President's Notes

CONSTITUTIONAL REVIEW

The ACTA Board has again reviewed the latest draft of the proposed constitution. This is a long and painstaking process and the document will now go to the Executive and then should be in the hands of the state associations by the time this goes to print. Of course the proposal

cannot ever be totally acceptable to all, but contains the requests of the majority of states collected during the consultation process. Regular explanatory articles have been provided in the CTSN to keep members informed of the way the new constitution works.

Please take the time to read these and future articles so you can make an informed decision.

MEMBERSHIP

Registered shooter numbers have risen to over 1 4250 as at the end of September. The Sub-committee looking at membership issues has provided an interim report to the Board. There are many and varied problems out there and once again it will be impossible to completely please everybody. It is now too late to instigate any major changes for the new registration year. However the Board is recommending to the Executive that the category "Club Only" be immediately replaced with a new category to be known as "Recreational" This term aligns the category with the term as used in Object 1 of the Associations constitution. It is proposed that "Recreational " members will be able to shoot practice and targets-only in all disciplines at ALL ACTA clubs, not only the club through which they register as was the case with "Club Only" The "Recreational " category will retain the "Club only" discounted pricing.

In good faith, action against clubs in breach of the constitution is currently in limbo whilst these matters are under further consideration.

NATIONAL GROUNDS

Continual rain and flooding over large areas of NSW and Victoria has resulted in NSWCTA deciding to postpone both its Trap and Skeet Carnivals. The grounds have received continual rainfall since April and earthworks associated with the drainage project have been unable to be completed. Rain events of this nature, although rare are a fact of life and nothing could have been done to stop these postponements. We hope shooters will support the postponed events on their new dates.

The only work that has been able to be completed on the grounds in recent months is the relevelling and underpinning of the skeet towers.

The State Government funded Business Case Study on the proposed major construction project at the National Grounds has been completed and is now with the NSW Government for consideration.

ICTSF

The 4th ICTSF World English Sporting Championship is being held at Kelmarsh Estate, Northamptonshire England from the 13th to the 16th July 2017. This will be the largest event ever conducted under the ICTSF banner and ACTA are sending a fully-funded Open Team. The Board is recommending to the Executive that for the first time in the Sporting Discipline we also enter a partially supported Ladies Team. More details of the event are available at ICTSF. Global under the events tab.

SHOOTING AUSTRALIA

The ACTA Board has met with the President and a Director of Shooting Australia. The meeting could only be described as a very frank and open discussion. It has become clear that some of their perceived issues between ACTA and SA were due to a lack of communication and some misinformation. ACTA intend to continue to try and influence SA selection policies which are currently under review. We will also continue to explore other ways of influencing the selection policies, and recognition of our own coaching accreditation. The association will be represented in Brisbane next month when SA is hosting its AGM, a Whole of Sport Governance Forum and a release of the Suiko Consulting survey and recommendations. It has been advised that at this stage the Australia Cups conducted by SA will be discontinued and more emphasis will be placed on existing ACTA events. This is one positive outcome for ACTA members.

UNIVERSAL TRENCH

ACTA members continue to excel overseas. Mitchell lles won both the Open and Junior World Championships in the UT discipline recently in Morocco. Anna Shedrina won the Ladies World Championship at the same event. The Universal trench discipline is not an ACTA event but we are fortunate that Sporting Clays Australia have generously allowed ACTA members to compete in this discipline domestically. Thanks must also go to the organisers of the selection events. Well done all.

CONSULTATIONS

I have attended meetings in Tamworth and Melbourne regarding the membership issues. I have also met again with a representative from SSAA, and your Board will be attending a meeting with the Board of Sporting Clays Australia in early November. We are also working on getting affordable pricing on members firearms insurance and expect to make an announcement on this shortly.

Executive Officer's Report

The ongoing rain across Australia is a welcome relief for farmers in most instances, there are however many who have been inundated with water following the abnormal rain. There are also many clubs who have been affected by rain over the past three to four months.

The underpinning of the skeet towers on the National ground was finished in early September during a fine break in the weather which has seen consistent rain since May this year. The ground drainage is now installed, however we have not been able to shape the ground because of the water issue. Much of the underground infrastructure has now been completed and we now need fine weather to progress the work to completion.

