President's Notes

Past President, Mr Jim Scott

Sadly I have to inform the membership that I have been advised of the passing of Life Registered Shooter and former National President Mr Jim Scott. Jim held the position of National President from 1988 — 1991. On behalf of the membership I express our

condolences to Jim's family and friends.

National Ground

Work has finally begun on the ACTA multi-purpose Conference Centre. Wagga Wagga based construction firm, Pascoe Constructions has been awarded the contract to deliver this 6.7 million dollar project by the 1st of March 2018. The development includes a conference centre that can seat 1200 persons or host 650 for dinner, bar, cafeteria, commercial kitchen, viewing deck that spans almost 2 layouts and the ACTA Hall of Fame. Other

ancillary items included in the project are a new entrance to the National Grounds, sealed car-parking, widening of the bridge and landscaping.

It has been a difficult task to manage the design and tender process and select a contractor able to deliver the project within the budgeted figure and within the tight timeframe. We feel confident that this is now achievable. This is a very exciting time for your Association with the NSW Sports Minister Stuart Ayers inspecting the site accompanied by Local member Daryl Maguire last Tuesday. This was reported widely in television, radio and print medians.

Indications are that NSW Premier, Gladys Berejiklian will also be inspecting the developments progress at the end of October.

Another application for funding has now been completed and is ready for lodgement when the next round of Federal Sports grants opens. This application refers to Olympic Discipline facilities that if successful will almost complete the National Ground development.

ACTA Hall of Fame

A Sub-committee of Bronte Evans, Mark McInnes, John Mack and Gary Read has been formed to develop the Hall of Fame concept. They have met once and their recommendations to date are under consideration. To give the Hall of Fame the prestige it deserves it is being sited in and along the main entry and foyer area of the Conference Centre. The actual fitout of this area is not covered within the NSW Government grant and so the Association would welcome any offers of financial support towards this specific purpose from interested individuals or the trade. Whether the area is completed in time for the opening may well be dependent upon support from outside the ACTA.

Sportspass

The Association is now pleased to be able to introduce a free loyalty type card to its members. The card in electronic format will provide financial benefits to members at various outlets Australia wide. The electronic format which is App based allows access to the cards benefits without yet another plastic card in the users wallet. Negotiations have also provided the opportunity to provide the card to all International visitors at the World DTL event next year. The ACTA Sportspass program

goes live on the 1st of November so please ensure your renewal contains your current email address which is required to activate your personal card. Full details appear elsewhere in this magazine.

Insurance

The Association has now called for expressions of interest for the brokering of our insurance products. This is done every three years to ensure we have the best deal in the market for our Registered Shooters, Club and States etc. The Registered shooters personal firearms cover will be retained providing \$12,000 of cover within the membership cost and an extra \$13,000 available by the payment direct to the broker of \$10. Larger amounts are available by negotiation direct with the broker. This is excellent value for Members and I would encourage those of you with firearms insurance attached to your household or other policies to review them and reap the financial savings provided to you by the ACTA policy. Anecdotally it could be that the savings on a household policy could be more than your total membership cost. I would like to hear from anybody that has achieved significant savings, or had a claim paid by the insurer.

2018 Membership Cost

The Executive have already decided that 2018 fees will remain at the current level. This decision was made as part of a strategy to closer align our membership costs with other Associations over time.

2018 Major events - World DTL.

Nominations for next years Trap Nationals and the World DTL are now open and filling quickly.

If you are a casual shooter and rarely if ever attend the Nationals, I would encourage you to attend next year. The World DTL is a fantastic event and only comes to Australia once every 10 to 12 years. Your new building will be open for use and inspection and a larger selection of traders than usual are expected to be in attendance.

Board and Executive Meetings

By the time this goes to print your Board will have met again in Wagga Wagga, during the ACTA Sporting Nationals and reviewed next year's budget. The proposed budget and other Board recommendations will be on the agenda for a full Executive meeting in late October or early November. The decision of the Executive to continue with a small Board sub-committee meeting in person regularly and then recommending to the Executive is in the best interests of the governance of the ACTA. It allows regular face to face meetings of the Board to deal with all sorts of matters in a timely manner, but still under the oversight of your full Executive. Recommendations are made to the Executive either electronically if urgent, or by being placed on the agenda of Executive meetings if time permits. The regularity of these meetings would not be economically possible if the full Executive had to meet this often.

