Vice President Reports



President Robert Nugent is travelling and has asked if I could write this months report on his behalf.

There has been good feedback in regard to the move to a company limited by guarantee, the executive have been briefed on the information received and they are considering those recommendations as well as ensuring the requirements of the Association are met.

A draft should be available midyear with the suggested changes including registered shooters being able to attend the AGM and Clubs voting at the AGM, two of the most debated subjects. The Association continues to work with our legal representatives to ensure we are always compliant with our statutory obligations.

National Championships

The Association will be monitoring the overall results of all National Championships in 2016 to gauge the success of a number of changes in the program. Finding a balance in prizemoney and overall cost is important, we believe we are very close to achieving that balance. The cost of sending World Teams is something we also need to consider. The World DTL in Ireland in July 2016 now features a Veteran and Super Veteran category, an additional three members to the previous World Teams.

New Zealand CTA/Glenn Shield

The ISSF Junior Glenn Shield featuring the Calrossie/McKenzie trophy was shot in New Zealand in February with the Australian Team consisting of Adam and Sam Bylsma taking out the event. We wish to highlight the importance of the event and the co-operation of the NZCTA. The event was initiated to ensure Junior's had a reward for effort and encouragement to shoot ISSF discipline and foster the shooting relationship with the NZCTA. This year we had only two members of a three man team, with one member being a late withdrawal. New Zealand offered to change the rules slightly to allow the best two scores by Australian Juniors to be placed against the two best New Zealand scores to ensure the event went ahead. We appreciate the gesture of the New Zealand Association to ensure that the event continued.

We will as an Association, do everything possible to assist the event as does the NZCTA. The boys were provided with ammunition to shoot the NZ National event at no cost and enjoyed the hospitality provided over the course of the event. The boys represented the ACTA with pride and we congratulate them on their performance.

National Executive Meeting

The annual meeting of the National Executive will be conducted

in June following on closely from the Skeet Championships. The meeting will look at the strategic plan, the constitution, business plan and budget as well as addressing the issues of the conduct of the sport. It is time for registered shooters, Clubs and States to meet at their respective levels to put forward agenda items to this meeting. These items should be directed through the appropriate channels to your State delegate. Now is the time to put forward any suggestions, changes or recommendations.

The process of dealing with these items: These items are then collated by the Executive Officer for inclusion on the sub-committee agenda for discussion. All agenda items should be placed on a briefing paper to assist the committees in making decisions based on written information that is clear and concise. There is an opportunity for the members of the Executive to read through the information provided and decide on the proposal put forward whilst also considering the ramifications and alternatives. At all times the Executive are looking at the big picture and deciding "Is this in the best interests of the sport and the Association".

Obviously the answer needs to be yes to progress the items with a recommendation to the full Executive meeting. At all times the Executive make decisions based on this criteria, as is their fiduciary requirement. This upcoming meeting is very important and significant for a number of reasons, the proposed Constitution will be discussed at length taking into account the information received at and following State meetings in relation to the Constitution. The consensus from the States is that clubs agree with the Association moving to a company limited by guarantee. This being the case we can progress the Constitution to a working document that all members can agree to. I am sure once the document is completed and agreed to then that is the last time the average member and club will look at the document. The Constitution is not something to be feared, it is the "rules" that we as an Association abide by.

The other important issue we currently have on the agenda will include progressing with the National Ground and preliminary planning for the World DTL in 2018.

The Worlds in 2018 will be an opportunity to showcase the Association and the strength of the sport in Australia. Our results on the world stage have always been very consistent, we have numerous world champions at all levels, with the "home ground" advantage it would be great to be on the top of the podium for all of the team events. With the depth of talent in all categories of the individual events we also expect to be at the top of the podium.

Executive Officer's Report

The ACTA has been very active heading towards the World Championships in 2018. The National Ground has had drainage installed and progressed bids for funding with local State MP Darryl Maguire and Federal Member for Riverina, Michael McCormack. The result of these discussions will be followed up with separate submissions to the respective Governments for funding to bring the National Ground up to national and international standard. This would allow the ground to host international events including World DTL, Australia Cups and Grand Prix events on the international calendar.

