President's Notes

OLYMPICS

What a great moment for Australia and the ACTA with Catherine Skinner winning the first RIO 2016 Gold for our country. Catherine, on behalf of the Association members please accept our heartfelt thanks and appreciation for your efforts and conduct. Also I would like to thank your family for the support they

have obviously shown you over many years. Congratulations also to James Willett for a great qualifying score, and the other team members for giving it their best shot. A full report and photographs will appear next month.

WORLD DTL

I do not grace the front cover of the CTSN often but I must say I have never been so proud as International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF) and ACTA President to present the DTL World Championship Cup to Matt Schiller. Matt is a champion shot, the only ICTSF dual winner, and a great ambassador for our sport. The centre page photograph with his proud family says a lot about clay target shooting — A great family sport, a great competitor and a great result for the ACTA.

A full report and photographs are included in this magazine's centre pages.

There are also 1000's of photographs from the event on the ICTSF website – ictsf.global

Some of the Australian contingent travelled on to the Grand in America and I have heard they may have had some success. We may be able to report on this in a later issue.

EXECUTIVE MEETING

The full Executive met last week to consider the issues raised by Shooting Australia. A strategy has been developed and will unfold in coming weeks. I believe we have concentrated solely on the issues whilst involved with SA and we will continue to do so. I therefore expect SA to do the same and comments made recently by a SA Director of a personal nature will only inflame this situation further, and are highly unprofessional.

A sub-committee has been formed to look at the membership/ participation issues. Three Executive members will be joined from representatives from NSW and Vic clubs where the problem is the greatest.

The issues are simple and revolve around the requirements of the current constitution that all are ACTA members whilst competing or shooting recreationally, the requirement to ensure all are ACTA members whilst competing to ensure proper grading and handicapping and thus equitable competition, and the mitigation of risk by not jeopardising the associations protection package.

This sub-committee needs to come up with a proposal for change that recognises all the above requirements. The full paying ACTA member is currently getting the rough end of the stick, with some clubs choosing

to ignore the above requirements and granting privileges to non-ACTA members that belong to ACTA registered shooters alone.

In accordance with the constitution, action is continuing against clubs that have been proven to be in breach of the constitution.

The Association is at great risk here, as why would anyone want to join the ACTA if they can get most of the benefits and the use of facilities that have been developed over decades by ACTA members for free?

WORLD DTI 2018

At the ICTSF General Assembly in Ireland during the World DTL, the dates for this event were approved. Planning is now underway and dates and program and an indication of awards are already up on the ICTSF website - Ictsf.global.

Australia has a great opportunity to host the best World DTL yet and we intend to take every step in order to ensure this. The General Assembly confirmed that up to three teams can be entered in each section of the event. Australia will now be filling all available team spots. A selection policy based on qualifying order over the DB, SB, Pts and Mackintosh will establish the order of the team members with any withdrawals being filled by the next shooter. This will mean that we will need to have extra Ladies, Juniors, Veterans, and Super Veterans shoot the Mackintosh teamscore to get an order for the top nine (three teams by three) and the reserves. The first teams will be outfitted under the existing Team policy and a decision will need to be made on outfitting of the second and third teams.

The biggest problem we envisage is that of having enough qualified referees. They are only required for the 3 days of the World. We are budgeting on 30 referees for the event and an allowance of \$300 per day per referee is being recommended. Referees will not be able to compete, and must be qualified. It is expected that distinctive apparel will also be provided. ACTA will be calling for expressions of interest at a later date. The quality of refereeing at a World event is extremely important and to be accepted would be real compliment to those engaged.

The Mackintosh rules have been further aligned with the World DTL with a Veterans age of 55 and a Super Veterans age of 65. Both ages are at the 1st of January in the year of competition. The final Mackintosh results for 2016 are now available on the ICTSF website.

The 2019 ICTSF World English Sporting has been allocated to the Irish Clay Pigeon Shooting Association. Their intention is to shoot the event in one of the magnificent castle grounds in regional Ireland. This event should be something special. This was on the back of a previous General Assembly decision to host the event for a number of consecutive rotas in the Northern hemisphere to build the numbers. The 2017 event is to be held in England, but dates and grounds are yet to be confirmed.

