President's Notes

It has been a very busy time for the Association and so some things may have taken a little longer than we would like. Please bear with us.

Commonwealth Trap Championship 2017 – Perth

A mutual agreement has now been reached by all parties involved following the Commonwealth Trap Championship in Perth.

The agreement will see the record books showing Tom Turner as the winner and he will be awarded the Royal Blue sash and the Commonwealth Medal. Mitchell lles will be recorded in second place as the silver medal winner.

Trap Nationals

The DTL Nationals was a great event with good weather and strong competition. The decision to conduct the points event in the World format caused some problems, but with the co-operation of the shooters all ended well. World DTL teams were selected in all categories. Congratulations to Glen Castellaro the OA High Gun winner. Attendance was the highest since 2009, with 3004 entries in the 6 main events. This is only the sixth time in 42 years since reliable records have been kept (1975) that the attendance on the 6 main events has exceeded 3000. Attendances in excess of 3000 were recorded at:

When there is room available in future magazines, we will print the complete attendance spreadsheets as they make interesting reading. It would be great next year with the World DTL following the Nationals to break all of these record attendances.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all the workers who helped throughout the event. Whilst some may receive some recompense, it is minimal and far below what any of us would expect in a workplace. I would encourage you all to pass on your thanks to these people as you come across them.

AGM

The AGM was well attended with 159 clubs represented in person or by proxy. A question from the floor in relation to the financials was taken on notice and we have now received the following response from the auditor:

In response to the below question, I note the following:

- Cost of sales Decrease of \$132,264 explained in part by an adjustment
 to stocktake adjustment of \$49,395, representing the write back to physical
 stock actually held, rather than accounting for the movement in stock
 annually. Furthermore, in FY 2015 we included targets used of \$80,045
 in the cost of sales. For the 2016 financial year we thought this expense
 is more appropriate in competition expenses, rather than cost of sales as
 the majority of targets are used during competition. There are other minor
 movements year on year but this explains the majority of the movement.
- Competition expenses Increase of \$284,908 As stated above, in FY 2015 we included targets used of \$80,045 in the cost of sales. For the 2016 financial year we thought this expense is more appropriate in competition expenses, rather than cost of sales as the majority of targets are used during competition. Added to this there was a \$68,350 increase in cash awards/prizes year on year. Furthermore, we charged to expense from the Levy reserves an amount of \$72,156 (mainly for the travelling teams) which was not charged to the P&L in FY 2015. Again, There are other minor movements year on year but this explains the majority of the movement in Competition expenses.

We hope this satisfactorily answers the question raised at the AGM.

The Executive's proposal to move to a Company Limited by Guarantee was soundly defeated.

During debate a question was raised from the floor of how many in the room had actually read the document. It was disappointing to see that of those on the floor only 13 claimed to have done so. This clearly indicates that the majority have been manipulated by the few.

Where to from here? The sticking point seems to be that states retain the right to elect the directors. The reality is that for the motion to be proposed to the AGM it required Executive support. There was a clear majority in the executive room that states would retain the right to elect directors. This position is not likely to change anytime soon so it is likely the efforts made to date have been wasted.

The matter will be reconsidered in June.

Current Constitution

The support shown for the retention of the current constitution at the recent AGM was clear.

All clubs were sent a copy of the current constitution with their 2017 renewal advice. This is the document under which we all operate so I strongly suggest that all take the time to read the complete document as displayed on the ACTA website before making decisions around membership and participation at their club.

Disaffiliation

Action has begun to disaffiliate a Queensland club allegedly breaching the current constitution by allowing members of their club to shoot ACTA disciplines without being a member of the Association, as clearly required by the ACTA constitution. This action comes after numerous attempts have been made over many months to get the club to comply. Other clubs in the area have complained about the clubs actions and it is now the Associations responsibility to uphold the constitution as recently supported by the membership.

Firearms Insurance

The policy provided within your membership costs protecting your firearms has now been in place for over 4 months. The broker has advised of 3 claims that have been settled and they have outlined the circumstances so that you have a better understanding of just how wide a coverage this membership benefit provides.