Riverina Water County Council has recently agreed to a two-year sponsorship with the ACTA leading into the World Championships to allow the Association to irrigate the ground, thus ensuring a greater coverage of green grass around the site. This will also allow the Association to landscape the grounds into a more attractive venue not only for the sport but to attract "outside" income for the use of the ground and hopefully the new club house.

All of our current Trap sponsors have committed to the ACTA National Championships up to and including the 2018 Championships. These sponsors will be offered the first opportunity to sponsor at the World Championships in 2018. I meet with individual sponsors yearly where possible, although we talk often which gives both parties the opportunity to discuss innovative ideas and options that will be mutually beneficial. I wish to thank all of our sponsors for their professionalism and support of the Association. The ultimate winners are the shooters who are the recipients of all of the sponsorship product and money received in sponsorship.

The National Skeet Championships are on the horizon with nominations now being taken online through the ACTA website. As well as the National titles on offer there is also an ACTA Team to be selected to attend the World Skeet Championships in the US in October. The event has been growing substantially over the past few years and this is a credit to those long time Skeet attendees who contribute to the Nationals every year. A new skeet house has been built on the number one layout with the Wagga Pistol Club agreeing to close the range for the week of the Championships. This will allow the event to grow further into the future.

We have now started preliminary work on the World Championships with dates, times, venue, accommodation, travel options, all to be included on a brochure to be distributed in Ireland and added to the "World DTL 2018" page on the website. We are leaving nothing to chance as we prepare to host the event. The ground will boast 20 DTL Traps in 2017 allowing more participants for the Nationals and the World event.

Wagga City Council has agreed to partner the Association through Tourism Wagga Wagga. The staff of Tourism Wagga Wagga has met with National staff to plan the event which will be themed as a "multicultural" event.

Rule Interpretation

Earlier this month I was asked to give an answer to the following scenario.

QUESTION: A skeet shooter is on station 7 shooting doubles, he calls for the targets which are released and appear to be legal but then does not fire a shot at either target. He then admits to the Referee that he was lining up to shoot 7 high not 7 low.

There appears to be three options open to the Referee. One — does he accept that the shooter has refused the targets, not fired at either and restores both targets to be determined by a proof pair. Two — that the first target is lost and that a proof pair to be thrown to determine the result of the second target only or as a third choice, that both targets be declared lost.

Can you please let me know which Rule is relevant.

Incidently the Referee made the decision to declare both targets lost.

ANSWER:

Your second option is the correct one.

Had the shooter not admitted to being negligent in selecting the wrong target to shoot at, the Referee could have declared NO target and a proof pair be thrown to determine the result of both targets.

In this instance, because of the shooter's neglect, Rule 5.08(b) LOST target is the relevant rule.

5.08 LOST TARGET

Lost target shall be called when:

(b) The competitor fails to shoot because his gun is unloaded, or because the safety was incorrectly set or jarred back, whether from his oversight or not, or because of any other cause chargeable to his oversight or neglect (no target shall be allowed for the first target of any visit to a trap if a safety catch is engaged). Should this happen in doubles, the first target only should be declared lost and a proof pair shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot only. However, a shot shall be fired at each target in the proof pair.

The decision made by the Referee was incorrect.



DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Dispute resolution is never far from topics discussed at any level of sport as we experience different opinions. likes and dislikes.

As I see it there are nearly always two scenarios. The dispute either revolves around the sport itself or the administering of events, generally those that occur at Club/Zone or State level.

Your response will be different depending on the circumstances.

The shooting rules should be used when a dispute arises during an event. This applies to all ACTA members.

For issues after the event has concluded your Constitution (and Natural Justice) should be your guide to solving issues.

When an issue arises it should be dealt with as guickly as possible, firstly by getting the parties concerned to sit down calmly for discussion. It may not be possible to have both parties in the same room, so the opportunity to hear both sides of the story separately should be offered by your committee.

The committee may then make a recommendation and ask both parties to attend and advise them of the decision

The decision of the committee should take into account the seriousness of the offence. Should either party not be happy with the result they may appeal the decision. The club should then set up an independent tribunal to hear the appeal.

