DTL NATIONALS

Before I start this very positive column I would like to apologise about the dust at the Nationals. We have had months of groundworks earlier this year and large events leading up to the Nationals (including over 540 vans on the grounds the fortnight prior) The grounds currently has access to a limited water supply and water restrictions. All of these circumstances made for a dusty outlook but those speeding towards the practice layouts didn't help much either. We are looking at ways to

improve the situation in the future.

Otherwise I hope all competitors enjoyed the Nationals as much as I did. I believe the performances of three shooters, Pat Guida winning the Gold Australia for the High Gun, Craig Kelly taking two Silver Australia's home and Emma Cox shooting 749-750 to be the highest qualifier in the Glenn Cup and World Championship teams stood out above all others.

The other team members selected for the forthcoming DTL World Championships and the Glenn Cup for 2017 along with all other National Title winners are also to be congratulated. The Ladies Mackintosh Team of Emma Cox, Tracey Barton and Laura Wooley shooting the teams score clean with 900-900 was another highlight. There were far too many other exceptional performances to mention here and congratulations go to you all.

The Opening ceremony provided quite a spectacle with all State teams now presented beautifully and wearing their State colours with pride. The initiative suggested by Team manager Matt Patmore, of having the successful Glenn Cup team march in full uniform gave those present a look at how the Association now present your teams for international competitions and I thank the Team members both for bringing home the Cup and for so proudly joining in as part of the opening ceremony. You will see more of this in the future as we endeavour to lift the level of prestige attached to our representative teams.

The cash prizemoney may be reviewed upwards next year as will the popular lucky draws at presentations. I think the most popular win was without doubt Craig Fitzgerald and he featured twice when he was not on the grounds when drawn and got the prize for the most popular loss also. Well done Craig and congratulations to those drawn who were present and collected the \$500 cash prizes. The evening entertainment at the BBQ area was also great. The charity chosen for the BBQ donations was represented by Rob Viney and on his behalf I thank all who made donations to this worthy cause.

Traps, targets and target presentation were not commented on much and I believe they were up there with the best. The Office staff, Shoot Marshalls and Tournament Director helped us finish on time each day and this is great for our sponsors to have large crowds present each evening, giving them the best possible exposure. We have made changes to help achieve this outcome and I can assure you all, this is the plan ongoing.

Next year should be bigger and better with bigger prizemoney a possibility,

more layouts being constructed and more entertainment. I thank all our workers and our sponsors of the event.

I enjoyed the Trap Nationals and now look forward to the skeet.

AGM

The largest attendance in many years at an AGM (61 clubs) was no doubt prompted by the proposal for a new Constitution, although no questions were raised following the meeting. I have been disappointed in the bad publicity received on the proposed draft, before we were given the chance to get the State input at the forums held. The draft was exactly that, a draft, and now following input from States and forums the document has been revised.

A timeframe as follows has been put in place.

3rd April – 2nd draft provided to Executive.

29th April – Receive Executive Input on 2nd draft.

19th June – Revised 3rd draft after Executive input goes to full Executive meeting.

29th July – 4th draft after Executive meeting consideration be provided to States and via them, clubs for further input.

30th September – Receive input from clubs and States via States.

October date TBA – Executive approve final document to present to 2017 AGM.

I hope this timeframe is acceptable as we received much criticism for what was perceived as too short a timeframe being adopted last year.

HALL OF FAME

A great night saw one of our greatest contemporary shots in Darryn Nicholls and a Lady from a completely different era, Pam Moloney nee Coxon, inducted. Congratulations to them both and all the other award winners on the night. Thanks to Sue Vesperman for the presentation of the room for the evening.

EXECUTIVE MEETING

A decision has been made to ask for Shooting Australia's support for the Association to again administer our coaching accreditation and re-accreditation programs. We believe that we are quite capable of administering these programs efficiently and effectively and aim to shorten timeframes and improve delivery.

A decision has been made to advertise for ISSF shooter input via State Associations to the ACTA for the compilation of a selection policy more acceptable to our ISSF shooters and the Association generally. This will be presented to Shooting Australia as a recommendation from the Association when the post Rio review is conducted.