24/12/16 Members property/home broken into and \$11,950 safe stolen with firearms

21/01/17 Members barrels damaged whilst on the range \$1,600

04/02/17 Member tripped over extension cord on the range damaging firearm \$1,350

The broker has indicated that the current claims experience is as expected by the Underwriters and so at this stage the cover should remain viable for the ACTA to provide within the membership cost.

I encourage all with firearms worth more than the \$12,000 cover provided within your membership to contact the broker who can top up the cover to \$25,000 for an extra \$10 and larger amounts are available by negotiation.

Skeet Nationals

Once again we are suffering consequences of the turmoil in the world shipping arena. The seventh largest shipping company in the World, HanJin, has gone into receivership leaving 100,000's of tonnes of freight stranded and backed up in ports around the world. Many suppliers to our sport have been caught up in this. Of course the Orange Dome targets we use for the skeet which were ordered in 2016 are amongst this freight backlog and ETA's are hard to get and unreliable

A decision has been made that if the Orange Dome targets are unavailable we will have to use black targets as was previously the case.

National Ground Development

Work has progressed on the grounds and a Development Application for the proposed clubhouse and Conference Centre has been lodged. It is expected

Executive Officer's Report

2017 continues to be a very busy year with many projects commenced and the planning for events for 2017 and 2018 well advanced.

The building project is a major focus in the coming months with construction planned for the winter months, this in Wagga will present its own challenges. The program for the Executive, Board and Staff will also be very challenging as we prepare for the World DTL as well as the four National events in 2018. We still have two National events for 2017 to conduct as well as the monthly production of the CTSN.

The National Skeet Championships are almost upon us with entries expected to be in line with 2016, the ground is in great condition however the long range forecast suggests it may be a wet winter in the Wagga Wagga area, bring your woollies just in case.

The Annual ACTA Executive meet in June and presents an opportune time for Clubs to discuss issues or topics they would like brought before the National Executive. One of the items already on the agenda is to set dates for National events up to 2025. Whilst not cast in stone this will allow the ACTA to fully utilise the Club/Convention centre when not in use by the sport.

The National Rules Supervisors meeting was conducted on Friday the 12th May in Melbourne. The results and recommendations of this meeting will be made to the National Executive in June for approval before being sent to the States with changes added to the online rule book. The meeting considered many submissions from State Rules Supervisors representing their individual States

that the Premier of NSW Gladys Berejiklian will attend the grounds to turn the first sod as soon as approvals allow, hopefully soon after the Skeet Nationals. Significant works will have been completed by the time of the NSW State Trap Carnival. The project has a planned completion date of February 2018.

I fielded a question from an interested shooter during the Nationals. The shooter was sure she had read in one of the Presidents Notes that an all-weather walking track had been laid from layout I through to II. I replied that was correct and she responded "well where is it" I replied you are standing on it. The all-weather track was laid with a gravel bed foundation covered with a plastic grid mesh as seen on sand dunes in National Parks. The material allows water to get away but grass to grow through it. We mow over the top of the track. This is where the buggy drives up and down the layouts.

Membership

Renewals in November and December came in much faster than in previous years and this was pleasing to see. The months since have seen a slight fall with membership being down about one percent on the same period last year. The association is continually looking for benefits to add value to the membership and anyone with any ideas please feel free to contact me by email.

World English Sporting

The Association wishes team members Anthony Panetta, Jamie Dunn, John Younger, Socrates Pilipasidis, and Robert Hall heading to England in July for the ICTSF World English Sporting Championships all the best for the competition. Entries are expected to fill the field which is limited to 1050. It is interesting to have a look at the venue (Kelmarsh Estate) website. This is a greenfield site at an English Manor House. No range approvals or safety templates required, perceived pollution not a problem, and the owners happy to have the ICTSF coming there. Quite a refreshing change.

Executive Meetings

The full Executive will be meeting mid-June for three days. These will be the main meetings of the year so please ensure your state reps are attending and over all the issues.

The ACTA will be preparing tender documents for the provision of Insurance services to the Association for 2018-2019, with terms and conditions available in the tender documents. The current Insurer Pollards have provided the ACTA with Insurance services since 2008, although tenders have been called three times over this period.