Importantly you should always be guided by your Constitution and Natural Justice. Everyone involved should have the expectation they will be able to be heard without bias.

Many issues can be sorted guickly and amicably with consultation and a calm approach.

Above all use the system to ensure you abide by your Constitution and the laws of Natural Justice.

Thursday February 4 has arrived again and the State Shooting Park was already buzzing with the usual caravanners and campers arriving to take up a vantage point for the annual South Australian Clay Target Association State Carnival, before the games begin tomorrow. The weather gods were kind to us this year with mild to warm temperatures forecast as opposed to the 40 – temperature of the last 2 years.

Trade stands were being erected and filled with heaps of exciting stuff for everyone to go through. Members of the State Championships Committee were busy out there setting the angles, heights and distances on all the traps and then the shooters came through to have a day of practice on the various layouts that they'll be using during the Carnival. Shooters that hadn't seen each other for ages were seen all over the park having a good laugh, telling stories and catching up on the last 12 months. Even the office was a flurry of activity as we made sure everything was in readiness for tomorrow, especially that all the Iollies were in their respective bowls for the staff!! As is always the case here at our State Shooting Park, venue caretaker & curator JoHanna Brown together with ICTC President Mario Pulverenti have spent an enormous amount of time behind the scenes preparing everything so that the competitors can come and have a great 3 days of competition without a worry in the world. Congratulations and well done again guys!

Attendances from nearly every State this year came in at a record 210 guns over the 3 days of competition, all vying to try their skill at claiming one of the many 'Red' State sashes that were on offer. Lurking around every corner and walking amongst us were some of the best shooters in Australia waiting to pounce and claim one of the available State titles. Most interstate visitors came in with their families for the events, and this certainly made for a large crowd of onlookers and a great ambiance at the grounds.

Early on the Friday morning from 6am, the officials were running around in a scurry of activity while final checks were done on the layouts. To this part, a word of thanks has to go out to the Chair of the Championships Committee (Steve Baynes) and his committed team for overseeing trap setups over the 3 days. Even the office was prepared for the rush of shooters at the ticket window. With nominations and squadding on cue, right on 9am sharp, 169 competitors started to get called and filed their way out to the walks to contest the 25 pair State Double Rise Championship. Conditions were calm with only a light breeze and temperatures around the low to mid 20's. However, by the time the shoot-off's started, it was a bit blowier which made the targets a little tricky for the shooters. It was over fairly quickly and when


the final results came in, they looked like this: C Grade 1st went to Nicholas Barnes with 50/70, while 2nd was Zoe Hawker 49/70. B Grade winner was Glenn Wilkinson 39/50 and 2nd went to Wayne Shaddock 37/50. 'A' Grade was taken out by Alexis Preston 44/50 and 2nd was Peter Digiannantonio 51/60. AA Grade 1st went to Craig Kelly with a 47/50 and 2nd was Stewart Forbes 55/60. The 'Overall' was taken by Ross Walsh with a well shot 49/50, sadly missing only his very last target and this meant earning Ross a 'Black Crow' badge. Veteran winner was Robert Andrews 44/50, Ladies was Alexis Preston 44/50 and the Junior went to Mitchell Iles 45/50.

Squad sheets for the 50 target State Handicap were already out so everyone started getting kitted up and at 12.30 we started the rounds to get through 33 squads of shooters. Chilled water made its way out to the grounds to keep everyone hydrated. As everyone came off, they were 3+4 deep at the scoreboard to see what the damage was, and how they had faired up. Conditions started to change as we got a bit further into the day with the afternoon winds that prevail here

to contend with. Eventually, everything went quiet and the shoot-offs went to the grounds to decide the top 10 positions. The greatest thing to see was that the top 2 positions were being shot off by 2 juniors. The crowds gathered around the fences to watch for a result while these 2 guys went target for target. Final results for the State Handicap were like this: 10th place - Craig Kelly 46/52, 9th place – Jack McInnis 47/52, 8th – Sox Pilipasidis 51/56, 7th - Colin Dunn 53/58, 6th -Ashley Hawker - 54/58, 5th - Vince Petraccaro 47/51, 4th - Peter Quire 51/55, 3rd - Nicholas Barnes 52/55, 2nd (after a great shoot off) went to Will Smithwick with 60/63, and taking the 'Overall' as well as earning himself an extra 2 metres was Will Jenkins with 61/63. A great day with everything over by 6pm.

