President's Notes

RECREATIONAL MEMBERSHIP

Following requests from clubs, the new category of Recreational has been created to allow shooters to recreationally shoot in our sport at a non-competitive club level at a greatly reduced rate. The category includes Firearms cover so it represents good value and is more than competitive with other

associations offerings. The category does not allow any competition at a Club, Zone or State level and it is hoped that States and Zones will act in the spirit of this new category and not charge any fees as this would totally defeat the purpose of its introduction. The Executive strongly suggest that States and Zones adopt this stance, without the ACTA having to consider enacting a bye-law for this purpose.

I believe VCTA have already taken the initiative with this and I commend their action.

CONSULTATIONS: Sporting Clays Australia (SCA)

Your Board met with the board of SCA recently. The ACTA and SCA are continuing to discuss issues of common interest. Further discussion will also consider a common coaching scheme. When finalised this could be a great step forward for clubs of both Associations.

Sporting Shooters Association of Australia (SSAA)

Three of Your Board members attended a Board meeting of SSAA National to discuss matters of mutual interest. ACTA have now been invited to put forward a proposal to bring the two Associations closer together in the spheres of participation and coaching. Talks will be ongoing.

BOARD AND EXECUTIVE

Your Board and Executive members have had some robust discussions recently and of course we cannot all agree all of the time. The proposals that are put forward, such as the Constitution, are formed from majority decisions of the Executive. The Association has spent a great deal of time and money to get what we believe is an acceptable and workable proposal for clubs to consider at the next AGM. I would like to thank Executive members and especially Board members for the time they have devoted to this in the last 18 months.

SHOOTING AUSTRALIA (SA)

The Executive have tried to have input on many issues with SA and have had little success. The only place it now appears that we have a guaranteed input is on the election of Directors at the SA Annual General Meeting. A Whole of Sport Governance forum was conducted after the meeting. Some of the other member bodies had not discussed the Suiko report and recommendations at Board level prior to coming to the forum. General feeling from ACTA members present is that it will be a long time before the member bodies agree to disband, at both State and National level and hand all assets to Shooting Australia which was the major thrust of the review.

NATIONAL GROUNDS

The all-weather walking track has now been completed from layout 1 down to layout 11. This should provide a much better walking surface once the grass grows through the underlying support mesh. Plans are to continue the track further as funds permit.

We have been in continual contact with various NSW Government officers regarding the funding application for further Grounds Development. To date all responses have been favourable and we are hoping for a positive outcome shortly. We cannot speak highly enough of local member Daryl Maguire who has persistently promoted this application to the highest levels of the NSW Government. We thank Daryl for his efforts to date on our behalf.

MEMBERSHIP

The Association had an increase in membership numbers during 2016. The year closed with 14359 members up by 418 from the previous number of 13941. This is a pleasing increase and is in conflict with all the negativity that has been expressed recently. The biggest concern is that the annual turnover of members is around 20%. If clubs could concentrate on keeping these members, even more growth would result. We hope that members can see the purpose and benefits of belonging to a dedicated competition shotgun shooting association.

Your Executive is now continually looking for ways to add value to the membership, and any suggestions should be raised with your State for National consideration.

Executive Officer's Report

Big things to come? Hopefully yes

The announcement by his Royal Highness Prince Harry that the 2018 Invictus Games are being conducted in Australia (Sydney as the host city) is another example of the esteem the Australian sporting community is held. Our ability to provide a professional presentation of these sporting events says a great deal about our volunteers.

About the event

Founded by Prince Harry, the Invictus Games uses the power of sport to inspire recovery, support rehabilitation and generate a wider understanding and respect for wounded, injured and sick servicemen and women and the families that play such an important supporting role. It is the only international adaptive sporting event for wounded, injured and ill active duty and veteran service members.

Quote from the Prince below

"We had three key criteria. First, it had to be an iconic city somewhere known the world over.

Second, it needed to be a city with a proud military heritage, which would welcome competitors from all over the world with open arms.

And finally, we wanted to go somewhere where they are absolutely sports mad and would really get behind our competitors. It was an easy decision really the 2018 Invictus Games are coming to Sydney."