Reviewing the data base over the past 12-18 months it is interesting to note the number of clubs and the geographical location of those clubs and the number of members per club. There is certainly a need for additional small clubs in remote and rural area's however there are a number of instances where more than one club shoots on an ACTA affiliated complex. This appears to be a waste of volunteer time and commitment. Having two clubs on one ground or within 25 km just means the need for twice or three times the number of volunteers to conduct each Club. Where numerous clubs are within very close proximity, the requirement of layouts, electricity, Insurance, volunteers and resources could be considerably reduced by amalgamation. It also takes up a number of shooting days on the calendar where I am sure they are competing for the same competitors to attend their events.

Whilst I am not advocating "amalgamations" as such, progressive clubs I am sure would see the benefits of having more people attend their events therefore making it more profitable for the Club and better returns for the shooters. This in turn leads to better facilities for the members and allows regular upgrading of sporting facilities. In circumstances of tight fiscal and time constraints, clubs should be looking to where they envisage being in ten years time. I am sure many clubs do not have a strategic plan, or a "where are we going and how do we get there" document. This document does not have to be war and peace epic. It can be a simple document outlining what is it the club wants and how and what do we do to get there. This is the unglamorous component of being on a Club, Zone or National Executive member, it is however an opportunity to get your members together and ask them to have an input, after all it is their sport. Giving people an ownership can also "bring along" new members and importantly committee members with that vision. Does your club have a job description for your positions on the committee? For example the secretary, president and treasurers positions. It is taken for granted anyone taking on these positions knows exactly what they are taking on, this is not always the case. Does your club committee understand the legal implications and responsibilities of their position? Under the incorporations act (in any State) "I didn't know" is not a reasonable excuse for not doing what you are required to

Clay target shooting is always facing challenges from outside of the sport, governance and firearms being foremost and our responsibility to maintain our ranges and surrounds another. Ignoring these issues will not make them go away.

This is a timely reminder for all members to keep their firearms safe when not in use, this also ensures any insurance claim for loss is not rejected. Do not allow a simple case of negligence to hinder your sport in the future.

ISSF REPORT

2017 ISSF RULE CHANGE CLARIFICATION

The ACTA will conduct all ISSF National Events under the rules of the ISSF in conjunction with the ACTA ISSF Rules.

If in the future when Rule changes are made by the International body late in the year prior to our National event, the competition will be conducted under the rules of the previous year.

The Jury of the event has the right to alter or change any decision that has been wrongly interpreted should it be required to ensure the competition is completed within the spirit of the rules as written in the ISSF Rules book.

The SHOTGUN FINALS FORMAT has changed to a progressive elimination format

ISSF TRAP

All Finalists will start their final matches with a new BIB number (from 1-6) which will be assigned according to their qualification ranking. Qualification rankings will also decide ties for 6th, 5th, 4th and 3rd places. In Trap Finals, all 6 finalists will shoot a round of 25 targets each. After the first 25 targets, the first shooter (with the lowest score) will be eliminated, taking 6th place. Following eliminations will occur after the 30th target (5th place) and the 35th target (4th place) and the Bronze medal will be decided after the 40th target. The two remaining shooters will shoot 10 additional to decide the Gold and Silver medals after the 50th target. Ties are broken by the Qualification Rank up to the Bronze Medal. Ties for Gold and Silver medals will be decided by a shoot-off.

DOUBLE TRAP

Six finalists will shoot 15 Doubles with eliminations taking place after 15,20,25,30 (Bronze) and 40 Doubles (Gold and Silver). Ties will be resolved as per the Trap event, using the qualification rank up to the Bronze medal and a shoot-off for Gold and Silver.

SKEET

Skeet Finals will be based on 10 target sequences that include regular and reverse doubles on station 3.

A regular or reverse double on station 4 and regular and reverse doubles on station 5. Station 4 doubles will alternate between regular and reverse doubles for each 10 target sequence. Skeet eliminations or medal decisions will occur after 20,30,40,50 and 60 targets. Ties will be decided by qualification ranking with the only exception of the Gold and Silver medals, that will be awarded after a shoot-off.

MOBILE PHONES

Athletes may not use mobile phones or hand-held or wrist-worn communication devices on their shooting stations.

SHOTGUN AMMUNITION

The use of coloured wads is prohibited. Only transparent or translucent wads may be used. Strict enforcement of maximum shot charge limits (24.0g + 0.5g) tolerance will continue.

