

Presidents Notes



Board Meeting

The Association Board has met for the first time and over 25 agenda items have been dealt with.

I can't mention them all due to space restrictions but I will cover some of the major points.

Charters

Draft charters for the Board and the two sub-committees have now been finalised and will be sent to the Executive for approval.

Once approved, these will be placed on the website.

Succession

We recognise that at least one of the Vice Presidents should have aspirations of eventually serving as President so a conscious decision has been made to "groom" Mal Dyson for his eventual progression to the Presidency. This process will include Mal accompanying myself to the many meetings we have on the calendar between now and Christmas. These include meetings with the New Zealand Clay Target Association, Shooting Australia, and Senator Bridget Mackenzie who is the parliamentarian behind the Friends of Shooting group within the Federal Parliament. Mal will also be representing the ACTA as the second delegate to the International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF). It is important that Vice Presidents get introductions to officials from other countries and from the numerous other groups we liaise with. From Politicians to Sponsors, Weapons licensing Officers to Wagga Wagga Council Managers, we have a relationship with them all and many others that must retain some continuity. Much of this falls on the Executive Officer but it is important that your elected representatives also have a relationship with all stakeholders.

Social Media

I believe it would be honest and fair to say that the association involvement with Social media to date has been less than professional and of little benefit to the Association. The Executive Officer (EO) has been authorised to implement a Social Media Hub where all platforms in the Social media sphere will be managed as one. It is our intention that the hub will be managed as a post only site so that it will not degenerate into a platform for nothing but criticism and negativity. It will become the source of current news for our members across Facebook, Twitter etc.

Grounds

The last 12 months saw little development on the grounds. The next period will see completion of weather shelters over the grandstands, some drainage work, fence realignment on our western boundary with more DTL layouts, and 2 Ball traps being installed. The Wagga club has generously offered to pay for one of the machines in this installation and I thank them for this. Concrete pathway along the building carpark area is also planned. One quote has been received for perspective drawings of the proposed clubhouse/multi-purpose building and we await a second quote at the moment. My position on this development is that if it doesn't go ahead because of a groundswell against it, or because we can't fund it sensibly, or some other unavoidable reason that's acceptable, but it is not acceptable if it doesn't go ahead simply because of our inaction.

Future meeting with Shooting Australia (SA)

The Board has adopted the position that whilst we respect the position of SA being funded by the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) for the

sole purpose of winning medals at World Class events, we expect that they respect our aims of increasing attendances and membership in the Olympic disciplines. We do not feel these differing objectives need to be mutually exclusive and will be arguing this case strongly. We will also be discussing with SA our thoughts and their future intent in the areas of Legislation, Facilities, and Self-funded third spots and Training regimes. I really hope we can come away with some positives for our ISSF shooters. I must say that I hope by now those responsible should have all realised that the constant tirade of negative and sometimes insulting comments on Social media have not and will not achieve anything. We will try our best on your behalf but I think it would be in everybody's interest if the whole Facebook thing cooled down a bit, and we are given an opportunity to try some sensible negotiation.

Sporting Nationals

The Board is recommending that the event program remain unchanged until 2018 except for the addition of an extra \$10 nomination fee to go to graded cash prizes.

Skeet Nationals

The Board is recommending that some slight changes to the program will be made to allow the opening on Monday and time for the Glenn trophy to be shot in good light and treated with the respect the event deserves.

Trap Nationals

The Board is recommending that the 100 target Points event at the next 3 Nationals be shot in one visit across four traps as is the format for the ICTSF World DTL Championship which is being conducted in Australia immediately after the 2018 DTL Nationals.

New Website

The Board is fully aware of how long the launch of the new website has taken, but for the first time, yesterday the 22nd of July, the Board was able to view the new site. I am confident that by the time you are reading this it will be available to the membership and you will all appreciate the amount of work that has gone into it. A whole new fresh look for your Association. Thanks to Tony and the office staff for the work they have done on this project.

Ron Traill Memorial

The Association is currently considering what type of memorial event or project should be named in Ron's honour. The Victorian Clay Target Association (VCTA) has decided to honour Ron with their State Handicap being named after him. We are looking at naming an event, or providing a scholarship for juniors amongst other ideas. The Board has a sub-committee looking at the matter at the moment. It is hoped we will be able to make an announcement shortly. For those new to the Sport, Ron was a long time Executive Member and Vice President of the ACTA.

State Results

The Board has authorised a strongly worded letter to all States about the lack of response from them following their State Titles in all disciplines. I cannot understand why it is so difficult to provide the championship winners to the ACTA office. Without this information it is impossible for the office to keep the numerous spreadsheets required to keep our calculations for Hall of Fame points up to date. I would encourage all state councillors to take an interest in this matter as getting this information lately has been like pulling teeth.

ICTSF Sporting

It has become apparent in NSW that Weapons licensing when reviewing Range Approvals are only approving templates and ranges at ACTA clubs for events that are under our control nationally. This has recently resulted in one club being stopped from shooting a Sporting type event, even though they had conducted it for many years. The Board is pleased to announce that following the EO negotiating with the Ranges Officer of New South Wales Police Service this club can now continue to shoot a Sporting type event, other than our ACTA Sporting. Negotiations centred on the fact that the ACTA holds an affiliation with the ICTSF and we regularly attend and will in fact be hosting the ICTSF World English Sporting Championship (2019). This event and another new event "Sportstrap" have now been accepted by NSW Police Service as being under our control in Australia, giving our clubs two more choices. Both of these events are being shot in South Africa at the ICTSF World Championship in October where Australia will be represented by an Open team selected at last year's Sporting Nationals. For Rules of both events go to www.ictsf.global.

Company Limited by Guarantee

The EO is currently reviewing the requirements and compiling a draft constitution for the ACTA to move to a new governance structure, that of a Company limited by Guarantee. This is a very complex matter but so far only one major stumbling block has surfaced. The first model considered was to have clubs nominate suitably skilled persons (does not have to be your delegate) to be considered by an independent nomination committee in reference to the skill set the Sport needs to progress. The nomination committee would then rate a number of these people for an election. Their resume would then be printed in the CTSN. All clubs would then vote on the four best persons to form a Board. They would then have the power to elect their chair from amongst their number and co-opt up to 3 more independent Board members to manage our Sport.

The second model retains clubs still nominating people for consideration by the nominations committee, but the eventual vote on who would sit on the ACTA Board would be by the States, each having one vote. This will mean each state will still have equal voting power but the big difference for the Sport is that we can have anyone nominated, not just club delegates who have worked through the Zone and State bodies before becoming a National delegate, and who are expected to perform in all these positions. I cannot personally remember in recent times any instances of the large states successfully abusing their power to the detriment of the smaller states but I suppose the danger is always there. We will keep you updated on our progress in this matter.

New Clubs

I thought I would end this month with a non-Board related matter. For those of you that don't know me, I am from Roma in the Western Zone of the QCTA. Tomorrow night I will be attending our Western Zone QCTA AGM. QCTA Executive member Geoff Moore recently attended a meeting in St George to provide information to a group interested in starting a new club. Today I received a call from one of their representatives and they are coming to the meeting to apply for affiliation. Within the last month I have provided information to a group from Yaraka also interested in forming a new club. On Sunday I have been invited to address the AGM of the Roughlea Recreation Association who have contacted us about forming a club there or getting a Range approval in conjunction with the Roma Club. All of this on top of our newest Queensland club, Eumamurrin (also in the Western zone) being approved and operational in the last few months. I can't ever recall a zone anywhere with four new clubs happening almost instantaneously?

Executive Officer's Report

The Board have initiated a number of very important meetings including a meeting with the Australian Sports Commission and Shooting Australia as well as with the New Zealand Clay Target Association in the next two months.

There are numerous agenda items on the table including the process to a new Company limited by guarantee and how this will look. We have commenced work on the Constitution for the new entity as is required under the Act. Our upcoming meeting with the Sports Commission will assist us in ensuring we put in place the best possible structure in line with expected governance requirements. This will include a review of all existing policies and procedures of the Association to bring them into line with best practice and ensure all policies are current and relevant.

We are progressing the development of the National ground with two more DTL traps to go in the ground very soon as well as two ball traps. The Wagga Gun Club has agreed to pay for one trap and assist in getting the traps in the ground. The co-operation between the Club and ACTA is ensuring the development of the ground is seamless.

Engineers are being sought to provide drainage plans to ensure drainage of the ground during major events. Once these consultations have been completed the decision including timeframes and cost will be factored into the overall ground plan for the development.

It is envisaged covers will be installed over all "grandstand" seating before the first of our National events at the ground in 2016. These shelters will provide much needed cover from the sun and/or rain. Final designs are still to be confirmed, however we do have a number of options on the table.

A meeting of Rules Supervisors is to be conducted on Thursday/Friday 10th & 11th of September 2015 in Sydney. The meeting will give Rules Supervisors the opportunity to discuss specific rules as well as a number of additions to the rule book and a new improved format. Rules is an area of any sport that requires constant review. We intend making the Internet an integral component of updating rules, policies and procedures.

The ACTA has issued invitations to each State to send one Rules Supervisor with the ACTA paying the cost of attendance, the offer, should the State wish to accept, also includes sending another Rules Supervisor at the expense of the State. This meeting will enable the ACTA to review, consider and implement rules changes that will support the continuing changes in the sport.

In an article in last month's magazine I referred to shooters not being able to shoot if they did not produce their grading card. This is not a rule of shooting and is not intended to be one. The fact is the new data base can be accessed by Club and State Secretaries, the "player directory" will give you access to any member's limited details, name, club, grade and financial status. If you do not access this to check and they do not have a current grading card they must be able to prove they are a member. If you can verify they are a member through this method they are to be charged a \$20 fee under the rules.

All clubs should also be asking to see a shooters license, no matter how well you know someone. This is called due diligence. If you fail to check these basic facts and an accident occurs this could seriously impact the insurance cover you have, you need to show you have taken "all reasonable care" in conducting the business of the Club. It is important all aspects of compliance are adhered to ensuring the safety of ACTA Club members and the public as well as protecting officer bearers of the Club.



TARGET TENDERS OPEN

The Australian Clay Target Association has opened the Tender process for the supply of targets for use on the National Ground. Wagga Wagga from 2016-2018 inclusive. This includes the World DTL Championships in 2018.

Given the advances made with targets the ACTA will be considering both "standard" and "Enviro" Targets for use on the ground.

- **9.** The Association will be conducting testing in line with the selection process. Testing results and price will be provided to the Board for consideration.

If you are entering a tender we would require 2 clearly marked boxes of each of the specified targets for testing.

All tenders are to be received at the National Office marked "TARGET TENDER" & the targets be received at the National Ground by Friday the 25th September 2015.

A good roll-up of shooters at Mathoura

MATHOURA GUN CLUB **JUNE 26, 2015**

Four full squads of shooters arrived at the Mathoura Gun Club on Friday the 26th of June to compete in the evening's program. An excellent attendance really when you consider how bitterly cold the night was, still with a heater inside the clubhouse, and a fire burning outside to combat the weather, that did help the shooters to warm up between events.

In Event One, a ten target, Double Barrel Continental Cash Divide, just one possible was shot and that was Mark Vistarini, a Moulamein member, and he collected all the 1st place cash for his 10/10 effort. Several shooters managed to lose just one target all sharing the 2nd place cash, they were Clayton Easden (Num/Shepp), Tim Maher (Deniliquin), Trevor Dehne (Cohuna), John Berryman (Mathoura), and Mick Keirl (Echuca), all on a score of 9/10.

Event Two, a 30 target Points Score Championship, and again Mark Vistarini proved how well he can shoot under lights by scoring an unbeaten 84/90, collecting the Overall Winners Sash and the 1st place in A grade trophy, well shot Mark! B grade 1st was Clayton Easden having scored a 75/90, and as so often happens at Mathoura, the C Grade 1st placing outshot the B Grade winner, scoring a 76/90, and that C grade winner was Mathoura's, April Thompson.

Finally, Event Three, a 15 target, Single Barrel Cash Divide, and this time Numurkah/Shepparton member John Fothergill was the Mark Vistarini OA & Ist A PS only shooter able to down all 15 targets to collect all the 1st place cash with his admirable 15/15 score. The athletes were introduced to skill acquisition and training strategies, along with preparing tactically and mentally for competition paying particular attention to their arousal levels whilst competing (or getting into "the zone"), technical changes to stance, height on trap

house and target acquisition and timing were also focussed on. The athletes attended an ASADA (Australian Sports Anti Doping Authority) lecture tailored to shotgun athletes. Along with hands on coaching I managed to sit down with each athlete personally and assist in goal setting. benchmarking and training and competition scheduling for the next 12 months. The group was extremely fortunate to have the Stockmaker Daryl Stevens come along and ensure correct gun fit of the participants, from minor pitch issues, to lengthening and shortening stocks to tailoring grips. I personally was impressed with his stock fit knowledge and his time management allowing him to deal effectively with so many shooters in a short period of time. Thank you Daryl.

Winchester Australia sponsored the ammunition for the camp and we went through a fair few slabs - the entire group was very, very grateful for this. Thank you Chris Milligan and Winchester Australia.

We stayed at the QLD Rifle Association Belmont Range accommodation which allowed the athletes to get used to bunk rooms and dining halls as they would experience at a

Commonwealth Games, Universiades or Olympics. This venue is right next to the Brisbane Gun Club and offers good discount accommodation. The ACTA Academy is a key component of the ACTA Junior Coaching Program.

The ACTA Academy is aimed at providing a structured program for approximately 10-15 elite juniors to enhance their shooting skills, educate them in various aspects of being an elite athlete and provide 1 on 1 coaching, monitoring and mentoring so that they can be well on their way to achieving their goals. There will also be funding provided for targeted camps and competitions.

The first intake of athletes into the Academy has been this year and together we have achieved some excellent results in 2016 we will be able to consolidate the success of the ACTA Academy and junior athletes in all disciplines.

When selecting talented athletes for further development there are two ways of doing this; taking those athletes that have already risen to the top and also identifying those athletes with the potential to rise to the top. SEPTEMBER 2015

Last month I made some observations about the recently completed Skeet Nationals and offered some suggestions for improvements to the program. I had also intended to make passing reference to the Hall of Fame night but ran out of room. In addition to this, as I still get occasional queries about Hall of Fame nights in relation to how, why and what we do there, I have decided to address both issues this month.

Birth of a Brainwave

As the culmination of about twenty years of research and evolution by Mark McInnes, the Clay Target Shooters Hall of Fame concept was launched in 1999 with the creation of the NSWCTA State Hall of Fame and within five years the idea had progressed to National level. However although NSW at that time, and all the other States that have joined in since, elected to incorporate all the shooting variations into a single entity, at ACTA level it was decided that the scope of the project was large enough to separate it out into the various disciplines. Thus 2004 saw the launch of the National Trapshooters Hall of Fame and the Skeet version followed it four years later.

The Advantages of Elbow Room

As I explained a couple of months ago, qualification for induction into the various facets of the Hall of Fame is based simply on a points system derived from results at major events. Inductions at State level are usually done at the various State Carnivals at either the Opening Ceremony or during presentations. But the National versions were deemed prestigious enough to warrant special Presentation Dinners at external venues during the respective National Carnivals. This progression then provided the opportunity to expand the concept out to include several other new and innovative awards. These include such things as "Brownlow" style annual medals, the acknowledgement of the longest breaks in key events during each calendar year and recognition of career-long achievements of "milestone" accomplishments by way of Grand Slam and Masters Awards.

How and Where

Tickets for the National Hall of Fame dinners go on sale a couple of months prior to the Carnival and generally close about a week before the event. The cost so far has been able to be kept to \$50 per head which includes preliminary finger food and a three course meal. Seating is by way of multiple tables of eight to ten people. Shooters are encouraged to arrange full tables of their friends and family but individual tickets are available and the Office arranges seating as best it can. The usual venue is the Wagga RSL Club who have always done a very good job, but this year we broke with tradition and held the Skeet dinner at the Commercial Club and the smaller venue was probably more suitable for the correspondingly smaller Skeet fraternity.

Advantages of Self Help

Both dinners are quite similar, the main exception being that with the Skeet function the participants seem to be more passionate about it and get a lot more involved with the preparation and presentation. The ASSA through their website charts the Annual Long Breaks during the year and "long time Skeet guru" Glenn Clarke puts an enormous amount of time and effort into researching and

preparing the Power-Point presentation, which he then presents and orates on the night. Both things cause a tremendous reduction in the workload for the National Office which is greatly appreciated by both the Office staff and the National Executive.

Pictorial Entertainment

The order of proceedings at both Dinners is also quite similar. This year at the Commercial Club guests were invited to arrive at 6.30 for drinks, socialising and appetisers. Kick off was at 7.00 with the MC inviting the National President to provide the opening remarks. Following this Glenn presented a slide show illustrating the various highlights of the previous year which he aptly titles "The Year in Review". This was followed by a short break for Entrées during which Glenn again entertained us with another slideshow of a more candid nature he calls "People and Faces".

From Little Things . . .

Between Entree and Dinner we usually present all the various "offshoot" awards. This always starts with the Annual Long Break Awards. This year these went to Michael Buttigieg for his 12ga

Psychological Skills for Shooting

VISUALISATION AND THE BLACK BOX TECHNIQUE, REVISITED

Last month, I took advantage of the Black

Dog institute handout looking at ways to relax. Relaxation is the most effective way to deal with anxiety and fears. Relaxation forms the basis of a number of therapeutic interventions.

When we relax off the field we are able to take it one step further by including some mental imagery or visualisation. In this article, which was originally printed back in 2000 includes "The Black Box Technique" which is a visualisation techniques specifically developed for clay target shooting.

Before we start into the article, the last month has seen more gun related deaths and attacks in the USA. These events eventually lead to the newspapers having articles about gun related crime and the shock jocks and the anti-gun lobby calling for tighter gun laws. As responsible gun owners and shooters it seems we are continually justifying our sport and our ownership of firearms. So it was a delightful surprise when I went into Rose's Restaurant in Cooma in July and saw several sashes hanging just inside the entrance. The sashes were from the Cooma Field and Game and showed that several of the family members who owned the restaurant were good shots and proud of their achievements in the clay target shooting. As well as being proud of their sport they also provided excellent service and beautiful food. We worth a visit for any shooters next time you are in Cooma. Back to the subject . . .

Visualisation or mental imaging is a skill that can be used to improve performance. Visualisation, according to Syer & Connolly (1984) is the process of watching yourself, as if on a screen, in your mind's eye. Whilst you watch yourself you consciously evoke and guide daydreams, in which you appear, towards a specific end.

A number of terms are often used interchangeably with visualisation. These include mental imagery, mental rehearsal, ideomotor training, visual-motor behavioural rehearsal. Mental imaging includes auditory and kinaesthetic (feeling) components as well as visual components; therefore, if you visualise yourself moving, you may see, hear and feel yourself moving. Visualisation is the most commonly used term and for the purposes of this article I will stay with it.

Visualisation is a tool that can be used to limit self-doubt because it incorporates the language that the body understands: pictures. Muscles and the nerves that are needed to move muscles, do not understand language, therefore when we tell them what to do they tighten up because they do not understand our instruction. If however, we show them a mental picture then what is needed, it is clearer and in a form that they can use. If you had to learn golf, trap shooting or waltz, from the verbal instructions, most people would end up confused and unable to do what was expected. However, when we show the learner, what to do and better still when the task is broken up into small steps, learning is easier, understandable and more fun.

The learning process is accelerated when we visualise what we have to. The brain cannot distinguish what is real and what is imagined so if we wish to practise a skill, then doing it over and over in our mind will reinforce what we have learned and accelerate the generalisation process of the skill. It must

also be noted that the same goes for visualising faults and mistakes, so it is important that the correct skill is being visualised.

Visualisation also affects physical functioning if you visualise a physical action, state or process and your emotional functioning can be affected if you visualise an emotional state or process. Research in the 1930s demonstrated that when a person imagined tensing and relaxing a muscle group, he could influence that muscle group without doing any actual tensing or relaxing.

Visualisation can be different for different situations and Syer & Connolly draw a distinction between two classes of visualisation; Problem solving and mental rehearsal. Problem solving involves using visualisation to aid concentration, reduce anxiety and physical tension or to suggest possible courses of action. Mental rehearsal is the process of imagining yourself performing a specific movement of skill. For the trap or skeet shooter, mentally rehearsing the shot they are about to perform will quieten the mind because it has just seen the target break and therefore lets the body shoot the target with interfering with a lot of useless verbal instructions.

Black Box Technique

This technique was designed for Barbara Lynch in 1979 before she won the European 15 Trench Title. Barbara Lynch, an English shooter, sought out Connolly & Syer to develop a way that would help her deal with distractions during a competition. Barbara found that using this technique she was able to give each of her distractions an image and then put them in the black box. Images that she put into the black box included other shooters kicking shells, having shell ejected in her direction, trap malfunctions, other shooters coughing, etc.

Having identified your concerns and distractions, sit quietly, close your eyes, take a deep breath and allow yourself to settle heavily into your chair as you breathe out slowly.

Imagine yourself sitting at a desk in front of a window. Look out and notice what you see, what the weather is like, what movements there may be. Then look down at the desk and notice a blank sheet of paper and a pen. Pick up the pen and write down a complete list of those concerns and distractions you identified. As you write, see the shape of your handwriting on the page, hear the point of the pen slide over the paper, feel the weight of your upper body on your arm. If you find it easier, you can draw a picture to represent the distractions or your distracted mood. When you have finished put down the pen, fold up the paper and turn around. You see a box behind you, somewhere within reach. It may be on a shelf or on the floor. Notice how large it is, what colour it is, whether it is in the light or in the shadow. Open the lid. Then put the folded paper inside the box, close the lid and turn around, settling back into your chair and once more looking out the window.