HALL OF FAME

It has been brought to our attention that because of an oversight on our behalf on a couple of occasions the runner up in a National event

The Olympics have been run and won (by some) including ACTA Mansfield CTC member Catherine Skinner. Congratulations Catherine. a fantastic result from a very dedicated and thoughtful person. I have been fortunate enough to talk with Catherine on numerous occasions at National events. Catherine is a very unassuming and quiet young lady with a great attitude towards her sport. Not only an Olympic Gold medallist in shooting, Catherine has completed a degree in Chemical Engineering. Undoubtedly another great role model for our sport.

A full report and acknowledgement of Catherine and the rest of the Olympic Team will be in the next edition of the CTSN.

It has been a very hectic two months since the National Executive meeting in June this year. There are an enormous amount of projects going on within the National Office. The ACTA has again raised the issue of recognition of the ACTA with the Australian Sports Commission including control of our own coaching accreditation specific to shotgun shooting, this was rejected by the Coaching and Officiating division of the ASC.

There are a number of people involved with resurrecting previous coaching manuals with the view of introducing a shotgun specific course through the ACTA for Level 1 and 2 coaches. Currently we have a generic program that does not really capture the essence of our sport. This we aim to rectify.

Following a full meeting of the Executive Committee a sub-committee

that attracts points towards the Hall of Fame has not been clearly established. Those involved in the known cases will be advised that the Hall of Fame points will be decided by shoot-off at the next National Titles.

Further, shooters need to be aware that any ties for Hall of Fame points will now be shot off on the day of the event unless otherwise announced.

GROUND DEVELOPMENT

A business case study funded by the NSW government has almost been completed for the ongoing development of the grounds. The scope covers a multi-use Convention centre, Hall and Dining facilities, Hall of Fame, National offices, and 3 Olympic layouts with associated pathways carparks and landscaping. The ACTA have already committed \$1.2M to the expected cost of over \$6M.

The skeet houses which have tilted slightly will be relevelled in coming weeks, after the Sporting Nationals, and extra work continues on trap layouts and fencing on the Western end of the ground.

It has been a very busy time and a lot of the unnecessary distractions that we currently have are making our jobs a lot harder. I urge all shooters and clubs to get behind your Association so we can work through these issues as a strong united body.

Robert Nugent

has been appointed to review ACTA membership including levels, benefits and associated issues in delivering a sustainable Association, at Club, Zone, State and National level. The recommendations of this committee will be then reviewed by the Executive Committee.

At the June meeting an updated set of referee examiners questions were viewed and discussed, ultimately being accepted at the meeting and now distributed to each State. These updated questions (and answers) are now in line with changes made to the rules. In the near future the Skeet and Sporting courses will also be updated.

National and VCTA Handicapper Ray Peatling and VCTA Secretary Judith Kent have put a great deal of work into producing a handicappers' training course. The course has been conducted in a number of centres in Victoria and in the near future with the co-operation of the VCTA the ACTA, will produce and distribute this program nationally. A great initiative from Ray Peatling, something we had discussed after the National Trap Championships this year. It is great to have proactive members who contribute meaningfully to the association. A huge thank you to Ray and Judith who found a void and decided they could help those thrust into a position of handicapper in their club with little or no experience. These courses should be available very shortly after the VCTA has "tested" the course content.

The position of National Rules Supervisors is now being considered by the Executive. The position will require the appointed person to oversee the rules of the sport including arranging and chairing the meeting of Rules Supervisors in 2017. The Executive sees this as another step forward in the professionalism of the sport. We have already seen some huge benefits come forward from the National Handicapper position with a course developed for new and existing handicappers.

A full economic and business case study commissioned with a grant from NSW Sport has now been prepared and lodged with the Minister for Trade, Tourism and Major event and Minister for Sport, Mr Stuart Ayres. This study is in support of the request for funding for the upgrade of the National ground including clubhouse, Hall of Fame, National offices, additional Olympic discipline facilities and infrastructure projects. We expect to hear in the near future on the result of the submission.

This is a very exciting time for the Association as having a facility of this magnitude will not only provide for shooting and shooters, it will be capable of holding external functions to increase the revenue stream of the Association and provide a much needed facility in Wagga Wagga.

All other competitors will be awarded 1 point for every target they are away from the winning score. The top 3 shooters with the <u>lowest</u> cumulative points recorded over any 3 events of the series will qualify for the team. Please note that a shooters worst performance at <u>ANY</u> event will be dropped and not counted towards team selection. All ties determined by Universal Trench shoot off rules. No events are compulsory to attend, just attend ANY 3 of the 4.

