# President's Notes

## NATIONAL GROUNDS – IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

*It is with great pleasure that I can now announce that the Association has been successful in securing 5.5 million dollars of NSW Government funding to*

*further develop a Club conference and functions facility on the National Grounds. This funding, provided outside of the sports grant structure, recognises the commitment and investment the ACTA has shown in the Wagga Wagga region over the last 15 years and the value of tourism injected into the regional economy by our presence.*

*Planning is well underway and will include major facilities for Administration, Catering, Functions, Presentations and Hall of Fame. A new entry will be created into the grounds and landscaping, carpark and sealing will complete the project. The development is to be completed in time for the ICTSF World DTL in 2018 and so we are in for a very busy time.*

*The official announcement was made on Monday the 2nd of January by local member Mr. Daryl Maguire, ACTA Board members and the Executive Officer following a press conference in Wagga Wagga.*

*It is important to recognise the efforts made by Daryl on our behalf. He has constantly championed our cause and along with us attended meetings with Treasury and other government departments and has lobbied extensively for the project. A big thank you to Daryl for being so determined and supportive.*

*Executive members and the Executive Officer have also made*

*a huge contribution to this project. I thank them on behalf of all members.*

## Federal Funding

*The granting of State government funding is a first for the ACTA and now opens up the opportunity for some Federal Government support. We will be discussing further options with Federal member Michael McCormack in the new year. The long term intention is to make Wagga Wagga a World Class facility across all disciplines, and one where members are not only comfortable and well catered for but also feel proud to welcome their friends and overseas visitors to their National Ground.*

## Ball Trap

*Installation of two ball trap layouts is now complete. These will be used for our training camps and be available to other users by negotiation.*

## Sporting Clays Australia

*The Association is continuing to confer with SCA and hope to make a positive announcement shortly.*

## Constitution

*The proposed constitution should be in the hands of all clubs by now as it was provided to the states in early November. Change is always challenging and some promote the negative side of things all the time. These type of proposals will never be 100% acceptable to everyone but why oppose the whole proposal because of one clause that can be changed as time goes by anyway? There has been a couple of years of work and significant expense gone into this document and I encourage you all to consider the benefits and ignore those that continually promote perceived shortfalls. There are many things in the document I do not personally agree with, but I will support it to get this important process of change started.*

## ACTA NEWS

### ACTA TRAP AA ELITE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

ACTA shooters who meet certain criteria in relation to their grading, handicap and Hall of Fame point accumulation may apply to the National Office to be elevated into a special grading level that reflects their achievement of an Elite level of performance.

Shooters may apply once they attain any one of the following levels:

1. AA grade and a handicap mark of 25 metres
2. AA grade with a minimum of 50 HOF points
3. AA grade and Induction into their State or the National Trapshooting Hall of Fame

Upon attaining AA Elite classification shooters shall be:

1. Issued with a Handicap Card sticker indicating their Elite grading
2. Added to a register of AA Elite Shooters maintained by the National Office and posted on the ACTA website.
3. Presented with a special lapel badge to indicate their achievement at the next Trapshooting Hall of Fame induction dinner.
4. Required to show their Handicap Card when nominating for events but the recording of scores shall be optional at the shooters discretion.
5. Required to shoot in AA grade and from 25 metres FOR LIFE.
6. Any application to be removed from AA Elite status will only be considered due to medical reasons that inhibits the shooters ability substantially. An application received will be considered by the Hall of Fame committee, individual cases will be assessed on their merit.

The skeet Hall of Fame Criteria will be published in the next CTSN



# Executive Officer's Report

## Membership and affiliation

It is that time of the year again where new secretaries and committees are faced with the inevitable questions regarding membership and affiliation. The Secretaries Handbook is on the website and documentation (including the current constitution) was forwarded by states to Clubs in November 2016. The constitution should be read in its entirety to allow committee's to understand what, where and when the rules are applied.

Whilst the ACTA is currently talking with a number of other Associations to further enhance membership the current situation is very clear.

All member / affiliated ACTA clubs are required to adhere to the ACTA constitution, this includes, clubs complying with the constitution. Shooters not registered with the ACTA cannot shoot on ACTA affiliated grounds when shooting ACTA events.

