Presidents Notes



On behalf of the Executive, I welcome all members back for a new shooting year, and hope you have all enjoyed the festive season.

Meetings and Consultations

ISSF Nationals — Brisbane. I and the Executive officer have met with the Vice-President of Brisbane Clay Target Club, Mr. Peter Tobin and inspected the facility for the forthcoming ISSF Nationals. Olympic trap boxes are all upgraded with the latest control chips and a spare box has been sourced for the event. The grounds are in great shape and all appears ready.

With this National Championship being one of the last qualification events for Rio we are looking forward to a good attendance.

There are a lot of unresolved issues in the ISSF discipline area and I will be available for discussion during the event. I would appreciate all in attendance being aware that the officials in attendance are all volunteers and they deserve both your respect and thanks.

Field and Game Australia. Your Board and Executive Officer had a very hospitable and worthwhile meeting with the Field and Game Association of Australia. There is a report on this meeting elsewhere in the magazine.

Field and Game Federation. We are currently arranging a meeting with Field and Game Federation to discuss mutually beneficial topics, and by the time this has gone to press it is likely that we will have met with them. A report will be printed at a later date.

Office of Sport and Recreation. Vice President Rob Fox and I were fortunate to be invited to a Queensland OSR meeting with the QCTA Administrator, Debbie Young also in attendance. We were given an update on proposals for the Commonwealth Games facilities for 2018. No final decision on venue and budget for the shotgun disciplines has yet been made and at least three proposals are being considered. We hope that a real legacy remains after the event as the construction of temporary facilities for the event could leave no legacy at all.

ACTA Board

The ACTA Board has met and considered numerous agenda items. These are still to be voted on by your Executive so I cannot comment on most decisions yet. I can say that a draft constitution for possible adoption at the next AGM has been considered and is now with the Association Solicitors for redrafting and further review. It is a delicate balancing act to give all stakeholders fair representation and yet still ensure that those making decisions at National level have the whole associations interest in mind at all times and indeed the skills required at this level of sports governance.

Perspective drawings have been previewed for the new multi-function building on the National Grounds, and a decision to appoint a committee to oversee the project has been made. It is hoped that, finance permitting, the grounds will boast the new building and a total of 20 DTL layouts for the ICTSF World DTL in 2018.

The Board has decided to introduce some curfews on shooting hours at the National Grounds following noise complaints during the New South Wales State Trap Carnival.

It is in everybody's best interests to minimise the impact we have on our neighbours. Those using the grounds will be notified of details as soon as possible.

International Clay Target Shooting Federation

I am pleased to report that the Danish Shooting Union has accepted an

offer of membership to the ICTSF and has indicated it will send a DTL Team to Ireland in 2016. New countries added to the membership of the ICTSF is great for DTL shooting and I hope they will take part in the Mackintosh event this year as well.

ACTA Protection Package

We have now received clear advice that the protection package provided to all Club, Zone, State and National officials is void if we knowingly allow breaches of the constitution to occur unquestioned and unresolved. Turning a blind eye, hoping some will change their ways is no longer an option. This now leaves the Association no choice but to disaffiliate any bodies continuing in breach of the constitution. Allowing non-members of the ACTA to take part at your club on a regular basis, disqualifies them as Bona Fide visitors and is clearly unconstitutional.

The ACTA has tried to make allowance for the non-competitive shooter wishing to shoot ACTA disciplines by introducing a discounted Club Only rate. Some states have also made allowance for them by not asking for the State affiliation fee on this type of membership. Still the problem persists.

The protection provided by the ACTA to our volunteers, so they can be involved in their chosen sport without any possible impact on their personal assets cannot be jeopardised continually by the actions of a few. We will not be taking this action lightly or without attempting to resolve the issues first but we will take it when proven necessary for the benefit of the greater membership.

Shooting Australia AGM

The SA AGM recently conducted resulted in Mr. Bruce Scott being returned as a Director. The member's forum conducted following the AGM gave our appointed representative Suzie Balogh the opportunity to raise issues of concern with SA and the other member bodies. The board believes Suzie as our Coaching Director is much better qualified to represent us at these types of forums than Board members.

