President's Notes

STOP PRESS: Correspondence from Shooting Australia

On Friday the 24th of June the ACTA received disturbing correspondence from the Shooting Australia EO, Damien Marangon which was copied to the Executive. This correspondence came without warning, and was a shock to myself, the Executive Officer and the Executive. Almost immediately,

similar correspondence from Shooting Australia was sent to State bodies and copied widely, sometimes to persons no longer in the positions indicated. The correspondence was critical of me personally, and where I have led the ACTA in the relationship with Shooting Australia.

ACTA have tried to get Shooting Australia to understand the differences in our sport compared to that of the other member bodies of Shooting Australia. ACTA have tried to explain the negative impact on attendances in the ISSF disciplines that Shooting Australia selection policies have had on our Sport. ACTA have tried to explain that the qualifying scores are too high. ACTA have tried to explain that the Shooting Australia conducted Australia Cup series was extremely detrimental to our State events, and added great expense to both shooters and official's involvement in the sport.

We recently requested support from Shooting Australia to approach the Australian Sports Commission to allow us to take over the administration of our domestic disciplines coaching scheme. This was because most of our members shoot the domestic disciplines, re-accreditation under Shooting Australia's umbrella had taken over 8 months and after having control of the coaching scheme for 8 years there is still no level 3 (Elite) coaches course to reaccredit our existing level 3 coaches against. This request was not supported by Shooting Australia.

The decision by Shooting Australia to go direct to our Member State bodies breaches protocols that have been in place since Shooting Australia's (AISL) formation. This is clearly divisive and not in the interests of our sport, and an attempt to start disruption from within. They have clearly misread the feeling in our sport and the dissatisfaction with Shooting Australia generally within our wider membership. Some states have already responded to Shooting Australia with replies that should leave no doubt in their minds that we stand united on the issues that are raised above.

The Board of Shooting Australia have been in possession of a consultant's report for some months now that they commissioned. All member bodies of Shooting Australia were part of this, with input from all levels. ACTA was totally transparent in it involvement in the survey. Now, for whatever reason, Shooting Australia has chosen not to provide the outcomes of this survey to the member bodies. We now suspect this report is self-serving.

Attacking my leadership, I will accept as all are entitled to their opinions, but I will not accept that ACTA are in some way subservient to Shooting Australia. Shooting Australia's actions in this matter are not in the spirit of our membership of this body and it now appears they wish to control the shooting sports totally.

The ACTA Board has previously discussed whether, as many shooters often comment, we should all be under one body, and specifically whether we could see Shooting Australia as that body. The unanimous conclusion was that Shooting Australia was setup to control International ISSF competition alone and as long as it was government funded there was an obvious and clear compromise of its loyalties and intentions.

Perhaps we need to look at another body for this purpose.

The Australian Clay Target Association will take whatever action it sees as necessary to ensure our independence and regain more control over our sport.

World Cup Success

Congratulations to Emma Cox for her Gold medal win at the San Marino ISSF World Cup. Emma was also the highest qualifier at the DTL Nats with a 749/750 and is leading the Ladies Team to the ICTSF World DTL in Ireland. Although not selected for the Olympics, Emma continues to shine at the highest level and no doubt will feature prominently in the ISSF disciplines in the future.

James Willett has also made another ISSF final finishing in 4th place.

Executive Meetings

Your Executive has just completed 2 days of meetings. I thank the members of the Executive for generously making themselves available, some for as long as 5 days to attend these meetings.

At the time of going to print, the minutes are yet to be ratified so I cannot comment much on decisions that were made.

Shooting Australia (SA) submissions

The Association made a decision to request input from interested parties regarding a possible future ISSF selection policy for the ACTA to support during the forthcoming SA review. Sometime after, SA called for submissions direct from interested parties. I would like to thank those that put together submissions for the ACTA to consider. These are being used to compile an ACTA submission to SA and this will be published at a later date. I can say that the submission will include the key common points made in almost all submissions being:

Transparency, objectivity, a balance between recognition for the event score and the finals result and lowering or possible removal of qualifying scores.