Clubs who are dual affiliated may conduct events under the banner of the other Association however any event conducted under the auspices of the ACTA cannot include non-members. Any event not sanctioned by the ACTA would not be covered by ACTA insurance and benefits.

**There are no reciprocal rights or agreements in place with any other shooting organisation. .**

It is now well into January and all members should now be financial for 2017 to enable them to continue to shoot. If you have joined a club and have not received your new record card label you should retain your club receipt and contact the club. It is imperative that clubs register new and existing members as they join. Waiting until the end of the month means your members will not receive their 2017 membership label.

The ISSF National Championships commence on the 16th of January, the ISSF Internationally have again made changes to the format of finals and numerous other changes that are implemented from the 1st

of January. This includes the provision of a countdown clock for finals and a new program chip for existing hardware. The ACTA event will introduce a number of the new measures however due to the limited notice of these changes the Event Management have determined that the rules in relation to wad colour and music being played during the final will not apply.

On the back of a fantastic 2016 year our ISSF shooters are expected to again figure prominently on the world stage in 2017 with a long term view of selection for the 2018 Commonwealth games on the Gold Coast.

It is also important to remember to ensure your firearms are kept safe, there have been a number of break-ins that I am aware of in Southern NSW/Victoria. To ensure you protect your guns, your sport and your investment it is important you comply with the laws of your state. Most Insurance policies are worded around compliance with Firearms laws being part of that compliance.

Our duty as the custodians of the sport of Clay Target Shooting is to ensure the sport continues to grow and develop for future generations, keeping your firearms safe will ensure this is possible.

## ACTA NEWS

### MEMBERSHIP

It has come to light that a number of Clubs are not processing memberships in a timely manner as is evident by a number of Clubs wanting to "join" members for 2016 because they "forgot" to join them with the ACTA as required. Whilst this may seem innocuous the ramifications are numerous:

Firstly if there was an incident or accident involving the person and the ACTA received a claim form, we would check the membership and ascertain their status. The result is that if they are a non-member they may not be entitled to coverage as they are not financial. The ramifications of this is that liability may fall back to the Club, its Executive and Members.

The second issue is that of continuous service. The ACTA is then in a position where the continuous service of the person involved is compromised, again this issue arises through protocols not being followed. Clubs have the ability to enter members, new and existing through the ACTA

processes, however if they are not processed the ACTA has no way of knowing that the person has joined a club, therefore the member who paid in good faith is disadvantaged.

If a person is not entered as a member on the ACTA data base they do not receive a membership label, so how is this person shooting throughout the year? These are very dangerous practices and everyone from registered members to Club and State officials should be concerned about these incidents and circumstances. The ACTA impresses upon all registered shooters to ensure you receive your membership label. If you do not receive it inside two weeks, return to, or contact your club to ensure it has been dealt with. If you are a Club Secretary you are requested to attend to memberships on a regular basis. We realise secretaries are volunteers, the electronic membership renewal and new member registration process is designed to make your job easier. The compliance to these issues ensures all members and clubs are covered legally and morally.

# New ACTA Constitution Summary Points

- ACTA becomes company limited by guarantee.
- Changes only affect the ACTA minimal impact on States and Clubs.
- No change to membership.
- Board replaces executive and consists of one director from each State and Territory.
- Adopts currently accepted principles of sports governance.
- Increases accountability of directors.
- Clubs nominate people for election as directors.
- Each State put forward maximum of four nominees.
- Nominations committee rates nominees against pre-advertised selection criteria.
- NB: the Nominations Committee does not elect directors and all nominations go forward for election.
- States are advised of nomination committee's assessments.
- All State representatives (presidents or their delegates) elect one director from each State or Territory.
- Directors serve for a period of two years.
- Three directors elected one year, four the next.

The event was run smoothly by the VCTA in conjunction with the Echuca CTC and the committee members, volunteers, traders and teams of people helping out made the carnival the success it is year after year.*

Friday the 11th dawned with near perfect conditions for shooting, a 21 degree day with a slight breeze and blue skies. Newly elected mayor of the Shire of Campaspe, Councillor Adrian Weston attended and officially opened the carnival. Two new shooters were inducted into the Victorian Clay Target Hall of Fame, Russell Mark and Stephen Atkins, who both have a long association with shooting and fantastic achievements in the sport. Congratulations to both Stephen and Russell on their induction into the Hall of Fame.



The first event of the day was the 25 Pair Victorian State Double Rise Championship, sponsored by Mialls Gun Shop. Matt Schiller was the



only shooter to hit them all and win the Overall Sash.

Russell Mark took out first place in AA with 69/70, Stephen Schiller claimed A grade with 47/50, Trevor Harbor was first in B Grade with 43/50 and David Currie was first in C grade with 43/50 also.

Tarryn Shaddock claimed first in Juniors with 48/50, Trish Carter took home the sash for the ladies with



a score of 46/50. Doug Thomas received the first place sash for the veterans with his score of 73/80.

Event Two, the Victorian State Handicap Championship sponsored by Beretta Australia was won by Stephen Pearson with a total score of 72/72 over Sub Junior entrant Luca

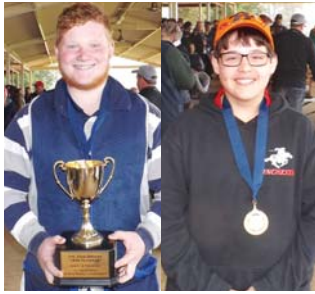


The second day of the carnival brought challenging conditions for the shooters, a dull day with blustery winds consistently throughout the events.

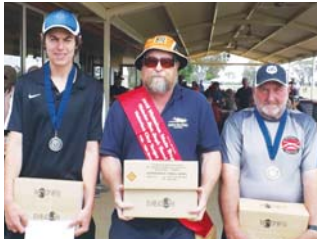

*After only our second year running the Gold Coast Clay Target Club Junior Olympics the kids have turned the tables on us. # 2016 NSW State Skeet Carnival

National Ground, Wagga Wagga, NSW



*Due to excessive and continual rain during July, August and September the State/National Ground was deemed unusable on the dates originally scheduled for both the Skeet and Trap Carnivals, consequently both of these events were rescheduled to November and December respectively.*

This change in date has had some advantages and disadvantages and left a number of shooters in a position where they could no longer attend, but on the other side has allowed others to attend that previously could not. A number of shooters reorganised their flight departure dates to the New Zealand Nationals so that they could still attend the NSW State Titles and we thank them for doing so.

It looked like our attendance numbers were going to be down around 30% based on pre-nominations but the numbers picked up and we ended up with only 10 shooters down on last year's record attendance.

# 2017 National Trap Championships OFFICIAL PROGRAM

**25th March – 2nd April**

*To be staged at the National Ground, Wagga Wagga,  
by the Australian Clay Target Association.*

## CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

### Entry

Entry into the 2017 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2017 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2017 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

### Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans sections; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

### Age Qualifications

**Competitors must be over the age of 12 (NSW Firearms).**

*Veterans* – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 55 years and under 65 years as of the 1st January.

*Super Veterans* – are those over the age of 65 years as of the 1st January.

*Juniors* – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 21 years as of the 1st January. (Under 21 for Mackintosh)

*Sub Juniors* – are those who, will be under the age of 16 years as of the 1st January.

### Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

### Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

### Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

### Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly

classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

### Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

### Practice

Practice will be available throughout the championships.

### Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

### Authority

This program shall control the 2017 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2017 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

### Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

### Services and Facilities

#### Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

#### Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting and our sponsors of this event.

#### Parking:

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times – Please co-operate.

#### Souvenirs:

In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting, the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 2017 National Championships badge.

# 2016 Australian Open Olympic Trap

**Brisbane Gun Club  
November 2016**

*After a busy year during which Brisbane Gun Club has experienced increased interest in the Olympic Discipline of clay target trap shooting, the annual Aust. Open Olympic Trap Championship was conducted at the Belmont Range over the weekend of 18th and 19th November.*

As usual, the opportunity for Olympic Discipline shooters to participate in a 200 target event at Brisbane was a great incentive for many shooters from throughout Queensland and Australia to come to Brisbane for this prestigious event.

Boasting former champions including Olympic medallists Michael Diamond and Adam Vella, along with Commonwealth Games Gold medallist Ben Kelley and former World Junior Championship team member, Fil Petriella (who won the event twice), the Aust. Open

Olympic Trap Championship has established itself as one of the most prestigious events on the year's Olympic Discipline calendar.

Along with the annual Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix", which will again be held from 17th to 19th February in 2017, the Aust. Open Championship is an opportunity for shooters from throughout Australia to shoot alongside visitors from other countries.

Following the success of Australia's shooters in recent overseas events, the field of shooters for the 2016 championship was expected to be good, and it was not unexpected when shooters from throughout Queensland, N.S.W., Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia and Papua New Guinea lined up for the first day's proceedings.

In keeping with past formats, the competition was shot over two days with 100 targets each day. All shooters (Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans) were eligible for grade and section wins and the Overall medallists would be determined following a 25 target single barrel with the final score to be added to the score out of 200.

Of course, one of the most important features on the two day Championship was the 8 rounds of 'Skins' held in conjunction with the event. The 'Skins' were graded AA and A Grades combined and B and C Grades separate.

At the commencement of shooting on Saturday morning, 9 squads of shooters had nominated. The number of shooters attending determined that the competition

could be conducted over two Olympic Trap ranges, with our third range in reserve should it be needed.

After the completion of the first round, Warren shooter Jason Owen established himself as a shooter to watch during the two days carding a first round 24/25. Former Olympian Craig Henwood from Melbourne Gun Club was next on 23/25 along with Brisbane's

## NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.  
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## Psychological Value of Shooting

In my previous role as Learning and Well-being Coordinator with the NSW Department of Education I was fortunate to look at the work of Tony Coggins.

Tony Coggins is Head of Mental Health Promotion at South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust. He has examined the impact of social programmes and projects and their impacts on personal wellbeing and the Department of Education wanted to use his Mental Well-Being Impact Assessment Tool to evaluate the impact of programmes developed for and used in schools.

In 2015 the NSW Department of Education released the Well-Being Framework, based on three aspects: Belong, Thrive and Succeed. All schools are now required to track and measure the wellbeing as part of the School Excellence Framework.

But how does this relate to shooting, I hear you ask?

Shooting as a sport and a life-style activity has a substantial impact on our physical and mental wellbeing. The UK Government Office of Science 2008 Foresight Report defined mental well-being as "... a dynamic state in which the individual is able to develop their potential, work productively and creatively, build strong and positive relationships with others and contribute to their community. It is enhanced when an individual is able to fulfil their personal and social goals and achieve a sense of purpose in society."

There are five basic components of wellbeing:

Connecting with the people around you. For shooters this is easy because we meet lots of people and we all have a common interest. Think of these as the cornerstones of your life and invest time in developing them. Building these connections will support and enrich you every day.

Be active. Shooting in the field or at the gun club is an active sport. It is outside involves exercise and is physical as well as mental. Further clay target shooting can be done at all ages and at all fitness and ability levels.

Take notice of your surroundings and what you are doing. Be curious. Catch sight of the beautiful. Remark on the unusual. Notice the changing seasons. Savour the moment, whether you are walking to work, eating lunch or talking to friends. Be aware of the world around you and what you are feeling. Reflecting on your experiences will help you appreciate what matters to you. Regular readers will have picked up that this is staying with the here and now.

Keep learning Try something new. Rediscover an old interest. Set a challenge you will enjoy achieving. Learning new things will make you more confident as well as being fun.

Give Do something nice for a friend, or a stranger. Thank someone. Smile. Volunteer your time. Join a community group. Look out, as well as in. Seeing yourself, and your happiness, linked to the wider community can be incredibly rewarding and creates connections with the people around you. All these components are easy for shooters as most clubs and organisations run on the help of volunteers. Giving something back to the club or organisation makes you a better person and better off mentally than those who take, take and take some more.

The British Association for Shooting and Conservation (BASC) knowing that wellbeing is used by policy makers and Governments as an indicator and measure of our quality of life initiated a survey in March 2015 and 1457 people responded. 86% of the respondents were BASC members.

The survey found that shooting actively contributes towards Government wellbeing targets by providing personal, social and physical benefits.

The key findings from the survey were:

1. Shooting makes an important contribution to health and wellbeing among people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities.
2. Shooting can help to get more adults active through sport and physical activity, reduce social isolation and promote personal wellbeing whilst encouraging people to engage with the natural environment.
3. Allowing for variations according to discipline, shooting and its associated activities are moderate to high intensity physical activities.

Why is this important to shooters here in Australia. It is difficult to pick up a newspaper lately without someone associated with the gun control lobby making negative and alarming inferences about gun ownership and shooting. As shooting sportspeople we are targeted along with criminals, gang members and terrorists because the media and the gun control lobby want to use the crime statistics to make their case appear significant and give them the moral high ground.

We need to have information at hand that we can use to refute their claims, but this information needs to have a positive community focus. For example, the Premier of NSW has as one of his priorities to reduce childhood obesity. Some gains can be made through more sport at school and healthy canteens but as a lobby group, responsible registered sporting shooters (that is us) should be pushing the physical and mental wellbeing benefits of shooting. Physical exercise and activity that involves walking, lifting, focus, etc can help people keep the weight off and not end up with preventable lifestyle diseases such as Type 2 Diabetes. To protect our sport we need to stress that responsible gun ownership and involvement in shooting sports can be positive and have an overwhelming social benefit. Another focus can be the intergenerational involvement in our sport where grandparents, parents and children can play and compete together.

Next month I will look at specific benefits from shooting activities in relation to psychical and metal wellbeing.

## Rule Clarification

### Rule 1.23(a-c) SWEEPSTAKES DEDUCTIONS and CASH DISTRIBUTION

This rule also appears in the Skeet section of our Rule book as Rule 5.15 and as Rule 11.07 in Sporting.

**What we need to clarify is the difference between Sweepstakes, either compulsory or optional, Cash Divide and Cash Prizes.**

**See Rule below:**

#### 1.23 SWEEPSTAKES DEDUCTION AND CASH DISTRIBUTION

- (a) Clubs have the option of taking 60% in cash divide events.
- (b) No deduction is permitted by clubs in optional sweepstakes.
- (c) In all sweepstakes, distribution shall be on the basis of 60% (1st), 30% (2nd), 10% (3rd). A competitor scoring the only possible in the event wins only 60% (1st place). All optional sweeps shall be compulsory division as in the above formula. The Management shall clearly indicate on the official score sheet or scoreboard those who have entered for the optional sweep. When running Graded Sweeps/Cash divide each grade monies to be divided between that grade.

**Sweepstakes or Cash Divide Events** are in fact the same. Clubs nominating either of these events in a program need to understand that the result of the event is finalised when the the initial amount of event targets are shot. That is, scores off the gun. There is no shoot-off

requirement and cash distribution of prize money must comply to the formula within the Rule.

**Cash Divide/Sweepstakes** events can be either graded or shot as a single category, but should be advertised at nomination as one or the other. In a Graded Cash Divide all money within each grade will be distributed solely within that grade, whereas if the event is advertised only as a Cash Divide, money will be paid out only as 1st, 2nd and 3rd. Both types of Cash Divide or Sweepstakes are acceptable in our Rules. Payments must comply with the 60, 30, 10 percent formula. If for example 2 shooters shot a possible then 90 percent would be divided between them and the remaining 10 percent be left for 3rd place. If more than one shooter shoots the same score in 3rd place then that 10 percent would be shared equally between them.

**Optional Sweeps** is a term used to describe an additional event within any other type of event. All money paid into this option must be paid out fully by the club and money is distributed on "off the gun" scores to the same percentage formula as above.

**Cash Prizes** often replace trophies. The difference between a Cash Prize and a Cash Divide event is simple. Any event where the intention of management is to shoot the event off until finality, either graded or outright can be a Cash Prize event. This then becomes a management decision as to the amount paid. Clubs can then pay equal amounts to each grade or as they determine.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