Funding will be on a semi funded basis to the TOP 3 shooters (irrespective of which category they have entered). Funding will be made up of all profits from the series and will be distributed evenly to the top 3 overall shooters. Distribution to be at organisers discretion.

Juniors, Ladies & Veterans teams may be selected providing sufficient entries recorded at all events. Should these teams be selected, some funding may be provided if available. Shooters under 18yo to be accommandied by a guardian when travelling to World Championships. All Team members will need to become members of Sporting Clays Australia (SCA) who are the Australian affiliate to FITASC to compete at the World Championships. You do not need to be a member of SCA to shoot the series. Visit ww.sportingclays.com.au.

TOP SHOT AWARD: Prize to the most improved shooter for 2017 (who is not awarded a funded position) based on scores shot compared from 2016 (best 3 from 4 events). Sponsored by Top Shot Industries.

ACTA Constitution-Part 3

Just to recapitulate, in the first of these articles we looked at the "why" for change and the last one we looked at the governance issues involved. In this issue we intend to briefly discuss the objects of the board and then look into the accountability of the board, executive officer and staff.

Objects

The objects of the proposed constitution will be almost the same as in the current constitution as they were just cut and pasted across. It was considered that these objects had served us well and captured all of the diverse issues the current executive need to deal with on occasion. Space considerations preclude listing all twenty-six here but one can easily access them on the ACTA website or just look at a hard copy of the current constitution.

The lawyers tweaked the first two objects to more strongly affirm the central role of the ACTA in the administration of clay target shooting in Australia:

- a) Create a single uniform entity in Australia through and by which the Sport can be encouraged, conducted, promoted and administered;
- b) Adopt and exercise the Sporting Power as the national federation for the Sport in Australia and act as an Australian affiliated member of the International Sporting Authorities that govern the Sport in accordance with the Statutes and Regulations;

The above effectively encapsulate the aspirations of a future board of directors. The other twenty-four objects are more definitive, cover all the known issues and tasks facing the current executive and have not been changed.

Accountability of the Board of Directors

Before we proceed I will deal with a matter of definitional semantics with respect to the terms "Board", "Board of Directors" and "Directors". In the previous article I referred to "the board" as that is the term in common use and is generally well understood. The constitution refers more often to "the Directors" as defined at 1.1, when all or some of the Directors act together in accordance with their powers and authority under this constitution. Nevertheless under section 13 it defines the Board as comprising of seven Registered Directors and up to two Appointed Directors. While there may be some arcane legal difference between the terms that I am unaware of, for the purposes of these articles please consider the terms "Directors" (plural only)," Board of Directors" and the "Board" as interchangeable. For clarity I will continue to use the term the Board.

Will the new arrangements increase accountability? Before answering that it is instructive to look at the **current executive**. Executive members are elected by their respective state associations via processes which vary from state to state. Apart from exceptional circumstances under the constitution they may only be removed by their respective state or territory. There is no doubt that each executive member is accountable to his or her state but for what? The states only have jurisdiction over issues within their state and thus it can be argued that the current executive members can only be accountable to their state on state issues.

However when members serve the ACTA they are not there to represent their state's interests but to manage the sport nationally. All their effort while serving on the executive must be toward the best interest of the ACTA which may or may not be in the best interests of their respective states. So given that clubs do not have the right to remove executive members at the AGM, who are members accountable to when serving in the national interest? It could be reasonably argued

that they are not accountable at all and, at the very least, that indicates a significant weakness within the current constitution. Thankfully it has not been a problem because our volunteer executive members take their job seriously, manage the sport responsibly and to the best of their abilities.

As you will remember from last month's article, the Australian Sports Commission mandatory principles for sport governance contain specific requirements to ensure proper accountability at all levels. Under the proposed new arrangements the board will be responsible for developing procedures to ensure that the performance of the board, that of individual directors, the chair and the executive officer is formally assessed. The annual report presented to the AGM will include the usual reports on the year's happenings and the finances but also the results of an independent audit of the performance of the board, individual directors and the chair. Club delegates at the AGM will then be able to make judgement on the performance of the board and individual directors.

At present, if the club delegates at an AGM were dissatisfied with the performance of the executive, while they no doubt would express their dissatisfaction forcefully, there is little they can do constitutionally. While five per cent of member states and member clubs can call a special general meeting under 16.2(f), such a meeting may only make recommendations to the executive committee.

