President's Notes

This report is being written ten days prior to the Trap Nats, Pre-Noms have closed much higher than last year with over 500 nominations already accepted. This year we are selecting three teams in each category for entry into the 2018 ICTSF World DTL,

making 51 entries in total. The first team in each category will receive recognition as the official Australian Team. B & C Teams will be outfitted to a lesser extent but also suitably recognised. Whilst we feel as the Host Nation it is important to field the full number of teams able to be entered in the World DTL, we also wish to protect the privilege, esteem and respect which official Australian Teams command.

The Points event this year will be shot over 16 layouts in banks of 4 with alternating waves as is the process for the World DTL. This is being done to allow all present the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the way this system operates.

Sporting Clays Australia (SCA)

After many meetings and deliberations SCA have advised that they do not wish to enter into any arrangement with ACTA in respect of some form of mutual recognition of each other's members.

Their advice included the comment that "SCA currently allows ACTA members to participate at SCA club events for competition and practice under an open door policy as 'visitors' to SCA shotgun ranges. This open door policy will remain in place . . . "

This is the first formal advice received from another national shotgun body that they allow some recognition to ACTA members. We will now need to reconsider what opportunities there may be to consider changes to benefit our clubs within the framework of the constitution.

I thank SCA Management for the frank discussions we have had and look forward to working closely in the future on matters of mutual interest. SCA are an independent organisation with a great history and the ACTA fully respect their decision.

Vales

The vales of two very well- known members of the ACTA appear elsewhere in this magazine.

Mr. Bob Buchan and Mr. Tim Catling both influenced the direction of shooting in Australia over many years. Without covering the content of the Vales, I will say that both had great involvement and a love for the sport and we extend condolences to their respective families and friends.

International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF)

Nominations for the 4th ICTSF World English Sporting Championships opened at the start of February and 500 entries were received in the first week. This event to be held at Kelmarsh Estate in England is shaping up to be the largest in ICTSF history. The Association wishes our team members success at the event. The Association will be doing all in its power to ensure that the DTL event in Australia in 2018 also breaks records.

Membership fees 2018

A Board recommendation to the Executive that 2018 membership fees not be increased has been accepted. This decision is part of a strategy to bring our membership fees closer to other shooting associations over time. The recreational membership at \$60 inclusive of firearms insurance represents excellent value and I urge clubs to offer this category to prospective members who only wish to shoot non-competitively. Some States have taken the initiative with this category by not levying the State fees thus further reducing the cost to the recreational shooter.

If ACTA clubs not currently abiding by the Constitution registered the 1000's of non-members with the ACTA the Association could even be in a position to reduce membership costs across its general membership. It is certainly not very fair on the fee paying ACTA member.

Rules meeting

Rules Supervisors from around the country will soon be meeting for the annual review of the rules. The ACTA is funding one representative from each State and a second is permitted funded by the State. Many submissions have been received from Rules Supervisors and these will be considered before recommendations being made to the Executive meeting in June.

From time to time the Association requires the service of suitably qualified persons to act as judiciary members. Recently we have struggled to fill these positions, often unnecessarily extending the time before matters can be heard. The Association would be pleased to hear from individuals that could be considered for inclusion in a pool of judiciary members from which we could draw on future occasions. If you have an interest in this field please contact the Executive Officer in the first instance.

Executive Officer's Report

2017 is off to a flying start with the highest level of membership renewals received in many years (since membership renewals opened in November 2016). The inclusion of firearms insurance has been extremely positive and popular. I am aware of a number of claims already with prompt and positive results. The inclusion of this with other insurance policies that cover members, clubs, volunteers and the general public is a service that is provided at a very low cost for those participating in the sport of Clay Target Shooting with the ACTA. The ACTA's ability to provide all of these insurances is based on the "Association" taking the policies on behalf of their members.

The ACTA has confirmed Public Liability coverage for all shooters on private property as part of our insurance cover, as with all of the insurance packages offered the activities on the property must comply with the law of the State including having permission to shoot on the property and the appropriate licence to do so.

The National Executive considered and accepted a proposal to change the way the ACTA collects fees. Commencing on the 1st November 2017 the ACTA will collect any Zone, State and National registration fees from clubs as part of the billing system currently in place.

The ACTA will provide the allocated funds collected to the Zone and State in line with the fees charged. This will allow Zones and States to account more easily for their income. Rather than receiving it from various sources it will all come from the ACTA with a report signifying the clubs/members it is for.

Work on the National Ground continues outside of the development of the ACTA clubhouse, the installation of the 16th trap on the ACTA Ground proper, we still have three additional practice traps on the neighbours land that will increase by the end of the year to four. This is iust part of the preparation for the 2018 World DTL and also to secure the Ground to a level that will host the National Championships well into the future.