The ACTA will submit a proposal through the Invictus games committee to conduct a clay target event at the National Ground during the games. Given nine countries are ICTSF affiliated Countries plus the USA it is our intention to shoot a points score Trap event, the same as the World Trap event.

The Wagga Business Chamber, Wagga City Council, Kapooka Army base and the RAAF base have all indicated they support the proposal by member for Wagga Wagga Daryl Maguire. Daryl has been a great supporter of the National Body since being elected, whilst also being the long-time Patron of the NSWCTA. Being able to secure this event would also enhance our sport and the chance of being granted funding to develop the ground. There will be a meeting of these bodies with the Invictus Games committee in February to formulate a submission. We look forward to a positive meeting and future announcement.

Constitution

The newly revised and updated constitution and by-laws were circulated to Clubs through State bodies in November, the constitution has now had refinements made taking on board the feedback received. As members would be aware, the Constitution is the Association rule book and as such needs to be updated on a regular basis to ensure the rules and regulations meet governance standards. A review in dot point form is in this magazine. If you have any questions regarding the document, available online under the "news" section of the website please contact the National Office or a State delegate to the ACTA.

Environmental Issues

In response to a number of environmental and health and safety issues the ACTA Executive have agreed to implement to the following recommendations on the National Ground and also strongly advise clubs and states to adopt the same the policies.

- All trappers are to have gloves and wear safety glasses, any person handling targets should wear gloves.
- The ACTA has engaged PCM Enviro to further develop the current environmental management plan for the National Ground. PCM Enviro completed lead clean up in 2014 so the adoption of a new plan should see similar work carried out in 2017.

Rules Supervisor's Meeting

The National body will conduct a State Rules Supervisors meeting on Friday the 12th of May. The meeting will be conducted in Melbourne with each State invited to send their two Rules Supervisors.

The ACTA will pay for the attendance of one with the State incurring the cost of the second. Further information requesting agenda items will be sent to State Secretaries in early 2017.

Rule Clarification

After speaking to National Handicapper Ray Peatling we thought it would be appropriate to write a small article on Handicap adjustments in both Trap and Skeet. It appears there is some mis-interpretation around inward movement in Trap relating to handicaps tied to grades and with the correct formula adjustment in handicap target allowances tied to grades in Skeet.

TRAP

This problem is easiest to explain by proposing a scenario.

Scenario: A shooter who is in A grade with a handicap of 19 metres shoots well from common mark and is moved to AA. His handicap is automatically adjusted to 21 metres. Consequently this shooter wins a handicap event and receives an additional metre. He is now on 22 metres. Over time and after shooting 300 handicap targets he returns to 21 metres and consequently after 600 common mark targets returns to A grade.

The problem seems to occur in interpreting where his handicap should be after he returnes to A grade. It has been suggested that after the 300 handicap targets were shot he has somehow cancelled out the meterage that he won (that is earned meterage) and is now able to be re-handicapped to 19 metres on his return to A grade.

This is incorrect, the word "cancelled" does not appear in our rules in relation to handicapping. The only way back to a lesser handicap after "earning" a meterage status is 1 metre at a time each 300 targets. Keeping in mind the minimum handicaps for each grade.

SKEET

There seems to be some confusion relating to when a shooters handicap can be increased or decreased. Skeet handicaps are tied to grades [see handicap formula Rule 6.02(g)] The problem of interpretation only occurs in B and C grade as the handicap target allowance In AA and A grade is 0 and 1 respectively. In B and C grades the handicap target allowance can be either 2 or 3 for B grade and 4 or 5 for C grade.

Although a shooter will be upgraded after 200 targets and handicap adjustment made accordingly, a downgrade can only occur after 3 consecutive brackets totalling 600 targets. This means that shooters in B or C grades can only move from 3 to 2 in B grade or 5 to 4 in C grade after 600 targets have been shot.

ACTA Constitution–Part 7

This issue we wish to detail the proposed process for the election of directors to the board.