As the 1st day drew to a close, everyone headed out to some of the local hotels and eateries for a well earned break and to get refreshed for the start of the qualifying events on the Saturday morning.

Saturday morning started bright and early right on 8.30 and the first event to greet the 34 squads was the State Single Barrel Championship in near

As the shooters came off, they were all hanging around the scoreboard to see if there were any 'red' scores. 6 competitors shot the perfect score and went to fight it out for the title. When all was said and done, C Grade 1st was Nicholas Barnes 46/50 and 2nd went to Will Jenkins 43/50. B Grade went to Frank Kentish on 44/50 and 2nd place Wayne Shaddock 43/50. 'A' grade was Kelvyn Prescott with a 48/50 and 2nd to Elio Marianello 74/50. AA winner was Mark Davis 57/58 and 2nd went to Justin Smith 53/54. The 'Overall' State Title was taken by Tarryn Shaddock after a shootoff, scoring 58/58. Great effort! Veteran winner was Rito Borzillo 49/50. Ladies went to Lisa Hawker 47/50 and the Junior winner was Tarryn Shaddock 50/50.

Most of the competitors got to have a small break here while the South Australian Zone teams came out to contest their titles. The 25 target event was shot as a Double Barrel with a point's countback and the final count's look like this: Open winners were Central Zone with 124 targets shot out

of 125 and 364/375 points. Team members were Robbie Clark, Dennis Lymn, Michael Veenstra, Jack Tapscott and Luke Higgins. The Veteran Team winners were also the Central Zone with 71/75 targets and 209/225 points. This team was made up of Rito Borzillo, Max Pontifex & Frank Caltagirone. The Junior winning team was Eastern Zone on 71/75 targets and 208/225 points. Team was Fred Wheaton, Claire Wheaton & Will Jenkins. Eastern also took out the Ladies with 71/75 targets and 204/225 points. Team was made up of Heather Ryan, Deb McPherson & Sue Crane. Well done to everyone that competed and congratulations to all the Zone winners.

Then, the battle was on for the State Double Barrel Championship. 208 competitors took to the walks to see who was capable of concentrating long enough and

how they would fair up in this 50 target event. There were murmurs that there was going to be a heap of 'red' scores on the board and some long shoot-offs but it wasn't to be. The conditions deteriorated during the afternoon with those head winds coming back and the targets rising rapidly. As the crowds watched from the fence line, everything was over reasonably quickly and there were no really high breaks to be had. C Grade 1st went to Nicholas Barnes 53/57, 2nd was Sean Coffey 53/57. B Grade was Wayne Shaddock 1st on 49/50 and lack McInnis took 2nd 52/55. 'A' went to Anthony Caltagirone 70/71, with Beth Hayden taking 2nd 51/52. AA was taken by Steven Trembath 86/87, with lordan King picking up the 2nd placing on 70/71. The Double Barrel 'Overall' State Title 'Red Sash' and State silver medallion went to Darryn Nicholls 87/87. Veteran winner was Rito Borzillo with a perfect score of 50/50; Junior went to Jarred Nicholls, on 52/52, and the Ladies winner was Beth Hayden, also on 50/50.

Shot in conjunction with the State Double Barrel event was the (SA 5) Club Team event (5 members registered with the same SA Club). Runner up for the event was Port Augusta on 240/250 and the outright winner claiming the honours was 'Elsewhere Clay Target Club' shooting 244/250 targets. Team members were: - Steve & Deserie Baynes. Martin & Ross Collumb and David Porter.

When the shooting had finished for the day, everyone headed for the showers and to get changed for the presentation dinner. Awards and prizes were given out for the first 2 days of competition with all the major sponsors present to say a few words about themselves, their sponsorship and to congratulate the winners of their events. Our Saturday night dinner was a cold buffet this year as we went through the official part of the night. Kelly said despite the quality of 2015, he hoped to continue his good form early in 2016. "I'd love to perform well in New Zealand and come home with the win for Australia." he said.