Clay Targets

There has been a fair bit of activity within the industry lately with a local manufacturer having ceased production at the moment, and another importer adding another brand to their product list. We will be watching pricing carefully as it is believed the local manufacturers pricing may well have put a ceiling in the market price.

Executive Officer's Report

The weather is warming up and with that there are a number of State events coming up of great importance. State selection for the Nationals in 2018 provides a platform to the World DTL event, with this event to be conducted immediately following the Nationals in 2018. Nominations to date show great support for both events. It gets people thinking, why do we not have more large scale National events? This will open a can of worms, however rational debate is always healthy.

The for and against ideas can be discussed and debated by registered shooters, Clubs, Zones and States. The National Executive would consider any submissions and work with those to review the sporting operations and calendar.

Discussion points:

- The ACTA (Clubs, States etc) are seen as being the best at conducting competition events amongst all shooting organisations.
 We as a whole do it well. This would be an extension.
- Could this mean a number of events requiring qualification to be selected for a "final".
- What would attract high quality shooters to bigger events.

Major prize shoots

Some may see this as pushing my own barrow because this relates to the Roma club of which I am a member, but I do not see any other way to explain this but in this column. Up until the mid 70's quite a few ACTA clubs hosted shoots with cars as prizes. Our involvement at that time with the ISU (now the ISSF) and rules around prize value for supposedly amateur Olympic sport saw these shoots discontinued. However all that has now changed. You can now see Tiger Woods and Serena Williams competing at the Olympics.

I have considered for years how we could again shoot for cars and yet keep nominations affordable to most shooters and also ensure the club does not lose. Recently I had a coffee and conversation with former ACTA Historian Mark McInnes where Mark mentioned there were no really successful sports that did not have a professional side. Personally I think Mark is correct and to lift the image and profile of this sport we need to lift the prize value. The Roma Club has now bitten the bullet and is committed to hosting a three year series of car shoots. We believe we have a format that will work. The first event in early March 2018 will see competition for a Mitsubishi 4x4 twin cab and a Lucky Door prize for a small Mitsubishi Car. The format will be advertised shortly but I can tell you that there will be 6 events over 3 days. Nominations will be \$300 full or \$240 discounted, pre-noms will open on the 1st November and both cars will leave the grounds in the hands of new owners at the completion of the event. If this format works it could easily be adopted by any club having enough facilities to handle the numbers. How good would it be to have numerous car shoots conducted annually throughout Australia again?

- Bigger events brings more profile, media exposure for the sport.
- Could this be a selection process for international events.
- Traders in firearms and ammunition would benefit with increased events and popularity of the sport in the long term.
- Clubs have limited opportunities to conduct events, any more days may take from their calendar.
- Sponsors would be required and this too may take away from Club sponsorship.
- Travel is an issue to get to these events.
- It is only catering for the elite or those with time and money to travel.
- This would require more volunteer hours when conducting these events.
- What are a Clubs thoughts on shooing within their Zone, State and Nationally.
- Is this an area that the National body should be further encroaching on (outside established National events).
- Do we need more events.
- Do we need less events and more competitors.
- Are we overtaxing volunteers.
- Can we reduce the workload for volunteers.

As I have previously stated there are some big opportunities that will present themselves leading into and following the ACTA Nationals and the World DTL in March 2018. There is also another small event following these two events, the Commonwealth Games where our super elite ISSF competitors will look to take out Gold. Some great results were achieved at the last Olympic Games where Catherine Skinner took Gold and James Willett came away with an Olympic record.

Since then shotgun shooting icon Adam Vella was appointed as National Shot Gun Coach with Shooting Australia. Adam has had an immediate impact, highlighted by international success at World Cup events over the past eighteen months.

Shooting looks good in the short and long term, we now need to capitalise.

Membership 2018

The National Executive agreed that the ACTA would change the process for registration of members in 2018 in relation to finance.

The ACTA will, as from the 1st of November (2018 membership year), bill Clubs for the full component of the membership, that is, the Zone (where applicable), State and National fees. Once a Club registers a member they will be invoiced the full amount (less their club fee). This currently occurs with payments through the "mypage" system. The ACTA will then process payments to the Zone and State saving the Club from this administrative duty.

It is extremely important that all member details are confirmed when processing membership, email addresses are required to allow members to access Sportspass.

Zones & States will still be collecting their fees for the 2017 membership year.

