# Presidents Notes



### National Firearms and Weapons Working Policy Group

The Association was invited to attend a meeting in Brisbane of this Working Policy Group on Thursday the 6th August. We were notified of the meeting by telephone the Friday before and of a time, venue and agenda in writing on the Tuesday before. I attended the meeting with EO Tony Turner. The agenda advised that the meeting was to consider the recommendations from the Martin Place Siege report.

The meeting was attended by the major industry representatives, Agforce, some of the major shooting associations and representatives from the Attorney Generals Department. There were also a large group of observers present from organisations such as Border Security, Customs, State Police Weapons branches etc. Having only received the agenda two days prior the Association had little time for consultation. We adopted the position that as the criminal involved in the Martin Place siege was unlicensed, the firearm unregistered and the coroner's report yet to released, that we would strongly oppose any recommendations that would affect licensed shooters negatively.

All invited groups expressed concern at the short notice and lack of agenda detail. The meeting spent little time on the Martin Place Siege review and moved quickly to one of the recommendations from the report: "The Commonwealth, States and Territories should simplify the regulation of the legal firearms market through an update of the technical elements of the National Firearms Agreement" We verbally raised the issues of:

Differing ages for minors in each state;

Non automatic recognition of interstate licenses;

Differing transport and storage requirements;

The issue of some states now reviewing their regulations as they apply to Cat C (Semi Auto) firearms retained under the "Grandfather" clause from 1996;

Difficulties involving overseas competitors importing Cat C firearms for major events conducted in Australia.

A major issue raised by industry was that of a linked database that could bring the benefits of easier interstate sales and point of sale approval to purchase firearms of a category already held etc.

Generally I can say that all input was positive for our sport and the legal ownership of firearms. The Association has now been invited to a second meeting in Sydney on the 26th of August to put our written submission and have further consultation on issues that may affect our sport.

### ACTA Sporting National

Nominations for this event have closed with a full field for the second consecutive year, which is very pleasing. The Association will now consider ways to handle larger numbers at this growing event.

### Nationals Prizemoney - DTL, Skeet, Sporting. 2016

Although a proposal I supported, the idea that prizemoney in the form of optional pools and cheaper nominations combined would increase entries has clearly proven itself wrong. Following receipt of a proposal from the Sport Enhancement Committee chaired by Garry Read, a totally new cash prize format will now be introduced.

The Board is recommending to the Executive an increase of nominations of \$20 per event for these three Nationals in 2016, making nomination costs similar to 2010. The \$10 discount for juniors and the "First Nationals Free" for Junior's remains.

Previously when cash prizes were on all events they were calculated on actual attendance on the day, and the value of any sponsors prize would be deducted from the cash award given. The new format will allow advance advertising of the actual cash payouts that will be made for all placings and all Sponsors Prizes will be on top.

It is envisaged that the total prize value of the DTL Nat's will approach \$80,000 so make your bookings early. Prizes for the Skeet and Sporting will be based on the same system.

This is a big step for the Association to guarantee prize values, and we hope that we can increase numbers with this strategy.

### Meeting New Zealand

Meetings between ACTA and the NZCTA will take place at the end of August. These meetings are conducted at about five year intervals. Agenda items include reciprocal disciplinary measures, The Glenn series of trophies matches, including the ISSF competition, and handicapping discrepancies between the two countries. Some may wonder if these meetings are worthwhile but I can say that many worthwhile outcomes have resulted from these meetings in the past. For example the plan to restart the World DTL that had not been shot since 1948 was hatched at one of these meetings and began with a letter to the English from our then EO Ian Hill, in the early 90's. The way we now score our point's event and almost identical rules for Skeet are also an outcome from these meetings. A full report will be in a forthcoming magazine.

### New ISSF facility

It is pleasing to have received an invitation to the Inauguration of the upgrade to Majura Park's ISSF Facilities. The event has guest speakers of the highest calibre including the ACT Chief Minister Mr. Andrew Barr and Mr. Russell Mark OAM. It is great to see investment continuing in the ISSF area of our sport in what could only be described as a difficult time for these disciplines. Congratulations and Good Luck for the future to Joe Thaller and his members at Majura Park.

