President's Notes

As I have been in England for the ICTSF General Assembly meeting and the World English Sporting Championships my report will be brief.

ICTSF English Sporting

The Australian Open Sporting team competed in England taking second

in the Teams events after a very solid performance. The team of John Younger, Peter Tobin, Jamie Dunn, Socrates Pilipasidis & Anthony Panetta with score of 662 ex768 took the silver medal for the ACTA. The team members represented the Association with distinction and are to be congratulated on their performance at the event. Taking second in AA grade was John Younger.

Gracing the front cover is the 2017 Ladies World English Sporting Champion Renae Birgan. Renae took out the event with a 166 winning by 5 targets. Congratulations Renae. There will be a full report in a later magazine.

ICTSF Meeting

A decision was made to revise the ICTSF affiliation fees. Since its formation in 2008 the ICTSF has accumulated over GBP 30,000 and it was agreed the Federation currently had no planned use for these funds. The meeting decided to cut affiliation fees from GBP 500 to GBP 100. It is intended this will eventually reduce funds held and may encourage some smaller nations to affiliate.

The next ESP championships have been confirmed in Ireland in 2019 as expected. Delegates present were extremely positive about the forthcoming World DTL and many countries will be fielding full teams. Some discussion took place regarding the 2020 World DTL. A decision on venue will be made at the next General Assembly to be held prior to the World DTL at Wagga Wagga. There is strong competition for the event from both Wales (Arthur Williams Ground) and a new ground in Scotland.

Hall of Fame Meeting

A meeting of a committee appointed to review the composition and structure of the planned Hall of Fame for the new building was conducted during July. The committee provided a blueprint for what the Hall of Fame should look like, its focus and structure. This will be further expanded upon in the coming months. As with all aspects of the new building we will only get one chance at it, so it is important we get it right for now and into the future. The Executive would be interested to hear from any members with ideas or who may be in a position to sponsor some of the costs associated with this development.

National Executive Meeting

The National Executive meeting was conducted in June with the minutes now approved. Some of the decisions of the Executive include:

1. The setting of dates for National events up to and including 2025. This will enable the ACTA to efficiently manage the conference centre in conjunction with shooting events on the ground.
2. Approved the details for the National DTL Championships including conducting the Nationals over 19 traps with a maximum 684 competitors.
3. Approved the details for the 13th ICTSF World DTL Championships including conducting the event over 20 traps with a maximum 800 competitors.
4. Both of these events are Pre-Nominations only (NOW OPEN).
5. The ACTA is advertising for paid referees for the World DTL event.
6. Due to the number of overseas visitors a nominal fee of \$20.00 per gun will be charged for storage at the ground.

National Trap Championships and World DTL Championships

Nominations are now open with a large influx of nominations already received in the first four weeks.

Numbers have been capped to ensure the events are conducted professionally with maximum enjoyment by the participants. The ACTA expect to have a large contingent from overseas attend the World event and by nature we expect those participants to attend some, if not all, of the National Championships.

Given this expected number of overseas visitors as well as many additional ACTA members, the Executive has decided to ensure the smooth conduct of the event by limiting the numbers over the 20 traps available.

No practice trap will be operating during the World event, the Nationals will be conducted over 19 traps with one trap available for practice.

To nominate for both or either Championships follow the link and choose your Championship. The National and World nominations are on different forms.

Follow the requirements in filling in the nominations form. When completed and sent YOU WILL RECEIVE A CONFIRMATION VIA EMAIL THAT YOUR NOMINATION WAS SUCCESSFUL: If you do not receive an email your form was not completed correctly and was not accepted. Before submitting ensure you complete the form in its entirety.

Executive Officer's Report

Forward planning

We are now approaching a time of the year when we should be starting to consider the future make-up of the Club, Zone and or State Committees.

If your Club, Zone or State is in the position where you have already scoped these roles and have a plan then you are well in front of the majority.

