President's Notes

SKEET NATIONALS

Earlier this week the Skeet Hall of Fame dinner was held and Mal Briggs inducted. Mal's achievements over many years places him in the top five all time points holders. Congratulations Mal.

Events have been well attended with

numbers in the smaller gauge events growing significantly.

Due to the unavailability of the Orange Dome targets the events are being shot using black clays and to date scores are still excellent. A full report on the event will be in next month's magazine.

INFORMAL SKEET MEETING

The meeting was held prior to the shooters BBQ and some interesting suggestions were proposed. I have not had the time to research them all but have looked at the suggestion that AAA Grade should be introduced even if it only applied for the Nationals as the numbers in AA Grade were anecdotally far in excess of the numbers represented in the other grades. I have used the figures from the Commonwealth event on the Thursday to test this argument. Numbers in attendance in the Grades were as follows:

AA	60
А	35
В	50
С	11
Total	156

Other considerations are as follows:

OA winner is generally in AA grade usually resulting in 4 places coming from AA Grade.

Cash payouts for the grades are relatively proportionate to the number in each grade.

In any case there were 50 B graders in attendance and 35 A graders so the introduction of another grade thus halving the amount currently in AA would result in approximately 30 in AAA and 30 in AA, which is significantly less than the number in B grade, and less than the number in A grade.

Therefore I believe that the argument used to promote another grade at the top end is not supported by the facts at the moment. Other issues that were raised will be looked at over coming months.

NATIONAL GROUNDS

Patiently, we are awaiting the development approval for your new clubhouse/conference facility. Planning is complete for construction and provision of most services etc. and we now have 6 contractors identified and shortlisted to begin the tender process following an expression of interest process. This is an exciting but very demanding time as our architects and planners strive to deliver a quality building at the budgeted price within the required short timeframe. It is anticipated that building will begin in July and be officially opened at the beginning of the Trap Nationals, 2018.

WORLD DTL 2018

Shooters interested in participating in this event need to look at accommodation options immediately. Information regarding the event is available on the ACTA website www.claytarget.com.au and at

www.ictsf.global.com . Nomination forms will be available on the ACTA website for both the Nationals and the World from the 1st of July. Entries to both events will be limited and filled on a first in basis. Prize value for the Nationals and the World is currently \$130,000. There will be a need for 30 referees for the 3 days of the World competition. These positions will be paid and will preclude those involved from shooting. Expressions of interest for these positions will be called later this year.

Under the current roster this event will not return to Australia until 2030 so please take advantage of this rare opportunity to compete in a World Championship in your own country.

LEGISLATION

Your Association recently funded an appeal in a South Australian District Court against the South Australian Police refusal to grant a Category C (Semi-Auto) license to a member of the Association. This matter was heard in the District Court and the refusal was successfully overturned on appeal. South Australian Police are now appealing the District Courts ruling to the Supreme Court. The ACTA is currently considering whether to continue to fund this matter, which we feel set an important precedent.

NSW POLICE

Consultations have taken place this week in relation to Liquor Licensing requirements for the new function centre. Options are now being considered.

Consultations have also taken place regarding possible requirements and storage solutions for International visitors to the World DTL. It is likely that at least 2 full time staff will need to man the storage facility from first thing in the morning until late in the evening.

SHOOTING AUSTRALIA (SA)

This coming weekend SA have scheduled a Participation Workshop. Unfortunately due to our attendance at the Skeet Nationals neither the Executive Officer nor I can attend. Just to set the record straight, this is simply a matter of circumstances and not any "disengagement" by the ACTA as was previously alleged following a similar occurrence. The paper provided by the Participation Committee is concerning to the ACTA. Some suggestions would clearly have member clubs in breach of the ACTA Constitution. It appears they wish to give away the product we sell? We want people participating in our sport as members, not as non-members paying for what could be considered a visit to a shooting gallery.

VOLUNTEERS

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the willing volunteers in our sport that keep the wheels turning from Club, Zone and State levels through to the Executive level. It would be great if whenever possible you take the opportunity to thank those that contribute so much to the sport.

Executive Officer's Report

The National Skeet Championships were conducted from the 20th–27th May in great conditions at the National Ground in Wagga Wagga .

Congratulations to all who attended for what was a great week of both shooting and social events. A full report on the event will be in the next CTSN.

The Executive have confirmed that the cost of membership for 2018 will be the same as 2017. The ACTA has continued to investigate member benefits with a number of new initiatives being considered for 2018.

Agenda items for the National Executive meeting to be conducted in June have been called for over the past two months, this is an opportunity to progress any items that individual shooters, Clubs, Zones or States have for the Executive to consider. The opportunity to follow the above process is available all year round to members, however this particular meeting is one to reflect and evaluate the previous year and plan for the future of the ACTA. There are always new considerations particularly with the changing circumstances that the ACTA will create through the new club house.