The lack of facilities for the Olympic Disciplines is a real problem throughout Australia and any new development should receive complete support from all quarters.

#### Ron Traill Memorial

A decision has been made that the ACTA Boardroom at the National Office will be renamed the "Ron Traill Room" in recognition of the years of unselfish dedication to the administration of our sport by Ron. It also recognises the close relationship Ron has had with ACTA staff and that he was their "go to man" for many years. The decision includes the proviso that this is named in perpetuity and if we ever move from that building, another suitable room will then host the name ongoing.

# Executive Officer's Report

The Executive and the Board have put in some great work to ensure the matters of the Association are dealt with in a timely manner. The Board met on the 22nd of July with the Executive ratifying those meeting recommendations on the 14th August. A timely turnaround considering the EO was on leave for a week.

The new streamlined process will be the model we put forward to take the Association to a Company Limited by Guarantee. We meet again as a board on the 7th of September, this will be followed by a meeting with the AIS and Shooting Australia. The Board will also be meeting with Senator Bridget McKenzie at Parliament House on Tuesday the 8th September. The Senator heads up the Friends of Shooters committee in the Parliament and we are eager to garner her support of the Association.

The new website is now operational with a faster format and improved layout. In the near future many of the administration forms for break badges, ordering stationary etc will be in a secure site on the site, we will be setting up access for Secretaries and Presidents to access this area and complete the forms. Once completed they will be sent directly to the ACTA National office where they will be actioned.

The ACTA have secured the rights to shoot English Sporting and

# Rule Interpretation

## QUESTION

#### Dear Sir,

Could you please clear up a rule for me. It relates to the allowance of a target to be shot at not to count at the start of an event (Rule 5a). Many times shooters insist they can have a target to shoot at "not to count" after they change events eg. Double Rise to Single Barrel, they insist it is a change of discipline. I cannot find any such rule in the ACTA Shooting Rules. I understand that if the event organisers declare that every body gets a "not to count" target before a new event there is no issue.

Could you please clear this up for me so that I am able to convey the correct information next time this issue arises?

### ANSWER

The question of a free target at the start of the day's event is not an issue and is clearly covered under the Rule you mention.

Guideline no. 5 "Targets to be shown by Referees" :

(a) One target shot not-to-count shall be offered to each shooter, for his FIRST TARGET, OF A DAY.

Many shooters mistakenly believe that they have a right to shoot at a free target at the change of events as you mention, but this is clearly not set out in our Rules.

Individual clubs have the ability to offer a free target at the change of events, for example Double Barrel to Double Rise but it is the club's decision, not a shooters right.

If you have any questions in relation to the interpretation of a rule in our Rule Book, please send your questions to the ACTA office and we will endeavour to provide answers in the CTSN Sportrap disciplines in Australia through the CPSA and our affiliation with the International Clay Target Shooting Federation. The new rules will be available on the Website following a review of rules by rules supervisors from each State. It is now for States and Clubs to register the events with State firearms authorities. The ACTA being in NSW we have done this through NSW Firearms. It is still a requirement for Clubs and the State Association to advise the Firearms branches in each State and for Clubs to have their ranges approved to shoot these events.

The ACTA has been involved and continues to provide submissions to the National firearms and weapons policy working group. This group is looking at reviewing and making recommendations on firearms following the Martin Place Siege in Sydney. We have had an active role in providing recommendations based on our membership requirements.

Our stance is and has been that we fully support taking illegal firearms off the streets however we will not support any additional requirements for licensed and registered shooters.

I again want to emphasise the importance of securing your firearm when not being used, particularly in transit. Firearms laws for safe storage of guns and ammunition are clear when in your home. They are not so clear when travelling. Lock your Gun in a safe locked gun case where possible and keep ammunition separated from your gun. Being overcautious is much easier to explain the being under prepared.

JULY, 2015







## OCTOBER 2015

I shot at my first clay target when I was about nine years old. One Saturday afternoon a school mate and I rode our bikes out to the edge of town where the local Gun Club was located at the rear of an outlying Hotel, which was par for the course in those days. My friend's father and uncle owned the local Sports Store cum Gun Shop and were keen shotgunners. During a break for afternoon tea his father offered us a shot. In hindsight the gun was probably a fairly light field gun using very big cartridges. I don't remember if I hit the target but I doubt it. What I do remember is that it almost knocked me over and made my eyes water. My friend didn't fare much better. Then we rode home nursing our injuries and our pride. On all future Saturday afternoons we found other things to do.