Our submission for funding to build a new Clubhouse and National office complex on the National ground was presented to the NSW Minister for Sport on Tuesday the 13th of September. If granted, the ACTA will commence building as soon as possible to ensure we get the project completed in a timely manner. The building will consist of an auditorium to seat 450 people banquet style and approximately 800 conference style. A coffee shop, bar and PA system as well as a fully functional commercial kitchen will be included in the plan along with a very large verandah. With the building being on the ground this will open up the opportunity to extend the facility to include practice on the National ground during work hours. The building will house the ACTA Hall of Fame and ultimately will provide an additional income stream that will enable the Association to invest in further development and promotion of the sport.

The VCTA and the NTCTA have also received grants in 2016 to upgrade facilities, it appears the tide is turning for recognition of the Sport at government level. There is a grant program for Regional Infrastructure based on a dollar for dollar basis available through the Federal Government, round four should open soon, see your local Federal Member for details.

In the past two months we have sought to introduce a shotgun specific Coaching program only to have it denied by Shooting Australia, so therefore not endorsed by the Sports Commission. We will continue to develop and introduce the program in the near future as a non-accredited course until we can have it accredited. There are numerous avenues open to the ACTA and the Executive believe this is vital to the continued growth of the sport. We will present the re-written course previously used by the ACTA along with the structure and pathway for coaches, development and referees. Our commitment to accountability in ensuring the integrity of all

of "training and development" programs is paramount in getting endorsement and subbort.

The revamped Level 3 or "Elite Course" will be a priority, as will the reaccreditation process, at this stage there seems to be confusion as to how to re-accredit. We will be reintroducing a card system where coaches attain points for ongoing coaching and coach updating (such as assisting at Zone, State and National coaching days and courses.) The courses and assessment will be based more on the ability to deliver quality coaching than talk about it. In my coaching experience I have seen many coaches who can talk the talk, however when it comes to teaching skills and basic techniques, skills to identify faults and correct them are found wanting. The courses will be competency based, not literacy based.

Rule Clarification

Earlier this month I was asked to give an answer to the following incident. I was not in attendance, but this is how it was reported to me.

INCIDENT: A club decides to use flash targets as a feature in a shoot-off. All goes well until a target is shot at, no visible piece is broken away from the target but there is some dust, either from the target or from the flash powder inside. The referee makes a decision to credit the target as a hit, perhaps being influenced by an ISSF rule which states: — ISSF Rule 9.13.4 "Where flash (powder filled) targets are used, a target must also be declared as HIT when there is visable emergence of powder after a shot is fired".

QUESTION: Did the Referee give the correct adjudication?

ANSWER:

First and foremost we must remember that we are not shooting ACTA Trap under ISSF Rules. There is no provision in our Rules for flash targets but I compliment the Club for attempting to make the shoot-off more spectacular. The only reference to flash targets in the ACTA Rule Book is to targets which may be included in our Sporting disciplines – Rules 9.04(a) and 20.02.

The rules which must be applied to ACTA Trap competitions are below:

1.05 DUSTED TARGETS

A "dusted target" is one from which dust is detached by the competitor's shot, but which shows no visible piece broken from it. A dusted target is not a broken target and is a "lost target".

1.08 LOST TARGET

and

(g) A target is dusted.

On this occasion the Referee made the wrong decision.

ACTA PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL POLICY

Preamble

ACTA National Presidents have traditionally awarded medals for outstanding achievement in coaching, administration, or contribution to, the sport of clay target shooting.

The following is a guideline for the assessment of individual nominations for the award of Presidential Medals outlining both the process and assessment criteria.

Process

- A call will be made to all states and the territory by advertisement in the *Clay Target Shooting News* November and December of each year.
- The nominations to be forwarded to the Executive Officer by the closing date stipulated in the advertisement. The letters shall be marked "confidential" on the outside of the envelope and shall only be opened by the Executive Officer
- The Executive Officer will treat the nominations as confidential and shall only release them to the President.
- The President will request advice from the Board of Management on a confidential basis and will carefully consider such advice.
- Board members will keep all details of the nominations and any relevant discussions confidential.
- The President shall make the final decision on the award of the Presidential Medal(s).
- The formal announcement and presentation of the medal(s) will occur during the annual Hall of Honour dinner held during the trap national championships.