A decision has been made to put forward to the International Clay Target Shooting Federation a proposal to align the ages for veterans in the Mackintosh competition with the ages used in the World DTL event. We will also be requesting that the ages for all age based sections be as at the 1st of January in the year of competition as is the World DTL criteria.

Executive Officer's Report

At a meeting of the ACTA Executive in April it was decided to call for submissions for changes to the Shooting Australia selection policies. This is an opportunity to provide options for consideration when Shooting Australia review their policies after the 2016 Olympic games. The ACTA was advised of the decision of Shooting Australia in Canberra in September 2015. The Australian Institute of Sport were at the meeting and agreed to assist in the review. Now is the time to provide submissions through to your State for advancement to the ACTA. The article and details is on page 64 under ACTA news.

The National Trap Championship was a fantastic event with a great atmosphere and spirit from the layout to the Club house.

Unfortunately we had a couple of sour notes to the event that the general membership need to understand. All those who are next to you on the layouts and in the Club do not necessarily have the same ethics. One of our Major sponsors Winchester had three advertising signs removed from the compound fence. These are one off articles produced for the 150 year celebration of the company. Make no mistake they are Stolen. It is a sad day when we cannot put flags out to promote the sport and our sponsors. If you see these "souvenirs" take care, the people that have them are not ethical.

There was another case of a truck being "milked" of fuel and had Tools boxes raided. This could necessitate further security being employed at a cost to competitors, again the ACTA would rather put the money into something for those nominated, but then this appears to be someone amongst us. What a Sad way to finish. I understand there have been instances of dishonesty at Clubs regarding prizes taken that were not the persons to take.

Moving on to more enjoyable topics and they are always advancing the ACTA as a National organisation. Over the next three months there will be a series of articles to do with a new Constitution. These articles will seek to explain the reasons and the changes that are being proposed. The major consensus is that the majority agree to move to a company limited by guarantee. Any registered shooter is allowed to attend the AGM, Clubs will retain the right to vote at the AGM. We are also looking at removing much of the Legal "jargon" to simplify the document for easier understanding.

Congratulations to all of those winners and placegetters at the National Trap Championships, there can never be enough accolades for those who reach the pinnacle of their sport, winning a National Championship is one of those only achieved by shooters with talent and a work ethic to match. To those who made the Mackintosh Teams, congratulations, and those who will represent the ACTA in Ireland in the World DTL Championships, congratulations also, getting there is the first accomplishment, being at your best for the event is the next. Good Luck to everyone selected and to those who are choosing to go to the event, you are also representatives of the ACTA.

The Skeet Championships will commence on the 21st of May, another very strong event judging by the entries so far. With a Glenn Cup and World Skeet team to be selected we expect another strong Championship.

To all of our sponsors, both Trap and Skeet on behalf of the shooters thanks again for your continued support, the provision of sponsor prizes plus cash prizes ensures the winners are rewarded for their wins. The Skeet Championships will also feature Cash lucky draws at the Presentations that were a feature of the Trap Championships.

Soil testing has been completed in preparation for the possible building of a new clubhouse and offices. The results of those tests are now available with the building Sub-committee to determine the options available for making a recommendation to the Executive.

Works continue on the National ground with a new skeet layout now in operation for the Skeet Championships. The layout has been completed to ensure it is the same as the existing layouts with all shooting pads completed and fences installed. We are now in the process of installing two ball traps on the ground in front and to the side of layout two and four, whilst two more trap houses will be installed between layout 15 - 16 on the fence line between the ACTA ground and our Neighbour. We will be relocating the fence to accommodate this installation with the other being installed then as the twentieth trap on our neighbours land. It goes without saying that without the ongoing support and co-operation from Mr. Rod Brown this would not be possible. We thank Rod for his support over many years and look forward to his continued support in the future. Rod has given the ACTA an undertaking we will be given first option to buy the land that we are currently using .

Further levelling at the ground has been possible through Don Power and his local contacts. Don has arranged additional "fill" from local excavators with the only cost being machinery to level the fill. Without Don's local building knowledge this would have been a very expensive exercise. With a wet winter we believe we can have a ground covered by grass by the end of September 2016. We are also investigating the de-silting of a current dam in the far left hand corner of the ground, this would enable us to have a supply of water to further water the usable areas of the ground.

We have now started preliminary work on the 2018 World Championships with dates, times, venue, accommodation, travel options all to be included on a brochure to be distributed in Ireland and added to the a "World DTL 2018" page on the website. We are leaving nothing to chance as we prepare to host the event.

The ground will boast 20 DTL Traps in 2017 allowing more participants for the Nationals and the World event.

We have had preliminary talks with all current sponsors in relation to the event, with all of our current sponsors enthusiastic about sponsoring the World Championships in some capacity.

The National Championships for 2016 commenced in brilliant weather with temperature around the early 30's, dropping slightly later in the week to high 20's.

The opening State Shoulder to Shoulder events were conducted with New South Wales Juniors – Nathan Burt, Jessy Ciappara, Brody Walters 74/222 taking the event.

The Ladies event was won by Western Australia with the team of Sandra Moffatt, Jessica Price, Nikki March with 74/220.

The South Australian team of Rito Borzillo, Robert Andrews, and Peter Claridge took out the Veterans in a sign of what was to come from Bob Andrews.

South Australia claimed the Open State teams event. This year's team consisted of Craig Bentley, Michael Veenstra, Darryn Nicholls, Robert Clark, Vince Bone, 125/373.



The official opening commenced with the piper leading in all teams representing their States with pride. For the first time the victorious Glenn Cup team marched with the States before presenting the Glenn Cup to National President Robert Nugent. In 2017 the New Zealand and Australian Teams will march at the end of the Glenn cup match that will be shot prior to the opening.

Patron Kay Hull was joined by the Deputy Mayor of Wagga Wagga, Councillor Dallas Tout, Bede Spanagle, Riverina Water senior engineer.

ACTA President Robert Nugent welcomed all shooters and dignitaries to the Championships and to the National Ground.

The best dressed team, Tasmania,

was announced and Kay Hull presented the SACTA Perpetual Trophy, donated by South Australian Clay Target Association. Kay also awarded each team member with an ACTA Gold medal.

The Deputy Mayor, with the assistance of Steve Schiller, then fired the opening shot to open the Championships.





This is to be the first of a series of short articles planned for future editions exploring the concepts and purposes of the proposed new constitution for the ACTA. It is common knowledge that an earlier draft attracted criticism from a wide spectrum of members and state associations and that, as a consequence, the National Executive withdrew the proposal from the 2016 Annual General Meeting. Your executive has taken on board the major concerns of members and the current draft differs in certain very significant aspects to the previous one.

Before we commence on the "why" and the "what" let's get the major objections to the previous draft out of the way right at the beginning. Those as expressed to the Executive were as follows:

- Loss of the clubs' vote at the AGM
- Lack of State representation on the Board
- ACTA power to oversee and intervene in a state or club's business and
- Lack of publication of by-laws.

Firstly under the revised draft clubs will retain the right to nominate delegates to vote at the AGM as occurs now. Also individual members will remain welcome at AGMs – in other words no change.

Secondly the revised draft calls for one representative to be elected from each state and territory making a total of seven directors. However the selection process will differ somewhat to the current system but this will be explored in detail in a later article.

Thirdly the requirements have been simplified from the old constitution to remove many of the direct specific requirements of the ACTA for Clubs and states in relation to reporting and intervention. A later article will go into greater detail about membership.

Fourthly, while there never was any suggestion of "hiding" the by-laws, they will be published on the website and discussed in detail over the next few months. A point needs to be made here that it is standard practice for associations to have the power to make by-laws and indeed the current constitution empowers the executive to:

determine rules, regulations, by-laws, policies, procedures for the governance and management of the Association and the sport of clay target shooting in Australia.

There will be no change as the future board will have the same power as the current executive, no more no less, to determine rules, regulations, by-laws, policies and procedures.

There were other issues but to our knowledge those were the major stumbling blocks. As we progress through the document over the next few months it is intended that other lesser concerns will also be addressed.

However all members are hereby invited to comment on this and future articles and/or make constructive suggestions. After all this is your organisation and you have a right to help determine the future of ACTA.

Now let us explore the reasons why we need to change

A constitution is the document which outlines the rules by which an organisation may legally conduct its business. Almost invariably the content and direction of a constitution reflect in part the prevailing political trends, social standards, laws and ethics at the time of its formal acceptance. However a constitution, while obviously important, is just a document and should never be regarded as written in stone as political trends, accepted standards, laws and ethics affecting associations are continually changing. Therefore a responsible organisation should incorporate into its business regular reviews of its constitution for current relevance and appropriateness. Organisations that do so are generally more successful being prepared to be progressive, innovative and dynamic. Our current constitution was formally accepted at the 2001 AGM but was many years in its development. Now fifteen years later it is a very different world so it was high time for a review which your executive undertook on your behalf.

In order to get better recognition for our sport, grow our sport and get

more government funding/recognition we need to change. Currently ACTA is incorporated in Victoria but operates within NSW and is separately registered as a national body. Obviously it would be better to truly organised and registered as a national entity not only saving costs associated with two registrations but more likely to be recognised by the Commonwealth Government as a national sporting organisation. Further, current standards and legislation signify the need to change to a more contemporary model such as a company limited by guarantee.

Some of the drivers for change include:

- Increased transparency in the association
- Changing nature of the political cycle
- Changes in government policy and regulations
- Changing member expectations
- Changing demographics
- Changing national and international priorities
- Increased necessity to collaborate with government
- Technological changes and
- Fiscal management.

Space considerations precludes a detailed analysis of the above drivers for change but it is doubtful if any reasonable person would disagree that things have changed and will continue to change. Unfortunately the saying "if it aint broke don't fix it" is not particularly useful for any modern organisation be it an international company or a simple incorporated club association. As indicated above the most successful organisations are those that move with the times so let's get ACTA moving as well!




The traps were set on the morning "in still air", as the mist could be seen rising off the dam as the sun came up over the distance hill on what was a beautiful day weather wise.

Victorious 2016 Glenn Cup Team

It's contested in Skeet and ISSF shooting, but in this report, a Trap event. On 10 occasions it's ended in a draw. So if there's any one with a mind for the details that could fill me in as to why this is, then by all means please call me I'd love to know why.

But back to this years Glenn Cup. Before we'd even left home, I'd been given the job of transporting the Cup, and each day before we left I'd walk past it sitting up on my dining table, looking at the years we'd won, wondering what each of the team members since 1960 had thought about being in this team,

And looking at the fact that we'd won the lion share of the event. I had a terrible thought . . . what if we don't win!!! I'd just read the February CTSN and seen Nigel Hughes's article that our Skeet boys had just been and defeated the Kiwi's, and on the same ground. No pressure there, could you dream of the ribbing a Trap shooter would get from one of the winning team Skeet shooters?? Well I can and that's the last thing I wanted to be part of.

All of our team had decided to shoot the whole of the New Zealand Trap Nationals. The team was Glen Castellaro, Dan Power, Matty Patmore, Craig Kelly and Wayne Hawker.

To say we showed our hand early would be a little bit of an understatement, because every team member got a little something from the Kiwi table.

And speaking of tables, we had the honour of being invited to the New Zealand Hall of Fame Dinner, which Dan, Craig, Wayne and myself, with Craig's lovely wife Helen and my ever understanding partner Tracey attended. It was a little different to our dinners, with more speeches, and a

few to stir us up. A few more awards such as a different long run from 15m, that goes from miss to miss, but it doesn't end till you miss, so if you shoot at 10 clubs and don't miss it counts as your long break.

But to the shooting. It started with Craig Kelly in the Ball Trap where he went out and smashed the 50 targets to get into the shoot off and went on to claim the runner-up. Next up was Dan Power who took to them in the New Zealand Minis, and again another team member grabs the runner-up. Two days in and we're looking good, then the change, up until this point the days had been mid to high 20's. But that wasn't to stay. The 3rd day I woke to hear 160km winds and rain!! Thinking that's not going to be any good for anyone along comes Wayne Hawker. And knocks out the qualifying in the Triples (mixed targets but no doubles) and then goes on to grab 3rd. So by the 4th day that leaves Glenn and myself on a big goose egg. Not looking great, and getting colder.

Then came the New Zealand Single Rise (Double Barrel to us) and after the qualifying I just assumed all five of us would go after them in the shoot

off. But I was somewhat wrong, only three of us made the cut. Craig Kelly, Wayne Hawker and myself (Matty Patmore). To cut to about 150 targets into the shoot off I think it was Craig Kelly who said "How good would it be if we came first second and third?" At this stage, a great idea but what are the odds? There could be 15 still going. So in about another 50 targets there we are the three Aussie Glenn Cup team mates 1 2 3. So a quick hand shake to honour the moment and back into it. Maybe another 50 and it's all over. Myself the victor, Wayne 2nd and Craig 3rd. So at this point we think we've got this Cup all but home. We've shown we can shoot double barrel. The Glenn Cup Match is 50 target Double Barrel, but is scored Points. Before the match we were going to shoot in our Australian Glenn Cup shirts and black pants. But at this stage it's all of 11 degrees with a little wind and cloud to help. So it's jumpers under the shirts to try and keep warm, and anything else you have to put on.

We won the toss, and off we go, a few words from our Team Captain Glen Castellaro, "don't miss and we've got this" followed by "it's only 50 targets Double Barrel, just hit them". Normally we'd destroy 50 most days of the week. But then comes the pressure . . . We've won 28 to their 17. And again I think of the Skeet Team, having already won and safely back in warm Australia just waiting to hear how we went.

I don't want to shame any team mates, but after the first 125 targets, 2 have hit the ground.

So not great, but not the end of the world, we'll knock out this next 125, and we should be right?

At the change of traps we hear murmurs that they've dropped a couple? So were still in this thing we think. But the next 125 targets don't go very well for us at all. We smash a few and then one lands, then same again, we're getting it together and heavens above another one goes on unbroken, I'm starting to worry. What are the Skeet boys going to say.

What are the team members from 95 to 2001 who won seven straight going to say? Will they ever speak to us again? Please don't miss any more.

When the last shot is fired by Wayne Hawker. We're 6 down, (everyone has missed bar one, but again no shaming the team). The boys are a little sombre as we shake each others hands, have some photo's taken by friends and family. Until word comes that they're in trouble, they've had a equally bad second half and missed 7 on that trap. So a little adding up and we're 6, so if they've missed 7 in one visit, we've won! Our heads are high again, we don't have to worry about the Skeeties any more, job's done! All the banter we copped at the New Zealand Hall of Fame Dinner, was all forgotten in a heart beat. So all we have to do is go and suit up and have a well earned drink, while the Kiwi's finish up there Points shoot offs and some team places to sort out.

Before the presentation ceremony. At this stage to say I'm happy would be the biggest understatement of this year. On behalf of the team our thanks go to Tracey Robinson for her fine work with the camera, and putting up with me, and also Keith Beddie who I asked to be our team photographer while we were at the shoot. Their photo's are fantastic.

To sign off these opportunities to be part of our trapshooting history don't come every day, so if you get the chance grab it with both hands, and make the most of it.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Mental Skills for Successful Athletes

With the trap Nationals over for another year it is interesting to look at what makes a successful shooter. Success at the nationals


can range from being the national champion, section or grade champion, or member of the McIntosh team. You can also be considered successful if you were able to set a new personal best or if the competition provided you with the opportunity to have fun and learn.

According to the Jack Lesyk from the Ohio Centre for Sport Psychology, there are nine specific mental skills that contribute to success in sport. Lesyk argues that all of these skills can be learned and can improve with instruction and practise. He also points out that these skills for achieving success at sport are the same skills that can be used to achieve success in all other areas of their lives.

The nine specific skills can be arranged in three levels:

- long term development skills (basic skills),
- immediate preparation for performance (preparatory skills),
- skills used during the competition itself (performance skills).

Lesyk arranges the nine mental skills within a pyramid to show the relationship of each skills with the others. The higher levels are based upon the skills of the preceding levels.



What do the skills at each level look like?

The basic or long term development skills are listed as level I and can be described as:

1. *Attitude.* Successful athletes understand that attitude is a choice and they predominately choose a positive attitude. This positive attitude is not just about winning, but I also includes learning new skills and techniques, dealing with losing and overcoming stress and injury. Successful athletes view their sport as an opportunity to compete against themselves and to pursue excellence not perfection. They can maintain a balance between sport and their life and show an ability to respect the sport, other competitors, coaches and officials.
2. *Motivation.* Successful athletes are aware of the rewards and benefits that they can expect by participating in their sport. They are also able to persist through difficult tasks and times, even if these rewards are not

immediate. They realise that the reward come from participation and not just the outcome. Successful athletes are process driven (participating) rather than product focused (the trophy).

3. *Goals and Commitment.* Successful athletes set long and short term SMART Goals. Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic and Time orientated. They are also well aware of their current performance level and have realistic goals to achieve the next step or level. Finally, successful athletes are committed to their goals and achieving the desired results.
4. *People Skills.* Successful athletes realise that they are part of a larger system that includes their families, friends, teammates, etc. They are effective at communicating their needs to these people. They are able to express their feelings and thoughts and listen to others as well. They have learnt effective skills for dealing with conflict, difficult opponents and other negative and oppositional people.

Level 2 skills are the preparation skills necessary immediately prior to performing in the competition.

5. *Self Talk.* Successful athletes maintain self-confidence during difficult times with realistic and positive self-talk. They talk to themselves the way they would talk to their best friend. That is, they do not berate or belittle themselves, and they are able to use self talk to regulate their thoughts, feelings and behaviour during the competition.
6. *Mental Imagery.* Successful athletes use mental imagery when preparing for competitions by seeing themselves perform well and achieving good results. They create and use mental images that are detailed, specific and realistic. Successful athletes also use mental imagery to recover from errors or poor performances, rather than dwelling on the problems.

Both of these skills are integral in developing effective pre-shot routines for many of the shooting disciplines.

Finally the level 3 skills are the performance skills that the successful athlete uses during each and every competition.

7. *Managing Anxiety.* Successful athletes accept that anxiety is part of sport and life and that some degree of anxiety can help them perform well. They also know how to reduce anxiety when it becomes burdensome. Using techniques such as focused breathing, centreing and the Black Box technique can be helpful in reducing anxiety.
8. *Managing emotions.* Successful athletes accept that all emotions, and especially strong emotions such as anger, excitement, disappointment, etc are all part of the sporting experience. Rather than interfering with high level achievement and performance, successful athletes use their emotions to improve.
9. *Concentration.* Successful athletes know that they must focus their attention and know how to narrow the focus when it is required. Successful athletes have learned and mastered the ability to maintain focus and resist both internal and external distractions. They are also able to regain their focus when it is lost and by focusing on the here and now aspect of the game stay firmly fixed in the present and avoid the traps of thinking about the past and the future.

It is hoped that as you read this article you will recognise the mental skills you have and use. It is also hoped that you will see the relationship and integration of these skills, and you will seek out ways to learn those skills you need to improve your performance and enhance your ability.





- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm

dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer:

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

At a meeting with Shooting Australia and the Australian Sports Commission in September 2015 the ACTA Board was advised there will be a review of all selection policies of Shooting Australia following the RIO Olympics. With the 2016 Olympics less than three months away the ACTA is calling for submissions offering alternative selection processes for selection in Shooting Australia Teams.

These submissions should propose constructive meaningful and detailed submissions on the way forward. All submissions from interested individuals, or Clubs, Zones or States should be directed through those channels to the Executive Officer of the ACTA.

The submissions submitted will assist the ACTA with a clear direction to put forward to Shooting Australia prior to their Policy review.

The submissions will be reviewed and discussed by the Full Executive at their June meeting.