Caboolture Clay Target Club July 2017

This is the first time that Caboolture Clay Target Club (CCTC) has hosted this event and the hard work and efforts of a great team in putting together a combined NSSA 500 as well as the Caboolture Clay Target Clubs annual Skeet Carnival were rewarded with some outstanding shooting and great compliments being passed on the success of the event.

The NSSA segment of the carnival was shot over $2\frac{1}{2}$ days beginning with 100 doubles and 100 20 gauge on the Thursday followed by 100 of both 28 gauge and the .410 on the Friday.

Saturday brought the final 100 target event namely the 12 gauge, this was combined with the 12g event of the two day competition

Back to the Thursday morning which started bright and sunny and the warm temperatures were very welcome for the interstate and New Zealand visitors. With the NSSA events filled to capacity, all shooters were advised in advance of their shooting times and squad positions so the first event, 100 target doubles, started promptly at 8.30am.

NSW shooters started their domination of the four days with Shane Bennett of NSW emerging the overall doubles champion with a score of 98/100. Shane then followed this up with a 99/100 in the 20g event after a shoot off with Paulette Walker who was thrilled with her score of 99 and hopes this will help raise her NSSA classification.

The weather wasn't quite so kind on day two with showers predicted for the day. However the disappointment of the weather was soon over-

come with the smell of hot roast being cooked for Mathew Rhue's famous hot pork and gravy rolls which were served at lunch time.

The rain didn't dampen Wayne Petersen's shooting ability however when he took the overall 28g championship with a fabulous 99/100. Mal Briggs followed this with a 96/100 in the .410 event to take that championship title.

Saturday's weather was back to the bright and sunny Queensland weather with clear blue skies, temperatures close to mid 20's



However, an equally big smile was on the face of John Pethybridge shooting a 50 straight in the first half of the event to finish on 95/100.

The combined 12g event saw the end of the NSSA 500 with New South Wales taking out both the NSSA HOA and HAA titles.

Saturday afternoon concluded with the ever popular Super Handicap event and much discussion about which gauge to use. The great conditions saw over half the entries get through to the first round of shoot offs including B Grade Tahnee Davenport shooting her first ever 50 straight and Tracey Ashton being regraded to AA Grade.

Round after round was completed with Shane Bennett, Mal Briggs, Allan McKenzie, Tahnee Davenport and Rodney Kneipp being the last five shooters. Shane Bennett (12g) emerged the eventual winner from Mal Briggs (28g) with a final score of 168/168. Great shooting!

National Trap Championships / World DTL 2018

Entry details of the 2018 Nationals and World DTL

- 1. The National Trap Championships will have a maximum 684 competitors
- 2. The Worlds DTL Championships are open to 800 shooters
- 3. Entries to the 2018 Trap National and the World DTL are by pre-nomination only, opening on the ACTA website and the ICTSF Website from July 2017.
- 4. Nominations for both will close on the 31st of January or when number have reached their maximum. A standby list will then be created.
- 5. The cost of entry to the World DTL Championships points score event will be \$350.00
- 6. Prizes for the World DTL will be published in full in October, the guaranteed first prize overall will be \$10,000.00
- 7. **Deauville Double events** will be by nomination at the event

World DTL Referees

The ACTA is seeking 30 suitably qualified referees/scorers for 20 layouts (these referees will rotate, 6 referee/scorers per bank of 4 traps).

The ACTA will make an honorarium payment of \$300.00 per day per referee/scorer. The ACTA is taking expressions of interest at **execofficer@claytarget.com.au**. Referees will be contacted and advised of the ACTA's decision on their expression of interest by October 2017.

Firearms Storage

Due to the nature and volume of the 2018 National Championships and the World DTL Championships it is necessary to have two full time attendants for the Vault.

This facility will be available from Friday the 16th March through to Tuesday the 27th of March. All guns will need to have been removed from the Vault on Tuesday at the completion of the World Championships.

Cost of storage: The cost of storage for the National Trap and World DTL is a total flat fee of \$20.00 per gun for the Nationals and World events.

Ministerial Inspection for ACTA Function Centre

NSW Sports Minister Stuart Ayres was recently in Wagga Wagga to cast his eyes over the finalised plans for the \$7 million Australian Clay Target Association headquarters

With the NSW State Government funding up to \$5.5 million for the project some 6 six months ago, initial ground preparation has finally begun. The ACTA will contribute the other \$1.5 million to complete the costs.