SHOTGUN VEST MARKER TAPES

The method of checking marker tape locations has changed and now will use a horizontal laser beam to locate the point of the elbow in relation to the tape.

SHOTGUN COUNTBACK RULE

When the countback rule is used to break ties, the last round and then the next to the last round etc. will still be used. When this does not break ties the target-by-target countback will begin with the last target of the last round. (not the first target in the last round and counted forward.)

Zeljko Bacani Memorial Shoot

The fourth annual Zeljko Bacani Memorial Skeet shoot was held on Sunday 9 April, at the Frankston Australian Clay Target Club. Melbourne really turned on the wintery weather presenting the 39 shooters with some very challenging conditions. They saw a completely overcast day with rough winds and rain coupled with a freezing cold temperature! Wet weather gear was a must!

Weather conditions aside, this event made for yet another enjoyable day as not only were shooters competing for their share of \$2000 in cash prize money, but they were also raising money for the Cancer Council of Victoria. \$20 from every Open nomination and \$10 from

every Junior nomination was donated to the Charity together with money raised from two raffles, and personal donations. Again this year, generosity was evident and \$1535 was raised, bringing the total now raised over the four years to \$8152.

This event was the first ACTA competition for Mark Du Rose, who, after his first fifty targets, shot himself straight into A Grade. Mark went on to shoot two clean rounds finishing with 96/100 and winning A Grade. Robert Holloway was not far behind in second place with 94/100.

A bit of friendly father-son competition between Les and Adam Beechey saw Adam beat his dad by I target with a 91/100. Adam also took out Juniors. Junior James Sacchetta beat his dad Daniel by 6 targets and finished on 89/100 with a second in C Grade.

Gerry Petruska took out Veterans with a score of 93/100 and 2016 Rio Olympian Aislin Jones took out Ladies with 90/100. B Grade was close with Keith Napier taking the win with 90/100 and Jim Turner 2 targets behind in second place.

Competition at the top was tough! Three perfect rounds saw Barry Moss with an outright Overall win finishing with an awesome score of 99/100. Michael Buttigieg and Adrian Cousens both finished on 98/100 with Michael taking first in AA and Adrian second.

Luigi Scalise was the lucky winner of the Pick the Joker and Max Oakley won the door prize. The Du Rose family won the first prize in the raffle thanks to the kind donation from the MCC Clay Target Club.

MANSFIELD HOSTS TWO STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The inaugural Mansfield Clay Target Club night shoot was held on Saturday 15th April 2017. The two event card included 40 mixed target championship and the second a 50 target single barrel continental. Both competitions were designated State Championships.

Night shoot events, held under lights were last conducted at Mansfield quite some years ago. The club recently made a successful sporting grant application which made possible many improvements; this includes the installation of a new light tower and lighting into both the shooting ground and the car park and surrounds. For most of the newer members and many of the visiting competitors this was a first experience at a night shoot and the scheduled competitions ensured a great challenge to participating shooters' skills.

Things kicked off Saturday night at about 7pm in perfect conditions, no wind, calm and cool weather with very little moon light. The darkness aiding the illumination of the targets as they passed into the lights which were mounted above and behind the layouts. A field of 36 competitors made a 6 squad competition. Being a state title, and a long weekend, shooters came from far and wide including Bendigo, Alexandra, Benalla, Euroa, Wangaratta, Melbourne, Woods Point and Wonthaggi.

The first 40 mixed target competition commenced on layout 1 with 10 targets shot double barrel immediately followed by 10 targets shot single barrel on layout 2. After all squads rotated through 10 targets were shot as a points score, then to round up the event 5 pairs double rise. The overall championship and AA was taken out by local member Phillip Desmond with a combined total of 54 out of a possible 60. 2nd AA Euroa's Craig Asquith, 53. A Grade 1st was Woods Point member Daniel Chin 52, over Shane Callahan 50. B Grade 1st Matthew Tingate, Melbourne GC 47, 2nd Brendan Grimes, Gippsland 46. C grade was won by Cameron Asquith, Euroa 53 over local John Winters 51. Best junior was Mansfield member Patrick Kirley with a score of 47.