However under the new arrangements, under 13.11(a) the Company may in general meeting by ordinary resolution remove any Director prior to the expiration of the Director's term of office. As clubs vote at general meetings including the AGM, the Directors will be accountable to the clubs in a very real sense rather than the tokenism at present.

Accountability of the executive officer and ACTA staff

Currently the executive committee has the responsibility for the recruitment, and performance review of the executive officer. In practice the executive usually delegates recruitment to a sub-committee and the performance management to the president. The EO takes direction from the decisions of the executive and the fundamental principle is that the EO is ultimately accountable to the executive committee. Under the new arrangements the board will assume these responsibilities so the management of the executive officer will not change apart from formal protocols being defined as such do not exist at present.

Similarly the recruitment and management of the ACTA office and grounds staff will remain the responsibility of the executive officer so they in turn will remain accountable to the executive officer.

Shooting appointments such as the national coaching director are currently undertaken by the executive committee and a future board would assume the responsibility.

In conclusion

Despite the fact that clubs are the cornerstone of our sport, currently they have little or no role in the management of our sport at a national level. Under the new arrangements they will assume a far greater role. Clubs will not only be able to nominate delegates for possible election to the board (something they cannot do now) but also formally assess the performance of the board (also something they cannot do now). The new arrangements will thus ensure a more vibrant reporting regime and therefore responsive management of our sport.

ACTA Constitution-Part 4

ACTA Constituion – Part 3 looked at objects and accountability and in Part 4 we will take a look at membership including individual, club and state. While there will be little change in the current relationship nevertheless it is worth exploring the issue because all members may not be aware of the various issues.

The basic issue that should be understood is that membership of any organisation of whatever kind and at whatever level is effectively a contract. Membership of a club, for example, enables a person to enjoy the benefits and the privilege of using the club's amenities and to be involved in the club's activities. However, like everything in life, there is no free lunch, as in return for the privilege of becoming a member a person is expected, amongst other things, to heed certain rules and behavioural standards. Today's sports administrators and athletes need to be aware of an extraordinarily wide and diverse range of ethical standards and of course shooting clubs have the added issue of gun safety which has implications far wider than that concerning clay target shooting.

So the basic premise of being an individual, club or state member of ACTA is that there exists a contract which must be complied with. This contract is contained in the Rules section 9 of the current constitution and 5.9(a) of the proposed constitution. Both are the same and the current one reads:

All classes of Members acknowledge and agree that:

- a) these Rules constitute a contract between each of them and the Association and that they are bound by the Rules and the Regulations;
- b) they shall comply with and observe these Rules and the Regulations and any determination, resolution or policy which may be made or passed by the Executive Committee or any duly authorised committee or other entity with delegated authority;
- c) by submitting to these Rules and the Regulations they are subject to the iurisdiction of the Association:
- d) these Rules are made in the pursuit of a common object, namely the mutual and collective benefit of the Association, the Members and clay target shooting;
- e) the Rules and Regulations are necessary and reasonable for promoting the objects of the Association and particularly the advancement and protection of clay target shooting as a sport; and
- f) they are entitled to all benefits, advantages, privileges and services of the Association membership.

The only changes in the new constitution will be the opening words: *Members acknowledge and agree that* and also the word *Association* has been replaced by *Company*. The bottom line is that there will be no change to the current contractual requirements for members of the ACTA.

Unfortunately an unrelated issue has recently tended to overshadow the debate on constitutional change that being in regard to non-ACTA members utilising ACTA registered club facilities. It is inappropriate to enter into that debate within this forum as that issue concerns insurance, liability and other matters which have nothing do with constitutional change. To avoid confusion, members are politely requested to keep the respective debates separate.

Individual shooter membership will not be affected by the adoption of the proposed constitution. Reasonable questions from an individual member's perspective may include why change and what is in it for me? The benefit to individual members will be in a more proactive and effective national administration of the sport resulting in increased membership, increased government and sponsor support leading to more clay target shooting opportunities as well as the satisfaction of belonging to a dynamic national organisation.