Most are looking at 2018 with a focus on the calendar and those things that affect our calendar. There is also the all-important role of determining who is going to continue on the committee and who we may recruit.

A "Volunteer Management Plan" with "Club Role Descriptions" needs to be developed or at least used as a template to assess the positions you require as well as the roles of the those positions. A DRAFT plan can be found on the ACTA website under Members Administration, this plan can be updated to suit your individual Club, Zone, and State requirements.

This template was developed using materials readily available on the Web. This document is not complicated, it is common sense with a step by step explanation of roles and responsibilities. It is however only a guide, the Club, Zone or State can easily review, add and change to suit their circumstances. Planning gives you the opportunity to succeed, without it you are just hoping things work.

This guide can assist your club by identifying the roles of the committee and volunteers. It should clearly outline the requirements of the job. If you know what positions and the roles of the positions you need to fill, it will not be left to chance to get the right people.

Do not leave it to the AGM to approach people to join the committee; a retention committee (President, VP, and Secretary) can seek out people regarding those bringing skills to the club. Do not leave it until the last minute where at your AGM the Secretary and President confirm they will not be standing for those positions (and have told everyone at the last AGM that this will be their last year) and then try to find someone from the floor to do the job. It is not fair on the Club or those who are coerced into these jobs without knowing what they are in for.

I would encourage all Clubs, and States where they own or lease property to ensure that they have an action plan to remediate their site when required. This can be a simple plan that includes testing on the ground to ensure compliance and or have a clean-up plan in place for the regular removal of lead. Being proactive in this area assists in assuring authorities we as a sport are complying with "best practice" as we know it. It is better to be actively planning for these circumstances rather than being told you are not following guidelines. Being able to provide a document approved by your Committee will greatly assist the organisation.

Loyalty Reward System

The ACTA is now instigating a new "loyalty" reward system with the

signing of an agreement with sportspass. Details of the Sportpass concept are in the magazine with instructions on how to join, there is NO COST to the service being offered and it presents considerable savings in many areas.

Rule Clarification

ACTA HANDICAP SHOOTING

With handicap shooting invariably taking on the format of five targets per lane there seems to be some confusion about what should happen if the Referee/Scorer does not advise the squad when to change lanes.

To make for ease of understanding consider this scenario – a squad is shooting and has already completed 2 lane changes and are shooting their third bracket of five targets. The Referee/Scorer forgets to inform the squad that they have shot their 5 targets and allows the shooters to shoot an extra 2 or 3 targets before realising that they have not changed lanes. What should happen?

Regardless of how many extra targets have been shot, the only solution to the situation is to move the shooters to their appropriate lanes and RE-SHOOT all the targets from that lane. That is, any targets shot as additional to the allocated 5 per lane will be disregarded, whether the shooter has hit or missed. The targets additional to the 5 per lane were not their targets, they should have shot from the next lane. I do not believe that we should punish the shooter for not changing lanes and call all targets lost. The onus is clearly the responsibility of the Referee/Scorer in charge of the squad to advise when lane changes should occur and to ensure that shooters are not punished for the Referee's mistake.

CHAMPIONSHIP SASHES

I remind Club Management that when ordering championship sashes that some colours are reserved for State, Commonwealth and National events and should not be used for Club, District or Zone Championships.

Looking through some of the photos that are sent in for publication in the CTSN we have noticed that this is not being observed by all Clubs.

See Rule below.

3.16 SASHES/DONATED TROPHIES

- (a) Sash colours for clubs to be any colour other than those designated for National, Commonwealth – both royal blue, State – red or alternatively Official State colours.

This rule was placed in the Rule book to certify that State and National coloured sashes are unique and carry the prestige that they deserve. Hopefully this reminder will remedy the use of reserved coloured sashes.

If you have questions or need to have a Record Card issue resolved, please contact your State Handicapper or State Rules Supervisor for clarification.