Criteria

- Outstanding contribution to the sport from Club to National level
- Generally only one medal to be granted per year but the President may, if the situation is warranted, grant a maximum of two medals in a year.

Friday night the 23rd of September at the Mathoura Gun Club was a perfect night weatherwise for clay target shooting, mild temperature, calm, and yet shooting numbers were down slightly, possibly because the preliminary final for AFL football was on the TV. Still, enough shooters for good competition, strangely though not one B grade shooter arrived to compete. It was an evening of all Continental discipline events, and as a complete surprise to all, April Thompson, an Echuca member, and a C Grade shooter, without the need for a shoot off, won the Overall Winners Sash in the main event, a 25 target, Night, Double Barrel Continental Championship, with an excellent score of 23/25. Congratulations April Thompson, possibly your first Overall sash!

Event one, a ten target Single Barrel, Night, Continental Cash Divide, and one possible score of 10/10 was produced by Mathoura's George Bradley and he put his hand out for all the 1st place cash. Club president Peter McCluskey shot an 8/10 earning him all the 2nd place cash.

Event two, was a 15 target, Night, Points Score Cash Divide, and Mick Keirl, an Echuca member, shot a 41/45 score to claim all the 1st place cash, 2nd placing went to Peter McCluskey having scored a 38/45 to claim his cash. The Continental discipline when shot under lights is extremely difficult, so these scores that were recorded are really quite good.

Lastly, Event three, a 25 target, Double Barrel, Night, Continental Championship, and with April Thompson collecting the Overall Winners Sash, and 1st place in C Grade trophy, there is only one other winner, and that was George Bradley who shot a 21/25 score to secure the 1st in A/AA Grade trophy. The shoot ran smoothly all night, and at the conclusion, Donna McCluskey, who knew that Mick Keirl's daughter, Lhydia, would be present, baked and presented a birthday cake complete with eight candles for Lhydia's

eighth birthday, a very nice gesture Donna.

With shooters arriving from Echuca, Deniliquin, Euroa, and of course Mathoura, competition was keen, and all shooters did say that they thoroughly enjoyed the nights shoot.

ACTA Constitution-Part 5

Last issue we looked at state and individual membership under the proposed new constitution. In this article we would like to take a closer look at the central role of the clubs.

Clubs are the basis of our organisation — without clubs we would not have a sport. Without clubs there would no zone, state or national associations. Without clubs shooters would not be able to legally shoot at licensed grounds. Clubs establish the facilities whereby shooters can compete legally and it is primarily within clubs that the essential esprit de corps so essential to any successful sport is developed. Recruitment of new shooters and the vast proportion of developing individual shooter talents occur at club level. Therefore clubs are the essential building blocks of the Australian Clay Target Association and it is not just proper but it is essential that they play a more central role in the direction and development of the sport.

As indicated in the previous month's article, clubs under the new arrangements will have a central and controlling role in the national direction of our sport.

Last month we mentioned that the privilege of membership requires entering a contract and this is the case for club membership of the ACTA. At the risk of repeating ourselves the contract will read:

Members acknowledge and agree that:

- a) these Rules constitute a contract between each of them and the Company and that they are bound by the Rules and the Regulations;
- they shall comply with and observe these Rules and the Regulations and any determination, resolution or policy which may be made or passed by the Board or any duly authorised committee or other entity with delegated authority;
- by submitting to these Rules and the Regulations they are subject to the jurisdiction of the Company;
- these Rules are made in the pursuit of a common object, namely the mutual and collective benefit of the Company, the Members and clay target shooting;
- the Rules and Regulations are necessary and reasonable for promoting the objects of the Company and particularly the advancement and protection of clay target shooting as a sport; and
- f) they are entitled to all benefits, advantages, privileges and services of the Company membership.

This is no different to the current contractual requirements on clubs registered with the ACTA so effectively there will be no change for club membership of the ACTA. So what changes if any are there for clubs in the proposed new arrangements? As far as their day to day operations are concerned, the simple answer is none.