Reports are that the forum was quite open and lively, and we thank Suzie for attending and representing on our behalf.

Down The Line Nationals

Details of a revised program and prize money allocation for the DTL Nationals should have become widely known by now. An increase in attendance is required to justify the decisions we have made to guarantee levels of prizemoney on top of sponsor's prizes. Bring your mates; bring the wife, the girlfriend and the kids. Let's all try and make it a great week.

Australia Post Rates

A review of postal rates for periodicals such as the CTSN is currently underway. Rises in rates as high as 150% have been rumoured. A rise of this size would effectively kill the CTSN as we know it today. Postage is currently around \$11,000 a month. Being the only direct contact with our Registered Shooters it is very important to the ACTA to retain this publication if at all possible. We are in talks with other associations regarding this matter.

Executive Officer's Report

2015 has been one with many different sport and gun related issues. The Enquiry into the Martin Place siege involved the President and Executive Officer attending three meetings of industry and firearms organisations along with Border Protection, interstate Police and Firearms branches and the Attorney Generals Departments (Federal and State) as well as victim impact groups. The position of the ACTA was put forward in a submission after the first meeting. That is, we do not support any further restrictions or changes to the use of firearms for licensed shooters and gun owners. We do support the upgrade of computer software to make purchasing a gun for those already licensed to acquire a firearm of the same category easier and more time effective. We wish to see all jurisdictions in Australia (States) have rules and policies that are uniform in relation to Juniors and the carriage and safe storage of guns.

There are numerous other gun related issues being addressed by the Attorney Generals Department under a separate enquiry, the ACTA however has made representation through the forum involving us in relation to these matters. The Attorney Generals Department is looking to provide the summary of information to the Federal Minister and State Ministers in January 2016. We have made further representation to the NSW Police Minister that we be consulted before any changes to the National Firearms Agreement are put before the Parliament.

I have also been involved in the Ranges and Clubs meetings of NSW Firearms branch, obviously with the National Ground in Wagga Wagga we have a vested interest in these fields. We are working to clarify the requirement of all juniors to be under "Direct" supervision. The wording of this is of particular relevance as to what is "Direct Supervision". The NSW Firearms branch states "within a distance where immediate intervention" can occur. This currently applies to all juniors regardless of the permit and how long they have had a permit. At this stage, this is the Law and it is something all juniors and their parents need to be aware of in NSW or when visiting.

It is timely with the Nationals in Wagga again in 2016 to remind everyone of the safe storage of your guns, not only for safety reasons, it is also a valuable piece of sporting equipment. We collectively need to ensure that we protect the sport and our ownership rights. The cost of compliance is very little compared to the cost of non-compliance, not only from a financial perspective but from a sport and ownership perspective as well.

The ACTA are in the later stages of compiling the new scoring system and automated handicapping system. This will be available live on the website and also be able to be used as in excel format just to upload scores for handicapping. This is the last piece in the updating of the ACTA's data base upgrade and integration of it services. All of our services will then

The new renewal system has been received very well with Clubs seeing the benefits of a much more streamlined process for renewal and new registrations. All forms required by secretaries are available through the website administration login, allowing access to real time form requests. I will keep members informed of the progress of system updates. Congratulations to the 2015 Skeet Glenn Trophy team who won the prestigious event in New Zealand with a score of 241 to 238. The Team consisted of Paul Johnston, Antony Ballarino, Nigel Hughes, David O'Sullivan

and Glenn Walker. Congratulations to the team on a fine performance.

Rule Interpretation

After becoming aware of some grading cards which appear to carry an excessive and inordinate amount of cross-outs, that is scores marked "not to count", we decided that it might be wise to explain how this rule is to be applied.

In Trap the Rule is:

2.04 ADJUSTMENTS

(h) In determining a shooters grade or handicap an official may disregard any scores obviously not indicative of the shooters ability at the time of the 100 (handicap) or 200 (grading) target rule off.