The next event sent shivers through the best of the field, night, single barrel with targets thrown continental, quite a challenge. 25 targets were shot on ground 1, immediately followed by 25 on layout 2. After 50 targets a tie resulted with two locals shooting it out for overall and AA, Ben Vogelzang 43 out of 52 was victorious over Anthony Kirley. A grade winner Neil Roberts, Melbourne GC 42, 2nd Shane Callahan 38. B Grade Brendan Grimes 39, 2nd Matthew Tingate 37. C Grade Cameron Asquith of Euroa took out his second win for the night after recently returning to the sport with 37, 2nd Mansfield's Beau Vogelzang 36, this score also ensured a win in the junior category for Beau.

The following morning at 11 am the next day of competition kicked off with a field of 26 shooters making up 5 squads participating in the Anzac Memorial Championship. Many of the travelling shooters returned for day two after an overnight stay in Mansfield. Once again conditions were ideal with weather mild and overcast.

Three event card commenced with 25 Target Double Barrel, followed by 25 Target Double Barrel Continental Points Score and rounding up the day 15 pair double rise thrown from the tower.

Event I was a cash divide. AA was split between three shooters Allan Cooper and John Wojcik both Wangaratta GC and Gordon James who all shot 24 out of 25. A Grade Ken Skinner 24, Mansfield. B Grade Matthew Tingate 22, Melbourne. C grade Mansfield Junior Patrick Kirley 20.

Event 2, 25 Target continental points score. This event was also the North East Zone Championship. Very close to a clean break and overall winner and AA was Wangaratta's John Wojcik 74, followed by Rob Stackhouse Euroa, 71. A Grade from Kerang Les Commensoli, also 74, A grade 2nd Troy Grimes 72. B grade Matthew Tingate Melbourne, 69. 2nd local lady shooter Shawntie Coolahan, 67. C grade 1st and 2nd both Mansfield juniors Patrick Kirley, 66 and Denny Walker, 65. The overall junior was taken out by visiting Kerang lady shooter Slap Commensoli with a score of 72.

Rounding up the day was the 15 target tower double rise. Overall and AA was Alexandra's Geoff McClure 21 out of 30. Other winners A grade Anthony Kirley 19, B grade Les Commensoli 14, C grade was daughter Slap Comensoli who will no doubt give Les a hard time due to her outscoring him with 17, this also gave Slap junior shooter winner by a slender margin over second placed C grade Patrick Kirley who scored a commendable 16.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

The Brain: how it works


In the last article I looked at executive function, which are those processes that have to do with managing oneself and one's resources in order to achieve a goal. It is an umbrella term for the neurologically-based skills involving mental control and self-regulation.

I have written often about the two hemispheres

of the brain: the right hemisphere and the left hemisphere. But in this article I want to explore and explain the other parts of the brain and why they are so important.

The brain can be divided into three sections.

- I. The brain stem
- 2. The Limbric System
- 3. The Cortex.



I. The Brain Stem

This is the basic, primitive part of our brain. It was the first to evolve and it is common to all animals.

One controls nnconscious physiological functioning such as breathing and heart beat. It also controls involuntary responses such as reflexes, ie; moving your hand away from a hot stove.

2. The Limbric Brain

The limbric brain was the next part of the brain to evolve and is the next part of the brain to develop for each individual. It is made up of the following parts:

• The Amygdala

The Amygdala plays a central role in the processing of emotions – as children move into adolescence the development of the Amygdala is characterized by emotional intensity and volatility. Decision-making is based on emotions rather than reasoned judgment.

It is hard not to become emotional when shooting. That feeling when you lose, miss a target or several targets, have to deal with distractions or put up with the proverbial 'pain in the neck' member of your squad. When your emotions take over, your brain is not doing you any favours. The opposite is true when you win or shot a personal best and the emotions keep you feeling on top.

• The Hippocampus

The Hippocampus plays a major role in memory decoding and it increases in volume until about 18. For the shooter memory can be a good or a bad thing. It is good when you muscle memory keeps you fluid and responsive and when you have to remember your goals and the plan you have made a commitment to, to achieve them. It can be a problem when it takes from the moment and makes you think of poor performances or a missed target. This will lead you to think in the past, leading to poor decisions, self doubt and lack of confidence needed to win.