Cazzo's Kamblings

MAY 2016

On Wednesday the 17th of February 2016 a small band of dedicated Skeet shooters assembled at the Cecil Park Clay Target Club in Sydney to commemorate a significant mile-

stone in the career of one of the ACTA's most iconic Skeet shooters. That gentleman was Reg Clarke and the occasion was his ninetieth birthday. Strictly speaking his actual birthday fell on the Friday of

that week. But as Wednesday afternoon is the traditional timeslot for old die-hard Skeet shooters to gather at their local Club to socialise, reminisce and even shoot occasionally, the traditional mid week timing was retained.

In Party Mode

From all reports a great day was had by all. The weather gods were kind and the only bump in the road for the whole day was when Reg showed that he is still human and actually missed a target for a change. His ongoing string of Wednesday afternoon 25s was temporarily interrupted by an errant High Two. However nothing could dampen the spirits of those present and both Reg and his wife lean enjoyed a great day with good friends and I'm told the birthday cake didn't last long after it had been cut. Some time ago the ACTA asked me to try to amass some history on all the currently inducted Hall of Fame members. As Reg is widely acknowledged as the Godfather of ACTA Skeet shooting, I decided that this occasion was a suitable catalyst to get started on that project.

Once Upon a Time

Reginald George Clarke was born in Granville NSW on the 19th of February 1926. He was the only son of Reginald (Snr) and Harriet Clarke, who later provided Reg with a little sister when they added a daughter Dawn to the family. Reg completed his Primary and Secondary education in the local area and then attended Sydney Technical College to study for a diploma in Civil Engineering. This eventually lead to him spending most of his working life at the NSW Public Works Department where he excelled in the area of design and development of waste water

treatment plants, eventually retiring in 1984. He met the love of his life Jean when they were 18 and they will celebrate their 66th wedding anniversary this year.

From Bikes to Guns

Although he did a little field shooting, his initial primary sporting interest was motor cycle racing. which he pursued very successfully for well over a decade. However in 1964, at the age of 38, he discovered the Royal Aero Gun Club at Bankstown, which effectively ended his bike racing career. Like most of us around that time he bought a "jackhammer" (A5 Browning auto) from the local gun shop and got stuck into Trap shooting. Unfortunately a freak accident some years before while performing car repairs had seriously damaged his right eye. So a change to the left shoulder and some very creative and artistic stock work over the years was the nett result. Once he started to travel around to other clubs he encountered the "Hawkesbury crew" who introduced him to Skeet shooting and the rest is history.

Nothing Easy

Over the next fifty odd years he went on to

become one of the most accomplished and respected Skeet shooters this country has ever produced. However none of this came easily. Unlike his bike racing, where he had a natural flair, Reg's shooting career was a testament to his determination to overcome a string of ongoing obstacles. First it was the awkward and uncomfortable transition to left handed and then to make matters worse a total lack of natural ability to hit a moving target became glaringly obvious. A popular expression around that time for shooters of limited skill related to their inability to "hit the broad side of a barn". Reg assured me that his only way to accomplish that task would have been to go inside the barn and shut all the doors and windows.

Seesawing Fortunes

However after about eight years of constant practice, trial and error and dogged determination, he was starting to get the hang of it. So he decided to travel to Griffith in 1972 for the Nationals which included the third staging of the National Skeet Championship. Now we start a seesawing story of the good news and the bad news. First some bad news. Just prior to this event Reg had started to suffer from another unforeseen problem: Trigger Freeze. Then some good news. Reg hit every target in the event that he fired at. Then some more bad news. He only fired at 49 and could not get his finger to respond on the other one. Then some more good news. No-one else managed to break any more than 49 either. Then some more bad news, but only for the other people in the shoot-off. Reg managed to shoot almost two more rounds in the shoot-off without either a miss or another freeze and eventually sent Vince Petersen back to New Zealand with the runner-ups purse.

Where to now?