Similar Rules for Skeet 6.03(h) and Sporting 10.01(u) are also included in the Rule book.

Two main reasons for misinterpretation of this Rule.

- A mistaken belief that the shooter has the right to perform the cross-out, and
- Cross-outs are applied before the appropriate number of targets are shot.

The only person to rule out any score non-indicative of performance must be left, as the rule states, with the appropriate handicapper or official. There may be some argument as to what exactly constitutes a non-indicative score and so far we have not been able to come up with a simple definitive answer, but commonsense should be enough for officials to make a subjective assessment of a score.

In general terms, if a score is more than one full grade below the shooter's average, it would be worth considering as a possible score to run a line through.

The second issue is when to cross out the score. No score should be ruled out before the completion of the appropriate number of targets for re-grading or re-handicapping. Once the rule-out has been affected the percentage is then calculated on the remaining number of targets within that bracket.

I have sighted some cards where there are almost as many scores crossed out as there are scores left. In this instance I might suggest that the shooter is trying to protect their grade, when in fact the choice is already there for a shooter to have their grading card marked as "prefer to remain in ?? grade".



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 5. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
- 22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
- 23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

Camblings

JANUARY 2016

Due to the early wrap up of December's magazine, it's probably been on everyone's coffee table for longer than usual prior to this month's editorial deadline. It's certainly been there plenty long enough for me to receive a lot of comment on the column I wrote last month detailing my ideas on what I thought we should do with the timing and programming of the Trap Nationals. Surprisingly enough, most people agreed with most of the things I said, which is about as good a strike rate as you could hope for. However, obviously some people disagreed with some of the content and/or offered alternate ideas. So in order to try to be as unbiased as possible (always difficult) I offered to air as much feedback as possible his month and I'll start with the timing.

The Alternatives

To clarify the debate for those who tuned in late I'll start by reiterating the four options I saw for the date setting. I) Move the date earlier enough to avoid Easter. 2) Stay with the first week of April and cop Easter on the chin. 3) Attempt to stay with the first week of April but move when Easter clashes, as we usually do now. 4) Move to the end of April to dodge Easter. For a start and for all the reasons I offered, no-one thought Option One had any merit, as we so conclusively proved last year. However only about half thought that Option Four (my personal favourite) was the way to go. Of the "nay sayers" most of these couldn't see a problem with Option Two and offered good reasons to allow Easter to butt up against either end of the Nationals whenever that occurred.

The Workability of Easter

There are certainly a lot of things I like about Option Two, such as the advantage of a fixed and totally predictable date and its historic precedent. Plus it also provides the potential addition of some "holidays" to the total timeframe causing less days off work to be needed to be taken. And with Service Stations and Grocery Stores no longer prosecuted for trading on Good Friday, it now makes a great travel day. Anyway, the general consensus of opinion regarding the religious consequences of a date clash with Easter were 1) In this day and age and for a variety of reasons, serious religious observance seems to be in decline, thereby causing less people to be affected. 2) Religious belief is now much more diversified than it's ever been and only those religions that fall under the Christianity umbrella observe Easter anyway and 3) As both competition and travel days would offer opportunities for church attendance and

dietary alterations, then the two agendas should be mutually compatible anyway. As a person who spends a lot of time talking to God but am not religious per se, I would have no problem with this option provided it could be set in concrete, but as we've proved so often in the past, that is very difficult to achieve.

Another Possibility

The remaining minority expressed support for an option that I was probably remiss in not initially considering and which should probably be classified as 3A. It entails still using the first full week of April as the primary objective and still retaining an option of moving to dodge Easter when this occurs. However the difference is in the fine print, which stipulates that the move can only be backwards to a later date. Although I see some merit in this idea, I like it the least of the three "workable" alternatives. First it doesn't provide the fixed and completely predictable Shoot Calendar that I have learnt by bitter experience to be such a staunch supporter of. And second it shares the problem of Option Two above in that it cannot be guaranteed to be cast in stone.