A club is a social, legal, and often fiercely independent entity. The Australian constitution works because it is a federation of independently governing states. Currently the national executive represents a federation of state bodies but in our sport the most independent and most important bodies are our clubs all 274 of them. State and zone associations exist because of the independence of clubs so it is a democratic anachronism for the clubs not to play a central role in the national governance of our sport. Under the new constitution Clubs will be able to nominate suitable candidates (candidates need to be financial members of the ACTA but cannot be President, Vice President or Treasurer of the State Association) directly to their State (up to 4 candidates); should the number exceed four the State will determine the most suitable four candidates. The Member States will then select from those nominated from each State. This ensures each State is represented at Board level.

Clubs will be able to focus more closely on the performance of the national board, so will there be a correspondingly greater focus on the governance of clubs. Clubs will under the new constitution be able to remove non performing Board members, something they cannot do currently. These days sports administrators have to be aware of a mind boggling array of issues over and above those of the simple conduct of the sport. It is far better that the pressure comes from within the sport rather from unfriendly outsiders. Shooting sports, saddled as they are with negative community views on gun ownership, need to be always one step ahead of trends otherwise they risk being sidelined and ultimately extinguished.

CONCLUSION

The current constitution seems to undervalue the essential role that clubs play. By directly nominating members to the Board Clubs have an increased role in providing the level of expertise required to run the National Body.

2015 Academy Results

This is the second year of the ACTA Academy last year saw athletes such as James Hayden (2016 Junior World DTL Team Gold Medal), Adam Bylsma (2016 Junior ISSF Trap World Cup Team Gold Medal), Kate Schiller (2016 DTL British Open Ladies Champion) Antony Ballarino (Australian Open Skeet Title, nominated for the 2016 Adrian Cousens Medal) and Jackson Willmann (nominated for the 2016 DTL Doug Smith Medal).

The ACTA Academy has two specific training camps for just them throughout the year, the first was at Cecil Park in February the next is planned for the AIS in Canberra. This years ACTA academy has lots more to achieve, review and learn in the next 6 months.





Catherine Skinner Women's Olympic Trap, Gold

When I started shooting, I was frequently asked if I would one day shoot for Australia at an Olympic games. My answer was always a confident yes, despite that I still had to shoot my first possible.



I knew that is was a distant goal, one that would require hundreds of targets, a few good days in between many ordinary ones, and a few bad days.

So, to be standing in the Olympic village in the green and gold was a moment of "wow, I'm actually here". This community of athletes all with their own stories and experiences, but a common ground where each of us had a burning passion for our sport, and an understanding of the sacrifices each of us had made to be there. It didn't matter what sport you were from, you were an Olympic athlete.

I didn't fully realise the extent of this until after my event. From the moment I shot the final target, I was launched into interview after interview, and somewhere in this whirlwind I was awarded my medal and whisked back to the village. I returned to a room full of athletes that had been waiting for me, to give me a standing ovation. Days later they would show me their personal videos of the finals, where the room had been packed, and they were all instant experts, despite not even knowing what my event was called.

That was my Olympic moment.

"Wow we have arrived!" someone yelled on the bus as we pulled up to the athletes village.

"Quick lets get our bags up

to our room and go to the food hall" Paul said, which unlike the shooting



range, didn't impress us much in the end (lucky they had maccas). The shooting range WAS impressive, remarkably like SISC so I felt pretty comfortable. I was fortunate to meet some great, like-minded people, watch some inspiring athletes, and have some memorable times. Being an Olympian has taught me to work hard, to dedicate myself and commit to something that I really wanted, with no excuses.

I gave it everything for Australia, and for myself, in Rio but just fell short. I have no regrets or excuses but just love and thanks to my family and friends for there support.

I learnt so much about myself and I aim to be doing it all again in another four years in Tokyo.

On the 10th it was competition day for me and I was very happy with my result of 140/150 in qualification, unfortunately 26/30 in the semi-final wasn't enough to get me into the medal matches but I come away with 5th place.

The ACTA Junior Coaching Program fosters junior development through involvement with Club coaching clinics, Zone, State and National coaching camps and coach development and accreditation.

The ACTA Academy is a key component of the ACTA Junior Coaching Program.