National Trap Championships / World DTL 2018

Entry details of the 2018 Nationals and World DTL

1. The National Trap Championships will have a maximum 684 competitors
2. The Worlds DTL Championships are open to 800 shooters
3. Entries to the 2018 Trap National and the World DTL are by pre-nomination only, opening on the ACTA website and the ICTSF Website from July 2017.
4. Nominations for both will close on the 31st of January or when number have reached their maximum. A standby list will then be created.
5. The cost of entry to the World DTL Championships points score event will be \$350.00
6. Prizes for the World DTL will be published in full in October, the guaranteed first prize overall will be \$10,000.00
7. **Deauville Double events** will be by nomination at the event

World DTL Referees

The ACTA is seeking 30 suitably qualified referees/scorers for 20 layouts (these referees will rotate, 6 referee/scorers per bank of 4 traps).

The ACTA will make an honorarium payment of \$300.00 per day per referee/scorer.

The ACTA is taking expressions of interest at execofficer@claytarget.com.au.

Referees will be contacted and advised of the ACTA's decision on their expression of interest by October 2017.

Firearms Storage

Due to the nature and volume of the 2018 National Championships and the World DTL Championships it is necessary to have two full time attendants for the Vault.

This facility will be available from Friday the 16th March through to Tuesday the 27th of March. All guns will need to have been removed from the Vault on Tuesday at the completion of the World Championships.

Cost of storage: The cost of storage for the National Trap and World DTL is a total flat fee of \$20.00 per gun for the Nationals and World events.

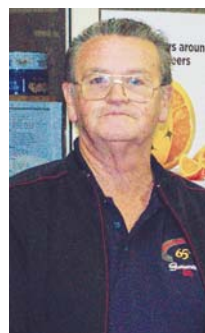

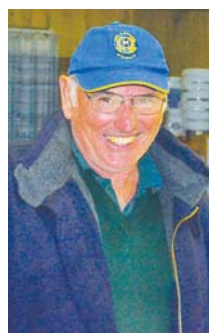

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Junior Development Squad

During the recent school holidays I had the pleasure of presenting a mental skills session to the 2017 ACTA Junior Development Squad. ACTA coaching coordinator, Suzy Corry (Balogh) organised a number of guest

coaches for the week long camp and asked that I focused on things such as pre-shot routine, concentration and how to bring your focus back, amongst other things.

Contrary to popular belief teaching is difficult. Before I ever enter a classroom or present a workshop to students or teachers I am reminded of a notice I once read in a staffroom.

"Everyone is in awe of the lion tamer in a cage with six ferocious lions: everyone, except the kindergarten teacher."

Why is it difficult? Firstly, you never know what the audience will be like, what they already know and what will interest them. Secondly, has what I've prepared going to be interesting, stimulating and meaningful.

So armed with this realistic fear I prepared a number of topics and activities that would hopefully meet what the participants wanted and were expecting.

Even though I had these topics, such as goal setting, motivation, concentration, dealing with distractions, etc prepared, I decided to change the format and asked the group what they wanted to know. Rather than me just lecture and tell them what I felt they should know, I opened the session with "What questions do you have?"

Now we all know there is no such thing as a dumb question, but in a group of about 25 teenagers who have only just met there is usually reluctance in standing up and asking questions.

The first question asked dealt with keeping your mind quiet. Regular readers will know that the answer to this question is not simple. We are human and we all talk to each other and often to ourselves. There is nothing wrong about this and it can be a useful strategy for setting goals or as a behavioural rehearsal technique. The problem is that this self-talk can be negative and force us to make judgements about our performance or about us as a person. This also happens when we focus on the past, when we think about poor past performances or a missed target. We will often beat ourselves up about losing or failing and this will then lead to us thinking that we are no good as a person. We equate missing a target with failure and we will make value judgements about us as a person based on the fact that we failed. It may be immaterial that we have a successful job, are in a stable and loving relationship, we are in good physical and mental health, the fact that we were unable to succeed at the one thing that we hold dear, overwhelms our thoughts and feelings.