As stated in the first article, consequent to member concerns, the requirements have been simplified from the old constitution to remove many of the direct specific requirements of the ACTA for clubs and states in relation to reporting and intervention. The critical section of the proposed constitution is 5.3(c) which now reads:

(c) Each Member State will:

- i. have objects that align with those of the Company as stated in clause 2 and do all that is reasonably necessary to enable the Objects to be achieved, having regard to legislation applicable to that Member State;
- ii. at all times act for and on behalf of the interests of the Company, the Members and the Sport;
- iii. be bound by this Constitution and the By-Laws and the Statutes and Regulations;
- iv. maintain and update the Company's database of clubs, officials and members registered with it as required and in accordance with the By-Laws; and
- advise the Company as soon as practicable of any serious administrative, operational or financial difficulties, assist the Company in investigating those issues and cooperate with the Company in addressing those issues in whatever manner.

Section 5.3(d) which deals with state constitutions and section 5.5 dealing with the membership of clubs also have been simplified. Space considerations preclude their inclusion here. However the important point is that the intent is unchanged from the current constitution. In reality the only area where the new constitution will affect states and clubs is in the selection of delegates to the Board.

Conclusion

The administration of states and zones, operation of clubs and the activities of individual members will not be affected by the new arrangements which are entirely concerned with the re-organisation of the national governing body. The only change will be the process of selection of delegates to the board which will be covered in a later article.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Concentration revisited

"I just wasn't concentrating . . .", "My mind must have been somewhere else . . ." Comments like these, and others that indicate that the shooter was not concentrating, are often heard around the traps in an effort for the shooter to make sense of the fact that a

target was missed. Shooting 49/50 or 74/75 is not an indication that you are a bad shot but it is a clear indication that there was a lapse of concentration.

Concentration is THE most important skill for both the inner and outer games. According to Gallwey (1979), nothing of excellence is achieved without it. Syer and Connolly (1984), add that concentration is a state of being that all sports people recognise as a prerequisite to good performance and involves an unwavering awareness of a specific subject to the momentary exclusion of other subjects. Champion American Trap shooter, Phil Kiner (1997) claims that concentration is not a thing that you do but rather, is a result of other things you have done or are doing.

Concentration is one mental skills that will help guieten the mind. What are the steps in concentration; Gallwey (1979) sees them as discipline, interest, absorption and oneness. The first step, discipline, is to make an effort to switch your attention from wherever it is and place it where you want it to be. Discipline is the ability to provide a focus for your attention on something specific, here and now, away from the interferences of past, future, should, shouldn't, and what might have been. Kiner sees this as staying in the present; you cannot change the past, and the only way you can affect the future, in the manner you wish, is to stay in the present and focus on the project at hand - which is to break THIS target. The second step to concentration is interest. Concentration reaches a deeper level when the mind becomes interested in its focus. Gallwey, states that interest is easier to establish and maintain if the object of our attention is moving. It is necessary to watch the ball in both golf and tennis; however in tennis the ball is moving and therefore it is easier to attend to. In trap and skeet shooting, the focus of our attention is also moving. Gallwey takes this notion a step further and says in tennis says that the player should focus on the seams of the ball not just the ball itself. This heightens the interest level and maintains concentration. In trap and skeet shooting; the focus could be the spinning, or the ridges or dimples of the target. The next step in concentration is absorption; and involves a deepening of interest to a point where you begin to lose yourself in what you are attending to. When you're absorbed in what you are doing, you are hard to distract; the noises at the back of the layout, your opponent ejecting shells towards you, trap breakdowns, etc, all mean nothing. In this state we experience an intensified contact with reality; things just seem to happen effortlessly and the targets appear to be as big as dinner plates. The final step is oneness; and involves an optimal state of mind where concentration is relaxed and awareness and perception is heightened, trust in yourself is elevated, there is an absence of self doubt, and there is a strong and undivided will.

Awareness skills increase our ability to focus our minds non-judgementally in the present moment, on details relevent to our purpose. Most shooters are aware at some time or another of their mind not being focussed on the target at the time they call for it. If we are thinking about achieving a break of 100 or 200, or thinking about shoot-off, the sash, high gun, etc. then we are allowing our mind to move into the future. If we concentrate on a target we may have missed, or our performance in the previous event, or the thought that "I don't like right hand swingers from lane five" then we are shooting in the past. Both scenarios limit our ability to remain focussed in the present and both

situations limit our ability to do what we need to do; which is to hit this target.

Whilst concentration skills are important to achieving our best, what can we do on a day to day, competition by competition basis to improve our skills. Firstly, individual shooters need to discover where their attention is really drawn to when they are shooting and why it wants to go there. This is an important step because it will allow you to eventually break from longheld, outdated patterns of thought or behaviour. You will need to become closely familiar with parts of your performance which are within your control and distanced from distractions or worries which stem from things that are beyond your control.