The ACTA Academy is aimed at providing a structured program for approximately 10 - 15 elite juniors to enhance their shooting skills, educate them in various aspects of being an elite athlete and provide 1 on 1 coaching, monitoring and mentoring so that they can be well on their way to achieving their goals. There will also be funding provided for targeted camps and competitions.

2016 has been an excellent year for the ACTA Academy not only with the camps but also with the Athletes results and development.

When selecting talented athletes for further development there are two ways of doing this; taking those athletes that have already risen to the top and the other is identifying those athletes with the potential to rise to the top. The ACTA Academy will select athletes both ways through achieving automatic qualification from the National Championships and then for the remaining positions through application to the National Coaching Director and recommendation by State Coaching Directors.

The ACTA Academy will be announced on 20th December 2016, after all of the National Events have been completed. Each athlete will need to accept the ACTA Academy terms and conditions prior to announcement.

The ACTA Academy will consist of 10 – 15 athletes each year, these athletes need to meet their discipline World Championship requirements as a junior the following year – so that they may see out at least one year as a junior e.g. ISSF Disciplines less than 21 in 2017 for other disciplines under 22 in 2017.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Do you need to be more Confident?

I have recently retired from my rather demanding and high pressured day job. This means I am more relaxed and have more time to shoot. Recently I attended the new Yass Gun Club while I was evacuated from my farm due to the Murrumbidgee River flooding.

At the shoot I met up with an old friend who asked about confidence and how can he be more confident. His question got me thinking and during the drive home I tried to come to terms with just what confidence is.

Confidence is an abstract construct. By that I mean it is not something that is concrete, you cannot pick it up for example or go the supermarket and buy some confidence. The more I thought about it the more the confidence as a thing became an integral part of how we see ourselves and interact with the outside world. It is tied closely to the values and attitudes we hold. It is also integral to mental toughness. Over the years of writing these articles, I have examined the idea of mental toughness, which is defined as the set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport, and how you interact. I outlined seven characteristics of mental toughness; being competitive, confident, in control, committed, composed, courageous and consistent.

Being confident means that you never fall victim to self-defeating thoughts; to be confident you need a can do attitude, a belief that you can handle anything that comes along.

So what is self-confidence? Patrick Cohn from Peaksports defines self-confidence as how firmly you believe in your ability to execute a physical skill or perform a task. Confidence, according to Cohn, comes from a baseline assessment of past performances, training, and preparation. As your competency or skill mastery grows, your confidence becomes proportionally stronger, which is strengthened more with successful training and quality practice.

The following is a list of sources of self confidence. Rank the following from I to IO (adding others if I have missed an important aspect of your own)

- Past successes in your sport
- An effective training program
- Immediate performance
- Positive comments from others
- Supportive people in your life
- Training or quality practice
- Quality coaching
- Quality Coacriling
- Optimistic coaching
- Belief in your physical talent
- Your own method or technique
- The quality of your equipment
- Level of your competition
- Warm up routine

under your control.

• Comfort with the environment

- Mental preparation
- Performance review
- Mental game coaching
- Coping well under pressure
- Good teamwork
- Positive rapport with teammates
- Positive rapport with coach
- Trust in teammates
- Sports diet, hydration, etc
- Fitness level or conditioning
- Other sports you have played
- Weather
- Game plan or strategies

Now that you are able to recognize the sources of confidence then it is also important to be able to recognize when confidence is dwindling. The biggest factor limiting confidence is self-doubt. I have written several articles over the years on self-doubt, and if readers need to revise, then go back over old issues or read "The Inner Game of Golf" by Tim Gallwey, which puts the whole idea of self doubt into perspective. Self-doubt is the opposite of self-confidence and it kills momentum, and stops athletes performing well because they are scared they will fail.

Self-doubt can be developed by a set of unhealthy and irrational beliefs about yourself and life in general. These beliefs include the following:

- 1. Strict expectations: "I can't make any mistakes if I want to win." What happens here is, is that you try to hard and tense up. You become less fluid and your unable to move and swing the way you should.
- Negative self labels: "I'm a poor finisher." This focuses you mind on negative judgements about past performances and takes you away from the here and now.
- Over-generalisations: "I don't do well on this course." Again you are focusing on the past and ignoring what you should be focusing on, which is the present.
- 4. Perfectionism: I need to be perfect. This is impossible and will lead to the following behaviours that will further undermine your self-confidence:
- Setting unrealistic goals and strict expectations
- Dwelling on shortcomings and failures
- · Worrying about past mistakes
- · Being too self-critical
- Comparing yourself to others
- Over-analyzing your performance
- Viewing your performance as either good or bad
- Measuring your self worth against your sporting success
- Focusing on future gains instead of playing in the present.