#### Second Time Around

My next experience was about ten years later and I drove my car to the Gun Club, which by this time had relocated to the edge of the local aerodrome. My competitive results weren't much better but the extent of my enthusiasm was diametrically opposed to my previous experience. During the following week I traded my big bore target rifle in on a shotgun and commenced to haunt Gun Clubs on and off for the next forty odd years. Which leads me to where I'm headed this month. What sort of gun did I buy? A Belgian



For many years Browning donated a unique gun each year for the National High Gun winner. Sadly by 1988 their market share had dropped to the point where this was no longer viable. Fortunately Beretta then took up the opportunity

made Browning of course! At that time (the mid to late 60s) there were only two types of clay target shooters. Those who shot a Browning and those who wished they did. Just exactly how the Browning brand had come to almost totally dominate the market by this time I'm not exactly sure but they certainly had a vice grip on it.

#### The Pecking Order

The poor people (like me) shot a "Jackhammer" which was a long-recoil five-shot automatic. Its

factory model designation was A5. It was popular and probably the best seller of all the models. There was another self loader available at that time. It was a short recoil design with no magazine, designed specifically for clay target shooting. For obvious reasons it was simply called the Two Shot Auto. Although very rare, I was fortunate enough to have a couple of them until Johnny Howard "recalled" them. The better off blue collar workers shot the entry level under/over blued gun with minimal engraving whose factory designation was A1, but which we simply called an A grade. It was probably the second best seller of all time. There was an A2, or B grade, whose frame was case hardened, instead of blued, but these guns were also very rare.

#### **Continuing Right Along**

The white collar workers shot the second tier guns: B1 and B2, more commonly but confusingly referred to in Australia as C and D grades. And the rich people shot guns from the third and fourth tier. Their factory designation was CI to C3 and DI to D5 but again in Australia we extended the alphabetical sequence and called the third tier E. F and G grades and the top tier H through L grades. The most popular were the F and the K as these had hunting scenes engraved on them. As the years rolled on and for a variety of different reasons Browning's market share eroded away to the point where today these guns are considered to be more of a collector's item and are rarely seen in competition circles. Which brings me to this month's focus. A local area friend and fellow club member, Simon Webster, recently acquired a very famous example of these fine guns and wrote a story about it which I am about to share with you. Enjoy!

#### A Couple of Legends

The name Fred Burns may not immediately be familiar to the modern day trap shooter, but during the late thirties through to the mid sixties he entrenched his name in ACTA history. Fred's shooting career included almost 300 championships including all of the major Australian titles at some point and the premier Champion of Cham-

pions title multiple times. In 1956 he and Newton Thomas were ruled out of competing for Australia at the Melbourne Olympics on the basis that they were not "amateurs". The very next week Fred beat the entire Olympic field in a gala live bird championship at the Melbourne Gun Club in Tottenham. An incredible feat! Undoubtedly Fred Burns and Newton Thomas were the country's top two shooters and in a class of their own. They were almost royalty amongst not only the shooting fraternity but the sporting community as a whole.

#### A Tale of Two Barrels

Rather than a story about the man, this is a story about the famous Browning over and under that Fred Burns was presented with by FN Browning in 1955. I have always been fascinated by Browning over and unders from my first days of shooting. History has also been a passion of mine and as such a conversation transpired some 3 years ago that started a journey.

#### An Icon is Born

During the late 1940s a new gun emerged onto the live bird scene that started a whole new era for shotgunning in Australia. From the early days of the side by side and A5 self loader, the all new Browning FN over and under appeared. This gun in all its various grades was generically referred to by the factory as the Model B25. And from the early fifties through to the mid eighties it was "the king" on Australian shooting tracks. The Browning OU dominated the live bird scene and early clay pigeon events. Regularly entire squads of shooters were all shooting a Browning. And the Australian shooter whose name was synonymous with winning big titles and undoubtedly pioneering the Browning OU in Australia was Fred Burns.