Mr Ayres said the facility, which will host the ACTA 2018 National

Championships and 2018 World DTL Shooting Championships in March, would add "another string to the bow" of Wagga's revered sporting reputation and provide the city's shooting scene with a shot in the arm.

"You always want the best athletes in the country choosing to come and shoot here in Wagga," he said.

"Wagga continues to deliver athletes who wear the green and gold and I'd love to see more people coming through this Association."



"This is the type of facility I think will attract other sports to Wagga too," Mr Ayres said.

"Maybe not straight to this facility, but there's the incentive of hosting their official events in this conference centre."

NATIONAL FIREARMS AMNESTY

National Firearms Amnesty update: over 12,500 firearms handed-in so far.

In the first month of the National Firearms Amnesty, more than 12,500 firearms were surrendered across Australia – that's an average of 400 firearms handed in every day.

There are now over 12,500 fewer firearms in our communities that are at risk of ending up in the wrong hands.

There's plenty of time left for people to continue to take advantage of the Amnesty, which runs until 30 September 2017.

Rare items of historical significance have been handed in, including

Camping on the National Ground booked out

Due to the 2018 World Down the Line Championships following the 2018 National Trap Championships, camp sites on the National Ground have been in great demand and are now fully booked

heirlooms from WWI, WWII and the Vietnam War. A Queensland police service rifle dating back to 1874 was also handed in in the ACT.

The Amnesty allows anyone with an unwanted and unregistered firearm or firearm-related items to legally dispose of or register them at approved drop-off points in each state and territory.

There is no cost involved with handing in or surrendering a firearm, and no personal details are required.

Outside the current amnesty period, anyone caught with an unregistered firearm could face a fine of up to \$280,000, up to 14 years in jail, and a criminal record.

Information about individual state and territory requirements, including how and where to surrender firearms, can be found at the Firearms Amnesty website or by calling 1800 909 826.

2018 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA or recognised organistion for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for nominations is the 31st January 2018.
- 3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 4. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
- 5. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed
 for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF
 ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 8. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 11. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 14. Optional sweep prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
- 22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
- 23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
- 24. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament Director of the Shoot Marshal.
- 25. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.







Psychological Skills for Shooting

Why should we have a pre-shot routine?

During the July school holidays, I spent some time with the Junior Development Squad again, which I wrote about last month. One of the topics that Suzy Corry and the other

coaches addressed was pre-shot routine. When this article is published I will be overseas, so I have revised the article I wrote about pre-shot routine in 2013.

Anyone who plays golf knows the importance of "addressing the ball". It is the moment when you have put the ball on the tee and placed your feet in the correct position and sit the club behind the ball, ready to commence the swing. In shooting the process is pretty much the same. For the skeet shooter it is walking onto the pad and setting your feet in the right position, For the sporting shooter it happens when you walk into the cage and position yourself, and for the trap shooter it happens when you step onto the next mark and position yourself ready to shoot the next target.

But a pre shot routine is just not about putting your feet in the right position although where to stand is an important aspect of the pre shot routine. The pre shot routine is the switch for you to change your level of attention. It is the trigger for you to start to concentrate.

According to Burton and Raedeke (2008) Attention is the process that directs our awareness to information available through our senses. Most of the time our senses are attacked and bombarded with stimuli. For instance you may be reading this article but you might also become aware of external stimuli of something cooking and you may feel hungry. You might smell something burning and you might feel worried. When you notice certain sensory information you make a decision on what action to take and this process requires attention. Thus, according to Raedeke and Burton, attention involves perceiving sensory information and using it to make decisions and choose responses. The sensory information in shooting can involve smell (the smell of the burnt gunpowder), touch (the feel of the gun in your shoulder, the recoil, the weight of the gun, the feeling of the sun on your neck, wind or rain on your face, etc), sight (the target flying through the air, the target smashing or the target not breaking at all) and hearing (the gun closing, the explosion, the call of the referee).