This meeting will consider a number of agenda items including recommendations from the Rules Supervisors meeting on the 12th May, recommendations for the 2018 National and World events will also be discussed.

With the building of a new clubhouse and conference centre the Executive will be setting the direction of the Association for both the long and short term.

This new addition to the ACTA will allow in the future, an income stream to grow the Association and keep costs to a minimum for members.

The Building Committee and EO have attended numerous meetings with the designers, planner, Wagga Wagga City Council and architects over the past three months. The development application should be assessed and approvals provided by mid-June. The tender process has commenced with six experienced builders having expressed an interest in the construction. A schedule of works agreed with the builders will see the building handed over to the ACTA in early February 2018.

The 2018 National Championships will be followed by the World Championships giving the ACTA the opportunity to showcase the Sport and Association to the World ICTSF Countries.

The ACTA expect a substantial increase in participation in both events, in anticipation of the need to accommodate this the ACTA has extended our agreement with our neighbour Rod Brown for an increase in the number of traps available to 20, this increase will assist in getting the expected numbers across the events. The ACTA is very grateful and appreciative of the co-operation of Rod, I am sure every club would appreciate such an accommodating neighbour as we have. Thanks again to Rod Brown for his support of the ACTA.





How does the ACTA operate?

The ACTA structure is as follows. The ACTA Executive has delegated power to a Board to make recommendations to the full Executive on matters raised through the reporting systems in place. Board and Executive members can bring agenda items to the Board at any time, through providing briefing papers clearly setting out the items they wish to raise. These items make up the agenda for meetings conducted on a regular basis and at times when urgent business is received at short notice. State Associations can also bring matters to the Board through their State meetings and through their delegates to the National Executive or to the Executive Officer.

Once the Board has met on the agenda items they make recommendations to the full Executive for approval by the full Executive. This process takes quite a deal of time to not only be decided but acted on.

The decisions of the Executive once approved are documented in minutes then placed on the ACTA website. The ACTA National office staff do not make these decisions, the full Executive make these decisions and the staff carry out the decisions of the Executive.

If a registered shooter is looking to have an issue addressed in relation to the sport there is a process to go through. At Club matters should be directed to the Club in the first instance. Mostly they will be resolved at the Club in line with your constitution.

For National matters, they should be addressed in writing to your club. The Club may be able to address many of the questions you have, should the Club not be able to resolve your issue they can then forward or place on the Zone agenda for discussion and determination, should this not resolve the issue then it should be referred by the Zone to the State Association. The State, if not able to resolve the issue or be able to deal with the issue under their own constitution should send the item through their State delegates to the National Office to be placed on the agenda.

Whilst on the protocols for contact with the National Body it is important to remember the role of the National Rules Supervisor & the National Handicapper. These volunteer give their time to work with the National body to assist in their specific areas.

The first action to be taken when you have a rules or handicapping issue is to talk to your Club. The Club may wish to refer this to the Zone for clarification or to the State Handicapper, Referee Examiner or State Rules Supervisors, these people can probably sort out your concerns.

If the concerns cannot be adequately addressed the State Rules Supervisor and or Handicapper can then contact the relevant National official. Where possible it is important to put these concerns in writing detailing the facts of your concerns. A written request is so much easier to deal with as the issues and resolution are then in writing so there is no ambiguity.

As with any rule book or handicapping system where they exist in any sport there will be grey areas. All enquiries or disputes will be adjudicated at all times by the National office holders based on the written rules in each case.

SACTA State Skeet Carnival

February 2-5, 2017



After the success of last year's Carnival with the new 4th layout at our State Shooting Park, we were wondering at a State level, if we could build any further on the number of participants that would attend. Many competitors told us last year that they would spread the word so that we could

ISSF REPORT

Unfortunately, some shooters do not realise that all our disciplines have different Rules. Those shooters moving from DTL (Trap) to ISSF Trap will find below some of the main mistakes that are regularly made.