#### Onwards and Upwards

From the late thirties through to the mid fifties. Fred had huge success firstly with his A5, then moving to a Browning A grade. In those years there were many agents in Australia for FN Browning. The most well known were Alcock and Pierce in Melbourne, Mick Smith in Sydney and Fullers in South Australia. In 1954, after having such great success with Browning shotguns, Fred Burns decided he wanted to own "the best Browning money could buy". He stretched himself financially and approached the agents in Melbourne for a quote. They spoke to the factory at Herstal in Belgium and a letter came back from the custom shop saying that they would be only too happy to supply Fred Burns with a high grade gun. But the gun would be their "Special Presentation" model and it would be supplied at no charge. This was in recognition for him putting their product on the shooting stage in Australia with his high profile wins.

#### **Special Specifications**

Fred selected his choice of engraving and specifications. Hand crafted from one end to the other the "Special" was 5 months in the making and arrived 9 months after ordering. Fred even had the gun sent via ship rather than air because he was afraid of loosing the gun in a plane crash! The gun is of single trigger design with a blued action. Perfectly balanced the stock is fiddle back walnut with classic French walnut and black highlights. The hand engraving rivals fine oriental inlay work and includes the owners name in the 24 carat gold escutcheon reading A.F Burns. The word "Special "is written in copperplate gold along the hand filed top rib. The sides of the receiver feature gold and copper rose bouquets on a

checkered and hard gold plated. With 30" barrels, extra long 3 piece schnabel forearm, choked full and full, this gun was a live bird specialist.

#### Constantly in the Limelight

The gun was well known amongst the shooters of the era and pictured in many famous shoot-offs and carnivals during the peak of his career. One such event that cannot be overlooked was the Australian National Championships conducted at the Australian Gun Club in Fast Burwood Victoria in March of 1958. All the greats were there, including Burns, Thomas, the great "Calrossie" and Paul and Sperry Marshall from Tasmania. At one point during the Carnival Sperry Marshall had to go head to head with Burns for a fourth placing in the Single Barrel event. Sounds quite low key, but what followed broke all records. Keep in mind that shooting 100 straight targets single barrel from 16 yards was virtually unheard of in those days. After a while these two great shooters decided to move back a yard every so often and ended up in the car park, shooting from beyond 27 yards with Burns finally taking it on the 134th target! This feat eclipsed all known records of the day.

where they shot to finality with Newton Thomas eventually prevailed on the 129th target! During this marathon exhibition their barrels got so hot at times they had to stop and dip them into a barrel of cold water. An amazing end to the carnival! These were undoubtedly the golden years.

While Fred managed Myers Gun Emporium during the 1960's, the gun was regularly featured in magazines and newspaper advertisements. "Shoot like Fred Burns" they read! As Fred's shooting career came to its twilight during the 1970's the "Special" became more and more rarely seen and eventually disappeared from Australian shooting tracks altogether. One of the greatest Browning shotguns ever and the first given to an Australian shooter by FN Browning simply faded away. Hearing about this legendary gun and Fred's incredible shooting career, I made it a mission to find the gun and bring it back into the light again. This gun's incredible story deserved to live on and be heard by the next generation.

#### The Resurrection

#### But Wait - There's More

Most would have thought that such a feat would not have been equalled for a very long time. But later in the day the two giants of the sport, Newton Thomas and Fred Burns, went head the head for a placing in the Champion of Champions, which had been won earlier by Sperry Marshall. After several other shooters had fallen away, these two famous ICI sponsored shooters decided to put on a show for the crowd. After discussing the situation they both walked back to 27 yards,

daughter Dawn Hill (nee Burns) was then entrusted with its custody. The day recently came when I had the privileged opportunity of firing the "Special" for the first time in almost 40 years. A friend said to me "this is like playing Elvis Presley's guitar" and I replied "that's exactly what it feels like for me too"! A legend has returned and is no longer forgotten. #### August's Trivia Question

Of the 33 All Australian Skeet Teams selected at the Skeet Nationals since 1983 there are only two members that also share the distinction of being inducted into the ACTA Trapshooting Hall of Fame. The first one is a "walk up start" as my old mate and Two Man Team partner. Billy Iles is unquestionably one of the best "all round" shooters in ACTA history. Attending Skeet shoots only when Trap shoots are scarce, he has still managed to rack up four State Skeet titles and three Runner-ups at the Nationals. Sadly all three of those would have been wins if only I had stayed at home. However he also qualified for the All Australian Skeet Team five times in 1985, 1994, 1996, 1997 and 2000.