However the shine of the Silver Australia Badge on his jacket was clouded by his inability to find a cure for an ever worsening freezing problem. After about a year of failed cures and frustration, Reg was on the brink of throwing in the towel and giving up shooting. But then a chance meeting with some visiting American shooters at the Nationals in 1973 introduced him to the concept of release triggers, which even in the US were still in their infancy. Although this eventually proved to be the magical cure, not just for Reg, but for so many others who followed in his wake, it was no easy fix.

A Hard Road

What followed was a marathon effort involving a number of people including Reg's good friends, Dick Snow and Dick Hunt, who put in an enormous amount of time and effort. First they had to figure out how to actually build it, then how to make it safe, then how to make it reliable and then refine it until it was user friendly. And then to add insult to injury, once all this was accomplished they had to go through all the drama of getting it approved for use by the

ACTA. Fortunately they had a few influential people on side like Ernie Hawkins and Pud Burgess, as a lot of people (who obviously didn't freeze) were very negative towards the concept. Lesser men would have wilted under the strain!

In the Beginning

Although we had obviously passed like ships in the night for several years prior, I did not really get to know Reg until 1979. Our first memorable encounter involved an Interstate Team Shoot at Geelong in 1979 and a very rude shock. So let me back up a couple of years and set the scene. State Skeet Carnivals did not start until the late 1970s, mainly because State Associations only began forming around that time. The first two Skeet Carnivals kicked off in October of 1977. The Victorian one was held at Wangaratta to provide the easiest access for NSW shooters and the NSW one was staged a week later at Wagga for the same reason. Although interstate rivalry amongst Skeet shooters, particularly between Victoria and NSW, had been building up for some time, these two Carnivals brought the matter not just to head, but to a fever pitch.

Bob at his Best

Melbourne Gun Club was undoubtedly the strongest Skeet shooting club in Australia at that time. Additionally, nearly all of the most acclaimed Skeet shooters in the country lived close by and operated out of that venue. Names like Ken Lowry, Alex Crikis, Ian Hale and John Summers spring immediately to mind. This put the president of Melbourne Gun Club, Bob Buchan, never one to be shy anyway, in the enviable position of probably being able to back up most of the outlandish boasts he made in relation to his beloved Club and their Skeet shooting team. During that first Wangaratta Carnival he taunted the NSW shooters by claiming that Melbourne Gun Club could single handedly field no less than three teams, all of whom could defeat any team presented by NSW. Consequently several Teams Matches were vigorously contested at Wagga the following weekend.

The Pendulum Swings

Unfortunately, on that first auspicious occasion the Melbourne Gun Club Team was unable to produce that particular rabbit out of the hat, much to the delight of the NSW contingent. However, the official Victorian Team did manage to defeat their NSW opponents on their home turf and this precipitated an interstate Team shooting rivalry that raged for many years and still lingers today. NSW undoubtedly gained the moral high ground the following year in 1978. First at Melbourne Gun Club, when their visiting team only failed by a single target over the entire program to match Victoria's score. Final result 958 to 959. And then more so a few weeks later, when the NSW Carnival was staged at Reg's home club of Hawkesbury and the Victorian contingent decided that discretion was probably the better part of valour and stayed safely at home.

Out of Range?

This seemingly cowardly failure of Victoria to

present themselves for the dish of humble pie that NSW had on the menu for them is probably what incited "Reg and Co" to covertly plan a pre-emptive strike into Victoria for the following year, 1979. The Victorian Carnival was scheduled for Geelong that year. As this is still well within the Victorian heartland, but about as far from the NSW border as you can get, we obviously had good reason to be quite complacent. And when the NSW team arrived we saw no reason to question Billy lles' summation when he dismissed them out of hand as "a motley looking bunch of old stiffs". And that was just one of a number of valuable lessons we learned the hard way that weekend: Never judge a book by its cover.