Now that you can recognize the sources of self-confidence and you can identify those irrational beliefs that get in the way and produce self-doubt.

There are five steps to seeing yourself as a winner:

Firstly, write down three positive self-labels that positively describe you in your sport, which you can truly believe.

Secondly, post these descriptions on your mirror, fridge, desktop, etc where you can see them every day.

Thirdly, Strive to identify and discard any negative labels that others have given you or that you have made up yourself. Write them on a piece of paper, crumple the paper, and throw it away with authority.

Next, when speaking to others about yourself or your abilities, use the positive self labels you have formulated with confidence. (Avoid deliberate outward displays of cockiness because people who lack confidence will view it as arrogance.)

Finally Goal: feel cocky on the inside while appearing humble on the inside.

By using the previous five steps, identifying the sources of your confidence and recognizing the negatives that get in the way, you will be on the way to being more self-confident and more mentally tough.

The DTL Oceania Shooting Championships were held at Auckland Metroplitan Clay Target Club, New Zealand in April this year. The ACTA sends development athletes to these events every 4 years (Kayla Grassi, Emma Cox and John Duryea went previously). Six athletes were selected from their scores at the 2015 DTL Nationals.

Nathan Burt, Cooper Mooney and Jack Cullinan comprised the official Australian DTL Oceania Team representing Australia as open shooters. Laura Woolley, Thomas Pilgrim and Tanya Skinner were also selected as individual athletes in the open section. All athletes being juniors were also eligible for the junior category. I I countries attended Fiji, New Caledonia, Norfolk Island, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Tahiti, Tonga, Vanuatu and Niue.

There were 3 events Double Barrel (known by the Kiwi's as Single Rise), Single Barrel and Points Score. There were open and junior categories and open teams.

Event I Double Barrel (Single Rise)

There were no possibles shot but 10 people shot 99/100 including Australia's Laura Woolley, Cooper Mooney, Nathan Burt and Jack Cullinan. After a long shoot off Nathan Burt was the overall winner. At this stage we thought we would have 3 shooters on the podium however to give all Oceania Countries an

opportunity on the podium only I shooter from each country may medal in each category hence Gold went to Nathan Burt AUS, Silver Christian Stephen FIJ and Bronze David Turner NZ. Cooper Mooney AUS won Gold in Juniors, with Franco Cafferelli from Samoa Silver and Kent Nicholl NZ Bronze. Australia winning Team Gold.

Event 2. Single Barrel

Glenn Kable FIJI Gold 99/100, Nathan Burt AUS Silver 97/100 and Stuart Sutherland NZ Bronze 96/100. Jack Cullinan 93/100 winning Silver in the

juniors, NZ Kent Nicholl Gold and Bronze going to Norfolk Islander Branker South. Team Australia winning gold, Fiji Silver and New Caledonia Bronze. The New Caledonian shooters were excellent shots with a strong background in Universal Trench and Ball Trap due to their links with France.

Laura Woolley and Jack Cullinan were only just out of the medals and would have been on the podium several times if multiple medals were allowed.

The most prized award at the Oceania DTL Championships is the overall team High Gun, our Australian Team of Jack Cullinan, Nathan Burt and Cooper Mooney were undefeated and came away with this coveted medal which is now found at the ACTA National Office.

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- 3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 15 Pair (30 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Monday 9th January 2017.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event. Written notification is required for any eligible refund to be processed and should be sent to accounts@claytarget.com.au refunds will be processed within 30 days of the completion of the event and will incur an administration fee.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role will INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Junior male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 16. Pre-nominations will only be accepted online on the form provided at www.claytarget.com.au
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 18. Junior to be under the age of 21 prior to January 1st 2017. Veteran to be over the age of 55 prior to January 1st 2017.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ACTA Clothing Rules.
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).
- 22. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