#### What mates are for

I'm sure he could have had more wins and made more Teams, but he was adamant he would only attend the Skeet Nationals if I was there, as his prime agenda was to "carry" me in the Two-Man Teams match and I missed half a dozen Skeet Nationals during this era. It's a shame that Bill never learnt to play euchre as that would have undoubtedly rounded off his Skeet shooting resume. And it's also a bit of a quandary as his late father "Joffa" was one of the sharpest card players that I ever had the pleasure of sitting around the table with. Obviously euchre is not a hereditary thing!

#### The Cream Always Rises

Anyway getting back to the question, the second one is the hard one and the realm of serious history buffs. Warren Charlton is one of the greatest ACTA Trapshooters of all time. In 1983 he was in the twilight of an illustrious career spanning two decades between 1960 and 1980 and as it was the first Skeet Nationals, I think he just came along for a look. However talent of that magnitude doesn't go on holidays and he proceeded to make the "elite list" that year in a discipline he rarely contested.

## NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 15 Pair (30 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Monday 5th January 2015. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. <u>Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they</u> <u>withdraw</u>. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only except Double Trap. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran shooters are eligible for OA for their grade where applicable.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition. Veterans to be over the age of 60 prior to January 1st 2016.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. he standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
- 21. <u>All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).</u>

## The Psychology of Winning

Recently I was in Dubbo for a couple of days for work. Dubbo has a great second hand book shop and on the shelf I found *The Psychology of Winning: ten qualities of a total winner.* Just the title caught my eye so I started to thumb through the book to see

what the author, Dr Denis Waitley saw as the ten qualities of a total winner and could these ten qualities be applied to sport. The book was written a long time ago, 1979 but it still has relevance in today's world.

Wailey's list of the qualities for winning are:

**Positive Self-Awareness.** He argues that winners know who they are, what they believe in, what they are currently doing and what their goals are for the future. Self-aware winners have learned through insight, experience, feedback and judgement how to fulfil their potential.

Positive Self-esteem. Having a positive self-esteem is an important quality

of being a winner. Winners have developed strong beliefs about self-worth and self-confidence. The word esteem means to appreciate the value of. If we have positive self-esteem we appreciate the value of ourselves. To do this we need to cast off the value judgements we make about ourselves and our performance. These judgements are usually associated with us thinking of the past, past performances and past mistakes. Self-esteem can be easily affected by self-talk. If we are negative then it will have an impact on how we think about ourselves.

**Positive Self-control**. Self-control is often misunderstood as being able to perfom under pressure. Self-control is this context is more about self-determination. That is, taking full responsibility for determining their actions in their own lives, meaning that individuals have the ability and freedom to make choices.

**Positive Self-motivation**. Motivation is the force that moves us to action and springs from the individual. Motivation can either be positive or negative. Most people who appear to be going nowhere often believe that that are not motivated. Unfortunately, they are very motivated: they are motivated to keep things as they are, when they need to be motivated to change.

**Positive self-expectancy**. Winners expect to win. They see life as a real game and not a gamble. They expect to achieve and win because of their desire to win. Their self-control gives them the skills to make it happen. And finally, they are prepared to win.

**Positive Self-image.** All winners develop and actively think about their positive self-image. Individuals often behave in accordance with their perception rather than the reality of the situation. If you see yoursdelf as a winner it will be easier to win.

**Positive Self-direction**. Winners have goals and are achievement orientated. They have a vision for what they want to achieve and set goals to meet these outcomes. Their goals are SMART: Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time-framed. Goal setting can be used for all endeavours and can be useful when returning from an injury or recess.

**Positive Self-Discipline**. This is the ability to practise within. Self-discipline relies on visualisation strategies to to allow the winner to see themselves achieving the results they want. The mind cannot tell the difference between what is real and what is imagined. So to win you need to practise seeing yourself win in your mind so that it can happen in real life. Visualisation, guided imagery, mental rehearsal and hypnosis are all ways to achieve positive self-discipline.