The ISSF Rule Book 2017 can be downloaded from the ISSF website. www.issf-sports.org

DIFFERENCES BETWEEN DTL (TRAP) AND ISSF TRAP

- DTL CARTRIDGES: 4.09a. For all 12Guage other than Handicap the load is limited to 28gram. Shot size not larger than No 6. Handicap load is limited to 32gram.
- ISSF Must not exceed 24.0gram (+0.5g tolerance) Only transparent or translucent with no colour may be used. Pellets must not exceed 2.6mm in diameter.
- DTL REFUSAL RULE: 1.06 a, (ii, iii) A shooter has refused a target and the target is called NO TARGET.
- **ISSF** The shooter must indicate this by opening the gun and raising an arm. It is the REFEREES call.
- **DTL GUN/SHELL MALFUNCTION: GRT 14:** The REFEREE will request the shooter to test fire the gun. Under NO circumstances will the referee attempt to test fire the gun.
- **ISSF** The shooter MUST hand the gun, closed, in a safe manner, to the Referee for examination.
- DTL RESULT CALL: GRT 6: Referee must call the RESULT.
- **ISSF** The REFEREE must give a clear distinct signal for targets declared LOST. (only).
- DTL PROCEDURE: 1.02: A Target must be thrown for the first shooter on his call, at his first and subsequent visit to each trap, or after a break in shooting.
- **ISSF** Each day, one target must be thrown from each machine, in sequence, **before the start** of the competition only, or if there is a break in shooting.
- DTL NOT TO COUNT TARGET: (Practise target) Will be allowed in DTL on the first target of the day.
- ISSF These are NOT allowed in ISSF.
- DTL PREPARATION TIME LIMIT: 1.02(d). The shooter must position himself, load gun and call for the target within 10 seconds, after the shooter preceding him has completed his firing.
- **ISSF** The shooter must take his position, close the gun and call for the target within 12 seconds, after the previous shooter has opened the gun.
- DTL ABSENT ATHLETE: 102(a) Must be at the firing point within 2 minutes of being called. Failing this he may be disqualified, penalised with loss of targets or re-squadded at the club's discretion.
- ISSF The REFEREE will call the athletes NAME loudly 3 times within ONE minute. If he does not appear by the end of the minute he will be declared ABSENT and MUST NOT join the squad. He will have **3 points** deducted from his make-up round. (He must report to the CRO to do this.)

I would like to put a case forward to the ACTA to reconsider the 10 seconds time infringement rule for American Skeet for the following reasons.

- American Skeet has a different time or format to all other clay target shooting disciplines such as Trap, Double Rise, Sporting, Ball Trap, Tower, and Trench.
- 2) Trap, Double Rise, Sporting, Ball Trap Tower and Trench shooting all have an advantage over Skeet and that is that these shooters are all ready standing on the station with their gun barrels resting on their foot, cartridges in the chambers, standing with the correct foot position ready to shoot, where as the Skeet shooter cannot step on to the shooting station until the shooter in front of him has stepped off the shooting station, then the Skeet shooter has to rest his barrel on his foot place his cartridges in the chambers, position his feet and only at this stage is the Skeet shooter equal in time to the other disciplines, clearly Skeet shooters are at a disadvantage and discriminated from the other disciplines, this is only one of the reasons why the time infringement rule for Skeet should be put back to 15 seconds.
- 24% of shooters at the 2016 Skeet Nationals were veterans which are going to increase each year and as we get older our reflexes and mental alertest slows.
- I have observed shooters over the past 12 months and would estimate that in excess of 65% of shooters exceed the 10 seconds.
- And finally how does the ACTA intend to apply this 10 second time infringement rule to a disabled shooter who will clearly exceed the 10 seconds.

I understand that we have been having completion time problems of events but there are other solutions to this problem other than upsetting the shooter the paying customer and the expansion of our sport and as you all know that the numbers have been increasing.

- a) Move the National Skeet Carnival to daylight saving as it used to be in November providing at least an extra 2 hours plus.
- b) Shoot 100 targets at one visit is another option.
- c) Install extra layouts.
- d) Better management systems.
- e) Time is lost on squad change overs for many reasons, (change over of referee's & scorers) (having shooters on the layout ready to shoot) (signs next squad layout shooting numbers keep up to date) (Shoot-offs for H'cap event as shooters qualify could start on spare layout before event has finished)
- f) Add another day to the Carnival to allow for these problems.
- g) Maybe having 2 Shoot Marshalls may assist in this problem and share the workload.
- h) Or you may want to consider deleting rule 5 (a) in (MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR OFFICIALS, SKEET) one target shot, not to count, from each house shall be offered to each shooter for his first targets of the day.
- i) Time is also lost on the first wave of the day due to shooters requiring targets to be adjusted, last year I was refereeing a squad who waited 20 minutes for this adjustment to be done no fault of the person carrying out the adjustments but he was only one person and could not be in two places at once, may be two people or more first wave of the day could help this situation.

I would like to sum this up by saying that I enjoy my sport immensely but if I am going to be hassled and hurried up on how long I take to prepare myself, within reason, to get the best possible chance of breaking the target, it is taking away the main reason why I compete.

And finally I would like to quote Tony Turner from July 2016 Australian Clay Target Shooting News which was printed just after the 2016 Skeet Nationals, which I totally 150% agree with as I think it further sums up my feelings and possibility other shooters.