The National Executive now has the floor plan to the ACTA Clubhouse including the Hall of Fame that will feature in the entrance to the building. The floor plan along with the footing and slab engineering designs have been submitted to council along with an early works package to allow the slab to be laid after Easter. Consultants GHD are in control of the project that will deliver a fantastic practical showpiece for the ACTA.

We are currently researching the Hall of Fame area with a view of looking at the past, present and into the future needs of the Hall of Fame. The entrance/foyer and Hall of Fame area will be used to showcase the sport. This will be our opportunity to promote the Association as an internationally and nationally recognised sporting organisation. The entrance will be a focal point and spectacular celebration of the sport, something all our members will be able to appreciate.

The building will provide for National Events, State Events and where required other shooting events. The Executive now have a recommended program of National Events for 2019-2025 for consideration. These dates along with NSWCTA State Titles for Trap and Skeet will be blocked out so no bookings for the clubhouse will be taken during this time. The ACTA already has an agreement with the Stone the Crows Festival organisers for use of the ground until 2024.

This group of grey nomads numbers around 500 recreational vans including caravans and motor homes on the Ground every Easter.

These types of events and proposed functions and conventions will be a great supplement to the ACTA finances, thus enabling the Association to retain low membership cost whilst providing more tangible services and benefits to the members.

This significant investment by the NSW Government has doubled the asset base of the ACTA overnight. The investment is great support for the sport and firearms ownership. Not only providing the asset, but significantly increasing the opportunities to gain further financial advantage through the operation of the facility.

Just to put this in perspective the ACTA has submitted proposals in 2013-2014/2015-2016. We were unsuccessful with all of these applications, even the 2016 application that was not approved in May 2016. The grant was made available in December 2016 after further consultation and negotiations with Government officials.

Once again none of this would be possible without the full support of the member for Wagga Wagga Daryl Maguire and the NSW Government.

NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- I. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 5. For the National 28gauge Championship load size is limited to 21gr (3/4oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7. For the National .410bore Championship load size is limited to 14gr (1/2oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7"
- 6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 14. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Women's, Junior's or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 15. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 20. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
- 22. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by prenomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
- 23. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message **PRIOR** to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

MICHAEL KRUGER-DAVIS

Executive Function

The last three articles have addressed the personal, psychological and social benefits of participating in shooting and shooting sports. Most of the findings of the BASC report from England and other comments I made in the articles was made clear at the recent "Veter-

ans Games" shoot Wagga Gun Club. A great number of shooters attended for five days to shoot three disciplines: sporting, skeet and trap. This shoot provided older and more experienced shooters to get together and compete for a medal in their age group. There were no guns, no big cheques or lavish prizes. So what was the attraction? It was the sense of belonging to a 'shooting family' where everyone has a shared interest and a common purpose. And it was the opportunity to shoot with mates and have fun, either on the traps or around the dinner table with a BBQ and a couple of drinks. This was my first experience at the games but I was told over and over again, "... this is the main shoot I must get to each year." I will definitely be back in 2018.

The focus of this article is Executive Function. What is it, I hear you ask?

According to an online article by Joyce Cooper-Kahn and Laurie Dietzel, titled "What Is Executive Functioning?" the formal definition is:

The executive functions are a set of processes that all have to do with managing oneself and one's resources in order to achieve a goal. It is an umbrella term for the neurologically-based skills involving mental control and self-regulation.

Executive Functions skills include:

- Inhibition The ability to stop one's own behavior at the appropriate time, including stopping actions and thoughts. The flip side of inhibition is impulsivity; if you have weak ability to stop yourself from acting on your impulses, then you are "impulsive."
- 2. **Shift** The ability to move freely from one situation to another and to think flexibly in order to respond appropriately to the situation.
- 3. **Emotional Control** The ability to modulate emotional responses by bringing rational thought to bear on feelings.
- 4. **Initiation** The ability to begin a task or activity and to independently generate ideas, responses, or problem-solving strategies.
- 5. Working memory The capacity to hold information in mind for the purpose of completing a task.
- 6. Planning/Organisation The ability to manage current and future-oriented task demands.
- 7. Organisation of Materials The ability to impose order on work, play, and storage spaces.
- 8. **Self-Monitoring** The ability to monitor one's own performance and to measure it against some standard of what is needed or expected.

The executive functions are a diverse, but related and overlapping, set of skills. They are located in the prefrontal cortex area of the brain. This is the area directly behind the forehead.

The reason I decided to write about this topic was that several events happened simultaneously.

Firstly, I was reading an editorial in the Sydney Morning Herald regarding concussion where it talked about the Rugby Leagues "Concussion Code" and the Mundine – Green Boxing match. Footballers and boxers are prone to mild traumatic brain injury because of the nature of the sports.