Shooting Australia and the ACTA all aspire to have podium success at major international events. The ACTA has to balance any selection policy against any detrimental effect on membership and attendances. Shooting Australia do not have these concerns and are driven as a government funded body to aspire to podium success alone, as required by the Australian Sports Commission.

Grounds

Progress is continuing slowly on the National Grounds with the wet winter playing havoc with partly finished earthworks. Work has been regularly stopped for a fortnight at a time whilst the grounds dry up enough to use machinery. An all-weather walkway behind the layouts is now awaiting installation but with continuing rainfall, a timeframe is hard to set.

National DTL and World DTL 2018

These events will be conducted back to back, over 20 traps. Dates for the Nationals and the World are as follows:

Nationals Sunday 18th March 2018 to Friday the 23rd March 2018. Mackintosh Teams and World DTL opening and reception Saturday 24th March 2018. (The ICTSF General Assembly and Technical meeting will also be on this day)

World DTL Sunday 25th March 2018 to Tuesday 27th March 2018. Australian teams for this event will be selected at the 2017 Trap Nationals.

Constitution Review

The Executive have reviewed the amended constitution (version 5) and it would be fair to say there is currently a great deal of difference in opinions around the table. Another draft has been agreed to for reviewing by our lawyers after which, it should go out to the states for further input and discussion. We must remember during this process that nobody will get 100% of what they believe is the best options included in what is eventually presented to the 2017 AGM for adoption.

The current document keeps the existing objects and powers, leaves clubs with the same voting rights they have now and states with the same voting rights they have now. Basically every level of memberships rights are retained as is. This appears the only way a document may be accepted.

Executive Officer's Report

Incorporation

I am going to revisit the issue of governance following revelations of some clubs seriously breaching the ACTA constitution and the implications that this has for members and the Executive of Clubs.

The reality is that under the Incorporations Act, Clubs and by virtue the Executives of those clubs are charged with the responsibility to act in a professional manner, at all times ensuring they abide by their constitution. They are required to attend meetings, ensure accurate minutes are kept and that finances are accounted for. They are required under the Incorporations Act to ensure that they are insured, this includes Directors and Officers insurance. Directors and Officers Insurance however does not cover negligence. Failing the due diligence test could leave clubs open to legal action.

The reason the ACTA is so diligent about reminding clubs about these issues is just that, we (the ACTA) need to be vigilant, that is our responsibility, to ensure Clubs, Zones and States are aware of their obligations. We are all linked through the system of governance that exists. All States and Clubs, ultimately through affiliation are required to adhere to the ACTA constitution, where there is conflict the ACTA constitution takes precedence.

Ground pollution

There are some significant issues relating to pollution on grounds that we have been made aware of. The responsibility for cleaning up your shooting template remains with the Club. We are meeting with

consultants to try to develop a "basic" plan to assist Clubs in ensuring their Club remains compliant. However the "duty of care" remains with the owners/lessee's of the Grounds.

I appeal to all Executive Members and members of Club to ensure you are compliant, the cost of compliance is not expensive, the cost of non-compliance is very expensive.

National Executive Meeting

The National Executive meeting was held over the 17th and 18th June, whilst not being able to advise of decisions made at this stage (Minutes will be on the website once approved) I can advise that the Strategic plan was updated and the proposed constitution was discussed at length with a number of changes made. This document will be updated and sent back to the Executive for approval before being released to the States firstly to review and then to Clubs. The timeframe for this process to be completed is September 2016.

National Clubhouse and Office

We continue to seek funding for the new Clubhouse / National office to be built on the National Ground. The Association has had meetings with the NSW State government and continue to make representations to Ministers and Local Members. The Federal Government round four facilities grants opens later in the year. We will then be in a position to seek further funding to assist in bringing the National Ground and facilities up to international standard.