Risky Business

And that is what really scares me about either of these two options: the fact that their association with Easter will periodically cause their implementation to come up for debate. Add to this the fact that the ACTA's current system of governance shares one of the unavoidable pitfalls that any democratically elected system provides: a constantly changing presence of representatives with varying degrees of experience, knowledge and astuteness. Therefore it is inevitable that sooner or later inexperience and dim memories will allow the lessons of history to be lost and we'll be right back where we started. That alone is enough reason for me to push for the last week of April and put the whole issue out of the danger area. Anyway, as I said last month, think about it, discuss it with your State representatives and see what eventuates.

The Unicorn and the Mermaid

Before closing off on timing I need to add that several people again raised the age old proposal of trying to co-ordinate the Nationals with School Holidays. Years ago, before I had any grey hair I thought "what a great idea!" However even a little homework quickly showed that this concept only exists at the end of the rainbow. For a start none of the States seem to try to co-ordinate with even their neighbors, let alone the whole group and then seemingly to make sure that synchronisation can never be achieved, most of them move their dates around annually and randomly.

Unfortunately even though they've managed to get a bit more uniformity into their railroad track spacing, no such progress has been made with School Holidays! To illustrate the point, if we had used the first full week of April in 2015, six of the eight "states" would have clicked. Sounds good, right? But move on to 2016 and you find that no less than five of them have switched weeks. Four went backwards and one forward and this year only three will line up. Don't go there!

Neat but Tight

Now my reference last month to "an arguably good trade off decision to stay within one working week" also generated a lot of discussion. To clarify that point, the idea was to set a program which allowed nearly everyone who competed at the Nationals to only need to take one full week off work in order to attend, provided they're prepared to sacrifice some or all of the Pre-Nationals. To do this you start with a nine day "available window" that starts on the Saturday of the first weekend and finishes on the Sunday of the second weekend. After allocating the first and last days as "travel days", you're left with a seven day "shooting window". Originally the Nationals program was scheduled over six days allowing one day for each of the main events and the Macintosh International Team Shoot was "squeezed" into the middle. It was conducted on the morning following the last qualifying day and the rest of that day was usually allocated to the Double Rise as it is the quickest event to stage and shoot off.

Expansion Problems

Obviously this provided a pretty "full on" agenda on that particular day but it worked OK for a while until we started overloading it with additions. First we added a Family Deauville Doubles event and that usually ended up in the dark. So by the time enough support for an Open Deauville Doubles brought it to fruition and the push for 100 target events included the Double Rise, there was simply no room any more for the Macintosh Team Shoot on "Doubles Day" as with all these additions and changes it reached saturation point on its own and returned to shooting off in the dark. Thus we needed to expand the program out to seven days to accommodate the Macintosh Team shoot, but as it really only needed half a day to complete, the question was how to fill in the other half. Initially there were thoughts of programming a Trophy Match that afternoon as they have done very successfully at the New Zealand Nationals for many years.

Side Shift

Clearly this would have rounded the week out nicely for everyone who lived more than four or five hours drive from Wagga (or Roma or Perth on the "away years") as the two travel days closed the loop. However, as I alluded to above, the major downside of the "trade off" involved in the whole "one week" concept was the negative impact it inflicted on the Pre-Nationals. Staying within one week allowed one day of Pre-Nationals for the locals but no "warm up" at all for the travelers. And this is probably the main reason the strict one week scenario was "traded off" by

moving the whole "box and dice" back one day and allocating the final Sunday for the Macintosh match. This killed one and a half birds with one stone as the overseas visitors and the people not involved in the Team Shoot could still use it as a travel day and even the Macintosh combatants still had half a day to allocate to the trip home. And now everybody had at least one day of Prelims to acclimatise to the conditions.