QUOTE: "IT SOMETIMES OCCURS THAT WE LOSE SIGHT OF WHY WE ACTUALLY COMPETE IN THE SPORT. MY PHILOSOPHY ON LIFE IS SIMPLE, IF IT'S NOT FUN, I DON'T DO IT" UNQUOTE well let me tell you people it is not fun at 10 seconds.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Muscle Memory

Last month, I explored the different sections of the brain. Starting with the "old brain" which is the prehistoric part that is responsible for dealing with hunger, thirst, sex, keeping us alive and making sure our genetic material is passed on. The second part was the Limbric System which contained the Amygdala, Hip-

pocampus, Hypothalamus and the Ventral Striatal system. These components look after emotions, memory, motivation and hormones. The final section was the cerebral cortex, which is the thinking section of the brain. It is made up of the two hemispheres, right and left and is connected by the corpus callosum. The left side of the brain is usually the area associated with language and thought and the right side is associated with visual spatial and visual motor functioning. The prefrontal cortex is the part directly behind the forehead and is responsible for executive function: the ability to plan and organise, working memory, inhibition, initiating, weighing up consequences or behavioural regulation and metacognition or thinking about thinking. The brain is really complex and according to my neuropsychology lecturer in the 1980's, "If the brain were simple enough for us to understand, we would be too simple to understand it." A lot has changed with neuroscience since the 1980's but the brain is still complex and difficult to understand.

In this article, I want to explore muscle memory.

The definition of muscle memory, according to Merriam-Webster.com "... is the ability to repeat a specific muscular movement with improved

efficiency and accuracy that is acquired through practice and repetition." Wikipedia claims "muscle memory has been used synonymously with motor learning, which is a form of procedural memory that involves consolidating a specific motor task into memory through repetition. When a movement is repeated over time, a long-term muscle memory is created for that task, eventually allowing it to be performed without conscious effort. This process decreases the need for attention and creates maximum efficiency within the motor and memory systems. Examples of muscle memory are found in many everyday activities that become automatic and improve with practice, such as riding a bicycle, typing on a keyboard, typing in a PIN, playing a musical instrument, martial arts and dancing. Clay target shooting is definitely a muscle memory sport."

In a recent article in an American shooting magazine, *Shooting Sportsman*, *Seven Guns The guns of top clays shooters* by Ed Carroll, seven top shooters were interviewed primarily about their guns. The article was showing that if you had a high quality gun that fitted you well, you would shoot better. This is probably a no brainer. The shooters in the articles talked about their firearms and it was a real contest between, Perazzi, Krieghoff, Beretta, Browning and so on. What was also evident in the article, but didn't rate a mention from the author as significant or important, was that each of these top shots said they shot between 25,000 and 40,000 targets per year. This is a staggering amount of targets but shows the effect of muscle memory, that they became the best through repeating specific muscle movements over and over again.

In an online article, http://theconversation.com/explainer-muscle-memory-17206 scientists approach muscle memory from a variety of perspectives based on their theoretical standpoint.

- Cognitive psychologists cite the centrality of the brain in any muscle memory (learning) that takes place.
- System theorists (the multi-disciplinary consideration of physics, biology, chemistry and maths) discuss the self-organising nature of the human movement system and the importance of the environment in which we act.
- Neuroscientists discuss neural plasticity and the strengthening of synaptic connectivity as a function of repetitive firing through practice.
- Neurophysiologists attack the question from first principles: "Can muscles really drive behaviour independent of the nervous system?"

In all cases, these scientific disciplines would generally reject the idea of muscle memory in the literal sense that the term is generally used.

My definition of muscle memory is a complex process of learning and retaining a motor skill. Firstly the skill needs to be learned and then practised and practised, to be retained and generalised. Retention of motor skills is not equal. Continuous-type skills such as riding a bike will be more easily retained than learning to play the piano. Shooting is not a continuous-type activity therefore it will take longer to learn and even more time, and a lot of targets, to retain. For most of us, shooting only on weekends and sometimes only once or twice a month just isn't enough targets.

This repetition value is the reason the shooters in the Shooting Sportsman article shot so many targets: to consolidate their muscles learning. Consolidating muscle memory is an excellent reason to shoot extra targets just for practise. But it must be remembered that you must be doing it correctly to make sure your muscles memory is remembering the right thing or the correct way to shoot. In the past I have written that when practising it is important to remember; it is not 'practise makes perfect', but 'Perfect practice makes perfect'.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another ICTSF affiliate.
- 2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- 4. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10.00am.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and second family members, they being wives and husbands entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 21. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 22. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
- 23. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.

Cartridge trophy. The results are as follows:


