President's Notes

Trap Nationals

The 2017 DTL Nationals are almost upon us and nominations are now open. The 2017 event will see the guaranteed prizemoney continued. A feature will be the selection of the World DTL teams to compete at the 2018 ICTSF World DTL Championships to be conducted in Wagga

Wagga immediately after the 2018 Nationals. Three teams will be selected in each of the Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran and Super Veteran categories as allowable under the ICTSF World DTL rules. This means there will be fifty-one individual spots available in total. I would encourage you all to come and try to make these teams. Following a great reception last year the Two Lucky draws of \$500 cash each night following presentation will continue.

National Ground

The interest received following the media announcement of the NSW government grant of \$5.5 million dollars has been immense. The Tourism and Development based grant will be used to construct a clubhouse and conference facility on your grounds. The facility will provide much needed catering and lounge facilities and also contain the ACTA Hall of Fame. Groups are already trying to make bookings for conferences and events in the facility, and caterers have already expressed an interest in operating from the venue. The ACTA is confident that the venue will be a money earner for the Association and that benefits will flow onto the wider membership following its completion.

It is however important that we remember that the National Shooting Ground is for the use of shooters in the first instance and that this ancillary development must not interfere with the grounds original intended use.

ISSF Nationals

A very successful ISSF Nationals has just finished at the West Australian Gun Club (WAGC). High scores were recorded with many benchmark scores being shot. National Championships were won by Aislin Jones, Teegan McCloy, James Willett, Keith Ferguson, Laetisha Scanlan, and Todd Malone. National High Guns were won by Aislin Jones, Trish Carter, James Willett, Paul Adams, Laetisha Scanlan and Mitchell Iles. Our congratulations go to these accomplished shooters.

Shooting Australia was represented at the event by their new High Performance Manager Adam Sachs and their Shotgun Coach, Adam Vella. We are sure the standard and depth of competition impressed them both. I would like to thank the ISSF judges, ACTA staff, members of WAGC and the West Australian Clay Target

Association who all strived so hard to make this event the success it was.

Unfortunately a procedural decision resulted in some controversy. The resultant fallout marred the event unnecessarily and affected the presentations negatively. We believe presentations are an opportunity for winners to be recognised and are not a forum for outlining your personal displeasure.

Sporting Clays Australia

Continuing talks between members of both the SCA and ACTA boards has resulted in a proposed agreement about to be circularised to both bodies for consideration. I am not at liberty to disclose the contents as yet, but we believe it to be a sensible and beneficial arrangement for both bodies and their members.

Insurance

Questions have been raised about whether members have Public Liability Cover if in the field on private property. This is due to some landowners requesting this before allowing entry. The broker has confirmed that financial members are covered for Public Liability whilst legally in the field.

Questions have also been raised regarding the Firearms insurance. The most common are which firearms are insured and where are they insured. The broker has advised that any firearm registered to you is insured up to the policy limit of \$12,000 or \$25,000 if the higher limit has been chosen. They have also advised that firearms are insured anywhere in Australia and for 21 days overseas providing the use or storage at the time of the incident is legal.

To date we have not found any shortcomings in these policies and believe them to be excellent cover and value for members.

Legislation

It is interesting to look at the commonalities between the Martin Place Siege and the tragic incident in Melbourne recently. No licensed shooter, no registered firearm, already known to police and out on bail. The Martin Place siege review concentrated on possible changes to licensed shooters rights. This time the review will have to concentrate on the real problems of bail process and mental health issues as there was no firearm involved. Perhaps a shifting of valuable resources from concentrating on the legal firearm owner and sportsmen into the area of known offenders and the bail process would now be in order?

Constitution

The proposed constitution is nearing the day when it will be considered by the membership. If it succeeds it will be a great step forward. Clubs, for the first time ever, will have the opportunity to put forward prospective Directors for consideration. Currently only the 270 or so club delegates can be considered for the positions of National Delegate but the proposed constitution widens this to any registered shooter, making it over 14,000 to choose from. With all States voting on all nominees, the outcome should see those with the greatest skills at the helm of the Association.

I encourage you all to look at the benefits and support the Notice.



Executive Officer's Report

There has been a great deal of positive comment regarding the overall medium to long term plans of the Association. If the Association is to drive the sport forward it is imperative the members understand the needs to grow the Association to be able to support clay target shooting into the future.

The Executive has worked and debated the important issues that affect and potentially hamper the development of the sport. It is commonly asked why the ACTA does not have development staff? Why does the ACTA not provide grants to clubs & States? The answers to these questions are explained in the following paragraphs.

The ACTA must be financially viable for the future generations of members. The Association is embarking into commercial operations that will support the Association in its plan to develop the sport. The \$5.5m grant from the NSW Government will provide the ACTA with a commercial income that will ensure the ACTA has money to spend without putting the Association at risk.

This Grant is just that, a grant, the Association is not required to return or payback this money. That means the ACTA will have a 5.5 million dollar function centre and a National facility to be proud of for the cost to the ACTA contribution of 1.2m dollars.

The NSW Government worked with the ACTA over the past four months to confirm the final grant terms and requirements. As late as May 2016 we were told for the fourth time the funding would not be granted. The persistence of local member Daryl Maguire and a professional submission provided by consultants GHD resulted in the grant being reconsidered and eventually accepted with an increase in the funding provided to ensure it also met the requirements of the NSW governments future vision.

With forward bookings already received, the income (3 confirmed events) will nett the ACTA more than we would receive in interest for our contribution. We have already received interest from many organisations and businesses for functions and to consider further commercial opportunities.

The foresight of the Executive to pursue this development is to be applauded, supported and encouraged. The economic benefits to the Association will be enormous. This opportunity will only happen once, so we need to capitalise and make this work for the future of the ACTA and our members.

We have a huge opportunity to promote the sport nationally and internationally in the next 18 months. The support of all ACTA members and shooters is paramount in making this work. I look forward to reporting more on the development in future reports.

The 2018 World Championships are not far away and the planning has commenced to ensure we present a professional event to showcase the ACTA. Whilst it is over 12 months away the selection of our teams in March 2017 puts the World Championships at the forefront of people's minds. The opportunity to represent the Association at a home world event should ensure a large attendance. Whilst the selection of the shooting teams will look after themselves by way of qualification we are working on the administration of the event. We believe the number of shooters will be around the 800 mark.

By 2018 we will have 20 traps in the ground hence catering for this number is well within our capabilities. However it will require a concerted effort by all to ensure we get through the program. Depending on numbers the points score event can be shot over five banks of four traps with shooters shooting their 100 targets per day over two hours. This format is typical of the World Championships format and works very well. The World DTL is conducted over three days with 100 target points on day one and day two and 50 target points on day three after which the top 50 plus ties will contest the final 50 target points. Teams are finalised at the conclusion of day two.

The ACTA will be seeking qualified referees for the event. The Rules Supervisors meeting in May will have this item on the agenda and we will take recommendations from this meeting as to how we recruit these officials.

The ACTA executive agreed to have Ray Mack produce and provide the World DTL Championships merchandise. Ray has already commenced designing the selection of shirts caps etc. We will be putting these on the ICTSF and ACTA sites later in the year so people can pre-order their requirements.

The ACTA has a great deal to accomplish in many areas in the next 18 months. The future for the sport continues to look positive.

Mansfield 2016 High Gun Awards

Mansfield Clay Target Club December 2016

The annual Mansfield Clay Target Club Christmas Shoot was held on Sunday in perfect conditions with warm weather and light wind with a field of 38 competitors resulting in a 7 squad competition. Shooters came from far and wide including Alexandra, Benalla, Euroa, Wangaratta, Melbourne, and Woods Point.

The day's events were not about record book shooting, but more about getting together to celebrate the end of the shooting calendar for 2016 and having a great fun day. The festivities included the serious business of recognising achievements for the annual overall High Gun at the conclusion of our last shoot for the year, and a special presentation of a life membership.

In keeping with Christmas shoot tradition a mixed bag of unorthodox competitions was conducted with the normal competitive nature of trap shooting taking second stage to having a fun day. An overriding rule applied to the 4 event card with all shooters only able to be awarded a prize for one first, second or third ensuring an even spread of prizes and festive cheer.

The first event was a twenty target double barrel silent rise with targets thrown without the normal process of a shooter calling for a target, quite challenging. The second was 20 targets, walk forward/walk back, starting with a first shot at 16 metres decreasing per shot down to the 11 metre mark and then one shot per metre back to the 25 metre handicap line.