The answer to the question of keeping your mind quiet is also complex. It would be good if we could shut out all the judgements and negative self-talk out but this unlikely. It is therefore necessary to put something else in its place. Hum, sing or recite poetry. It doesn't matter as long as the mind is active so that the negative self-talk is unable to occur because it doesn't have an audience. You cannot think of negative things if the mind is already busy. The second part of this question is to focus on your breathing. Breathing, and more importantly concentrating on your breathing, helps you stay in the here and now. It denies your brain to focus on the past. Therefore you cannot construct those judgements that will impact on your ability or you as

a person. Deep breathing also increases the oxygen to your brain and blood supply, lowers your heart rate and allows you to 'centre yourself'.

Another strategy for keeping your mind quiet is to have a definitive pre-shot routine. Making sure that all the bases are covered before you take your shot will deny the brain the opportunity to ask questions and give you advice. Part of the pre-shot routine should be the visualisation of the shot you are about to take. Seeing it in your mind's eye, allows your brain to think it has already happened and therefore it does not need to give you advice or ask any more questions. The part of the brain that has to execute the shot, track the target, move your body, pull the trigger and follow through deals better with picture than words. Once your brain has seen you shoot the target (in visualised form) it believes that it has already done it and that there is nothing to get anxious or worry about.

The last element of the answer to this question involves focusing attention. As a shooter your attention has to be on the target you have just called for. Just as thinking about the past is problematic so too is thinking about the future. Thinking about the future develops worries and fears that will interfere with your ability to focus on the targets. If you think about the product: the score, trophy, long break, etc you are leaving the present and entering the future. This can be distracting. You need to maintain your focus on the process. By focusing on the pre-shot routine, stance, mounting the gun, seeing the target and shooting the target you will be able to hit the targets one after another and in doing so the product or the score will look after itself.

The mental skills coaching session only dealt with a couple of questions. But these questions were so complex that they touched on all the aspects required to be mentally strong shooter and covered the material that the participants were interested in rather than just have me stand up there and tell them what I wanted them to hear. They actually got the answers to the questions that were worrying them.

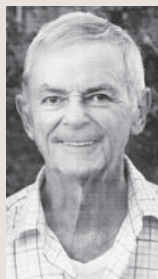

ACTA members have been asking about firearm insurance. Now you have it!

Affordable, Quality Firearm Insurance

The ACTA has accepted an Association Insurance policy that will see eligible members (defined as the legal owner of a firearm) provided with **Firearms Insurance** for up to **\$12,000**. For an additional **\$10.00** fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to **\$25,000**.

This insurance represents a significant saving on insurance for firearms and accessories. The ACTA has been looking for this type of insurance for some time. This will allow all eligible members to have insurance at a very low cost compared to what they may pay now. Covering member's firearms, and/or associated equipment whilst in transit, stored in a locked vehicle in accordance with State Law and/or building and damaged or destroyed whilst in use anywhere in Australia and New Zealand and overseas coverage for 21 days per year.

DEFINITIONS APPLYING TO THIS POLICY

- Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases. Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.
 - Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
 - No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s).

Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member. The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

The full policy document will be available on the ACTA website with all other insurance documents on the 1st of November 2016.

For an additional \$10.00 fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to \$25,000.

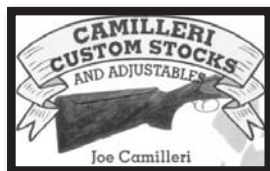

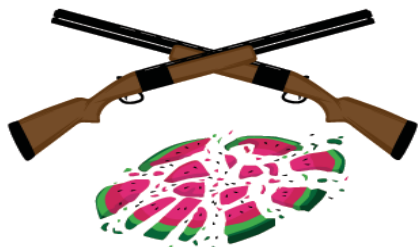

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller;
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
