workshops and the team building activities.

Guest coaches for the session were Competition Coach Paul Tattam from Moree focussing on DTL and Competition Coach Scott Wright from NSW Gun Club focussing on American Skeet.

The Camp started off on Sunday night with a visit to a local gym for a lecture from accredited pistol coach and Sports Physiologist Joe Kapitanof. Coaches and parents also attended even ending up getting involved in stretches and key exercises themselves. Fitness, strength and stability along with the need to warm up and be prepared for a days shooting were key to this session. The group then headed off for dinner and team building at Club Marconi – the aim of this was to have parents feeling comfortable about who their children will be away at camps with and also for the Athletes themselves to bond. They have become guite a knit group with regular chats and questions on the private ACTA Academy facebook page. This page has been a success in answering questions that arise and keeping everyone in the group including parents in touch.

Monday morning athletes met at the Sydney International Shooting Centre lecture room. Sessions covered expectations, diary keeping, goal setting and the introduction of skill acquisition and training patterns.

Athletes were asked to place their phones aside at the beginning of each session, just as we were starting the

day news of the siege at the Lindt shop in Martin Place came through. Several of the parents were headed into that part of the city that morning. the house burns down etc. etc. When travelling to an Olympics or Commonwealth Games a plan for 'notification' is put in place for each athlete. The athletes now have their own individual plan on how to deal with these situations.

Key team building activities were group stretches every morning prior to shooting, making lunches and doing the dishes, going ten pin bowling and at the end of the camp having a medley shoot and an 'Annie Oakley' both competitive but lots of fun.



A Performance Profile

Training patterns were discussed and then put into practice. When we learn or enhance skills our mind lays down what is called 'mental trace' – a bit

like a map to knowing how to do the skill. One of the key ways of acquiring a skill and improving it for the long term is to vary the way the skill is done, so that there are several 'maps' to choose from and the mind will choose the best fit for the task. Shooting under variable environmental conditions (light, rain, wind, heat etc.) and at variable targets (fats, slow, different colours, odd angles etc.) helps us come up with several 'maps' and is a great training technique. Also the amount of training and the repetition of the training can help in the long term acquisition of the skill.

If we mix training up with drills, variation, randomisation, blocks of the same skill and repetitive shooting the skill is likely to be better learnt and retained in the long run than just shooting round after round after round. Even shooting a different discipline once in a while will help achieve some of this – just try not to shoot a different discipline just prior to a major competition.

The ACTA Academy athletes covered technical, mental and physical components of shooting in this camp. They were each assessed and also carried out their own performance profiling allowing them to note any change in their performance over time. Nutrition, Sports psychology and recovery will be key topics when they head off to the AIS.

Aislin Jones takes Gold in ISSF Women's Skeet at Australia Cup # I

After her recent Silver Medal in January at the Australian National ISSF Championships in Newcastle, Aislin competed in the first Australia Cup for the 2015 competition calendar at the Sydney International Shooting Centre on Saturday in a field of competitors from Australia & New Zealand.

Having turned just 15 less

than a fortnight before the event, the majority of her competition in the event was 7-12 years her senior, though one competitor, Suzy Balogh – Athens Olympic Gold Medalist in Women's Trap – has been competing since before Aislin was born. Despite the seniority and experience of her opponents, Aislin went about the task ahead of her in her uniquely calm and quiet but dedicated manner. At no stage did she give any impression that she was under pressure, either in the event, or the finals.

In variable light and overcast conditions, the shooting in round 1 was challenging. Aislin shot 21/25 before equalling her personal best in the second round shooting a very credible 22/25 in the heavy rain as the weather deteriorated.

After coming third in the preliminary rounds with a new personal best total of 62/75 she went into the semi-finals as third placed shooter behind Laura Coles (Commonwealth Games Gold Medalist) on 68/75 and Chloe Tipple (NZ) on 64/75.

In the semi-final she finished equal second, putting her into a shoot off to

determine who would shoot the gold medal match with Laura Coles. Aislin out gunned Amy van Bysterveldt from New Zealand for a place in the ultimate final.