Having done this you can open your eyes, ready to interact with those around you.

However, it is important that once your session or match is over, you close your eyes again and go back to the imaginary desk, turn around, open the box, get out and unfold the paper and look to see what you wrote or drew. Sometimes it will no longer be of interest, that's fine, but if you promised to give the object attention then you should now keep that promise.

I have found this technique useful in a variety of settings in my practise for helping children deal with bullies, manage exams, deal with issues affecting their lives (grief, etc). This technique puts you in control and reduces anxiety because the problems are now able to be dealt with.



Elva Churches

Elva Churches passed away on the 20th February 2015 aged 95 years.

Many Clay Target Shooters would remember Sid and Elva Churches proprietors of Taipan Gunshop at Edwardstown South Australia. This shop operated from 1967-1980 and was the store-front of the Taipan Projectiles manufacturing plant established in 1946. Elva was a very keen Clay Target Shooter becoming involved from around 1970. Elva

shot competitively up to about 1990, then socially to around 2005. At age 85 she told me, "I just can't pick them (Clay Targets) up anymore" but continued shooting for "clays only" for a few more years.

Elva & Sid were both keen supporters of the Clay Target movement becoming "converts", Sid first in about 1968 thanks to one Phillip Mules. They travelled all over SA and later to many interstate clubs making many new friends and reunited with many old acquaintances from the Rifle and Pistol shooting days.

Elva first took up Clay Target shooting in about 1970 and was a member of her beloved S.A.G.C. until only a few years ago. Other Clay Target Clubs that she was a member of over the years include Mallala G.C., Alexandria G.C., Southern G.C. and International G.C. Being a Life member at many.

After competing in a Car Shoot at Griffith NSW in about 1972 where there were a couple of other woman competitors, Elva came up with the idea of a Postal Shoot for woman. Elva realised that there were many woman that wanted to shoot Clay Targets, but didn't necessarily want to learn clay target shooting shoulder to shoulder with men. Postal shoots are not a new idea and Elva through her Pistol Shooting years from about 1948 to 1972 had competed in a few over that time and knew how they were run. However, in the world of Clay Target Shooting, a Postal shoot for woman was new, and she was told by more than a few blokes "that won't work"! Elva had a can do attitude which annoyed more than a few blokes over the years.

The "Taipan Ladies Shield" was born and in 1974 the first event was held. The Taipan Ladies shield was competed for from that year until about 1989. They were a great success and Elva received many letters from ladies who started shooting as a direct result of this event.

Elva was the SA State Skeet handicapper for many years in the mid-1970's, and had a reputation for being "tough but fair". Often aggrieved shooters would approach the Club President (Bob Mules) at the time to complain about Elva and her "fairness" but Bob would always say, "If you've got

a problem speak to the handicapper, not me, she doesn't cut me any slack either"!

In 1976 Sid and Elva donated to S.A.G.C. 2 Winchester White Flyer automatic clay target throwers for use on a Skeet layout at that Club. The idea being that you didn't need to hunt down trappers to load the clays, simply find a "Button Pusher" pay your practice fee and have a round of skeet. The concept at the time met with much opposition. Elva fired the first shot on station 7 to officially open the layout. A memorial Skeet Shoot in Sid's honour is held every year at S.A.G.C., and Elva attended many of these shoots up until about 2011, often presenting the awards. Now all the Skeet Fields at S.A.G.C. are automatic.

In 2012 with failing health and early onset Alzheimers disease, Elva moved to Murray House Aged care facility in Wentworth NSW. This was close by to her eldest daughter living in the area. Elva had many of her Clay Target shooting memories, photo's, sashes and beloved SAGC vest on display in her room. Elva would reminisce of those wonderful Clay Target Shooting days and friends made.

Elva and Sid often said that the Clay Target years were amongst the happiest they ever had and it was something they shared together. I would like to thank all those people that knew them, and became a part of their Clay Target friendships over the years.

Elva will be sadly missed.



NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

> (a) the licence or permit number of the seller, (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5.500.

Club coaches and administrators continue to provide the level of training and discipline required to retain a gun license, any falling down in that area could lead to severe injury. WE ALL KNOW THAT.

However we need to continue to promote the safe use of firearms at all time to the general public and Politicians.

We are investigating how to best disseminate this information into the Home of every Australian. This will be an enormous task that will be structured over a number of years to achieve what is a lofty goal.