A Strong Brigade

Unbeknown to us Reg had selected his "attack team" very carefully. With his 1972 National crown, his own credentials were obvious. But we definitely should not have underestimated his close friend Adrian Hayes, who had stolen our State Title away from us the previous year at Melbourne. And just to rub salt into the wound, he proceeded to repeat that performance again at Geelong, before travelling to Griffith two weeks later to win their NSW High Gun. Reg had also convinced Ray Melville, who went on to be National Skeet Champion in 1982, to make the long trip down from Tamworth. Plus they collected Barney Rooke from Wagga on the way through and he went on to be National Skeet Champion in 1987. And to round out the squad they picked up Graham Martin from Canberra on the way past as he was in top form at that time. To cut a long story short, the nett result was they gave us a fair old caning and rubbed our noses

Every Dark Cloud

The only upside to the whole ordeal was the long and close friendships I forged with Reg and most of the rest of his "motley bunch". On at least one occasion I enjoyed Reg and Jean's hospitality when a major Carnival was held at Hawkesbury. Ray Melville and I spent many happy afternoons shooting together on his private skeet range at Tamworth. Barney Rooke staged many great Skeet Shoots at Wagga over the years and we always looked forward to shooting together on the same squad. Unfortunately Adrian Hayes was sadly taken from us way too early, but I had the honour of sponsoring a memorial event for him at one of the early Skeet Nationals. And Graham Martin? Like a minority in our game he emulated that appropriately named night sky phenomenon, the shooting star. He glowed brightly but briefly and then disappeared before I got a chance to know him. In closing, we did square up the team shooting ledger with them a couple of years later in Griffith, but that's another story for another day.

Like the Duracell Bunny

Over the next decade Reg stayed at the forefront of Skeet shooting wherever he went, adding a couple of NSW State Titles and a Commonwealth Skeet Championship to his resume. Plus at the first Skeet Nationals in 1983 he qualified for the Australian Team that attended the World Skeet Championships in 1984. However the early to mid 1990s, when he was in his mid to late 60s was undoubtedly his "finest hour". He added a couple more National Skeet Championships in 1990 and 1995, both at Townsville where the background is challenging. And

between these he went to Wagga in 1993 and beat the great Brian Thomson in a shoot-off to win the National Skeet Doubles event.

A Worker as Well

He served on the Committee of the Hawkesbury Gun Club over many years in various positions including the President. He was eventually awarded life membership which transferred to Cecil Park when urban sprawl eventually

necessitated relocation to that venue. During his career he was named on eight All Australian Teams and qualified for at least two Glenn Trophy teams against New Zealand. Therefore it's no wonder that when the ACTA commenced a Skeet Shooting Hall of Fame in 2008,

Reg was the obvious choice to be the inaugural inductee.

Perfect night for Handicap

MATHOURA GUN CLUB. FEBRUARY 26, 2016

February, Friday the 26th 2016 was a perfect night for clay target shooting at the Mathoura Gun Club, after all the days of very hot weather Echuca/Moama had been dished out to date, 30 degrees and the gentlest of a cool breeze was very easy to contend with. As well it was almost moonless, with the black sky making the white targets under lights really stand out for the shooters.

The first event was a fifteen target Double Barrel Cash Divide, and it was an all Mathoura affair with local members, Rhys Glenn and Bill Simpson sharing all the cash having recorded a 14/15 score each.

The 2nd event was a ten target, Single Barrel Cash Divide, and Deniliquin's Bruce Cook matched Club President Peter McCluskey's score of 9/10, and beating all the other shooters they both shared all the Cash Divide.

The main event, a 25 target Handicap, with the back mark shooter being 22 metres and quite a few shooters off the front mark of 15 metres, and a relatively new local member, Rhys Glenn, surprised himself and all others by top scoring with a 22/25, and with that, having his first major win, Overall 1st in the Handicap. Well shot Rhys Glenn, congratulations. 2nd placing was another Mathoura member Thomas McCluskey with a well shot 20/25, and third placing after a shoot off between Bill Simpson and another local member George Bradley ended up being Bill Simpson after George managed to let one target go.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 3. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 5. For the National 28gauge Championship load size is limited to 21gr (3/4oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7. For the National .410bore Championship load size is limited to 14gr (1/2oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7"
- 6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management.
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONETARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONETARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE** (5) **TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 14. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Women's, Junior's or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 15. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 20. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
- 22. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
- 23. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Other games people play

Regular readers of these articles will have heard me mention Tim Gallwey. Tim was a successful sportsman at both tennis and golf. The Inner Game: it is important. His greatest claim to fame was his books, The Inner Game of Golf and the Inner Game of Tennis.