Complications

Unfortunately, like Newton's third law of motion, every action has an equal and opposite reaction and this is where the 'bad bits" of the trade off start to kick in. You can't really move the Team shoot to the end of the week without dragging the Qualifying events along with it. So the last four days become DB, SB, PS and the Team Shoot. Which is the main reason why we now don't have enough "elbow room" to allow the National Double Barrel shoot-off to navigate its own way to finality and we're constantly arguing about which is the best way to "vandalise" it. Plus we've effectively "neutered" the Macintosh match! We've taken what should be a very prestigious spectacle, where the protagonists get to "strut their stuff" in front of their peers and receive their deserved accolades and turned it into a little "tack on" stealth event that is staged in isolation after everyone else has gone home.

An Empty Nest

Last time I was charged with organising it, the car park on Sunday morning looked like Mother Hubbard's cupboard and I had to beg and plead and scrape the bottom of the barrel just to get the 24 referees and scorers required to get the show on the road. Incidentally, due to this I am now fully qualified in the art of giving crash courses in scoring to shooter's wives. And thank goodness none of the qualified participants "took sick" as most, if not all, of the Emergencies had capitalised on the travel day and were half way home. The solution? Read last month's column and you'll start to see why I'm firmly convinced that Wednesday morning is the optimum place in the program to vie for Donald Macintosh's big silver cup!

Collateral Damage

In addition to all the feedback I received on the timing and programming of the main events, I also got a lot of comment on the negative long term effect this whole "one week" concept has had on the Pre-Nationals. What was once a very proud and prestigious event in its own right, has seemingly been turned into some sort of undesirable "ugly sister" of the main event. Once upon a time the Pre-nationals was a full three day tournament that almost mirrored the Nationals as a sort of mini version of it, complete with sashes, trophies, high guns and the whole nine yards. The mindset of the one week scenario initially reduced this to one day but the deferment of the Macintosh Team Shoot to Sunday resurrected it back to potentially two days. However, when the 2015 Double Barrel "restructure experiment" needed an extra day, again it was the Pre-Nationals that bore the brunt of the cull and receded back to a one day wonder.

Other Factors Involved

To be fair the One Week principle was not the only culprit in the demise of the Pre-Nationals. The National Ground project, of which I am one of the most ardent supporters, must accept some of the blame as well. However not as an intended objective, but as an unfortunate side effect. Prior to the National Ground coming on line around the turn of the century, each year the ACTA would allocate the Nationals to one of the States to conduct on a rotational basis. That State would then select one of its member clubs to be the host venue at which the State Association would run the event. And as some compensation for wearing out their equipment and tearing up their grass, the club usually got to run the Pre-Nationals, which the club's treasurer loved, and everyone was happy.

Responsibility Shift

However, with the advent of the National Ground, the venue situation got a bit more complicated. Even though the Nationals had been held at this exact geographic location in the past, the political administration was now completely different. Wagga Gun Club were no longer the host entity, NSWCTA were effectively no more than interested bystanders and the ACTA basically allocated the event to itself at its own venue and a whole new organisational situation evolved. And as the magnitude of the total package unfolded, the Pre-Nationals took on the mantle of an evil necessity and an overload of the organising committee. Therefore it's not hard to see how and why this once great spectacle wound down to the sad and sorry toothless tiger that it now is. No more sashes or trophies. No more shoot-offs. No more winners or High Guns. You just pay your money, shoot some "scored practice" and then sidle up to the office window later on to see if you get any of your noms refunded. Pitiful really!

If it Wasn't Broke

Crying over spilt milk won't fix it and neither will a Royal Commission into just exactly how and why it all ran off the rails. We already know that! Organisational complexity shifted the focus all the way down from bigger and better to quicker and easier. What's really needed now is a solution. And I think the answer is to wind the clock back. If the load has got too heavy for one horse to carry, then get some more horses. Offer the Pre-Nationals back to the State Associations and/or the resident clubs. I'm sure that WACTA and WAGC could do just as good a job as the QCTA/Roma Gun Club combo on the "away years". And what would be wrong with NSWCTA and/or the Wagga Gun Club putting in the hard yards and reaping some financial rewards if they were prepared to try to resurrect the Phoenix from the ashes. Again, think about it, talk to your State representatives and see if Pre-National sashes can't once again hang in pride of place on people's walls!