Secondly, I was sent this quote by Michael Elmes:

"A strong body makes the mind strong. As to the species of exercise, I advise the gun. While this gives a moderate exercise to the body, it gives boldness, enterprise, and independance to the mind. Games played with the ball and others of that nature, are too violent for the body and stamp no character on the mind. Let your gun therefore be the constant companion of your walks."

This was written by Thomas Jefferson in letter to his 15 year old nephew Peter Carr in 1785. Jefferson obviously was aware 332 years ago and worried for his nephew.

Finally, in a clean up I came across a report of a child I had assessed, several years ago, who appeared to have executive dysfunction as a result of mild traumatic brain injury. He had been knocked out on the football field and when he regained consciousness, the coach sent him back onto the field. Several weeks latter it was noticed there were significant changes to his behaviour and learning. He was unable to regulate his behaviour, use self-restraint, plan, organise, set goals, focus or decide what was important. Continued knocks to the head can have long lasting detrimental effects. This is why there is now a concussion code for all football codes. The prefrontal cortex develops slowly. In males it is fully developed by about 25 years and a bit earlier in girls. This is why some adolescents have difficulty understanding the consequences of their actions or act in a risk taking and impulsive manner.

To follow on from the previous three articles, it can be argued that as well as the personal, psychological and social benefits of shooting, as a sport, it can be less harmful than contact sports. Also to be able to concentrate, focus, plan, set goals, regulate your behaviour and monitor your progress you need good executive function skills. Shooting allows you to practise these skills, and with practise they become more refined.

The issue of non members has again been brought to the attention of the ACTA.

If a person cannot produce an ACTA handicap book it should raise a red flag at clubs. It is a requirement that shooters produce this card to verify a number of things:

- I. That they are an ACTA member and that they are a currently financial
- 2. Verify their handicap and grade
- 3. Verify their membership category

It is not fair or equitable to ACTA members if non-members and those members in the recreational category of membership shoot competition. It is a member benefit to shoot competition and practice. If a non member or recreational member shoots, how do you handicap them? How do you know their age for categories, what happens if something goes wrong on the day? Who is responsible?

Corporate days, Media, Polly days etc are different, they are a legitimate way of promoting the Association and the sport as described in the Constitution.

We ask that clubs abide by the rules and ensure our members are provided with this level playing field. We also ask States to ensure their Clubs comply with the Constitution.

ROBERT "BOB" BUCHAN JANUARY 7 2017

As well as being a Life Member of the club he was also a Life Member of the VCTA and the ACTA and was an outstanding ambassador for our sport at all levels. He was also influential in the formation of the Zones of Victoria.

He will be sadly missed by all.

TIM CATLING 19/4/1933 – 16/2/2017



The sport has lost one of its most respected contributors with the passing of Tim Catling.

Tim was born and bred in the Katanning area of WA. He moved away to boarding school at Perth's Hale School, but at the completion of his education he moved back to the family farm "Carramar". Tim was a respected farmer maintaining the same line of quality merinos throughout his farming career.

Whilst at Hale School, Tim excelled at all sports and played a great variety. He

was proud of the fact that throughout his life he had tried nearly all sports there were on offer, apart from surfing! However, Tim's main sporting passions proved to be golf and clay target shooting.

For the majority of his sporting life, Tim would spend half the year playing golf and the other half shooting. This tactic worked well for him as he represented his state and country in both sports.

Tim started shooting competitively in 1954. He celebrated his Diamond

Jubilee in shooting in 2014 and then continued to shoot up until late 2016. Throughout his 62 years of shooting, Tim was a formidable competitor, mainly in down the line shooting, but his achievements extend into skeet and field shooting. He represented Australia in 14 Open Mackintosh teams (over five decades) and 5 Veteran Teams. He has claimed two Nationals titles including the 1968 Points Score title which saw him shoot off with the great Newton Thomas to finish with the winning score of 459/459. Tim's second National Title was the 1984 Champion of Champions which he won with a score of 179/179. Tim won 32 state titles, and has made 64 WA State Teams. He won the Veteran's World Championship in New Zealand in 2002, and has also won 6 Veterans National Titles. He won nearly 300 open titles in Australia and overseas, and his highest DTL break is 697. He achieved all this only using two guns throughout his 62 years of shooting – his first gun was a Browning Auto and then he used a Winchester 101.

Tim's achievements are not only on the layouts, as he gave a huge amount of time to the sport's growth behind the scenes. He has actively contributed as a member on committees at club, zone, state and national level. Tim was a foundation member of the ACTA Coaching Council and remained a highly active Competition Coach (formerly Level 2). He received the 1999 Presidential Medal for his invaluable ongoing contribution to the sport. In 2006 he put together a booklet called 'A Guide to a Winning Mind' and it was filled with ideas to gain the mental edge in clay target shooting.