The Ventral Striatal

The ventral Striatal is circuit involved with motivation. An underactive Ventral Striatal will mean a lack of drive. Motivation to achieve and improve as well the motivation to win is essential in all sports as well as life.

The Hypothalamus
 The Hypothalamus is control centre of the endocrine system, which regulates hormones.

3. The Cortex

The cortex is the most recent part of the brain to have evolved and is the last part of the brain to develop. In males it is usually developed by about 25-26 years and slightly younger in females. It is responsible for conscious thought and reason. The prefrontal cortex, is housed in the front of the skull and is the brain's executive or CEO. It is responsible for the executive functions mentioned in the previous article, such as responsibility for planning ahead, considering consequences and managing emotional impulses. A review of the last article will remind you of the eight skills listed under executive function. The cortex also has the right and left hemispheres and the corpus callosum, which is the bridge of neurons that connect the two hemispheres.

In sport these executive function skills will not only help you plan, set goals, regulate emotions and manage drives and motivation, they will also prevent non-sportsmanlike behaviour such as cheating, drug taking and throwing the odd tantrum when things do not go your own way. The brain develops in individuals in the same way it has evolved in the population: the brain stem first, then the Limbric System and finally the cortex. It must be remembered that not all brains develop at the same rate or to the same level. Some people never develop executive function skills or because of drugs, including alcohol and nicotine, and trauma have some level of dysfunction.

Fourteen ACTA Academy athletes headed to the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), Canberra for their first camp in March. These camps and the Academy are aimed at progressing our preelite juniors ahead of their years through improving technical skills and knowledge.

The 2017 ACTA Academy athletes are: Vic: Jack Stockdale, Will Smithwick, Thomas Armstrong, Tarryn Shaddock, Luella Foster, Jack Clerk, NSW: Amy Smith, Jack Turner, Brody Walters, Frank Morris, Cooper Mooney, Nathan Burt, SA: Jack Cullinan, QLD: Cameron McKiddie

During the camp the athletes utilised AIS lectures:

NUTRITION LECTURE: This lecture was focussing on nutrition to sustain themselves during competition and ways of getting quick energy if needed for shootoffs etc. and also how to eat without protein supplements to repair muscle after a training or gym session. The Australian Olympic Committee has a no supplements policy due to the fact that often protein shakes/supplements etc. are tainted with steroids, testosterone or similar. If steroids or other banned substances are found in an athlete's blood or urine – regardless of whether it got there intentionally or not bans will be imposed on these athletes for doping. For further information on nutrition try www.ausport. gov.au/ais/nutrition/ and for further information on anti-doping and what medications can be taken head to www.asada.gov.au

RECOVERY LECTURE: This lecture looked at methods of recovering the body from heat, long competitions, dehydration and training/gym sessions. Methods for recovery are massage, stretching, hydrotherapy massage, nutrition, hot cold hydrotherapy, aerated compression and compression clothing. The lecture didn't just focus on the body but also on the mind and suggested things such as meditation, floatation tanks, walking, music, debriefing and just chilling out and hanging with friends.

RECOVERY SESSION: After a long day at the range the crew did a hydrotherapy recovery session at the AIS pool – they started off in a circular pool "the river" that flowed with a strong current similar to a fast flowing river, this was a warm pool, next they went into the warm spa with strong massaging waterjets, next 2 minutes in the cold pool 12-15°C, then out into the warm pool for 2 minutes, this was repeated 3 times. The aim is dilation and constriction of the muscles and veins helping flush out dead cells and toxins but also resetting the athletes inner thermostat. It is quite torturous for some but afterwards you feel really good – rested and recovered. TIP: We don't all have access to ice baths or hot cold pools – so after a very hot day on the range hot cold showers are effective. Try a hot shower for a minute then a cold one for a minute ... continue swapping between the two for about 10 minutes or until you feel refreshed.