Each sport is unique in the sensory information that needs to be attended to for an Ideal Performance State (IPS). Nideffer (a renowned US sports Psychologist) has developed an applied theory of concentration, which should be considered by all athletes and coaches. To understand this theory it is necessary to realise that for each of us an optimal level of arousal will coincide with efficient use of attentional capacities; this is referred to as our ideal performing state (IPS). At this IPS, we efficiently match the attentional demands of the situation with use of appropriate type of concentration. When we are not at our ideal performing state it is because the types of attentional focus becomes inefficient and mismatched with the situational demands. Nideffer believes that we all have an individual concentration style, which means that we have characteristic ways of using our attentional capabilities. Nideffer describes concentration as being either broard or narrow. An analogy here is like a torch with a variable beam: broad type of concentration is when the beam is broad and wide and narrow type, is when the beam is focused on a small point. Jeffery

Bond argues that Nideffer also sees influences on concentration as either external or internal. We can now measure our concentration style in each of these types of concentration:

- Broad -External: awareness of everything that is going on around seeing, hearing, feeling. Necessary for good court/field vision. Probably more critical in team sports than individual
- 2. Narrow External: Ability to concentrate in a focused way, to focus on the one thing, to narrow onto the relevent aspects of a task. Very useful in target sports and as a way of blocking distractions.
- 3. Broad Internal: Need to analyse, organise and plan. The ability to mix it with what is going on and draw some logical conclusions. Being able to deal with a large number of ideas at the one time.
- 4. Narrow Internal: Ability to focus on a single thought or idea and stay with it. Needed to enhance awareness of aspects of body reactions to stress (tight muscles, too high heart rate, etc) Usually indicates extreme dedication and capacity to follow instructions, to stick to a performance plan.

Beyond focusing on the task relevant cues (attention) shooters need to be able to block out all internal and external distractions. This ability to sustain focus and effective block out distractions is called concentration. Effective concentration allows shooters to apply appropriate attention to the internal and external cues. According to Perry, a shooter who can focus, or pay attention, on the task at hand and avoid distractions enjoys the greatest possibility of success.

So, this is the secret. And we need to use the pre shot routine to help us narrow or focus of attention so that we only focus on the target. The difficult part is, we have to do it every time we step onto the tracks or into a cage to address the target. So when we are shooting twenty five targets we have to have our 'one shot' pre shot routine twenty five times. Because our attention broardens (when we are not shooting) and narrows when we are about to shoot, we have to learn how to turn on and off continually.

Therefore, our pre shot routine can have a number of steps.

- Walking on to the pad, track or into the cage.
- Putting our feet in the correct position.
- Taking a breath to centre yourself.
- Closing your gun.

Mounting the gun for the gun up disciplines or holding the gun ready for the gun down disciplines.

While this process is being followed the focus of attention will be moving from broard to narrow. When this has occurred, you are ready to call 'pull'. Our pre shot routine is the all-important step required to change our focus from broad to narrow: from the environment to the target. We can make the pre-shot routine more sophisticated and elaborate by adding visualisation. We will deal this in the future.



NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the ISSF Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
- 3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the relevant Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- 4. The Tournament shall be conducted in accordance with the ISSF Official Statutes, Rules and Regulations (ISSF Rules) and where applicable, ACTA Shooting Rules (grading, teams etc). Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of **15 Pair (30 targets)** with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
- 5. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (Eastern Summer Time) Monday 5th January 2018.
- 6. Shooters will be squadded as per the ISSF rules and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event. Written notification is required for any eligible refund to be processed and should be sent to accounts@claytarget.com.au refunds will be processed within 30 days of the completion of the event and will incur an administration fee.
- 7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable round.
- 8. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- 9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 10. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the score recorded on the sheet.
- 11. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role will **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER ISSF RULES**.
- 12. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. All shooters, coaches and team officials are prohibited from entering the trap pits after the jury has examined and approved the trap settings.
- 13. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament director or the Shoot Marshal.
- 14 All appeals must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit and lodged with the Tournament Director. The \$20 is refundable if the appeal is upheld by the appointed jury. The decision of the jury is Final.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in both Commonwealth and National Championships.
- 16. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in both programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
- 17. Junior male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable. Veteran male shooters are eligible for OA or their grade where applicable.
- 18. Pre-nominations will only be accepted online on the form provided at www.claytarget.com.au
- 19. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events. ACTA rules will be used to determine grade placing where applicable.
- 20. Junior to be under the age of 21 in the year of the competition. Veteran to be over the age of 55 prior to January 1st 2017.
- 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 22. The standard of dress required for all competitors is that defined in the ACTA Clothing Rules.
- 23. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the State. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that State).
- 24. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eliqible for this concession.
- 25. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.