Currently national executive members are elected through, in some jurisdictions, a rather tortuous process of being elected as club delegate, then zone delegate then onto the state executive. Effectively those eligible for election hold three jobs <u>before</u> taking on the job of national executive member. As the election of delegates to the national executive members are influenced by state considerations making it less easy to concentrate on national issues as required by legislation. It is a credit to current and previous executives that members try very hard to override these conflicts in the interests of the sport nationally. Nevertheless it is hard to deny that there is a systemic conflict of interest and there is no doubt that some executive members have in the past paid a heavy price for subordinating state agendas in favour of the national interest.

The difficulty always comes down to the necessity to balance both the necessity of representation and also independent stewardship. As an aside, let's consider how these systemic conflicts are catered for in our national government. The Commonwealth Government of Australia is bicameral being comprised of two bodies: the House of Representatives whose job is to run the country independent of the states, and the Senate which is the States' house and whose job is to review legislation. Well that's the theory - let's not get side-tracked on how it actually works! The issue of relevance to the ACTA is that the conflicting necessities of independent governance and state representation must be catered for within the one body. Therefore any selection system of board members will be a compromise between total independence and total representation. Like all compromises the proposed model is not perfect and will not please everyone but in our opinion it will pass the "suck test" i.e. it will work. If it doesn't work there is no reason it couldn't be changed further down the track if need be.

To briefly reiterate from the first article in this series, the proposed board will consist of seven directors being representatives from the six States and the Northern Territory. Directors will be elected for two years as is the case now. In the first year after the adoption of the new constitution three member states will have a registered shooting member nominated by clubs within that state and elected by all member states. In the second year fours member states will go through the same process and so on through the ensuing years.

Despite the lengthy detail in the proposed new constitution (section 13.4), the actual process will be somewhat simpler than now with a focus on getting people with the right skills elected. The process will occur in four consecutive stages:

- At least 100 days prior to the AGM the Executive Officer will issue an invitation to all clubs within the State that has a relevant vacancy to nominate delegates for possible election to the board. Along with that invitation will be included a list of the necessary qualifications and job descriptions for the positions falling vacant that clubs will be requested to consider when making their nominations.
- 2. At least 90 days prior to the AGM clubs will then forward their nominations to their respective state executive who will consider the nominations on their merit and at last 60 days prior to the AGM forward a maximum of four to the ACTA office.
- 3. The ACTA office will then forward the nominations from the states

to a pre-selected, independent nominations committee which *in its* absolute discretion and acting in good faith, consider each nomination and may choose to endorse, recommend or comment on each nomination as it sees fit (13.4(f). In effect rate each nomination against the previously published skill sets. The committee will forward these comments to the ACTA office not less than 30 days prior to the AGM. The committee's comments will be provided to the member states no less than fourteen days prior to the AGM. It is important to note that all nominees will remain eligible for election.

4. At the AGM, State and Territory representatives (most likely the presidents or their nominee) will consider the nominations and the published ratings and then vote by ballot on the election of each state director for which a vacancy exists in turn.

An argument has been raised to the effect that clubs should vote on the election of board members. While this sounds more democratic but will it in practice? The vast majority of clubs are in NSW, Victoria and Qld. As the constitution will require that the board of directors will consist of one member from each state and territory there is no danger of board members coming entirely from the big states. However one issue is how many clubs will actually bother to vote remembering that the voting procedure will be a little complicated. In the first year they may be required to select the best candidate from four lots of four. It is likely that many clubs will decide it is too hard or simply won't care and not vote. This would not be good for the sport.

It is also suggested that clubs electing board members is proportional representation bit is it if the vote of the smallest country club has the same weight as the largest club in the city? When one objectively considers the issue it is difficult to find any process which is perfect. We consider that having the state representatives voting on all nominees is the closest to not only a fair system but, equally importantly, one which will work without the uncertainties outlined above.

A final point is that the states and territories are a legislated and known quantity with clear boundaries, a situation which is not likely to change any time soon. Clubs on the other hand can dissolve or affiliate with another organisation, be shut down or from year to year may or not choose to be part of the process, so there is no constant situation in place to ensure consistency of input on the directors' positions. With the state delegates voting on the final selection of directors it will be the same process year after year.

Please remember that the clubs, as well as nominating potential delegates, will have a constitutionally guaranteed formal role in the assessment of the board both collectively and individually. These are privileges that clubs currently do not enjoy.