Gallwey argues that there are always two games going on: the outer game (the one you play on the field or on the trap layout) and the inner game (the one you play in your head).

Shooting, like all sports, involves these two games; the outer game and the inner game. The outer game involves the sport itself; shooting the target. The outer game involves physical fitness, well fitting gun, reliable ammunition, correct stance and gun hold and all of the variables that are outside the shooter. The inner game involves mental fitness and relies on each of us having trust in our own ability to do what is required. Inner game strategies involve concentration, mental rehearsal, awareness, attention, relaxation, goal setting, etc.

The problem with either trap or skeet shooting is that an error will usually cost you the game or the match. There are rarely, second chances. In tennis, you can be down forty - love and still win the game; one or two poor strokes in Golf doesn't put you out. However, depending on the day, 24/25 or 49/50 may not be good enough. If a person can do something as difficult and as complicated as shoot a small moving object 49 times out of 50, then the problem is not with their technique, equipment or ability. The problem is most likely involves the inner game. We miss because we doubt our own ability.

To understand the difference between the inner and outer games and the concept of self doubt and trust I strongly suggest you read the Inner Game of Golf. The book is old now but is still very current in the concepts and constructs it tries to explain. The arguments in the book allow us to make sense of what happens when something goes wrong and we miss.

In his next book, The Inner Game of Tennis, Gallwey explains the other games that people play on and off the court. I will change the examples from tennis to shooting to illustrate what he is saying. It must be remembered that much of this game playing comes from our subconscious motivation: it is not something we think about.

The first game is the Good Game. The general aim is excellence and the general motive is to prove oneself "Good". The first type of "Good" gamer is the one striving to be perfect. How good can I get? Can I reach the highest standard? If I can prove myself competent then I am worthy of the respect of myself and others. In this game there are external obstacles such as the never-closing gap between one's idea of perfection and one's apparent ability. There are also internal obstacles, which involve the internal self-criticism for not being as close to perfect as one would like. This can lead to discouragement, compulsively trying too hard, which can lead to a sense of inferiority. It will lead to a fear of not measuring up.

The second type of "Good" gamer is the one who is striving to be complete. Here 'god' is measured against the performance of others rather than a set standard. For this person it is not about how good he played but whether he won or lost. The general aim is to win, be the best and beat all others. The motivation comes from wanting to be the top of the heap and stems from the need for admiration and control. For this gamer the external obstacle is that there is always someone who can and will beat you. Internal obstacles include the mind's preoccupation with comparing oneself with others. This will lead to thoughts of inferiority alternating with superiority. This will also lead to a fear of defeat.

The third type of "good" gamer is about how good do I look. Good is measured by how good I look. Style is important. This person has a strong desire for attention and praise. The external obstacles are that one can never look good enough. The internal obstacle is confusion about who he really is. The fear is about not pleasing everyone and the imagined loneliness that it will bring.

The second game is the Friends Game. The first type of 'Friend" gamer is one striving for status. Desire for friendship is prominent, but they must be the right friends. The second 'friend' gamer is in it for the companionship. The motive is a desire for friendships and acceptance.

The third game is the Health or Fun Game. The object is to play to maintain health, have fun or move to a higher level of consciousness.

The problem with the 'Good' Gamer is that we are more than what we are measuring ourselves against. Who said you should be measured by how you do things? Who said I should be measured at all? Human beings cannot be measured by performance or any other arbitrary measurement. Our worth is more than how we achieve or perform at a given moment on a given task. We must remember that my score does not define my identity, nor does it give me cause to consider myself as something more or less than I was before the match.

I have taken a brief portion of the Inner Game of Tennis to try and illustrate a point between the inner and outer games. If you only read two books this year then I suggest you read both the Inner Game of Golf and the Inner Game of Tennis. For more information about games, Eric Berne's book The Games People Play also offers some good insight.




To complete a full day of skeet shooting a 50 Target Handicap was programmed and this event proved to be very popular as it gives all shooters a more equal chance.