More Thoughts

An additional feedback issue on the Saturday to Friday timing of the main events that I recommended last month was the whole weekend free at the far end. Although a minority expressed the

opinion that this was a waste of a day that could be better utilised, most didn't see it that way. The majority thought that one day to travel home and one day to unpack and catch up on the myriad of overdue built up chores before facing up to a return to work took all the stress out of a week and a half's absence. Everyone to their own, but that's the way I see it too. Another point raised was the best night for the Hall of Fame Dinner. Clearly at the moment it's the Single Barrel day as there's not much to do on that day currently, but with the more even workload of the proposed itinerary, I think the Double Rise day is the optimum point. It falls on the Thursday, it's the second last day and it's the one most likely to wind up the earliest.

Winding Up

Now as this magazine should arrive in everyone's mailbox around the middle of December, I need to remind you that the deadline for Annual Long Run Break claims is January 3 I and to wish you a Merry Christmas — Eat, drink and be merry, but please don't drink and drive. I would rather see you in the shooting statistics next year, than the road toll statistics this year.

November's Trivia Question

The first woman to qualify for the OPEN Macintosh Team was a young lady from western Queensland by the name of Pam Coxon. Unfortunately her career only spanned eight short years between 1953 and 1961 before she married and moved on. However, she was unquestionably the dominant lady shooter of her era, winning several ladies titles at the Nationals during the late 50s. And in 1960, while at the top of her game, shot on the Queensland Open Trap Team as well as becoming the first lady to shoot for Australia. Her induction this year into the ACTA Hall of Fame is long overdue recognition of one of our great pioneering lady shooters. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Laurie Sheehan from Roma in Queensland.

- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Monday 11th January 2016. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event. Written notification is required for any eligible refund to be processed and should be sent to accounts@claytarget.com. au refunds will be processed within 30 days of the completion of the event and will incur an administration fee.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role will INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Junior male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 16. Pre-nominations will only be accepted online on the form provided at www.claytarget.com.au
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 18. Junior to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition. Veteran to be over the age of 60 prior to January 1st 2016.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ISSF Rules (clothing).
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).
- 22. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

Goal Setting Checklist

In last month's article I revisited goal setting. As a subject it is not very exciting but as a strategy, it is essential for success. Goals are derived from a vision, which inspires a plan and that with the help of strategies, outcomes can be reached.

Every sport psychology text book talks about smart goals and I am sure every child in fifth class can explain exactly what smart goals are. So this month I want to provide a goal setting checklist to help you develop goals for 2016. Firstly list three goals you want to achieve.

Are you able to tick all these feature for all three goals? Do you need to revisit one or more of your goals?

Most of these features are self-explanatory, but a few may need some an explanation.

Keep your goals simple. Reduce the complications and the goals will be far more achievable. The goals need to be simple but the task may need to be challenging. This means that you will have higher expectations and you will strive harder. Process focused: I have written about many times, but it is essential to success. Set positive goals rather than negative ones. Write your goals down: goals are useless if they are forgotten. Writing them down means you can monitor them regularly by using a journal or chart.

How we write them down is also important.



It was quite a windy day which all the locals said was pretty normal at this club so the prospect of shooting tough targets that were also wind affected was going to be a daunting task. The 4 grounds we were shooting from were quite flat so the club used towers to get some height on some targets.

squadded together for this event so it was quite enjoyable to see everyone smoking targets.

COMP 4 - FRIDAY 16/10/15

Preliminary I 00tgt English Sporting event, which we all competed in and saw as an opportunity to warm up for the following days World Title. The targets had been altered a little from the previous days FITASC event but were obviously now all pairs. Fair to say we all battled through the day with no one really excelling but Brian Mortensen finished top Aussie with 87/100, Bart Brighenti 82/100, Me 81/100, Reece Turner 80/100 & Peter Tobin 77/100. George Digweed strolled in the night before and won this event on 97/100 which was just an unbelievable score considering the windy conditions and difficulty of the targets. The opening ceremony commenced after the presentations of this event so we all donned the Australian Blazers and tried to look as pretty as possible. NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