Conclusion

As stated above the proposed selection process is a compromise between the demands of ensuring an independent, skilled board against that of member representation. In our opinion and also that of our legal advisors this is a workable compromise which ensures that both objectives are being realised in a way that is both fair and workable.

The ACTA has accepted an Association insurance policy that will see eligible members (defined as the legal owner of a firearm) provided with **Firearms Insurance** for up to **\$12,000**.

For an additional **\$10.00** fee any eligible member will be able to increase the Insurance coverage to **\$25,000**.

This insurance represents a significant saving on insurance for firearms and accessories. The ACTA has been looking for this type of insurance for some time. This will allow all eligible members to have insurance at a very low cost compared to what they may pay now.

Covering member's firearms, and/or associated equipment whilst in transit, stored in a locked vehicle in accordance with State Law and/or building and damaged or destroyed whilst in use anywhere in Australia and New Zealand and overseas coverage for 21 days per year.

• DEFINITIONS APPLYING TO THIS POLICY

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases. Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

The full policy document will be available on the ACTA website with all other insurance documents on the 1st of November 2016.

For an additional \$10.00 fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to \$25,000.



NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- 3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 5. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message <u>PRIOR</u> to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
- 22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
- 23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Skills Audit

Like many shooters, I read Clay shooting magazines from the UK and the USA.

What is interesting in these magazines is they often talk about the clay shooting season because it is too cold, wet and unpleasant to shoot in full winter.

In the temperate areas of Australia, we do not

have an off-season, because the weather, daylight and conditions mean that we can shoot all year round. That means there is no break from one year to the next. This means that there is little time to take stock of what we have achieved this year and what we want to achieve next year.

As this article is being published in January it seemed a good idea to look at where our skills may be and what improvements may be needed.

In the past at mental skills workshops, I have talked about doing a skills audit to work out what you are good at and what you need practise in and what you might need to learn or relearn. I have broken this skills audit into three components: physical skills, technical skills and mental skills.

Physical training can involve anything from walking, jogging, swimming and or cycling. Physical training with help from a life coach or physio will help deal with those problem muscle groups and get you back on track faster. You need to have a definite plan and if possible a buddy to work out with. This is essential as a motivator and keeps you committed because you will not want to let your buddy down. Secondly keep the sessions time limited as this will mean that you will not feel resentful about the opportunity cost of doing the exercises. Yoga, Pilates and Tai Chi are also great ways to boost physical skills and so too is getting rid of destructive behaviours such as smoking, drugs, steroid use and sugar.

Technical skills coaching should involve a coach to guide your technique. You will need to develop a plan with your coach to focus on problem areas such as difficult targets or dealing with problems such as distractions, weather, etc. Plans are all well and good but there must be a commitment to completing the plan.

Mental skills training focus needs to be ongoing and continue throughout the physical, technical training sessions and in the competition itself. For most sports, and any shooting discipline is no exception, the mental focus needs to be at least 90% mental while the physical aspect is only 10%. Now it is impossible to spend 90% of the time on mental training as it would be boring but in ten minutes of visualisation you can shoot 100 targets and shoot them all and shoot them well. Mental skills training is not just imagining you are shooting targets. It also involves relaxation, breathing, goal setting, concentration, mental rehearsal, etc.

In the past I would have stopped here but there is another skill that needs to be added; Competition skills.

Competition skills are the outcomes you develop around how you want to compete now and in the future. Competition skills are very important for B and C grade shooters who want to improve and move up the grades. It is very easy to feel overwhelmed or embarrassed about entering and competing in big competitions such as state carnivals or Nationals. These events and the experience you gain from competing in them will help you be a better shot back at your local club.

So as you read this in January, give some thought as to what you want to achieve in the next year and whether you have the skills set to help you achieve these goals.

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 3. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of **I5 Pair (30 targets)** with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 4. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business **(Eastern Summer Time)** Monday 9th January 2017.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. <u>Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.</u> Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event. Written notification is required for any eligible refund to be processed and should be sent to accounts@ claytarget.com.au refunds will be processed within 30 days of the completion of the event and will incur an administration fee.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS**.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role will **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES**.
- 11. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 12. All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 15. Junior male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 16. Pre-nominations will only be accepted online on the form provided at www.claytarget.com.au
- 17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- Junior to be under the age of 21 in the year of the competition. Veteran to be over the age of 55 prior to January 1st 2017.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 20. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ACTA Clothing Rules.
- 21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).
- 22. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

Swan Hill Clay Target Club held it's first Annual Ladies Day on 30th of October 2016. It was a fantastic day with 14 ladies in all, all beginners, all excited.