Expression of Interest: *Marketing and Promotions*

Expressions of interest are sought from suitably qualified persons with expertise in the area of Marketing and Promotions to join

the Board of the Australia Clay Target Association.

The person would be required to attend Board meetings (approximately 4 per year) to provide guidance through the adoption of a marketing and promotions plan.

The ACTA is planning to become active in the area and has commenced preliminary discussion for the development of a plan with research already being conducted.

The appointment would be for a 12 month period concluding on or about the 17th June 2017.

Ladies Skeet Long Run Broken After 25 Years

A great achievement took place at Melbourne Gun Club on the 1st of May 2016 during the annual two day MGC "Bonanza" Skeet shoot. The "Bonanza" is a tournament used by many skeet shooters as a warm up shoot for the Skeet Nationals and the attendance is always littered by high calibre shooters.

In the "Blue Ribbon" event the "Calcutta" which is shot first on Sunday morning Sarah Bennett was one of several shooters to shoot the possible in the event.

As the shoot offs started the rain started to pour and the wind started to howl as a cold front swept through the club. The shoot off dwindled down to Sarah Bennett and Multiple National Champion Michael Buttigieg going shot for shot, station by station round after round until a long way into the 4th box finally a low six was left to go on its merry way.

After the shoot off ended it was the realisation that Sarah had broken the Ladies long run National Record of 176 set by Maree Rooke in 1991.

Sarah had shot a 190 Break!

Ladies skeet shooting has enjoyed and enormous growth in the last several years and the competition and quality of these competitors is second to none. At our recent Skeet nationals we had 25 lady competitors with is now 15% of the overall attendance.

But it wasn't always like that and we have Lady competitors such as Maree Schuster (Rooke) to thank for that as she was an early pioneer in ladies skeet shooting. Maree has won over thirty titles as Australian Women's Skeet Champion and holds the previous women's skeet break records of 104, 140 and the now past record of 176 straight shot in 1991.

In 1986 Maree was the first

woman in the history of the sport to make the Open State & National Skeet Teams - qualifying in number one position for the State of NSW.

Maree attained AA grade status in skeet shooting, the first female to achieve this feat.

In 1991 she competed at the ISU Australian Nationals winner of the women's events and qualifying for the national training squad – open and women's. Maree was in the skeet team for the Oceanic Games where she won gold in the women's event and shot the only skeet qualifying score for the women's team.

At the Australian ISU Grand Prix she was placed 4th followed by the World Championships where she was placed 19th in the individual's women's event.

Maree's Long run record had stood unbroken for 25 years.

Maree was so happy to hear of Sarah's achievement that she attended this year's Skeet Hall of Fame night to personally present the Ladies National Record Plaque to Sarah. In passing the baton to Sarah, Maree also recounted how hard it was to succeed as a lady in the early days and how proud she was of today's skeet community where the sport is flourishing and the ladies competition is so strong.

To top it off at the end of the Skeet Nationals, Daniel Spatz from Krieghoff Germany and Renae Birgan from Clay and Hunt awarded Sarah a plaque recognising her achievement.

ROUND Two -FRANKSTON AUSTRALIAN CTC APRIL 17, 2016

Sunday 17th April was the second round of the Teams event, hosted by Frankston Australian C.T.C. 130 shooters were attracted to the contest, making up twenty three teams and five Junior teams. A clear sky and very sunny conditions saw event one, the handicap under way at 9.30 with four traps in operation.

It took until squad fifteen to see the first of the three possibles, it was Troy Loveridge and he was the eventual winner with 32/32. Second was Steve Trembath 31/32 and third lames Strangis 29/30. Todd Malone 26/27 was the Back Marker and Sebastian Piscioneri collected the Junior front marker 24/25.