The 16 target gold medal match between Aislin & Laura was another close competition which was thrilling for the assembling crowd – a repeat of the Australian Nationals at Newcastle.

Shot as 8 pairs of crossing targets the sequence in finals differs from the main event to add to the difficulty. Complicating the final further is the introduction of two reverse pairs off stations 3 & 5, which aren't shot in the preliminary event.

Aislin & Laura went station for station shooting the first two stations without a miss, going into the third 8/8 each. After the third station they'd both dropped one target to be 11/12.

All eyes were on the pair and the audience were silent as they shot the final station. Laura Coles dropped a target in each of her final pairs to finish 13/16. Aislin followed and shot both pairs clean to the satisfaction of the onlookers.

Aislin came home to Lakes Entrance with a Gold Medal having beaten a Commonwealth Games Gold Medalist 15/16 to 13/16. In her admirable modest way, when asked by others how she'd gone, she replied with her usual, "Oh. Alright I guess." However her potential is revealed in a comment on Facebook by Russell Mark, retired 6 times Australian Olympian and multiple medalist, when he stated simply, "Great result Aislin. You're on your way. 15/16 in the Gold Medal match shows you have the X factor. Enjoy."

Her next domestic event is the South Australian State Titles in American Skeet in Adelaide on Labour Day weekend, and her next international event will be Australia Cup #2 in Brisbane in April. She is hoping to be accepted in a position on the Australian squad to attend the ISSF Youth Cup at Suhl in Germany in June although it is likely to be self funded, and may be looking for sponsors to help make that possible should she be successful.

Laetisha Scanlan Wins Silver in Acapulco, Mexico – 1st World Cup for 2015

This week (3/3/15), in Acapulco, Mexico the 1st World Cup for 2015 where competition commences. The Womens Olympic Trap was the first event and Laetisha Scanlanbecame the top scorer in the qualifying rounds with a score of 73/75 which placed her in the semi final where she was the highest scorer out of the six shooters.

Britten captures National Winchester 'Top Gun' Award

Phil Britten from the Noorat Clay Target Club in Victoria used 1250 HA $7\frac{1}{2}$ s to win his first National Championship, the Single Barrel at the recent A.C.T.A. Trap Championships held at the Melbourne Gun Club. Phil receives 4,000 shotshells for his 58 straight to capture the title.

Another first time winner at the Nationals was Tasmanian lady shooter Cheryl Arnol, who captured the Overall Ladies High Gun as well as second in the ladies section of the Double Barrel. Cheryl takes home a bonus of 1,750 shotshells for her fine efforts.

Other significant winners at the National Carnival were Keith Mules from South Australia who earned 2,000 Top Gun' target loads for his victories in the Veterans Single Barrel, Points and Overall High Gun. Glen Hayden also won 2,000 target loads for his second placing in the Double Barrel and a massive break of 748.

The National Trap Championships proved to be an outstanding success for Winchester users with six out of the seven major open titles going to Australia's leading target load manufacturer. It is always disappointing to see shooters win any of the events on offer, particularly in grade sections, with Winchester ammunition and then realise they have failed to join the 'Top Gun' award scheme. Many thousands of shotshells on offer this year at the Nationals could have been won if only a registration form was filled out prior to the event.

Particular mention must be made to two of Winchester's leading shooters in Michael Diamond and Russell Mark. Michael set a new record score for the National Double Barrel Championship with 749 straight and also collected the National Points and the Mackintosh Team High Gun. Russell became the first person to win the Grand Australian Handicap twice as well as the Overall High Gun for the week.

At the New Zealand Nationals earlier this month, Adrian Cousens established a new record in Skeet with a 479 break as well as an earlier break of 341. Adrian also won the National Championship bringing his weeks total bonus shotshells to an impressive 5,000 rounds. Les Chant won 2,500 target loads for his Single Rise win and Roger Duthie 1,500 for his Mini Target victory, Jon Whittakers also won 1,500 shotshells for his second in the Single Rise and a 420 break.