Tim had the wonderful attribute of being able to spot what improvements a shooter could make and then know exactly the right time to tell them. He coached a great number of shooters and was always willing to give a tip here or there. PARA TRAP IS BORN!

World Shooting Para Sport has announced that the first Para trap World Cup will be held in Lonato, Italy, between 15-16 September 2017.

The International Federation for shooting Para Sport also confirmed a shift in the naming from Para clay target shooting to Para trap. The change was made to align with and distinguish between the Olympic disciplines of trap, skeet and double trap.

The confirmation of the dates and location for the World Cup follows an announcement in December 2016 that the shotgun discipline will be officially taken under World Shooting Para Sport.

Several years of research and development was previously carried out by the Italian shooting federation FITAV, but is now being taken forward by a Para Trap Development Group.

The next stage is to hold the first World Cup as part of two year review of the technical and classification rules.

Tyler Anderson, World Shooting Para Sport Manager, said: We are really looking forward to heading to Lonato for this historic milestone in the development of Para trap. It is fitting that the first World Cup will be held in Italy, given that the country's National Federation, FITAV, have been instrumental in the discipline reaching this point. I am sure that we will see a good number of athletes and countries competing, supporting this event as we carry out further research and testing of the rules and classification system. In the coming months, World Shooting Para Sport will also be launching a bid

process for countries to host future Para trap World Cups.

So where did all this start from and where is it heading?

The 1st International Grand Prix for Disabled Trap Shooters, was held in Italy, in 2011. Australian shooter Mark Farrow (left arm amputee) attended the event. Around 30 participants from 5 countries.

The 2nd International Grand Prix for Disabled Trap Shooters was held at the same time as the ISSF World Cup Shotgun in Lonato Italy, from 1st to 8th May 2012. Once again Australian shooter Mark Farrow attended the event with 40 participants from 8 countries.

In 2013 the 3rd International Grand Prix for Disabled Trap Shooters was held in Todi, Italy. Again Mark Farrow attended the event with 39 participants from 10 countries.

The Italian Sport Shooting Federation (FITAV) ran these events to collect data by the way of video footage and photos. FITAV then submitted this data, as well as participant classifications for the event, to the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) in November 2013 for consideration for inclusion in the Paralympics. The events have had 15 countries represented and 100 competitors covering all types of disability. Australia only had one self-funded shooter at all three events.

In February 2014 the ISSF, FITAV and IPC met in Bonn, Germany where representatives discuss the feasibility of para-clay target shooting becoming an IPC Shooting recognised discipline.

ships although Australia had a team participating in Pistol and Rifle no trap shooters attended.

The 5th International Grand Prix for Disabled Trap Shooters was held in Cologno Al Serio, Italy in 2015 with 70 participants from 14 countries no Australians

The Final (6th) International Grand Prix for Disabled Trap Shooters was held in Battuda, Italy in 2016 with 70 participants from 15 countries. Two Australian shooters, Mark Farrow and Scottie Brydon attended the event.

Scottie Brydon, first time overseas traveller, shooting from a wheelchair, qualified for the final and was placed 4th.

So where to now?

The first historic meeting in Germany, of Para Clay Target Development Committee, the commission charged by the International Paralympic Committee for the development of the Paralympic shooting, has officially recognised Para Trap for inclusion in the international calendar.

The international working group consists of Tyler Anderson (USA), World Para Shooting Sports Manager, Ghislaine Briez, IPC Shooting Chairperson, Wanda Jewell, IPC Shooting Deputy Chairperson, Jagdish Maharaj (IPC Shooting Head of Classification), and the team of experts Italian Francesco Fazi (sporting and technical Medical), Federica Alviti (sports and international classifier Medical), and Luca Minelli (assistant FITAV for the Paralympic field). During the meeting it was discussed important issues such as the criteria defining the functional classes, amendments to the technical regulations, training events to be implemented to create a base of consensus for shooting directors, coaches, classifiers, and Paralympic shooters, with regard to technical and material aspects, such as the fight against doping.

Technical regulations and classification will be made official in the coming weeks and available to the world community. The meeting also set guidelines for international participation in the event in this year's program: the World Cup 15-16 September in Lonato Italy.

Participation will be open to national federations with teams consisting of four competitors in each class.

Functional classes will be recognised:

SH4 class will be reserved for shooters competing in the sitting position in a wheelchair.

SH5 class will include athletes with impediment in the legs.

SH6 class reserved for athletes with obstruction of the upper limbs.

The event will be open to additional shooters, entered as MQS by their respective National Paralympic Committees and national shooting federations.

The hope is that Para Trap will enter the Paralympic by 2024 if not in Tokyo 2020.

Plans in Australia are still in the early stages. Shooting Australia is taking on the task of finding athletes and running events here and are currently searching for shooters to participate.



NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