The team scores at this point favoured the Werribee Teals with 116/125 and Morwell 112 next. Both the Werribee Junior teams look in good position with 46/50 and 45/50 respectfully.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

Mindsets

There is currently a revolution in education. Teachers, coaches and educators are looking at new and novel ways of explaining the way children learn and how they should be taught. Part of this revolution involves changing both the mindsets of the teachers and coaches and the mindsets of the learners.

A **mindset** is defined as a set of assumptions, methods, or notations held by one or more people or groups of people that is so established that it creates a powerful incentive within these people or groups to continue to adopt or accept prior behaviors and choices, according to Wikipeadia.

Stanford University Professor of Psychology, Carol Dweck talks about two different mindsets, the fixed midset and the growth minset. There can also be a mixed mindset where there are feature of both while the individual is growing and changing thinking patterns. This happens to all of us and we should not assume that we are in locked into being one or the other.

The Fixed Mindset

Having a fixed mindset means that a person believes that is or her skills and abilities are set and cannot be changed. A fixed mindset leads to an emotional player who is constantly comparing himself or herself to others. This creates a rigid and fearful athlete who is limiting his or her potential. People with a fixed mindset generally believe:

- Skills are something that a person is born with
- · Challenges are something to avoid

- Challenges can reveal a lack of skill in an area
- Perseverance will not help
- Effort is unnecessary
- If a person has to put effort in, it must be because he or she is not good enough
- Feedback should be taken personally
- When failure happens, it must be the fault of others

The Growth Mindset

A growth mindset means that a person believes that his or her skills and abilities are things that can be developed and improved. Someone with a growth mindset is able to share in the successes of others and win or lose with class. This way of thinking leads to a hard- working, calm, more open minded athlete who is coachable and able to reach his or her fullest potential.

People with a growth mindset believe:

- Skills come from hard work
- Skills can always be improved
- Challenges should be embraced
- A challenge is a chance to test one's self
- Effort is the most important trait
- Effort is the basis for mastery
- Feedback is something that you can learn from
- Feedback helps you make a better product and identify areas in which to improve
- · Setbacks are a learning moment
- Setbacks are viewed as a wake-up call

How Fixed vs. Growth Mindsets Relate to Coaching

It is the responsibility of the coach, to assist each player, develop a growth mindset. Athletes with a growth mindset are able to grow, learn, and achieve more than those with fixed mindsets. For those shooters who have a coach you need to look at the following page and determine where you think your coach sits.

For those who do not have a coach or who adopt that role for yourself, have a look at the sheet and see where you sit yourself. Do you have to change your mindset when it comes to what you think your abilities and talents are.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY WACTA STATE TRAP CARNIVAL

GENERAL

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the State Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Shooters will be NOT be pre squadded at WACTA run State Carnivals. Pre nominations are for the sole purpose of competitor numbers and monetary advantage to the competitors. Competitors providing 24hrs notice of inability to attend will be provided a full refund.
- 3. A strict Nomination cutoff time will be imposed at each WACTA run State Carnival. These times will be advertised prior to each Carnival.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONETARGET** will be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONETARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONETARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, and must be ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfill their responsibility will be penalized one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, if the replacement fails to fulfill their responsibility, the penalty of a LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits (\$20) must be lodged with the Shoot Marshal or Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 14. Any eligible competitor paying full nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open Section.
- 15. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun, before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nominations paid.
- 16. Nominations will close at the Shoot Marshal or Tournament Director's Discretion.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the WACTA Executive Committee or the Tournament Director, whose decision shall be final.
- An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, the Shoot Marshal or Tournament Director to adjudicate.
 19.
- 20 Squads of five to shoot 50 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of five to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- 21 Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program, including the number of targets shot, will not make the shooter eligible for any refund.
- 22 Shooters should be aware that any photographs taken by the WACTA "official" photographer may be submitted and displayed on the WACTA website. If shooters DO NOT want photographs of themselves or their minors on the WACTA website they are to inform the office before the end of the last day of events.





NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