The idea initially came about after I had attended a similar day at the Donald Field and Game the last two years running. When our Club was asked by the VCTA to hold a ladies day in an effort to promote the sport to women, it only added fuel to the desire to run such an event.

Our club decided to run our event as a beginners day and not a competition day. The idea was to introduce women to the shotgun gently before introducing them to clay target shooting in general. We organised local, female orientated businesses to sponsor our event, by donating prizes, for ladies who attended to win, as a lucky door idea. We ordered platters of nibbles and cold drinks to keep the ladies refreshed during the day and we began the day at I pm. In hindsight, we could have started earlier and not been so rushed towards the end.

We had managed to organise 3 female instructors to assist with the teaching of the beginners. Two local club members, Kat & Bec, and one from the Donald Field and Game, Sarah who organises the ladies day there. Sarah was pretty nervous about attending our ladies day as she herself had never shot down the line, only ever Field and Game but after reassuring her that shooting a clay is shooting a clay she was fine and she proved to be worth her weight in gold. Our instructors were pre warned to be very vigilant about the safety of all in attendance as most of these women have never even been exposed to a firearm let alone shot a shotgun. They were very aware of the reactions that the ladies may face during the day including nerves, fear and excitement with a slight chance of tears and/or vomit.

The ladies began arriving, very excited, just prior to start time. Some in pairs, some in car loads and some braved it on their own. One lady had even travelled 3 hours from near Ballarat, convincing a couple of local friends to join her. Once they all got together, they mingled and mix well and the general excitement built.

The afternoon began with a quick 10 minute presentation and safety demonstration. The ladies were split up into small groups and the first group was asked to head out to the first layout but it became evident that excitement was too strong as they all headed out to sit and watch. Each lady took a turn receiving instruction on shotgun operation and safety, stance, position, footing and aim before they were given two single barrel shots. The trap had been set to release clays straight and slow. After the initial two shots, we changed shooter to give each a break to calm the nerves, then they had 3 further shots all single barrel. By some stroke of luck the very first lady with her very first shot smashed her first clay. The crowd applauded loudly! Once the first group was done the second group was called up from the gathered crowd and they were given the same one on one demonstration and instruction to shoot 5 single barrel shots at targets. After the final group had run through the single barrel targets, the first group were called again

this time to shoot double barrel. They each had 5 double barrel shots at 5 targets. We continued to witness quite a few ladies hitting the target and the excitement continued to grow amongst the crowd.

Once all shooters had been through their 5 targets, we returned inside for a refreshment and a chat. After that we headed out to the second ground where we had a standard competition ground setup with speakers and an oscillating target and each shooter took a position on the layout to simulate a competition shoot with instructors again assisting each shooter in turn. Each shooter was offered two shots at each target before moving on to the next path when it was their turn. Every shooter passed through the ground before the crowd headed back inside for a wrap up.

Part of the day's proceedings was to have each lady photographed in a special Ladies Day sash made for the day and we also had a group photo as well. Ladies were offered a celebratory glass of bubbly to celebrate their achievements. Every shooter that attended the day was entered into a lucky door prize with over 15 prizes on offer some participants were lucky enough to pick up 2 prizes. At the conclusion of the prize draw the crowd was addressed again, thanking them for their attendance and providing them with the information they need to continue to pursue this sport, firearms licence, firearms purchases, Club information etc. Surprisingly enough, despite a long 4 hour session and very trying conditions with wind picking up and reaching excessive speed that would test the skills of any seasoned shooter, the ladies we're still excited enough to have lots of questions and hang around for a chat afterwards.

As an organiser, it was such a thrill to be part of this day and I'm so proud of what we achieved, we meet some fantastic ladies. After such a successful day I'm confident that we will run this event again next year perhaps having both a beginner course (like this year) and an introduction to competition course but I'm also confident that we will triple our numbers next year with the ladies saying they will return and the most people they could bring with them, we also had quite a few people that had said they would have liked to have attended had the date not clashed with something else.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

ACTA NEWS

HOW DOES THE ACTA OPERATE?