To change these patterns, shooters can:

- Build and practise a stronger pattern; this can involve adopting rituals
 that can be used during warm-ups, and by practising a number of task
 orientated procedures to use if distractions threaten once the event has
 started.
- Strengthen the attraction of the object or action on which you want to focus: for example, looking to see the target spinning, or focusing on the outer edge, etc.
- Deliberately paying attention to the distraction: This means treating it as if it has a life of its own, giving it space, discovering its needs and eventually making a contract to deal with it later. For example; shooters often complain about counting where they are up to. Kiner, argues that counting is not important; acknowledge that you know where you are upto, but do not treat it as a big deal. When you are shooting well, accept and acknowledge the fact and then focus your energy to staying in the present and break the next target by watching it.
- Make friends with the distraction: Either practise in an environment
 where the distractions are present, or find a way to view them positively.
 If you don not like a particular target from a particular lane, hope that you
 will get that one, then you will be more focussed and when you hit it, it
 will appear a greater achievement.
- Dialogue with the distraction: Imagine you can talk to the distraction and ask it what message it brings you, what it is that you are ignoring that is important.
- Removing focus from emotional distractions to physical and mental patterns: The one thing that we all do in the here and now all the time is breathe. If you need to refocus, by concentrating on your breathing you will return to the here and now.

Concentration is integral to excellence in sport. Whether we are talking about international or Olympic standard, state level or club participant on a weekend who is trying to win or just improve. Whilst it is important that you concentrate on each and every target, this does not mean that you have to attend or concentrate for the whole round; on the contrary, you only need to attend to your target when it is your turn to shoot. Rather than concentrating to practise your shooting, we should be shooting to practise our concentration.

The ability to concentrate can be affected by a range of things that are happening to you at any one moment: grief, work stress, personal stress, health problems and even eye strain. We should all practice concentrating on a specific thing (breathing is a good example) and when we notice that our concentration has lapsed bring our focus back to what we are concentrating on.

THE ACTA EXECUTIVE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ALTER THE PROGRAMME

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- 3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 15 Pair (30 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Monday 9th January 2017.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event. Written notification is required for any eligible refund to be processed and should be sent to accounts@claytarget.com.au refunds will be processed within 30 days of the completion of the event and will incur an administration fee.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role will **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES**.
- II. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Junior male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 16. Pre-nominations will only be accepted online on the form provided at www.claytarget.com.au
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 18. Junior to be under the age of 21 prior to January 1st 2017. Veteran to be over the age of 55 prior to January 1st 2017.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ACTA Clothing Rules.
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).
- 22. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.







And that was the case on the weekend of the 18th and 19th of lune when the Silkwood Clay Target Club hosted a two day coaching clinic. QCTA coaches Richard Morrison, Bill Allan and

stockmaker/coach Daryl Stevens worked with 43 shooters assisting them to learn proper techniques, unlearn bad habits acquired, and relearn what many had forgotten over time.

Day I focused on DTL with the coaching program run in four distinct phases. Phase I began with shooters on the layouts shooting a batch of 10 targets with all three coaches closely scrutinising each shooter and making a mental note of areas that required correction or further development.

Once this was completed for all participants, Phase 2 began. This involved a lecture and discussion in the club house on numerous topics including stance, head position, gun hold, vision and much, much more.

Armed with much of the theory and having viewed practical demonstrations by the coaches, participants then progressed to Phase 3 – gun fit. Here, stock maker Daryl Stevens worked his magic with each shooter individually, adjusting each gun to suit. With an array of stock parts including wedges, spacers and recoil pads, and the ever reliable duct tape, each gun was adjusted and tested on the pattern board. For some it was simply a tweak here and there, whilst for a few it was the daunting task of watching the drop saw take to their stock. Regardless of the process, the result for all was the same; a better fitting gun.

With gun fit completed, shooters then moved to Phase 4, the final stage of the coaching program. This involved 1:1 coaching with either Richard or Bill on the layouts. Both coaches worked with each individual shooter providing



feedback, coaching tips and corrections. This continued until the coaches were satisfied that progress was being made and that the shooter was consistently breaking targets.

Shooters were then released to continue their practice independently. As they say, "practice makes perfect", but only when it is based on sound technique. And that is what this coaching program gave shooters; sound and successful techniques to base their practice on.