This was followed by a Christmas lunch with all the usual trimmings enjoyed by competitors, spectators, family, friends and helpers. After lunch the third competition was a two target presentation with one target thrown from the trap house forward of the shooters and the second from the tower behind the layout, as ten pair. This was both challenging and great fun with scores ranging from near perfect to 'better luck next time'.

The last game for the day a 20 target 'reverse' points score could be approached tactically or just shoot as normal and see how it pans out. Reverse points score was scored I for a first barrel 2 for a second barrel and three for hitting a chip of the target partly broken by the first shot. Shoot-



Psychological Skills for Shooting

Personal Value of Shooting continued

Last month, I explored the connection between shooting and wellbeing as reported from the British Association of

Shooting and Conservation (BASC) The Personal Value of Shooting: The social, physical and personal wellbeing contribution of shooting and outlined the five basic components of wellbeing: connection, activity, observation, learning and giving.

To recap the key findings from the survey were:

- I. Shooting makes an important contribution to health and wellbeing among people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities.
- 2. Shooting can help to get more adults active through sport and physical activity, reduce social isolation and promote personal wellbeing whilst encouraging people to engage with the natural environment.
- Allowing for variations according to discipline, shooting and its associated activities are moderate to high intensity physical activities.

In the 2015 Australian Psychological Society Wellbeing Survey the following key facts were noted. The top five causes of stress in Australia over the past five years are:

- personal finances 49 per cent;
- family issues 45 per cent;
- personal health 44 per cent;
- trying to maintain a healthy lifestyle 40 per cent; and
- issues with the health of others close to us 38 per cent.

I imagine that this finding would not be all that different from the main causes of stress in the UK, USA or Europe. When asked how do you manage stress the five most popular ways of managing stress in Australia over the five years are:

- watching television/ movies 85 per cent;
- focusing on the positives 81 per cent;
- spending time with friends and/ or family 81 per cent;
- listening to music 80 per cent; and
- reading 75 per cent.

It is interesting to note here that Australians stress over trying to maintain a healthy lifestyle but exercise or sport is not listed in the most popular ways of managing stress.

So what were the outcomes of the British Association of Shooting and Conservation (BASC) *The Personal Value of Shooting: The social, physical and personal wellbeing contribution of shooting* report. The top 3 reasons for taking part in shooting:



77% said their social life would suffer without shooting and the average the number of friends made through shooting is about 20

The top 5 areas people said would be negatively affected if they could no longer take part in shooting were:

- Enjoyment of life 86%
- Engagement with the natural environment 84%
- Happiness 78%
- Opportunity for relaxation 77%
- Engagement in sport 72%

These are powerful statistics because they show that shooting is integral to being physically fit, exercising, spending time outdoors, relaxing and being connected with others who share similar interests. This will lead to positive wellbeing. With so much negative press about shooting lately we should be armed with data that can put shooting in a positive light and show that as an activity or a sport it has a significant personal benefit for those who shoot.

ACTA RECORD CARDS

While most Club Secretaries and Handicappers seem to be very efficient in requesting Record Cards for entry, entering scores and totalling up brackets for grading, there is still a very small minority of shooters who seem to go out of their way to make life difficult for our generally overworked, usually volunteers, club office workers.

Please try to assist by pleasantly presenting your card on shoot day and please also ensure that your entered scores are correct and totalled.

I remind all ACTA shooters that the presentation of your Record Card is compulsory at shoots, AA Elite included. Not only does it identify you easily from the ACTA data base on Club computers, but it proves that you are a legitimate financial member and establishes your handicap and grade.

All ACTA disciplines, Trap, Skeet, Sporting and ISSF, have provision made for recording scores in the Record Card and I would like to compliment the UT shooters who have made an effort to record their scores by renaming one of the other discipline pages for their needs.

Although UT is a FITASC discipline it is generally shot on ACTA grounds. To this end we will make pages available in the next printing of the Grading Card for UT scores.

Of particular note is the lack of scores being entered into the ISSF sections by some clubs and I reiterate that ALL SCORES, regardless of what authority the event is run under need to be entered to establish appropriate grades.



NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- 3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 5. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message <u>PRIOR</u> to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- II. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 13. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
- 22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
- 23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.




four shooters managing the full score. Bryan Rafferty, John Dohnt, our Geraldton Western Australian visitor, Peter Tate and Travis Gull.



(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

ACTA NEWS

HOW DOES THE ACTA OPERATE?

The ACTA structure is as follows. The ACTA Executive has delegated power to a Board to make recommendations to the full Executive on matters raised through the reporting systems in place. Board and Executive members can bring agenda items to the Board at any time, through providing briefing papers clearly setting out the items they wish to raise. These items make up the agenda for meetings conducted on a regular basis and at times when urgent business is received at short notice. State Associations can also bring matters to the Board through their State meetings and through their delegates to the National Executive or to the Executive Officer.

Once the board has met on the agenda items they make recommendations to the full Executive for approval by the full Executive. This process takes quite a deal of time, to not only be decided but acted on.

The decisions of the Executive once approved are documented in minutes then placed on the ACTA website. The ACTA National office staff do not make these decisions, the full Executive make these decisions and the staff carry out the decisions of the Executive.

If a registered shooter is looking to have an issue addressed in relation to the sport there is a process to follow. All Club matters should be directed to the Club in the first instance. Most will be resolved at the Club in line with your constitution.

For National matters, they should be addressed in writing to your Club. The Club may be able to address many of the questions you have, should the Club not be able to resolve your issue they can then forward or place on the Zone agenda for discussion and determination, should this not resolve the issue then it should be referred by the Zone to the State Association. The State, if not able to resolve the issue or be able to deal with the issue under their own constitution should send the item via their State delegates to the National Office to be placed on the national agenda.

Whilst on the protocols for contact with the National Body it is important to remember the role of the National Rules Supervisor & the National Handicapper. These volunteers give their time to work with the National body to assist in their specific areas.

The first action to be taken when you have a rule or handicapping issue is to talk to your Club. The Club may wish to refer this to the Zone for clarification or to the State Handicapper or State Rules Supervisors, these people can probably sort out your concerns.

If the concerns cannot be adequately addressed by the State Rules Supervisor and/or Handicapper Zones can then contact the relevant National official. Where possible it is important to put these concerns in writing detailing the facts of your concerns. A written request is so much easier to deal with as the issues and resolution are then in writing so there is no ambiguity.

As with any rule book or handicapping system where they exist in any sport there will be grey areas. All enquiries or disputes will be adjudicated at all times by the National office holders based on the written rules in each case.

MEMBER CATEGORIES

FULL MEMBER – This category of membership provides the member with rights to shoot at any affiliated Club in Australia (with the Club's approval), they are eligible to shoot Zone, State and National events and are eligible for selection to ACTA national teams.

PARTNER MEMBER – This membership is available to the partner of a full member or veteran member, living at the same common address. This category of membership provides the member with rights to shoot at any affiliated Club in Australia (with the Clubs approval), they are eligible to shoot Zone, State and National events and selection for ACTA national teams. The Partner member can only join once their partner is a financial member for that year.

VETERAN MEMBER – This membership is available to persons who are eligible to apply for a pension/65years at 3 I December of the year their membership is due, date of birth is required. This category of membership provides the member with rights to shoot at any affiliated Club in Australia (with the Club's approval), they are eligible to shoot Zone, State and National events and selection for ACTA national teams.

CONCESSION/LOYALTY – This membership is available to persons with 30 years or more continuous Full membership with the ACTA. This category of membership provides the member with rights to shoot at any affiliated Club in Australia (with their approval), they are eligible to shoot Zone, State and National events and selection for ACTA national teams.

JUNIOR MEMBER – This membership is available to people under the age of 18 years at 31 December the year their membership is due. Date of birth is required. This category of membership provides the member with rights to shoot at any affiliated Club in Australia (with the Club's approval), they are eligible to shoot Zone, State and National events and selection for ACTA national teams.

RECREATIONAL MEMBER – Open to members to shoot targets only and practice at any ACTA club (with the Club's approval). This category of membership DOES NOT provide the member with rights to shoot competition at any affiliated Club in Australia, they are NOT eligible to shoot Zone, State and National events OR selection for ACTA national teams.

INSURANCE:

All eligible members receive firearms insurance up to the value of \$12,000 with their membership. To be eligible the gun must be registered in your name.