The ACTA structure is as follows. The ACTA executive has delegated power to a Board to make recommendations to the full executive on matters raised through the reporting systems in place. Board and Executive members can bring agenda items to the Board at any time, through providing briefing papers clearly setting out the items they wish to raise. These items make up the agenda for meetings conducted on a regular basis and at times when urgent business is received at short notice. State Associations can also bring matters to the Board through their State meetings and through their delegates to the National Executive or to the Executive Officer.

Once the board has met on the agenda items they make recommendations to the full executive for approval by the full Executive. This process takes quite an amount of time, not only for items to be considered but acted on.

The decisions of the Executive once approved are documented in minutes then placed on the ACTA website. The ACTA National office staff do not make these decisions, the full Executive make these decisions and the staff carry out the decisions of the Executive.

If a registered shooters is looking to have an issue addressed in relation to the sport there is a process to go through. Matters should be directed to the Club in the first instance. Mostly they will be resolved at the Club level in line with your constitution.

For National matters, they should be addressed in writing to your club. The Club may be able to address many of the questions you have, should the club not be able to resolve your issue they can then forward or place issues on the Zone agenda for discussion and determination. Should this not resolve the issue then it should be referred by the Zone to the State Association. The State, if not able to resolve the issue or be able to deal with the issue under their own constitution should then send the item through their State delegates to the National Office to be placed on the agenda.

Whilst on the protocols for contact with the National Body, it is important to remember the role of the National Rules Supervisor & the National Handicapper. These volunteer give their time to work with the National body to assist in their specific areas.

The first action to be taken when you have a rules or handicapping issue is to talk to your club. The club may wish to refer this to the Zone for clarification or to the State Handicapper or State Rules Supervisor, these people can probably sort out your concerns.

If the concerns cannot then be adequately addressed by the State Rules Supervisor and or Handicapper they can then contact the relevant National Official. Where possible it is important to put these concerns in writing detailing the facts of your concerns. A written request is so much easier to deal with, as the issues and resolution are then in writing with no ambiguity.

As with any rule book or handicapping system where they exist in any sport there will be grey areas. All enquiries or disputes will be adjudicated at all times by the National office holders based on the written rules in each case.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS

2017 Member renewals including Club and State affiliations are due and payable by the 30th of December 2016. The ACTA welcomes back current members to a new year whilst those joining for the first time will also be welcomed via the Clay Target Shooting News.

It is important to note that memberships are due and payable before the 30th December 2016, if your membership is not paid by this time it will make you ineligible to shoot in 2017 until the fees are paid. There are numerous options to pay including through your club or directly through the database program "mypage". If you attend a shoot and have not renewed you may join the Club you attend, you will be issued with a receipt for you to show until your sticker arrives. If you are not a financial member you will not be able to shoot.

MYPAGE RENEWAL PROCEDURES

- Open the ACTA website www.claytarget.com.au and click on Member Log In.
- The ACTA has not previously collected email addresses, so even if you provided your email address to your club via your member renewal form there was no provision to forward it to the ACTA.
- Log In using your Member No. and password. If you do not have a password click on "forgot password" one will be sent to your email address. You need to have provided your current email address to the ACTA for the forgotten password link to work. If you have any issues to this point please contact the National Office on 02 6938 2121 or via email: membership@claytarget.com.au for assistance.
- Family members cannot share an email address in this system. All members must have their own email address.
- Once you have access to your MyPage area, please take the time to check all your details are correct. If your handicap is incorrect please contact your club secretary to have it updated.
- Processing your membership if your details are incorrect will mean that your 2017 membership sticker will be incorrect. Incorrect details can be changed by you manually in "mypage".
- Click on the renew membership tab follow the prompts to renew your membership.
- Processing your membership this way means that the ACTA will collect the ACTA fee, the State fee, Zone fee (if applicable) and the Club fee and pay these back to the relevant bodies on your behalf.
- Your renewal sticker is then placed in a queue to be printed at the National Office and mailed the next working day.