Day 2 of the coaching program focused on the art of shooting double rise. It began with a briefing where the finer points of shooting double rise were discussed and demonstrated. This was then followed by a session on the layouts shooting pairs of targets and all three coaches providing advice on the run. It was amazing to see how a few simple strategies made a world of difference to many of the participating shooters.

To sum up, it was an outstanding coaching weekend that made such a difference to so many of our shooters, particularly our young and less experienced shooters. The OCTA is to be commended for this initiative and Richard Morrison, Bill Allan and Daryl Stevens are to be congratulated for volunteering their time to give something back to the sport they are so passionate about.

Saturday 22 July saw the conclusion of the 2016 Victorian Clubs ISSF Trench Series with Round 3 held at Melbourne Gun Club. 6 full squads attended the last round where the Series High Guns were still yet to be determined, with the best two scores out of the three Rounds being used to determine High Guns.

Some top shooting, and the highest scores of the Series, saw Milad Nasr and Penny Smith finish on 95/100 (a personal best) and taking out AA and A grade respectively in Round 3. Mark Boyce won B grade with 82/100 and Elias Dagher C grade with 80/100. Kate Puhar shot an impressive 25 in her first round of the day claiming Ladies with 81/100 and Mitch lles finished with a 90/100 taking out Juniors. Craig Henwood (AA) and Nathan Cassells (AA) both finished on 91/100 and Jeffrey Tonna (A) and Charlton Vella (A) on 90/100.

To add to the friendly competition, everyone was invited to take a guess at what infamous Nidal Asmar would shoot in his final round of the Series. Consideration was given to Nidal shooting a 69 in Round 1 at Frankston (the day 14 people finished ahead of him out of a field of 24, including 5 Ladies and Juniors) and a 78 in Round 2 at Werribee. Rumour had it that he had found his form and was ready to rumble! The only thing rumbling on Saturday were the clouds with Nidal finishing on 78, his 19 in the first round immediately eliminated his prediction of shooting a 95 in Round 3. The lowest two guesses for the day were 79 and 77 so unfortunately no one guessed correctly but it added to the fun spirit of the day. Thanks to Nidal for being such a good sport throughout the Series and helping add some good old fashioned fun.

Consistent shooting from Craig Henwood saw him take out the AA Series High Gun with 181 (one target ahead of Brett Dunstan), shooting scores of 90 (Round 2) and 91 (Round 3). Penny Smith stood out the entire Series improving each Round with an 80 in Round 1, 90 in Round 2 (equal highest score of the Round with Craig Henwood) and then finishing with a 95 in Round 3. Penny took out the A grade High Gun, but had there been an Overall Series High Gun, she would have won this by an impressive 4 targets! Elias Dagher started the Series in B grade with a 79 and combined with his 80 in Round 3, gave him the B grade High Gun with a 159/200 and just one target ahead of Mark Boyce. A total of \$3,118 was paid out in cash prize money (\$1696 in Round prizes and \$1422 in High Guns) which is a fantastic commitment from the three Clubs for a non-sponsored Series. Thank you to Bornaghi Australia and Ross Hibbert for donating 5 slabs of Bornaghi Summa ammunition to Ladies and Juniors as part of their beating Nidal in Round 1, and to Brett Dunstan for donating his AA win in Round 1 to the Ladies and Juniors High Gun cash pool. NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the

following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

CTSN Delivery and Content

The production of the ACTA magazine is a complex task commencing in the National Office. Checking the contents of all submitted material including results, reports, photos and of course advertising by the ACTA office staff is just the first part of the process. Collation of all these elements for inclusion in the CTSN pages is another major time consuming factor in compiling the magazine. Once collated, this material is then sent to the typesetter who has to arrange and compose the magazine into a printable file. The typesetter reviews the amount of material supplied and establishes the layout design that will ensure the correct page extent for the printer and then composes the magazine for proofing. The proofs are then sent back to the National Office for another checking process to ensure all stories and advertisements are included and are correct to copy.

The proofed file is then sent to a number of further proof readers to ensure we have a professional end product.

Once approved for printing the print files are sent to the printer, the print date by this time has already been established to meet our expected mailing date and scheduled in for printing on set days. If we cannot get the finished files to the printer on time and it misses its print run we have to wait (usually a number of days) to have it printed.