ATHLETE PRESENTATION: We had the number 4 ranked Australian men's gymnast, Joshua Di Nucci who is 19 years old and from WA come along and talk to the group about life at the AIS. He particularly spoke about having a support network at his doorstep — psychologists, physiotherapists,

nutritionists, like minded dedicated athletes etc. He spoke about the trials of making teams and not making teams, about the many hours spent training and recovering – we struggle to do 2 minutes in the ice baths whilst these guys manage 10-20 minutes depending on how tough a training session they had. Joshua was likely to be heading to the Commonwealth Games for Australia however the day before talking to the group he did his anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in his right knee which puts him out of competing for about 12 months. Everyone in the group just wanted to give him a hug as they felt his disappointment. This presentation gave the group a look at the dedication and commitment required to achieve in elite sport.

SELF MASSAGE: We had one of the AlS's highly experienced massage therapists run through self massage techniques with the group. I think he managed to get across to the group that it was better to massage tight or sore muscles before they became inhibiting to performance or costly to pay for a proper massage therapist or physiotherapist. He discussed the importance of drinking lots of water after a massage.

SKILL ACQUISITION: This presentation focussed on setting training environments and tasks /drills to simulate competition to hone skills and prepare for shoot-offs and finals however it also discussed the need for variation and randomness in training to prepare the athlete for all circumstances and conditions. A particular skill that we looked at was "quiet eye". There has been some research on this skill with elite Australian shooters such as Catherine Skinner and Russell Mark. Generally it is the eyes acknowledgement of the target and then the tracking of the target. Elite athletes are able to acquire the target earlier and track it for longer before the result of triggering the shot – the length of this visual hold on the target increases with skill level. A key factor is to be prepared, with a stable gun and a calm visual focus, focussing at where the eye will acquire the target. Rushing set up does not aid "quiet eye".

INFORMAL LECTURES: Along with the formal AIS lectures there were also informal sessions on gun fit, performance benchmarking, simulating competition pressure, focussing and mindfulness to stay on track and focussed during

a competition, cross training and multi-disciplining, the importance of shot routine, shooting equipment and keeping a range diary.

The experience

We stayed at the AIS in the athlete residence, ate breakfast and dinner in the dining hall, had packed lunches and our guns were checked in very securely into the armoury. The AIS armoury is adjacent to the security office, it has 2 huge gun safes – both that a new code is put into, by the coach, this code is written on an envelope then the envelope locked into the security office safe. The Armoury room which itself is alarmed, and the safes separately alarmed can only be opened using two swipe cards at the same time—a swipe card the coach has and a swipe card the security guard has.

Range training was carried out at the Canberra International Clay Target Club, a good training venue where ISSF Trap, ISSF Skeet, American Skeet, ACTA Sporting Clays, Field & Game and DTL can all be shot at the same time. The Club members were fabulous at setting up, filling traps and assisting where necessary. Sincere thanks go to the CICTC Committee and members Brent Murphy, James Jonklaas, Terry Forrest, John Taylor, Rob Butterworth and Trish Coates – you made our visit worthwhile and friendly. Special thanks to sub-junior Blake Gruba for mixing it up in the Handicap practice and providing us with a front marker, and a special thanks to Steve Balogh for his help with the ISSF and American skeet practice. Training camps can't happen without Clubs so we very much appreciate Canberra International Clay Target Clubs assistance.

A new sponsor for the Academy and ACTA junior development camps is Falcon Ammunition, thank you very much Graham Beckworth – the ISSF shooters loved the Pro ISSF ammunition and the DTL shooters always appreciate the lighter loads 1150, 1200. Any sponsorship is greatly appreciated and allows our coaching program to include more shooters.

ISSF Trap training focussed on shot routine, gun mount and finals. For DTL Double Rise, Handicap, Mackintosh and shootoffs were the key focus. Randomised and variable training patterns and long breaks were focussed on in American Skeet training and in ISSF Skeet gun mount, speed and hold points were key.

At each National development camp or Academy camp different assistant coaches are invited to coach. This gives the athletes an opportunity to be coached by a variety of coaches often picking up different technical pointers. The coaches broaden their experience and knowledge and take back the enthusiasm to their States. Steven Baynes from South Australia was the assistant coach for this camp. Steven has been an Australian representative shooter, is an accredited Competition Coach and runs many coaching clinics in South Australia. Positive feedback from the ACTA Academy crew appreciated his straight forward coaching approach and his years of experience he brought to the camp.

The next ACTA Academy camp will be towards the end of the year, with the application process for the 2018 ACTA Academy being published in the CTSN around September this year.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