**Positive self-dimension**. Winners see themselves within the big picture. They see their sporting ability as part of their whole self. This means that they can cope with the ups and downs of the competition and their performances. Being resilient means that winners will turn up for the next competition even when they have experienced failure. Winners know they cannot win all the time, but more importantly they also know that they a loss every now again is not the end of the world.

**Positive self-projection**. Winners project themselves as winners throughout their whole life. They walk, talk, dress, look, listen and react like winners. Because winners see winning as important and because of the previous nine qualities, winners are happy to show the world that they believe in themselves and their ability.

To be a winner takes all these qualities and more. You must have the technical and physical skills to be able to perform in the first place. But these are ten good mental skills that will go towards developing mental toughness.

# VCTA NEZ school kids bang on target

## ECHUCA CLAY TARGET CLUB AUGUST 13, 2015

Thursday the 13th of August saw 29 full squads of school students arrive at the Echuca Clay Target Club to compete in the Victorian North East Zone School Student elimination shoot. With four age and gender categories, a team and an Overall winner to be chosen to go on to the State final, it proved to be a big day for all. Student numbers were down a little on previous years, but Zone reclassification and much stricter rules about gun ownership etc, and of course, these tough economic times may be the reason. All that aside, there were certainly a lot of students in attendance, all vying for the opportunity to shoot well, and represent themselves and their schools at the Championship finals.

Fortunately, after the previous days' rain, the day was clear and calm enough, with just a few clouds moving around. It was very cold, but of course, it is wintertime. After an initial hiccup with the supply of cartridges, the shoot got underway, and with six traps working constantly, even with a late start, everything ran smoothly and the entire event finished only a little later than in previous years. This must be attributed to the much appreciated help from all the volunteers.

Firstly the Overall winner, who shot extremely well, as everyone was having trouble with the fluoro targets disappearing into the clouds, and that produced lower than normal scores on the day, but Connor Keck, from Kyabram P12 school and a member of the Echuca Clay Target Club, managed to record an 18/20 score which earned him the prestige of being the Overall Winner of the shoot. 

# ACTA NEWS

## **RENEWING A CLUB MEMBER**

As the Club Secretary you can renew members and have the club billed for the ACTA component. Immediately the secretary processes a member the membership sticker is placed in a queue for printing. This will be processed in the next available print run and posted (one day). Your membership label is then delivered as fast as Australia Post can deliver. You can process these renewals as they come in and a bill will be provided at the end of the month, no more waiting for forms to fill before submitting therefore ensuring members have the membership renewals done expediently.

Login to your Club and go to your club members, select a member and go to the membership area and proceed to payment. Select the "Invoice Club" button and confirm. Move to the next member to renew, a very simple system that should enable fast processing of renewals.

Membership applications and renewals must contain all relevant information including date of birth. If not provided we cannot process your membership and it will be returned to your club.

## PRESENTATION OF ADVERTISING COPY

Recently some club advertisements have been sent to the ACTA in the form of a "Print Ready PDF file" There are three important things to remember when presenting material in this format.

I. Make sure that you compose the advertisement to the

correct size. Many of the files we receive are made to an A4 format and need to be reduced in size. This means that the hieght and width reductions will be a different percentage and your image will look distorted. The correct page size for the Clay Target Shooting News is 267mm deep x 197mm wide. If you intend the image to fit within the column image area you should make that trim size 238mm deep x 178mm wide. If you intend the image to go to the page edge then you must add another 6mm to each side and top and bottom to allow for bleed.

- 2. Remember when selecting colours that you allow for the possibility of registration creep on the web press that we print on. The use of fine type or overprint colours may become unredable as will colours that are similar.
- 3. Make sure that you output your final file as a PRINT QUALITY PDF.

The ACTA takes no responsibility for the quality of reproduction of material prepared and sent in as a print ready file.

Below are the correct sizes for advertising other than full pages:

- I/8 page landscape 52mm deep x 86.5 wide.
- 1/4 page portrait 116.5mm deep x 86.5mm wide.
- 1/4 page landscape 52mm deep x 178mm wide
- I/2 page portrait 238mm deep x 86.5mm wide
- 1/2 page landscape 116.5mm deep x 178mm wide