Deadline: The copy deadlines set for each operation are extremely important, as the process is reliant on our staff, who also need to fit in their regular office duties and which allow a reasonable amount of time for the typesetter and printer to process their parts in the production of the magazine. Whilst there is a deadline set for copy there is nothing wrong with getting the information into the ACTA Office as soon as possible, don't leave it until the last minute. Murphy's Law applies when under pressure to meet deadlines. Anything that can go wrong usually does.

Once printed the CTSN is sent to a Mailing House along with the latest database printout of who is to receive the magazine. It is bagged and labelled and mailed to our members. This process is also scheduled into a time slot with the mailing house for a specific day (if late we are again rescheduled). This can add up to a week to the length of time in getting the magazine out.

It is then off to Australia Post for delivery. The process from the Printer to Australia Post can take up to 10 days. All going well, the mail-out is smooth and Australia Post commence delivery. We do have occasions where a member phones in having not received their magazine. There are a number of areas where something can go amiss from the mailing house to you but Australia Post delivery is the most likely. Should you not receive your magazine please contact the National Office where we will verify your address in our database. Once we check that our records are correct and that the same correct information was given to the mailing house we will then send you a copy of the magazine from the National Office

As you can see this is a relatively complicated process, if you don't receive your magazine please just give us a call and we will sort it for you.

Content for the CTSN

All content for the magazine should be thoroughly checked by the person lodging it with the National Office to ensure the correct process is followed:

For Clubs, the process is to send a story via a word document with photo's attached to the email, not embedded in the document.

If you are placing an advertisement you may embed photo's to show how you want an advertisement to look however you still need to attach the photo's to the email. PLEASE DO NOT SEND PDF files unless you are sure that they are sized correctly to the CTSN document size and are of print ready quality.

When placing an advertisement, take notice of the events being advertised. If you are entering a "hybrid" then it should be referred to as a "Medley" including for example: single barrel, skeet, double rise, 5 stand sporting etc. So called "Novelty" events, which could include competition conditions, shooting disciplines or targets that are outside the ACTA Rules and that may possibly be outside the Safety Template of your club, will neither be condoned or advertised.

The ACTA will not advertise that a Club would welcome "Non-ACTA Members" in any advertising to any event.

Officials - voluntary and paid

I have become aware through member Clubs and States of misinformation in relation to the position of Secretaries and Presidents in particular, within our structures.

To assist I wish to put simply the roles of Secretary and President and how they work.

The President of the Club is the "Chair" of the committee and leads the Club through engaging the committee in meaningful discussion about the affairs of the Club. The President sets the agenda and guides debate also ensuring procedures are followed in relation to committee meetings. Many Clubs have sub-committee's to attend to specific roles within the club, all reporting back to the full committee. Mostly, depending on individual constitutions the President may be a voting member of the committee.

The position of Secretary at Clubs does not mean the Secretary makes all the decisions for the Club, this is not the case. The decision making process is handled by the Committee, in most instances this person is part of the process however, and is charged with carrying out the decisions of the committee.

Within the zone the roles are very similar however relating to the Zone and their requirements. Again Presidents may or may not have voting rights depending on the constitution.

States are slightly different, I believe all States have a President who is a non-voting member. They conduct (chair) meetings, they deal directly with the Secretary as the conduit between the full committee and the secretary. It is impossible for the Secretary to deal with individual committee members in relation to the business of the organisation. Most

States have secretaries who are paid a small honorarium or in some cases are employed by the State. The Secretary in most cases does not have any voting rights and does not make decisions on policy. Their role is to carry out the decisions of the committee similar to the Club and Zone Secretary.

At National Level the President leads the Association through the same process as a club, they conduct (chair) meetings, and they deal directly with and oversee the work of the Executive Officer. The President is a non-voting leader, their role is to ensure there is equal debate on issues that may not be unanimous. The President and the Executive Officer at times are required to make decisions on matters that arise in the everyday course of business conducted by the ACTA. At all times

the President and the EO are bound to work within the confines of the policies and the constitution of the ACTA.

Club. Zone and State Secretaries and the National EO do not formulate the rules or the policies, they administer the policies and decisions of the committee. In the day to day running of any of these levels of administration people make decisions in the best interests of the sport within the confines of the policies approved by the executive or committee.

These officials should be dealt with in a professional manner at all times taking into account they act in a position to assist the sport. All correspondence including letters and phone calls should be courteous and based on fact.


